

DESCRIPTION ACCOMPANYING PREPARATIONS.

The UTERUS had only its right half developed; its left half, left fallopian tube, left ovary, and left broad ligament being wanting.

The RIGHT KIDNEY had two ureters, the upper, which was imperforate, opening into a cyst with bony plates in its walls, and terminating in the usual position to the *left* side of the bladder; the *right* (lower) ureter running the usual course.

The kidney lay completely on the right side of the spinal column.

The LEFT KIDNEY was absent.

The LEFT SUPRA-RENAL CAPSULE was found at the position it usually occupies; the *right* one at the upper end of the double kidney.

The body otherwise, the pelvis, and the external genitals were normally developed.
