INTRODUCTORY NOTES

AS TO

THE STATE OF THE INCORPORATION OF SURGEONS IN ITS EARLY PERIOD.

July 1, 1505.—Seal of Cause was granted at this date by the Town Council to the "Surregeanis and Barbouris" constituting them a Civic Incorporation of Edinburgh.

October 13, 1506.—Charter of Confirmation of the preceding was granted by James IV.

August 16, 1542.—Of this date it is recorded as follows :—

"Item, gevin to George Leche, William Quhite, George Fothring-ham, and David Robertsoun, surrurgeanis passand to the bordouris for curing of all personis that hapnit to be hurt be the Inglis menne, xii li."—("Pitcairn's Criminal Trials," vol. i. part i. p. 325.)

None of these five appear to have been living in 1581, though Bris-

set may have been an ancestor of No. 2.

June 10, 1558.—Of this date it is recorded that the Incorporation sent twenty-five of their number, apprentices included, to join a corps then raised "for the defence of the toune" against "our auld inemyes of Ingland."

The names are as follows:—"Jhone Wawchthet, and Edward Wawghthet, his servand [i.e., apprentice]; David Robertsoun, and Thomas Kawpe, servand; Jhone Weddel; Patrick Mertene; Alex ander Bruce; Jhone Libertoun; Robert Henrysoun, Andro Wyntoun, and Gilbert Prymros, his servandis; Nowye Bruschet, and Thomas Boyes, his servand; James Lindesay; Archibald Maw, and Jhone Scot,

servand; Alexander Percy, Thomas Blak, his servand; Niniane Maw, Jhone Chalmer, his servand; George Campbell; Maister Armle, William Gray, his servant; Maister Babteist, Jhone Pectarne, his servand; Pate Hardye, Walter Hardye, his sone."—(T. C. R.)

Among these are found Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 9, and 15 of the subjoined

list.*

November 28, 1560, and May 12, 1561.—At these dates Robert Hendersoun (No. 3) was "dekin."—(T. C. R.)

June 27, 1569.—At this date Patrick Hardy was a member, and must have died before 1581.—(See above, June 1558; also No. 2 in the list.)

November 1572.—"James, erle of Mortoun, regent, lay deidlie seik of rumbussanes [rupture], and war nocht he was cuttit he haid lost his lyff."—(Diurnal of Occurrents, p. 321.) The name of the operator, who was presumably one of the Incorporation, is not given. But it is probable that he was John Chisholm, Doctor in Medicine, some time Chirurgeon to King James VI. He died 22d August 1577, and his testament was confirmed in the Commissariat Court, Edinburgh, 6th January 1577-8. He could not therefore be included in the list.

To these things it may be added that in the first page of a work published in Edinburgh in 1620 by "D. Aparisiis Neapolitano," and entitled "Consilia Medicinalia de Conservanda Sanitate," there occur the following words:—"Eam (i.e. Medicinæ artem) exercent hodie magna cum laude Edinburgi doctissimi Doctores Arnotus, Gellius, Sibbetus, Kinkedius, mellifluus ille Henimannus, Lindesius, aliique." As it is mentioned a little further on that King James VI. on his visit to Scotland three years before the date of this publication had honoured them with some marks of his royal approbation, it is to be presumed that they were connected with his Scottish Court. Two of the names, and probably also the individuals, are identical with Nos. 5 and 63 of the following list.

* The cause of this alarm may be understood from the following extract—it being recollected that England and Spain were at this time at war with France, and that the Dauphin's marriage with Queen Mary Stuart was in the preceding April.

[&]quot;During this hoill symmer (1558) the warris continowit still betwix France and Flanders vary hoit, and likewyse betwix Scotlande and Inglande, quair Monsieur Dosell and the Frenche-men maid continowall incursionis, and the hoill nobill-men and gentill-men and substancious yemen kepid the bordouris and accompaned the French-men to quarteris, as use is of the realme; and thair was mony gret scarmishes maid with Ingland, quhair sindre was slayne and mony taiken on both sides."—Bishop Lesley's History, Bannatyne Club. vol. 830, p. 265.

The dates of entry of the first sixteen are not known; but they were all on the roll in 1581, the date of the earliest minute.

N.B.—Residence at Edinburgh is not noted in this List till after

1852, when the non-resident Fellows became numerous.

1. GILBERT PRYMROSS.

Ch. 1581-2, also 1602; died at Westminster, 8th April 1616, at. 80—(B. E. p. 83). Surgeon to King James VI. Known to Dr Peter Lowe, founder of the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow, who inscribed his treatise on Chirurgery to him and to James Harvie (32). He was apprenticed to No. 3 in June 1558. See T. C. R., 10th June 1558, and Weir's History of the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow.

2. Noyer Brwssate.

On 27th June 1569 four surgeons were consulted by the Court of Justiciary in a maiming case,—Nowye Byssat, Dekin of the Chirurgianis, Robert Hendersoune, Alexander Twedy, and Patrick Hardy. The first three are in this list. Hardy probably was dead in 1581. See Pitcairn's Trials, vol. i. part ii. p. 7.

3. ROBERT HENDERSONE.

See No. 2, also Edinburgh Council Register, apud Maitland, quoted in Chambers' Annals, vol. i. p. 24. It appears from thence that, in July 1563, the Town Council voted to this gentleman 20 merks, being equal to £1, 2s. 23d. sterling, for certain cures he had performed, some of which, from the statement given, seem marvellous enough. Ch. 1583.

19. JOHN NAYSMYTH.

E. 30th June 1588. Surgeon to King James VI. B. E. p. 10. Descended from the family of Posso in Tweeddale; chief surgeon to the Scotch Guards of the King of France; died at London 16th September 1613, being in his 57th year; named by the King, in his account of the Gowry Conspiracy, as having been with him at the hunt at Falkland. In the minute of entry he is stated to have been "prenteiss to Gilbert Primroiss." Ch. 1595.

 E. 24th February 1590. Father of No. 44. Ch. 1599.
- 22. Robert Awchmwtie.

E. 29th September 1591. See H. S., p. 8, note; also Pitcairn's Trials, vol. ii. 112, 113, and note, 124. The narrative of the tragic end of this gentleman is full of interest both in itself and with relation to the rude justice of the times, and the interference with the course of justice by the King. He was beheaded for killing his antagonist in a duel, fought at St Leonard's Craigs on Sunday, 20th April 1600. See No. 46.

E. 3d May 1594. See I. Edinburgh, No. 125, February 25, 1624. Possessed tenements in Edinburgh in right of Margaret Laing, his wife. See also I. Selkirkshire, No. 58, May 10, 1636. His son, John Scott, possessed the property of Winterbrugh, with mill and fishings in Ettrick Forest, also the lands of Fawoodgraing, alias Craighill, in Selkirkshire. See also I. G. Nos. 2859 and 2860, of date June 20, 1643. He had two nieces, Joneta and Besseta Scott, who were his heirs. Ch. 1598-9, second time 1606-7, third time 1616-17, fourth time 1620-21, fifth time 1627-8.

25. JAMES SKAITHMURE.

E. 3d May 1594; Ch. 1603-4.

26. James Kinloch.

E. 3d May 1594. See I. G. 1160, September 1624. James Kinloch in Caldermanes was his heir. See also I. G. 1169, December 10, 1624. It appears that he had a brother, named Samuel. Ch. 11th March 1606; elected in the room of Hendrie Lumisden, deceased, second time 1608-9, third time 1619. Died before 10th July 1633. See No. 48.

27. HENRY AIKMAN.

E. 28th May 1595. He married a daughter of John Voddal. Ch. 1601, second time 1610-11, third time 1624-5.

28. DAVID PRINGLE.

E. 18th April 1605. Father of No. 47. See Surgeons' minute

of his entry. Was apprentice to James Henryson. See also Nos. 60, 64, 65, and 72. Father-in-law of No. 73. Ch. 1612-13, second time 1622-3. Must have died before 1643. See minute of entry of No. 73.

29. JOHN KER.

E. 12th May 1608. Married Grizell, daughter of James Henryson (No. 18). Father of No. 57. Father-in-law of No. 43, and of No. 75. Ch. 1631.

30. John Skaithmuir.

E. 30th August 1610. Was son of James Skaithmuir (No. 25).

31. BARTILMO AIKMAN.

E. 30th August 1610.

32. James Hervey.

E. 26th November 1612. See No. 1. He died 10th November 1614. See Confirmed Testaments, Edinburgh. Surgeon to the King and Queen, 26th November 1612. See I. G. No. 753, May 10, 1618. See also I. G. Nos. 1234, 1235. His two nieces, Mariota and Joneta M'Keane, were made heirs-portioners of the property of their then deceased uncle, June 2, 1627. He was apprentice to Gilbert Primroiss (No. 1).

33. JOHN DAVIDSOUN.

E. 31st May 1614. See 352 I. Edinburgh. His wife was hæres portionaria Jacobi Heriot, brasiatoris (brewer), burgensis de Edinburg, June 3, 1615. See also I. G. No. 3612, March 13, 1650, from which we find a son of this gentleman admitted to be "hæres" to his father. See Nos. 58 and 61. Father-in-law of Nos. 45 and 71. Died before the entry of No. 58.

34. DAVID DOWGLAS.

E. 13th September 1616. See No. 67. Ch. 1637-8, second time 1640, third time 1646-7.

35. James Brown.

E. 13th September 1616. See I. Edinburgh, 446, date 1616. Some tenements in Edinburgh were then conveyed to his son James. See also I. Edinburgh, No. 481, from which we learn that in 1622 certain tenements in Edinburgh were inherited by "Andreas Broun," as "hæres Magistri Jacobi Broun filii quondam Jacobi B. chyrurgi, fratris." Father of No. 43.

36. WILLIAM LOWSOUN.

E. 13th September 1616.

37. JOHN FLUCUR.

E. 26th September 1616. See Pitcairn's Trials, viii. 574. "John Fluiker, chirurgane," and another of the same profession, sat in a jury in a trial for murder, and were objected to on the part of the accused party, on the ground that they had been employed by the prosecutor to exhume and examine the body of the murdered man. The objection, however, was over-ruled by the Court.

38. JOHNE MAKILROWIE.

E. 16th January 1617. See I. G. No. 1128, April 9, 1624. His son John was his heir.

39. LAWRENCE COKBURNE.

E. 13th May 1618. Married Helen, daughter of James Henrysoun, No. 18. Ch. 1629-30. Father-in-law of No. 56.

40. ARCHIBALD HAY.

E. 30th October 1621. Chirurgeon to his Majesty. Was "prenteiss" to Andrew Scott (No. 24).

41. JOHN PRINGLE.

E. 22d May 1623. See I. G. No. 2562, March 11, 1641. George Pringill was his son and heir. From the minute of his admission, which is very curious, this gentleman appears to have been "prenteiss" to David Pringle, to have travelled in France and Flanders, distinguished himself, and held high appointments. Ch. 1626, second time 1635-6, third time 1639.

42. THOMAS LOWSONE.

E. 18th May 1624. Son of No. 11.

43. Andro Broun.

E. 4th January 1626. Son of James Broun (No. 35), son-in-law of John Ker (No. 29). See No. 76.

44. JAMES RIG.

E. 16th September 1626. Son of No. 21. See I. G. No. 3523, April 5, 1649. His heir was Robert Rig, his younger brother. Ch. 1633-4, second time 1641. Died before 26th December 1656. See No. 77.

45. James Broun.

E. 11th April 1626. Married Marie, daughter of John Davidsoun (No. 33). Brother of Andrew Broun (No. 69). See No. 83.

46. JOHNE SPANG.

E. 1st December 1626. He married Katharine, daughter of the unfortunate Robert Awchmwtie (No. 22). Ch. 1632. Died 1639.

47. DAVID PRINGILL.

E. 1st May 1628. Minute of admission shews that he was eldest son of David Pringle senior (No. 28). The minute of admission of his son, David Pringle (No. 82), shews he was dead by 6th April 1660.

48. MICHAEL ANDRO.

E. 10th July 1633. Surgeon to the King; "prenteiss to umqhl. James Kinloch" (No. 26).

49. Thomas Caldwall.

E. 12th July 1633.

50. James Suricht.

E. 12th July 1633.

51. ROBERT HENRYSONE.

E. 1st April 1634. "Son lawfull to umqle. James Henrysone, chirurgeon" (No. 18).

52. JOHNE SCOT.

E. 13th August 1639. See I. G. No. 3380, December 15, 1647, in which his son, bearing the same name, is declared to be his heir. Ch. 1642-3. Died before September 1649. See No. 70.

53. Duncan Primroiss.

E. 16th August 1639. He is called "surgeon to the King his Majestie," also "apprentice to umqle. Gilbert Primroiss." See No. 1.

54. George Mitchelsone.

E. 23d August 1639.

55. Alexander Pennycuik.

E. 21st November 1640. Ch. 1644-5. Son of Pennycuik of

Pennycuik. Father-in-law of No. 97—I. G., 493, 494, 495, 496; father of Dr Pennycuik, the poet and naturalist. Sold Pennycuik and bought Newhall, in Midlothian, the scene of the "Gentle Shepherd." Born 1605; died before 3d October 1695. Surgeon to General Banner in the Thirty Years' War, and to Alexander Leslie, afterwards Earl of Leven, in the Civil War of Charles I. Rff.—S. R.; Life of Dr Pennycuik; E. H.

56. Andro Walker.

E. 1st December 1640. Son-in-law of No. 39.

57. James Ker.

E. 4th November 1641. By minute of admission he appears to be admitted in right of umqle. John Ker, his father (No. 29).

58. THOMAS CARTER.

E. 5th November 1641. In minute of admission he is described as having been apprentice to umqle. John Davesone (No. 33). Carter must have been dead before 17th December 1686. See minute of that date. Ch. 1667-8.

During Mr Carter's tenure of the chair (1669), arrangements were made for the construction of the first meeting-house of the Surgeons on the ground acquired in 1656. See No. 63. H. S., p. 36.

59. DAVID KENNEDY.

E. 18th January 1643. Father of No. 74. Father-in-law of No. 66. Ch. 1651.

60. JOHNE MURRAY.

E. 27th March 1643. Described in the act of admission as having been apprentice to umqle. David Pringill (No. 28). Father-in-law of No. 68. Died before May 1649. See No. 68.

61. JOHN CRANSTOUN.

E. 20th March 1645. Described in the act of admission as having been apprentice to umqle. John Davidsone (No. 33).

62. James Borthick.

E. 20th March 1645. Ch. 1648-9-50, and 1659-60. Born 1615; died 1675. Son of Borthwick of Crookston and of Marion Maisterton, his wife; proprietor of estate of Stow; M.P. for Edinburgh 1661. His portrait—the oldest painting of the College, and much damaged—is in the Hall. Father of No. 95. Father-in-law of No. 88. Rff.—H. S.; Acts of Scots Parliament, 1661-2.

63. THOMAS KINCAID.

E. 7th December 1646. He married Mary Young—B. E. Ch. 1655-6. Some informality in his admission is thus explained by an allusion to the Civil War—"The paucitie of their number, throw the decease of certane masters in the common visitation." Rff.—Selecta Poemata, Edinburgi, 1727, pp. 38 and 42.

During Mr Kincaid's tenure of the chair the surgeons acquired Curriehill House and grounds, on the site of which they erected two successive houses (in 1669 and 1697), for their meetings. Curriehill House, though not named, is delineated in Gordon of Rothiemay's plan of Edinburgh (1647), on the site of the old Surgeons' Hall, of which the remains are now a part of the fever hospital. The ground, which belonged to the Black Friars, was secularised, and passed successively into the hands of Sir John and Sir James Skene, judges of the Court of Session, both under the title of Lord Curriehill. It then became the property of Samuel Johnstoun of Scheynis; and after him of the Patrons of the University, who made it the house of their Professor of Divinity, and who sold it to the Surgeons for 3000 merks Scots. T. C. R. 21st May 1656; S. R. 23d June 1656.

64. ALEXANDER WILSOUNE.

E. 27th October 1647. See I. G. No. 3540, July 12, 1649, shewing that his son James became his heir at that date. Act of admission shews that he was an apprentice of umqle. David Pringle (No. 28).

65. HECTOR M'LEY.

E. 27th October 1647. Had been also an apprentice to umqle. David Pringle (No. 28).

66. James Cleiland.

E. 25th November 1647. Married Isobel, daughter of David Kennedy (No. 59). Father of No. 94. Ch. 1657-8.

67. WALTER TRUMBILL.

E. 5th February 1649. See T. C. R. 27th August 1662, shewing that he was a "deaken of the kirk." He was apprentice to David Douglas (No. 34), who was probably living, as he is not called "umqle." Father of Nos. 93 and 96. Ch. 1663-4.

68. JOHN BISSET.

E. 8th May 1649. Married Catherine, daughter of "umqle. Johne Murray" (No. 60).

69. Andro Broun.

E. 21st September 1649. "Apprentice to umqle. James Broun, his brother" (No. 45). See No. 76.

70. WILLIAM BURNET.

E. 21st September 1649. "Apprentice to umqle. Johne Scot" (No. 52). Ch. 1652-3; second time 1661-2.

71. ARTHUR TEMPELL.

E. 18th June 1650. See H. S. p. 10, Note 1. Member of the Scotch Parliament, as Commissioner for Edinburgh, in 1669. See also Thomson's Scotch Acts, vol. viii. p. 198, for an Act confirming to him and to "Jonet Davidsone, his spous," a charter, dated 10th July 1671, of the lands of Ravelrig, with manor-place, house, &c., "within the barronie of Ballerno," also of the lands of Pilmuir, with house, &c., "within the barronie of Niddrie-Marshaill, parish of Currie, formerly pertaining to Sir John Wauchope, Knt." See also Chambers' Domestic Annals of Scotland for an unusual operation performed by Temple on 14th May 1671. Jonet Davidsone was daughter "of umqle Johne Davidsone" (No. 33). Her family was not of the same blood with that of the late John Henry Davidson, Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians, who became possessors of the estate of Ravelrig at a later date. Ch. 1665-6 and 1669-70.

72. James Hopkirk.

E. 11th January 1653. See I. G. No. 998, April 8, 1648. Hopkirk's wife, "Joneta Newlandis," is set down as "hæres portionaria Willielmi Newlandis," the subject being a tenement in Edinburgh. James Hopkirk was apprentice to umqle. David Pringle (No. 28). See also I. G. No. 5831, in which it appears that he was served "hæres Helenæ Hopkirk filiæ," August 26, 1675.

73. WILLIAM TEMPLE.

E. 13th February 1653. Married Margaret, daughter of umqle. David Pringle (No. 28). See I. G. Edinburgh, No. 1302, September 1, 1686, in which certain lands belonging to him "in burgo vice canonicorum et baroniæ de Brughton" were transferred to James Watson of Saughton.

74. ROBERT KENNEDY.

E. 16th May 1653. Son of David Kennedy (No. 59). Father-in-law of No. 98.

75. ADAM DARLING.

E. 4th January 1656. He married Anna, daughter of umqule. John Kerr (No. 29).

76. Peter Nover.

E. 27th May 1656. He married "Kathrine, daughter of umqule. Andrew Brown," No. 43, or, possibly, No. 69.

77. George Scot.

E. 26th December 1656. Father of No. 100. See I. G. No. 5319, which shews that he was "hæres Roberti Scot de Woll, patris." See Minutes, No. 100, also of 7th November 1684, which shew that he was then dead. He was apprentice to umqle. James Rig, No. 44.

78. Christopher Irving.

E. 28th December 1658. See Catalogue of Graduates of Edinburgh, 15th April 1645, shewing that he then took the degree of A.M. In E. H. (p. 21-22) will be found a good deal of information about him. See also T. C. R. 16th March 1660, shewing that he was employed by the Council to "translate from Latine" into the Scotch language the Bohemian Covenant, for the use of "the Colledge of Edinburgh." See E. H. p. 17, Note. The Irvings of Castle Irving, in Ireland, were his descendants—See E. H. p. 22, Note; and a family of the same name are still in possession of that estate in the county of Fermanagh. His own estate of Bonschaw appears to have been for some time in possession of a family of the name of Irving. See Pitcairn's Trials, vol. iii., 576, date 1624. He must have died before March 1703. See No. 137. He dedicated one of his publications to General Monk and another to Sir Robert Sibbald, and was made first physician to James VII. of Scotland. Sir Walter Scott, by a venial error, has introduced him into "The Fortunes of Nigel" as contemporary with James I. of Great Britain.

Christopher Irving was the first who entered after the crisis described in H. S. as having occurred in 1657. He was accordingly admitted "ane frie chirurgane," &c., and the words "and barber," which occur in all previous minutes of admission, are not added, either in his case or any later one.

79. JOHN FORREST.

E. 22d July 1659.

80. Samuel Cheislie.

E. 14th October 1659. It appears from minute 1st July 1697 that this gentleman was then "deceast." Ch. 1671-2.

81. JOHN FAIRFOULL.

E. 7th February 1660.

82. DAVID PRINGLE.

E. 6th April 1660. Act of admission shews that he was admitted in right of his umqle. father, David Pringle (No. 47). Ch. 1684.

83. ADAM GAIRNER.

E. 29th August 1661. Act of admission (which is curious as to the relations of the Surgeons with the Barbers) shews him to have been son-in-law of umqle. James Broun (No. 45).

84. JAMES NISBET.

E. 22d April 1662. A.M., and therefore designated "Mr" in the Surgeons' Minutes. See Catalogue of Edinburgh Graduates, 20th July 1638, for an A.M. of his name. He was also M.D. In the Surgeons' Minutes of 12th November 1689, and afterwards, he is always designated Doctor. Ch. 1679-80.

85. George Stirling.

E. 26th June 1662. See H. S. p. 10, Note; was Member of the Scotch Parliament, as Commissioner for Edinburgh, in 1689. He must have died some time prior to 11th June 1700. See the Surgeons' Minutes of that date. See the minute of 14th January 1694, when he appears to have left off all business on account of bad health. See I. G. No. 8097, May 2, 1699, where he is described as "hæres Georgii Stirling, apothecarii burgensis de Edinburgh, patris." Ch. 1677-8 and 1689-90.

86. JOHNE JOYSSIE.

E. 25th December 1662. See I. G. No. 7222, February 15, 1692. "Joannes Joussie" is described as "hæres Joannis Joussie, pharmacopæi, burgensis de Edinburgh, patris." Father of No. 134. Ch. 1673-4.

87. HEW BROUN.

E. 27th April 1665. This gentleman was of a Jacobite race. His son James was examined before Parliament in 1695, in the case of the Earl of Melfort, one of the Jacobite exiles. Before giving evidence James Broun craved "remission for his being and corresponding in France" after the 1st August 1693, contrary to an Act of the current Parliament. He and his son James also got into some trouble with the local authorities by attending, on 17th February 1695 (Sunday), a meeting for Roman Catholic worship. See Chambers' Domestic Annals, vol. iii. p. 108, also No. 109 and No. 130.

88. WILLIAM BORTHWICK.

E. 15th November 1665. See H. S. Appendix, A. Was ap-

prentice, and afterwards son-in-law, to James Borthwick. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall. He married Marionn, eldest daughter of James Borthwick, 13th January 1666. He was eldest son of Alexander Borthwick in Gilchristoun, in East Lothian. From I. G. No. 8041 we find that his son Henry was served heir to him on 3d December 1698. Ch. 1675-6, second time 1681-2.

89. James Ogilvie.

E. 24th September 1667.

90. JOHN CARMICHAEL.

E. 9th February 1671.

91. THOMAS HENRYSON.

E. 2d August 1672. See I. G. No. 7667, February 14, 1696. From thence it appears that "Beatrix Spence, sponsa Jacobi Hepburne, et Rachel Spence, sponsa Thomæ Hendersone, pharmacopolæ, burgensis de Edinburgh," were "hæredes portionariæ magistri Thomæ Spence, Doctoris Medicinæ, fratris."

92. Thomas Chisholm.

E. 12th March 1674.

93. DAVID TURNBULL.

E. 21st April 1675. Eldest lawful son of Walter Turnbull (No. 67). See minute of his admission. Brother of No. 96. Ch. 1683.

94. DAVID CLELAND.

E. 8th December 1675. Eldest lawful son of James Cleland (No. 66).

95. Francis Borthwick.

E. 28th December 1675. From minute of admission it appears that he was son of James Borthwick of Stow (No. 62). He was dead by 8th May 1702. See minute of that date.

96. James Turnbull.

E. 7th December 1676. Lawful son of Walter Turnbull (No. 67). Brother of No. 93.

97. THOMAS EDGAR.

E. 21st March 1677. From minute of admission it appears that he was "maryed to Margaret Pennicuik, lawfull daughter to Alexander Pennicuik of Newhall" (No. 55). His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall. On 16th May 1699 will be found a minute

of a present of books by him to the library of the Surgeons. Father-in-law of R. Swinton (No. 127). He must have died prior to 17th August 1703. See minute of that date, and also a previous minute of 2d April 1703, in which on his deathbed he made a bequest of 300 merks to the Surgeons. Ch. 1685-6.

98. JOHN RAINOLDS.

E. 6th August 1678. "Maried to Janet, daughter of Robert Kennedie" (No. 74). See minute of admission. See below, No. 139. He was alive 14th January 1696. See minute of admission of that date, in which "umqle." is omitted. Ch. 1691.

99. James Crawford.

E. 24th September 1678. I. Linlithgowshire, No. 279, 16th August 1695. James Crawford, the son of this gentleman, was constituted his heir "in annuo reditu 124^L correspondente 2067^L 13^L 10^L de terris et molendino de Breistmilne cum 7½ acris in lie brae cum ustrinis, &c., infra parochiam de Kirklistoune." See No. 120, which shews that he was dead by August 1695. Ch. 1692.

100. THOMAS SCOT.

E. 1st October 1680. Eldest son of George Scot (No. 77).

101. James Brown.E. 15th July 1681.

102. JOHN BAILLIE.

E. 9th September 1681. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1687-8.

103. John Lawder. E. 23d February 1683.

104. James Muirhead. E. 14th August 1683.

105. Walter Porterfield.E. 7th November 1684. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

106. THOMAS GIBSON.E. 17th December 1686. Father of No. 214.

107. HUGH SOMERVILL.

E. 19th August 1687. He became bankrupt, and went to

Holland, two months after his admission. From the minute of admission of Robert Elliot (No. 124) it appears that Elliot had been his apprentice. He died between 8th December 1691 and 7th March 1693—(See minutes at these dates). After his return from Holland Somervill was reponed at the former of those dates.

108. Hugh Paterson.

E. 24th July 1688. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

109. Robert Clerk.

E. 6th September 1689. Was apprentice to Hew Broun (No. 87), and married his daughter Margaret. See minute of entry. See also H. S. p. 16, for his family history. Father of Dr John Clerk, Fellow of the College of Physicians. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall, and his son's at the Hall of the Physicians. He was elected in 1701 to the Chair, but refused it.

110. JOHN HAY.

E. 9th November 1689. This gentleman, who is always designated "Mr" in the minutes, was therefore a Master of Arts. There are in the Catalogue of Graduates of Edinburgh University no less than four M.A.'s of his name prior to the date of his admission.

111. GIDEON ELEOT.

E. 26th December 1689. Ch. 1693-4, also 1699-1700. From Chambers' Domestic Annals, vol. iii. p. 117, we learn that Sir Thomas Burnet and Gideon Elliot were employed in 1695 (April 3) by the Council of King William to visit the Earl of Home, a prisoner at his own house, The Hirsel, near Coldstream, fifty miles off, and report whether the state of his health was incompatible with his removal to the Castle of Edinburgh, he being deemed a dangerous person. For this journey Sir Thomas, as King's Physician, received 200 merks, equal to £11, 2s. 2\frac{2}{3}d. sterling, and Gideon Elliot, 100 merks, equal to £5, 11s. 1\frac{1}{3}d. sterling. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

112. JOHN KING.

E. 20th February 1690. Must have died before 22d June 1704. See minute of that date. Had been apprentice to Thomas Edgar.

113. James Auchinleck.

E. 23d October 1691. See I. G. Nos. 6760, 6761, and 6762, October 7, 1686. "Hæres Willielmi Auchinleck, scribæ in Perth, patrui;" also of Ann and Grisel, daughters of the said uncle. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

114. ALEXANDER MONTEATH.

E. 22d December 1691. A distinguished early teacher of Anatomy and Chemistry. Son of James Monteath of Auldcathie, the representative of the second (or Stuart) line of Earls of Monteath. See H. S. pp. 16, 20; E. H. p. 23. After serving his apprenticeship to William Borthwick he went abroad several years, for improvement in his profession. He presented a number of books to the Surgeons, 2d June 1696. He acted as President in 1701, in consequence of Robert Clerk's refusal of the chair. Ch. 1695-6, second time 1699, but was deposed, probably because he was a Jacobite. Was owner of the estate of Todshaugh, now Foxhall, in Linlithgowshire. E. H. p. 23. From a Collection of Epitaphs, Glasgow, 1834, p. 76, and B. E. p. 262, it appears that he died 23d December 1713, nearly about the same time as his friend Pitcairn.

In the time of Mr Dunlop's occupying the chair, the second Hall was opened in Surgeons' Square (December 17, 1697), with a theatre for instructions in Anatomy which was the germ of the Edinburgh Medical School. H. S. p. 17.

121. JAMES HAMILTON.

E. 3d October 1695. Father of No. 221. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1702-3.

122. George Kirkton.

E. 14th January 1696. See "Pitcairnii et aliorum poemata

selecta, Edinburgi, 1727," pp. 31 and 34, from which it appears that he died before No. 114. He was one of Pitcairn's friends.

123. JOHN CHEYN.

E. 14th May 1696. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. Practised in Leith; was succeeded by his nephew, No. 235. Was son of George Cheyne, town-clerk of Leith. His mother's name was Tennant.

124. ROBERT ELLIOT.

E. 27th August 1696. See H. S. pp. 17, 18, with note p. 18; also Appendix, pp. 32, 33, and 34. He was the earliest Professor of Anatomy (1705) to the incorporation of Surgeons and to University. No. 114, who taught anatomy before him, held no appointment either from the Surgeons or from the Patrons of the University.

125. ALEXANDER EDGAR.

E. 1st July 1697. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall.

126. George Dundas.

E. 16th May 1699. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall.

127. ROBERT SWINTON.

E. 28th December 1699. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. He married Anna, daughter of Thomas Edgar.

128. HENRY HAMILTON.

E. 11th June 1700. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1704-5, second time 1710-11.

129. ALEXANDER NISBET.

E. 4th July 1700. Always designated in the Minutes "Mr," and therefore had received the grade of A.M.,—in all probability from our own University, in whose "Catalogue of Graduates" (August 1683, July 1691, and April 1700) three M.A.'s of his name are entered. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1708-9, also 1740-1.

130. ROBERT CAMPBELL.

E. 25th March 1701. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. In his minute of entry he is designated "chirurgeon to His Majesty's Regiment of Guards." From same source it appears he married Katharine, daughter of Hew Broun (No. 87).

131. Andrew Murray. E. 18th April 1701.

132. JOHN MIRRIE.

E. 4th September 1701. Portrait at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1706-7.

133. ARCHIBALD PITCAIRN.

E. 16th October 1701. H. S. pp. 13, 14, 15, with Notes. Born 1652; died 1713. He was son of a proprietor in Fife, and was born in the parish of Leslie, in which a small property, once belonging to him, still bears his name. His mother was a Sydserff of Ruchlaw, in East Lothian. He was A.M. of Edinburgh (1671), studied law at Edinburgh, and afterwards physic at Paris, became M.D. of Rheims, 13th August 1680, and of Aberdeen, 7th August 1699. He married Margaret, daughter of Colonel James Hay, by whom he had a son and a daughter. The son died, and the daughter, whose name was Anna, was constituted heir to her mother on 8th February 1694 (I. G. No. 7439). The mother died before he went to Leyden. After his return from thence he married, as his second wife, Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Archibald Stevenson, Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians. By her he had one son and four daughters. The son was in the Rebellion of 1715, and owed his pardon and release from the Tower to the interposition, with Walpole, of Dr Richard Mead, a man of quite opposite politics, but a grateful pupil of his father's at Leyden. This son was afterwards in the Dutch service. The second daughter, Janet, became Countess of Kellie, 12th October 1731. Her husband was the fifth Earl, and the sixth and seventh were her sons. She died in 1775. Pitcairn's family have all died out. trait, by Sir John de Medina, is at the Surgeons' Hall.

134. JOHN JOSSY.

E. 3d February 1702. Son of No. 86. See minute of his admission. He was six years abroad for professional information. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

135. THOMAS INGLIS. E. 8th May 1702.

136. WALTER POTTER.
E. 10th December 1702.

137. JOHN MONRO.

E. 11th March 1703. See H. S. p. 13. His portrait is at Surgeons' Hall. It is by Aikman, his relative, whose portrait is

in the National Gallery. See his son's life by his grandson, the second Alexander Monro, 1781, in which it is said that John Monro died thirty years before his son, and three years after laying of the foundation of the Hospital, in which he took a warm interest. There must be some error in this, as the first A. Monro died 1767, and the foundation of the Hospital was laid 2d August 1738. John Monro married his cousin, Miss Forbes, niece of Duncan Forbes of Culloden. From the minute of his entry it appears that Christopher Irving (No. 78) was then dead. John Monro had been apprenticed to W. Borthwick, and transferred to Irving on account of some informality. Ch. 1712-13.

E. 22d June 1703. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

139. JOHN KNOX.

E. 16th September 1703. Minute of entry states that he was bred with John Raynolds (No. 98), and that he thereafter went abroad for his improvement. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1722-3.

E. 7th January 1704. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

141. George Borthwick.

E. 22d June 1704. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

142. HENRY HEPBURN.

E. 8th March 1705.

143. James Nisbet.

E. 5th July 1705. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall.

144. ADAM DRUMMOND.

E. 6th November 1707. Of this Professor of Anatomy to the Surgeons and to the University, and of his family, much will be found in H. S. pp. 17, 18, 19, and 34. From the autobiography of Dr Carlyle of Inveresk it appears that one of his apprentices, who was also his nephew, conveyed a large sum of money to his relative, Captain Adam Drummond of Megginch, then a prisoner in Queensberry House, Canongate, at the time of the battle of Prestonpans. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall, and there is another in possession of Dr Stuart of Chirnside, who, with others of the Dunearn family, is descended from his daughter. He was apprentice to No. 97. Ch. 1748-9.

145. JOHN LAUDER.

E. 1st July 1709. His portrait is at the Surgeons' Hall. Ch. 1714-15, 1718-19, 1730-1, and 1736.

His eldest son, Colonel Thomas, who died 1822, was in Gibraltar at the time of the siege, under General Elliot. His second son, Sir William Inglis, K.C.B., served in the Peninsular War. His third son was No. 280. Ch. 1772-3, also 1782-3, and 1790-1.

218. JOHN CAMPBELL.

E. 7th October 1743.

219. James Russell.

E. 29th January 1747. See No. 260. Son of No. 177. Father of No. 260. Professor of Natural Philosophy in Edinburgh University. He succeeded Adam Fergusson, who had become Professor of Moral Philosophy. Ch. 1752-3.

220. ROBERT WALKER.

M.D. E. 29th January 1747. See B. E. p. 233. Also see

below, Nos. 282 and 286. He was born 24th September 1718, and died 30th November 1791. Ch. 1754-5. Was some years in the Navy, and received a silver tea-set in acknowledgment of his services. Was author of "An inquiry into the Small-pox, medical and political," London, 1790.

221. James Hamilton.

E. 18th March 1747. Son of No. 121.

222. JAMES RAE.

E. 27th August 1747. Ch. 1764-5. His daughter, Elizabeth, married Dr W. Keir. She died 3d November 1834—B. E.

On the 27th August 1772 is a minute of the Surgeons, from which it appears that James Rae had then for several years given a course of Surgery, and also "practical discourses on cases of importance in the Royal Infirmary." These were supported by the Surgeons, and by them advertised. The course being continued, it appears that on 23d October 1776 it was attempted by the Surgeons to get a professorship of surgery established in the University in his person. A petition to the Crown to that effect will be found 1st May 1777. But this endeavour of the Surgeons to have surgery taught separately from other departments was defeated (see 21st May) by the influence of Dr A. Monro secundus. Dr Monro afterwards got his own chair of anatomy made also a chair of surgery, which it had not before been.

223. ADAM AUSTIN.

M.D. E. 14th September 1749. He married the Honourable Ann Sempill, daughter of Hugh Lord Sempill. See B. E. p. 28. His daughter, Miss Sempill Austin, died 4th March 1864, aged above 100—("Scotsman," 7th March 1864). F.R.C.P. Edinburgh, 1762. His portrait is at the Physicians' Hall.

224. ALEXANDER BRUCE.

E. 14th September 1749. His name is found in the Edinburgh Almanac for 1798, but not in that for 1800.

He settled at Inveresk, and afterwards moved to Edinburgh—(See Autobiography of Dr Carlyle of Inveresk). He left a considerable family, of whom were Dr George (No. 272) and Sir Alexander Wood. Alexander Wood was son of Thomas Wood, farmer between Edinburgh and Stockbridge (brother of William Wood, No. 162). It follows that Nos. 244 and 239 were cousinsgerman. His brother Walter, merchant at Elsinore, in Denmark, was father of Dr James Wood, and grandfather of Rev. Walter Wood, Elie, and of Dr Alexander Wood, Fellow of Royal College of Physicians, Edinburgh. Ch. 1762-3. Died 1807-8—Almanac.

242. Alexander Hamilton.

M.D. E. 28th February 1764. Professor of Midwifery in the University. See No. 226. Father of No. 279. Ch. 1776-7.

During the period of Dr Hamilton's presidency a Charter of Geo. III. (14th March 1778) was obtained erecting the incorporation as the "Royal College of Surgeons of the City of Edinburgh." The members were at the same time called "Fellows."

243. Joseph Robertson.

M.D. E. 6th October 1768. Succeeded to the estate of Ardblair, situate between Perth and Blairgowrie, which came to him by the death of his wife's sister. He retired thither from business in Edinburgh, and was wealthy. His daughter married Oliphant of Gask. His partners were Andrew Wood (No. 244), and afterwards James Latta (No. 269). Died 1815-16—Almanac.

244. Andrew Wood.

E. 28th February 1769. Son of No. 162. Father of No. 312. His daughter married Thomas Spens, M.D., Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians, son of Dr Nathaniel Spens—(See Nos. 217 and 229). He died in 1821. Ch. 1774-5 and 1798-9.

245. Thomas M'Donnell.

E. 28th April 1769.

246. JOHN WILLIESON.

E. 28th April 1769. See minute 21st November 1769, from which it appears that he went abroad, and that his father's name was David Willieson.

247. THOMAS WILLIAMSON.

E. 23d June 1769. It appears that this gentleman must have assumed the surname of Bruce. The reasons are, 1st, That in the minutes he is often noted as absent up to 8th August 1775, and not after; 2d, That the name of Thomas Bruce occurs on 28th November 1775, and not before; 3d, That Thomas Bruce appears in the same position as Williamson as to seniority; 4th, That there is only one other Thomas with whom he could be confounded, viz. Thomas M'Donnell (No. 245); 5th, That no such name as Thomas Bruce is to be found among the list of entrants. Thomas Bruce disappears from the Edinburgh Almanac list after 1806, not being found 1807.

248. John Cheyne.

E. 30th May 1770. Nephew of No. 235. Father of No. 295, also of Mr Bayne Cheyne, who was of opinion that the author of "The English Malady" was of kin to his family, but could not trace the connection. He died about 1822—Almanac.

250. Thomas Anderson. M.D. E. 30th May 1770. Died 1813-14—Almanac.

252. BENJAMIN BELL.

E. 5th April 1771. The well-known author of a System of Surgery. His family is not of the same blood with that of John and Charles Bell (Nos. 277 and 297). He was married to a sister of Dr James Hamilton (senior of that name in the Royal College of Physicians), whose portrait is at Heriot's Hospital. Father of Nos. 293 and 315. Died in 1806, æt. 57.

254. COLIN LAUDER.

M.D. E. 31st August 1772. Died 1831-2—Ascertained from annual Printed Lists of Fellows, commenced in 1818.

258. WILLIAM ANDERSON.M.D. E. 30th December 1773.

259. THOMAS WOOD.

E. 9th December 1775. Son of Thomas Wood, farmer on the north side of Edinburgh, Stockbridge road. Brother of No. 239 ("Lang Sandy"). Cousin-german to No. 244. He died prior to Christmas 1817. Ch. 1792-3.

260. James Russell.

E. 11th July 1777. Son of No. 219; father of No. 362. The first Professor of Clinical Surgery in the University of Edinburgh. Appointed 1806; resigned 1834, when No. 363 succeeded. Ch. 1796-7. Died 1836-7—Printed Lists.

261. JOHN SHIELS.

E. 11th July 1777. His name is in the Edinburgh Almanac for 1798, but not for 1800.

262. WILLIAM RAE.E. 18th July 1777.

263. ANDREW WARDROP.

M.D. E. 28th November 1777. Surgeon to Royal Infirmary. Uncle to No. 309. Ch. 1788-9. Died 1823.

264. JOHN RAE.

E. 14th March 1781. Ch. 1804-5. Disappears from Almanac 1807-8.

265. James Arrot. E. 13th August 1781. Died 1818-19—Almanac.

266. ROBERT KERR.

E. 19th December 1781. Died 11th October 1813, æt. 54. See B. E. p. 17. Author of "General History of Voyages and Travels," 17 vols. Edinburgh, 1811 to 1816.

267. Thomas Hart.
 E. 3d February 1783.

268. James Law.

E. 3d February 1783. Father of No. 338. Ch. 1800-1, and 1812-13. Died 1830—Printed Lists.

269. James Latta.

E. 16th June 1783. Author of Practical System of Surgery, 1794. Name in Almanac List 1803, but not 1805.

270. JOHN BENNET.

E. 22d June 1784. Ch. 1802-3. Found in Almanac List 1805, but not 1806.

271. James M'Dowal. E. 13th October 1784.

272. George Wood.

M.D. E. 13th October 1784. Son of No. 239 (Alexander). Father of the late Lord Wood, one of the Judges of the Court of Session. He married (1788) Isabella, daughter of John Campbell of Newfield. He had a brother, Sir Alexander, who married the eldest daughter of Sir William Forbes of Pitsligo. George Wood married, as his second wife, Miss Burnet, daughter of Gilbert Innes of Stow. He died before 10th October 1833—Printed Lists.

273. JOHN LAMONT.

274. ROBERT LAWSON.

M.D. E. 8th August 1785. Died 1810-11—Almanac.

275. Alexander M'Dougall.

M.D. E. 24th April 1786. Died 6th April 1824.

M.D. London. E. 14th August 1786. Died 1839-40—Printed Lists.

277. JOHN BELL.

E. 14th August 1786. A distinguished surgeon. Author of several works on Anatomy and Surgery; lecturer on both of these. Brother (much older) of Sir Charles Bell (No. 297), and of George Joseph Bell, the eminent Professor of Scots Law. They were sons of the Rev. William Bell, of the Scottish Episcopal Church, and not related to No. 252 and his descendants. Uncle to No. 384. Died 15th April 1820, at Rome.

278. WILLIAM FARQUHARSON.

M.D. E. 2d February 1788. Father of No. 375. Ch. 1806-7. Died 1823-4—Almanac.

279. James Hamilton.

M.D. E. 23d June 1788. Professor of Midwifery in University of Edinburgh; son, and successor in that chair, of No. 242; appointed 26th March 1800. F.R.C.P. (1792). Died 1839-40—Printed Lists. Not to be confounded with the brother-in-law of No. 252.

280. Andrew Inglis.

M.D. E. 10th August 1789. Son of No. 217. Father of Nos. 334 and 370. Ch. 1808-9. Married his cousin Janet, daughter of Thomas Spens, Esq. younger of Lathallan, Fifeshire. Ch. 1808-9. Died 1834—Printed Lists.

281. HENRY JOHNSTON.

E. 17th January 1791. Father of Nos. 368 and 428. Died 1844-5—Printed Lists.

282. JOHN WALKER.

E. 15th September 1791. See B. E. p. 233. Born 28th November 1766. Died 26th December 1841. He was son of Robert Walker (No. 220).

283. WILLIAM RITCHIE.

E. 15th September 1791. Died 1811-12-Almanac.

284. JAMES CLARK.

E. 20th February 1792.

285. Walter Harkness.
M.D. E. 11th June 1792. Died 1811-12—Almanac.

286. WILLIAM BROWN.

M.D. E. 12th August 1793. Was surgeon to the Royal Infirmary in some of the early years of the nineteenth century. Was some years in the navy; then in the Russian service as physician in the government of Kolyvan, Siberia. Author of "Hints on the Establishment of an Universal Written Character," 1797; also of "Observations on the Duration and Course of Fever in Britain, &c." 1802; also of "An Attempt to Estimate the Power of Medicine in Controlling Fever," 1818. See B. E. p. 233. Born 14th November 1757. Died 28th November 1818. Married to a daughter of Robert Walker (No. 220). Was treasurer to the College. Father of No. 335.

287. John Thomson.

M.D. E. 12th August 1793. Professor of Surgery to the College of Surgeons (1805); of Military Surgery in the University (1806); and of General Pathology there (1831). Author of a great number of professional works—on inflammation, small-pox, syphilis, &c. Father of Nos. 372 and 396. Died 11th October 1846, et. 72.

288. CHARLES ANDERSON.

M.D. E. 22d November 1793. He practised in Leith, and was the father of Dr Thomas Anderson, Professor of Chemistry in Glasgow. Died 3d February 1855, æt. 80.

289. James Anderson, Senior.

M.D. E. 1st December 1795. Died 1811-12—Almanac.

290. James Bryce.

E. 11th November 1796. Father of No. 378. Author of a work on the cow-pox. Ch. 1816-17. Died 1826-7—Almanac.

291. James Anderson, Junior.

E. 14th November 1797. Died 1826-7—Almanac.

292. JOHN HERDMAN.

M.D. Northumberland. E. 26th December 1797. Became a clergyman of the English Church. Died 1841-2—Printed Lists.

293. GEORGE BELL.

E. 1st May 1798. Son of No. 252. In large practice as a

surgeon in Edinburgh. Father of No. 365. Surgeon to Royal Infirmary for many years. Died 1832, æt. 55. See No. 323.

294. SIR WILLIAM NEWBIGGING, Knight.

E. 19th March 1799. Stood high in his profession in Edinburgh. Was surgeon to Royal Infirmary. He and No. 255 married sisters. Had two sons, Fellows of the College, Nos. 402 and 407. Ch. 1814-15. Died 1853, et. 77.

295. John Cheyne, Junior.

M.D. E. 1st August 1799. Son of No. 248. Brother of Mr Bayne Cheyne. See Nos. 234 and 235. He settled in Dublin, where he had a very large practice as a consulting physician, and is favourably known to his profession by his medical works on epidemic fever, croup, &c. His removal from Leith to Dublin was about 1811. He was M.D. of Edinburgh 1795, Fellow of R. C. P., Edinburgh, 1810, F. K. and Q. C. P., Ireland, Professor of Practice of Physic at the School of Surgery, and Physician to Hardwick Hospital, Dublin. Died 1835-6. Rff.—Autobiography in his Essays on Mental Derangement.

296. JOHN ALLEN.

E. 1st August 1799. Lecturer on Surgery, Edinburgh, afterwards Secretary to Lord Holland, and Master of Dulwich College. Died 1842-3.

297. SIR CHARLES BELL, Knight.

E. 1st August 1799. The well known and distinguished writer on the nerves. Brother of No. 277. Professor of Surgery at Edinburgh (1836), and previously of Physiology at University College, London. Died 27th April 1842. Rff.—Knight's Dictionary, and Life by Lady Bell.

298. James Cassills. E. 21st October 1799. Died 1823-4—Almanac.

London. E. 20th May 1800. Died 1836-7--Printed Lists:

M.D. E. 6th April 1802. Died 1811-12—Almanac.

James Brown Johnston.M.D. Kirkcaldy. E. 4th May 1802. Died 1853, æt. 76.

302. Robert Robertson.
M.D. Lanarkshire. E. 18th May 1802. Afterwards took the

additional name Glasgow, on acquiring the property of Mount Greenan, near Irvine, Ayrshire. Said to have been the "Oswald" of "Corinne." Brother of Nos. 308 and 353. Died 1845, aged 68. He was of the family of Prendergast in Berwickshire.

303. George Kellie.

M.D., Leith. E. 18th May 1801. A learned and accomplished medical man. He had a very extensive practice in all departments of his profession. Died before Whitsunday 1830. His only daughter is the wife of George Kellie M'Callum of Braco, Perthshire. See No. 453.

304. PATRICK ERSKINE.

M.D. E. 18th May 1802. Died 1811-12-Almanac.

305. JOHN JACK GIBSON.

E. 4th January 1803. Died 1825-6—Almanac.

306. Thomas Lothian.

E. 1st August 1803. Treasurer of R.C.S. Died unmarried, 1842-3.

307. Alexander Gillespie.

M.D. E. 9th August 1803. Was surgeon to the Royal Infirmary, and father of No. 430. His father was a medical practitioner in Ayr, and afterwards practised in Edinburgh. His sister was the wife of No. 312. Ch. 1810-11 and 1818-19. James Donaldson, the founder of Donaldson's Hospital, married another of his sisters. Died 1st September 1859, et. 83.

308. WILLIAM ROBERTSON.

M.D. E. 16th August 1803. See No. 302. Died 1834-5— Printed Lists.

309. JAMES WARDROP.

M.D. E. 19th June 1804. Practised as a surgeon in Edinburgh, and afterwards in London, and was Surgeon to George IV. Much devoted to ophthalmic surgery, on which, and also on aneurism, and other professional subjects, he is a well known writer. Nephew to No. 263. Born 14th August 1782, and died at London 13th February 1869. He had much humour, and great eccentricity.

310. JOHN ABERCROMBIE.

M.D. E. 12th November 1804. The eminent consulting physician and medical author. Fellow of the Royal College of

Physicians (1823). His bust is in the Museum, and is a good likeness. Died 14th November 1844, et. 64—Knight's Dictionary.

311. ARTHUR EDMONSTOUN.

M.D. Lerwick. E. 5th March 1805. Author of a book on Zetland. Died 1840-1—Printed Lists.

312. WILLIAM WOOD.

E. 1st October 1805. Son of No. 244. Married sister of No. 307. Father of Nos. 393 and 450. See H. S. p. 25, for some account of his estimable character. See also under No. 307. Ch. 1822-3, and 1828-9. Died September 1858, æt. 75. Notice of motion given for placing in Hall suitable Memorial expressive of gratitude for his services to College.—Minutes, 15th December 1873.

313. JOHN HENRY WISHART.

E. 1st October 1805. Was much devoted to ophthalmic surgery. Translator of Scarpa's work on Aneurism. Ch. 1820-21. Died 1834—Printed Lists.

314. JOHN YOUNG.

E. 16th May 1808. Was successful in cultivating opium here. Died 1841-2—Printed Lists.

315. Joseph Bell.

E. 18th October 1808. Son of No. 252. Father of No. 403. Brother of No. 293. Born 25th November 1786. Died 1848.

316. John Gordon.

M.D. E. 18th October 1808. Lecturer on Anatomy and on Physiology, Edinburgh, on which subjects he has left works; universally regarded as a man of remarkable ability, but cut off prematurely. See his Life, by Daniel Ellis. Born 19th April 1786. Died 14th June 1818, of fever, after a short illness. He married the sister of Andrew Rutherfurd, advocate, afterwards a Judge of the Court of Session. His son, who was a member of the Scotch bar, became Sheriff of Midlothian.

317. ROBERT ALLAN.

E. 7th November 1809. Lecturer on Surgery at Edinburgh; conjointly, for some time, with John Lizars (No. 328). Born February 1777. Died December 1826. B. E. p. 256.

318. James Keith.

M.D. E. 13th September 1810. Brother of Sir A. Keith of Ravelston, near Edinburgh. Born 29th November 1783. Died 12th May 1863. 319. DAVID HAY.

M.D. E. 2d April 1811. Son of No. 257. Ch. 1824-5. Died 1843-4.

320. JOHN CAIRD.

E. 1st October 1811. Died 8th October 1861, æt. 81.

321. HINTON SPALDING.

M.D. E. 1st August 1812. West Indies. Died 2d June 1853, et. 67.

322. ROBERT WATSON.

E. 15th September 1812. Born 8th May 1789. Died 1st July 1862.

323. Adolphus M'Dowal Ross.

M.D. E. 29th September 1812. Partner of George Bell (No. 293), whose wife was his sister. He was the medical attendant of Sir Walter Scott. Died 20th October 1842, at 52. He married the youngest daughter of David Hume, Professor of Scots Law.

324. JOHN WILLIAM TURNER.

E. 6th October 1812. Professor of Surgery to Royal College of Surgeons 1821; and (1831) Professor of Surgery in the University of Edinburgh. Died 1835-6—Printed Lists.

Mr Turner was the first Professor who gave an adequate course of surgery in the University of Edinburgh. Previously to his time the course consisted of a few lectures on the operations of surgery, given, as an appendage to the course of anatomy, by a professor who was not a practitioner of surgery. 325. JOHN GAIRDNER.

M.D. E. 5th October 1813. Born 18th September 1790. Eldest son of Robert Gairdner of Mount Charles, in Ayrshire, Captain of Bengal Artillery. His portrait, painted by Mr Barclay, by order of the College, is in the Hall. See minute 2d August 1867. Ch. 1830-31. Treasurer 1853. Dr W. T. Gairdner, Professor of Medicine in Glasgow University, is his eldest son. The late Dr William Gairdner of London was his brother.

During Dr Gairdner's presidency the Hall in Nicolson Street was opened (1832).

326. JOHN FYFE.

E. 15th September 1814. Son of No. 342. Died 1817-18—Almanac.

327. WILLIAM BOWIE.

M.D. Bath. E. 17th January 1815. Son of John Bowie of Ayr, who was also of the medical profession, in the West Indies. Born 22d March 1793. Died 2d July 1864.

328. JOHN LIZARS.

E. 15th August 1814. Lecturer on Anatomy. Professor of Surgery to the College (1832). Performed some operations in ovariotomy, which he published. Author of "System of Surgery" and of "Anatomical Plates." Brother of No. 394. Died 21st May 1860, et. 66.

329. SIR JOHN M'NEILL, G.C.B.

M.D. E. 4th September 1815. British minister to the Court of Persia (1836 to 1844). Was apprenticed to John Bell (No. 277). Brother of Right Honourable Lord Colonsay. Born 12th August 1795. Married Lady Emma Campbell, only sister of the present Duke of Argyll.

330. ADAM HUNTER.

M.D. E. 5th December 1815. Was from Greenock. Father of No. 440. Related to No. 327. Ch. 1838-9. Surgeon to Royal Infirmary. Born 20th June 1791. Died 24th June 1870, at. 79.

331. DAVID MACLAGAN.

M.D. E. 16th July 1816. Of an Edinburgh family. He married Jane, daughter of Dr Philip Whiteside of Ayr. Went through the greater part of the Peninsular War. Was physician to the forces. Father of No. 398, of Dr Philip Maclagan of Berwick, and of Dr J. M. Maclagan of Hexham. See No. 369. Ch. 1826-7. Born 8th February 1785. Died 6th June 1865. An active and eloquent citizen, who made himself useful in many public positions in Edinburgh. He became a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (1848), and was elected President of that body (1856, 1857).

332. JOHN AITKEN.

M.D. E. 7th January 1817. Brother of No. 379. Both were lecturers on anatomy. Died 6th March 1860, æt. 64.

333. DANIEL SCHAW.

E. 15th April 1817. Died at sea before Whitsunday 1827.

334. THOMAS INGLIS.

M.D. Eastbourne. E. 2d September 1817. Born 31st March 1796. Son of No. 280. Brother of No. 370.

335. WILLIAM BROWN.

E. 11th September 1817. Born 31st May 1796. Son of No. 286. Ch. 1834-5.

336. Alexander Tweedie.

M.D. E. 17th October 1817. Born 29th August 1794. Went to London, where he practises as a physician, and is a considerable writer in his profession. He and Sir Robert Christison, Baronet, married sisters, whose name was Brown.

337. John Thatcher.

M.D. E. 16th December 1817. F.R.C.P. Edinburgh (1828). Practitioner and Lecturer in Midwifery. Father of Dr Lewis Hay Thatcher of Edinburgh. Died 30th November 1853, et. 68.

338. WILLIAM LAW.

E. 7th July 1818. Son of James Law (No. 268). Died 1842-3—Printed Lists.

339. John Alexander Schetky.

E. 7th July 1818. Born March 1785. Army Surgeon in the Peninsular War, 3d Dragoon Guards. Much devoted to art. An anatomical painting by him is in the Museum. Died 1824-5—Almanac.

340. Adam Macdougal.

M.D. E. 18th August 1818. Died 1826-7-Almanac.

341. ROBERT LISTON.

E. 29th September 1818. The distinguished Professor of Clinical Surgery, University College, London. Was previously a lecturer on Surgery in Edinburgh. Author of Elements of Surgery, Practical Surgery, &c. Born October 1794. Died December 1847. He was son of the Rev. Henry Liston of Ecclesmachen, and brother of David Liston, M.A., Professor of Hebrew in the University of Edinburgh.

342. Andrew Fyfe.

E. 23d October 1818. Demonstrator of Anatomy in the University of Edinburgh, and author of a book of anatomy. Father of Nos. 343 and 326. Died 1824-5—Almanac.

343. Andrew Fyfe.

M.D. E. 1st December 1818. Lecturer on Chemistry at

Edinburgh, afterwards (1844) Professor of Chemistry in King's College, Aberdeen. Son of No. 342. Father of No. 434. Ch. 1842-3. Born 18th January 1792. Died 31st December 1861.

344. DAVID CLARK.

M.D. E. 5th June 1819. Died 1843-4.

345. WILLIAM HOWISON.

M.D. E. 2d August 1819. Born 4th June 1793. Died 1872.

346. WILLIAM CAMPBELL.

M.D. E. 28th September 1819. Lecturer and Practitioner in Midwifery. Father of No. 419 and No. 533. Died 1848.

347. JOHN M'FARLAN.

E. 22d March 1820. Son of John M'Farlan of Campsie, advocate. Died 1852, et. 54.

348. ALEXANDER MACAULAY.

M.D. E. 4th April 1820. Author of a medical dictionary. Born 3d February 1783. Father of No. 556. Treasurer R.C.S. Edinburgh. Went to London, where he died 14th February 1868.

349. THOMAS HARDY.

E. 15th May 1820. Died 1835-6.

350. SIR GEORGE BALLINGALL, Knight.

E. 15th August 1820. Army surgeon. Was in the Duke of Kent's regiment. Some time in India, where he prepared and presented to his former teacher, the late Dr Barclay, the skeleton of an elephant, now in the Museum. Became Professor of Military Surgery in the University (1822). Ch. 1836-7. Died 4th December 1855, æt. 69.

351. ROBERT HAMILTON.

M.D. E. 11th November 1820. Born 4th September 1794. Died at Edinburgh 6th March 1868.

352. ALEXANDER WATSON WEMYSS.

E. 12th November 1821. Born 5th December 1799. Was at one time surgeon to the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary. He succeeded to the estate of Denbrae, in Fife, and, assuming the name of Wemyss, retired from practice.

353. JOHN ARGYLL ROBERTSON.

359. James Begbie.

M.D. E. 11th November 1822. Pupil of Dr Abercrombie, after whose death he acquired a large consulting practice in Edinburgh. Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (1847). Elected President of that body (1854, 1855). Father of Dr J. W. Begbie, F.R.C.P. Wrote many papers in the medical journals. Born 18th December 1799. Died 26th August 1869.

360. James Scarth Combe.

M.D. E. 3d June 1823. Born 5th January 1796. Ch. 1851-2. He practised at first in Leith, but has been for many years in Edinburgh. Father of No. 482. Father-in-law of No. 374.

361. DAVID ROSS CUNDELL.

E. 17th June 1823. Died before Whitsunday 1828.

362. James Russell.

M.D. E. 24th June 1823. Son of No. 260. Married a daughter of Colonel Burnet of Gadgirth, Ayrshire. Being independent, he gave up his profession. Born 9th September 1801. Died 21st November 1862.

363. JAMES SYME.

M.D. E. 24th June 1823. The distinguished Professor of Clinical Surgery in the University of Edinburgh, and Surgeon to the Royal Infirmary. Author of several works on Surgery. Born 7th November 1799. Ch. 1849-50. See No. 260. Died 26th June 1870.

During Professor Syme's presidency the College obtained a new charter, by which its local status as a civic incorporation was abrogated, and its national status confirmed under the title of "The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh."

364. Robert Nasmyth.

E. 4th July 1823. Pupil of Dr Barclay. The first in Edinburgh who united the profession of the dentist with the qualifications of the educated surgeon. Was very successful. Born 7th November 1791. Died 12th May 1870.

E. 4th July 1823. Son of No. 293. Born 1802. Died 1843.

366. JOHN CAMPBELL.

M.D. E. 4th July 1823. Son of Sir James Campbell, Baronet, of Aberuchill. His sister married Dr John Barclay, the celebrated anatomist. Was surgeon to Royal Infirmary. Born 17th July 1784. Ch. 1832-3. Died 9th February 1867. His family is of the same blood with the Campbells of Lawers (in the same part of Perthshire), so well known in the history of Scotland as Lords Loudon. 374. James Simson.

M.D. E. 22d July 1825. Son-in-law of No. 360. Born 25th August 1795. Ch. 1844-5, also 1873. Honorary Secretary of College from 1861 to 1873.

375. Francis Farquharson.

M.D. E. 3d January 1826. Born 2d August 1802. Son of No. 278. Succeeded to the estate of Finzean, in Aberdeenshire, and retired from practice.

376. MARTIN SINCLAIR.

M.D. Manchester. E. 18th April 1826. Was of an Edinburgh family, and brother to the late John Sinclair, City Clerk. Died 1852, et. 53.

377. ADAM MESSER

E. 15th May 1826. Died 7th July 1861, æt. 63.

378. Alexander Bryce.

M.D. East Indies. Son of No. 290. E. 2d October 1826. Died 1841-2—Printed Lists. Killed in the Kyber Pass.

379. Thomas Johnston Aitken.

M.D. Younger brother of No. 332. E. 21st November 1826. Teacher of Anatomy along with his brother. Died 1843-4—Printed Lists.

380. JOHN MURRAY.

E. 21st November 1826. Born 19th April 1798. Son of

John Murray, author of System of Chemistry, and Lecturer on Chemistry, Edinburgh. He was for many years in Melbourne. Died there 4th June 1873.

381. JOHN SCOTT.

M.D. E. 23d October 1827. Physician in Ordinary to the Queen. Had a considerable amount of consulting practice in Edinburgh. Paid much attention to auscultation and diagnosis. Connected with Selkirkshire. Died 3d May 1853, et. 49.

383. SAMUEL ALEXANDER PAGAN.
