# The General Infirmary at Leeds.

---

## KING EDWARD VII. MEMORIAL FUND.

---

**I**N the year 1911, the citizens of Leeds selected the improvement and extension of the General Infirmary at Leeds as the most suitable object for a public commemoration of the reign of his late Majesty King Edward VII.

This work was much overdue as the claims upon the Institution had long outstripped its resources and the more modern developments of surgery and medicine had created requirements which necessarily had not been foreseen at the time the Infirmary was built.

The problem which had to be faced was a difficult one. The existing Infirmary, though built on an excellent plan, completely filled the site originally reserved for it, as well as an additional piece of land which had been subsequently obtained, whilst several large blocks of supplemental buildings had been erected on the opposite side of the various roads surrounding the original site. Further building on this congested area was much to be deprecated, but it seemed difficult to propose any satisfactory plan for extending the accommodation of the Hospital by creating more buildings which would be separated by public streets from the original Infirmary. So great did the difficulty appear that a gentleman of special experience in Hospital matters advised after a visit to Leeds that the Infirmary should be removed and rebuilt on a new and greatly extended site in one of the suburbs of the city.

This suggestion was however dismissed because

The present buildings are in most respects excellently planned for their purpose and only need some minor alterations to bring them completely up-to-date.

Their situation is healthy and also convenient, being near the centre of the City and within easy reach of the Railway Stations, the Medical School, and the University, and the residences and consulting rooms of the Physicians and Surgeons.

The existing buildings have cost upwards of £225,000, which would practically have all been wasted if the Infirmary had been removed, whilst a similar sum would have had to be spent on building a new Hospital of similar size on a different site, without counting anything for the extensions which are so much needed, or for the cost of the land.





It seemed possible by purchasing Land near to the existing buildings, and by obtaining the co-operation of the City Council, to obtain the site needed for the present extensions and for any further extensions which would be needed for many years to come, and at the same time to effect a great improvement in the City itself.

For these reasons the Infirmary Board limited their suggestions to alterations and additions to the existing Buildings, suggestions which they summarized as follows :

1. Modernising the existing Wards and their Sanitary Arrangements.
2. The erection of four new Operating Theatres.
3. The provision of additional accommodation for Nurses.
4. The erection of two additional Wards for Patients.
5. An addition to the Pathological Department.
6. Additional rooms for the use of the Casualty and Out-patient Departments.
7. The provision of new Boilers and Boiler House.
8. Making certain additional safeguards against fire.

They also asked the Citizens of Leeds to give them an additional sum to enable them to meet the increased annual expenditure which these extensions would involve.

The total sum asked for was £150,000, and towards this £109,000 has been promised, of which £90,000 has already been paid over by the subscribers.

Considerable progress has also been made towards meeting the requirements previously enumerated :

Eight of the thirteen existing large Wards have been modernized, the Ward block which was burned down immediately before the issue of the first appeal having been rebuilt on lines which have greatly improved its accommodation for Patients, and have also provided room for thirty additional beds, as well as rendered the Ward Block fireproof.

Considerable alterations have been effected in the roof of the old building, which it is believed will greatly reduce the risk of fire.

Accommodation for five additional Nurses has been provided.

An addition has been made to the Infirmary Site, which will enable the existing Buildings to be retained for their present purposes, and new Buildings to be erected on a most convenient plan to complete the original Scheme.

The first three of these requirements have been comparatively easy to attain as they did not involve the co-operation of any other body than the subscribers to the Infirmary, but the fourth has been surrounded with the gravest difficulties, and has only been rendered possible by the sympathy and assistance of the Leeds City Council.

A glance at the two Plans Nos. 1 and 2 will more fully explain these difficulties.

**Plan 1** shows the Hospital as it will exist when the additions and alterations which are now contemplated are completed, whilst the dotted lines show the spaces which will be left for further Ward extension as required.

The existing Infirmary site measures a little less than six acres, but it will be increased to over 10 acres when the new Land has been added.

It will be observed that the first plan shows that all the Streets or parts of Streets indicated within the red lines on the second plan are included in the new Infirmary grounds.

The new Buildings shown on this plan will include :

1. An entirely new Operating Department with five Theatres.
2. An extension of the Out-patient Department to accommodate the new Department for the treatment of the Nose, Throat, and Ear, an Orthopaedic Department, and new rooms for the Casualty Department.
3. An extension of the Ward accommodation of the Infirmary which will make room for 100 additional beds.
4. An extension of the Pathological Department.
5. An extension of the Nurses' Home, to make room for the additional nurses rendered necessary by the other alterations.
6. A new Boiler House and Laundry.

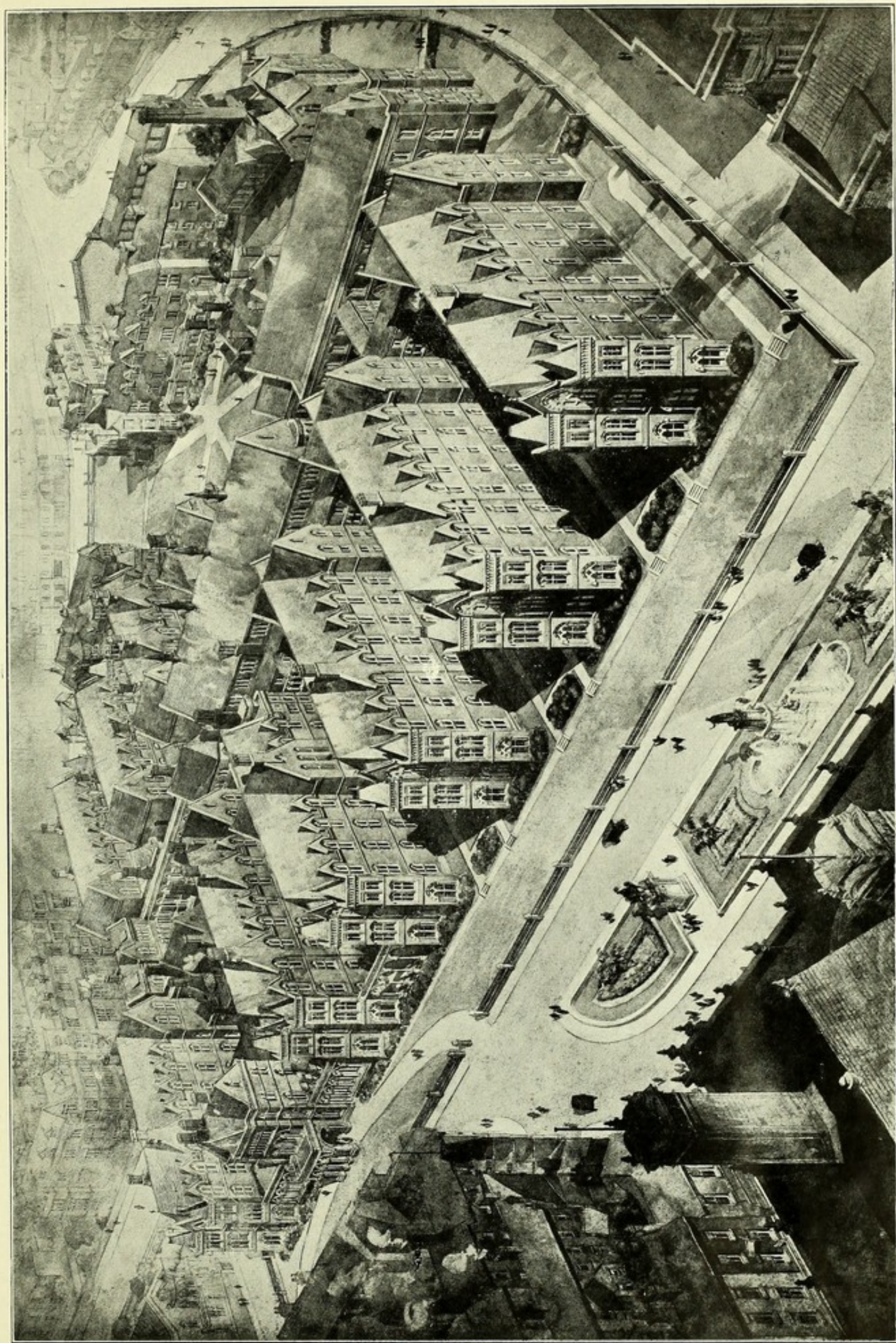
As has been shown above, all these alterations were contemplated when the original scheme of extension was drawn up, but it is perhaps advisable that they should be shortly referred to again.

**Plan 2** shows the existing Infirmary Buildings with the surrounding streets, whilst the dotted lines running from Calverley Street on the East of the Town Hall up to Fenton Street show the proposed alteration of Streets which is to enable the Infirmary to acquire and utilize as part of its Building site all the land which lies to the West of the New Street and to the North of Portland Street.









General Infirmary at Leeds when the Contemplated Extensions are Completed





At the time the present Infirmary was built, the population of the City of Leeds was less than half its number to-day, whilst improved railway and other communication, as well as a largely increased population outside the City limits, have enormously increased the number of sufferers who depend upon the services of the Infirmary.

Last year the Infirmary treated over 9,000 In-patients, and those who came in from outside the City were more in number than all the In-patients treated at the Infirmary in 1870.

Even this statement does not give any fair idea of the great increase in work which has really taken place.

In 1870 the number of operations upon In-patients was only 469 (198 of which were Eye operations), whilst in 1913 the total had risen to 4,365, and there were also 3,845 operations upon Out-patients under anaesthesia.

The increase in the importance of the operations has also been very remarkable. Science has made great strides since 1870, and the discoveries of Pasteur and Lister, coupled with the extended use of general and local anaesthesia, have made operations possible which were formerly not dreamed of, with the result that many diseases which were formerly considered incurable, or only treated by operation in the last resort, are now operated on with almost uniform success.

As an example we may mention :

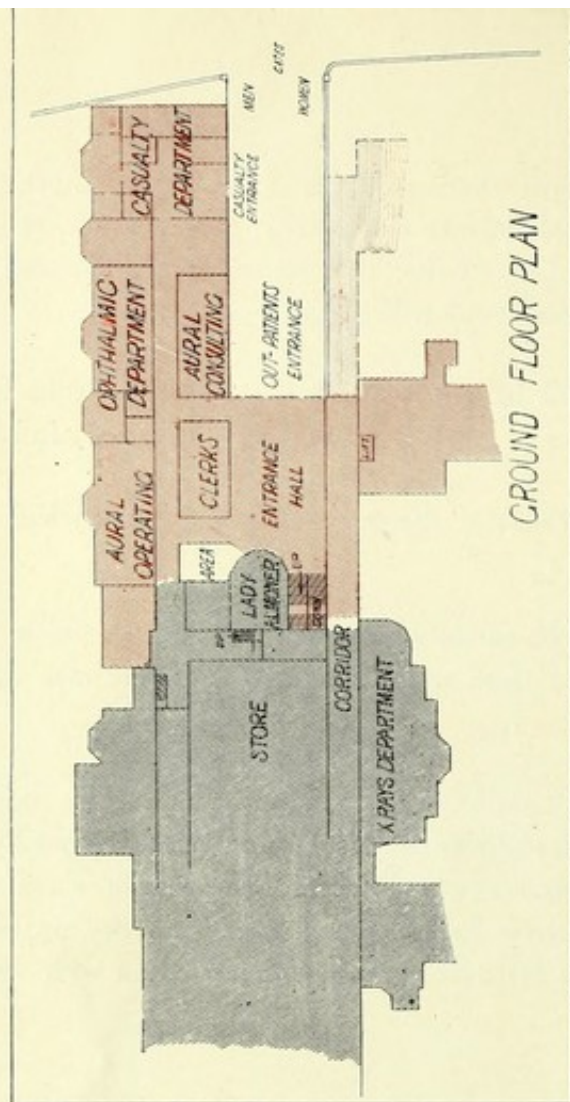
208	Operations on the stomach,
452	„ on the appendix,
40	„ on the kidney,
120	„ on the liver and bile passages,
136	„ for intestinal obstruction,

performed during 1912.

No one of these operations was performed in 1870. In addition to the opening of these and many other new fields of work, the older fields have been enlarged and the older operations are now performed in increased numbers and with better results. In 1870 operations for the cure of hernia (rupture) were performed 9 times; in 1912 these operations were carried out on 530 occasions. The total number of operations on bones and joints in 1870 was 40; in 1912 over 300. Many similar instances could be quoted.

It is worthy of note that the total number of amputations has decreased owing to the great advances made in conservative surgery. Limbs which in 1870 were condemned as useless are now saved. Thus in 1870 there were 64 amputations, whilst in 1912 there were only 59, although the general range of work had increased tenfold.

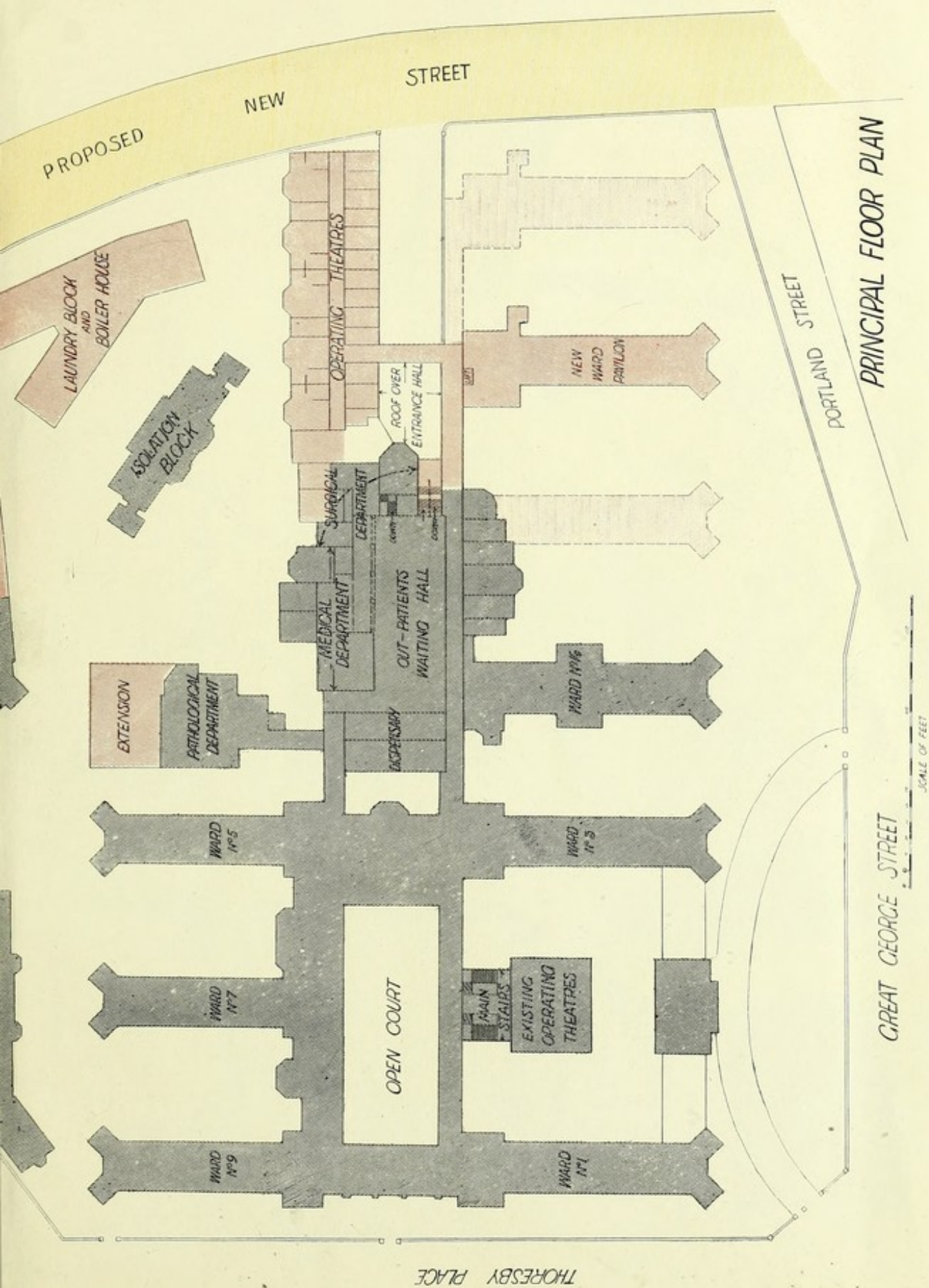

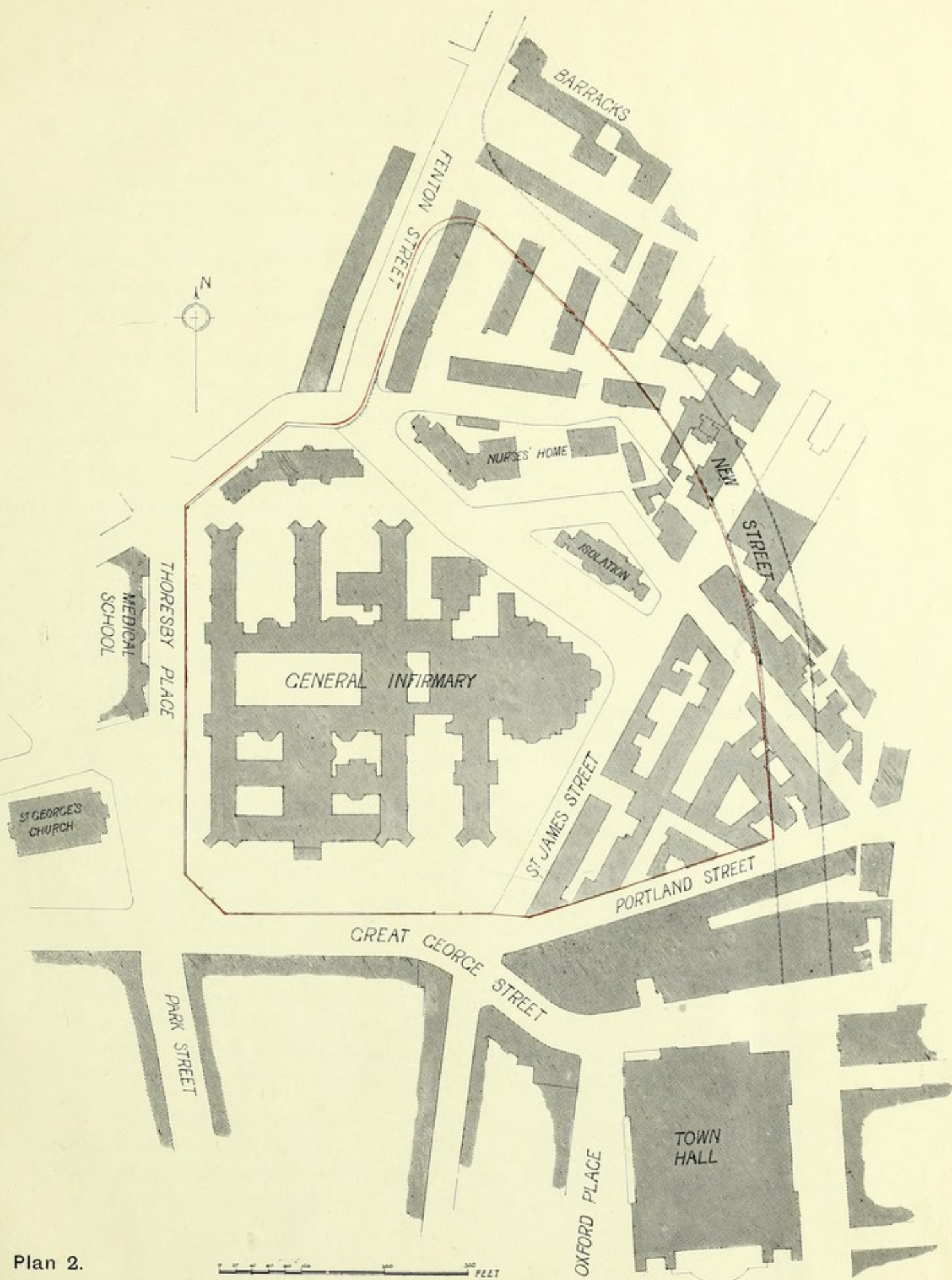




Plan 1











The foregoing statement has indicated the reason for the need for more Operating Theatres.

At present the work of the Infirmary is seriously hampered by the want of Theatres; Patients are often kept waiting for some days after operations have been decided on, which is expensive to the Infirmary and most unpleasant to the Patients. The existing theatres are used so constantly that it is impossible to have them properly cleaned and aired between operations, and, in addition, operations have often to be performed at night, which is inadvisable for both Patients and Officers.

When the Infirmary was built one Theatre was provided; in 1897 this was converted into two. It is now proposed to build a range of five, four of which will be utilized for General and Gynaecological Surgery, whilst the fifth will be utilised for Ophthalmic and Aural Surgery.

It may be observed that the Theatre accommodation at the Leeds Infirmary falls far short of that in other large modern Hospitals. In the Royal Infirmary at Manchester one Theatre is provided for 50 surgical beds. In the London Hospital one Theatre for 100 surgical beds. At the Newcastle Infirmary one Theatre for 59 surgical beds. At Leeds we have one Theatre for 135 surgical beds.

The new additions will, with our present surgical beds, which it is proposed materially to increase, only give us one Theatre for 54 beds.

For economic and efficient working, it is most advisable to have Theatres built near together and staffed by a common body of nurses. The two existing Theatres could not be utilized for such a scheme, they will, however, be retained, and used for emergencies.

The extension of the Out-patient Department in the manner indicated above is rendered necessary by the great advances which have been made in Surgical Methods.

**Out-patient  
Department.**

It has been found impossible for the Ophthalmic and Aural Departments to be adequately dealt with by men treating both classes of cases, and separate departments under specialists have already been established for the treatment of Ophthalmic cases and cases of diseases of the Ear, Throat, and Nose.

No rooms are at present available for the treatment of the latter class of case, and the Aural Surgeons have to share in the use of the Ophthalmic Rooms. The alterations now proposed will include a fully equipped department for Ear, Throat, and Nose cases, and will obviate the tedious delays inseparable from the present system.

The Orthopaedic Department is a new one in Leeds, although it is one which has met with great success in Liverpool and other Cities in England, as well as in France. It is believed that by its establishment the large number of crippled children, so unhappily found in Leeds and its neighbourhood, will be greatly reduced.





The extension of the Ward accommodation needs no recommendation to Leeds people. It is commonly known that the present Wards, designed as they were to serve a much smaller population, are now inadequate, and that a considerable increase is urgently needed. Until this requirement is met, the present overcrowding of the Wards, with its accompanying evils of delays in entry and premature discharges, must necessarily continue.

**New Wards.**

The proposed alterations in the Pathological Department, though not very ambitious in their character, are of extreme importance to the future progress of the Infirmary. The importance of Wards and Operating Rooms cannot be overestimated, but it is difficult for those who have not an intimate knowledge of the internal working of a Hospital, or a knowledge of the general outlook of medical science, to gauge the enormous importance of an up-to-date Pathological and Bacteriological Department.

**Pathological  
Department.**

As Professor Osler said in a recent speech on Hospitals, "You cannot have proper treatment of your patients, you cannot have the cases investigated properly unless you have a good chemical, a good bacteriological, and a good pathological laboratory."

The Infirmary has at present got a valuable department of this type with two highly qualified workers devoting their whole time to the Pathological investigation of cases. It is now proposed to increase the accommodation which is available for this work, and at the same time to provide space for some of the members of the Hon. Staff and others to undertake enquiries of their own in regard to the problems which arise in their work at the Infirmary. This accommodation has been needed for some time, and it is most desirable in the interests of the Infirmary Patients and of the public that it shall be supplied as soon as possible.

There are few things more remarkable in connection with the modern developments of Hospital work than the great importance which is now attributed to perfect Nursing. When the present Infirmary was built in 1868 there were only 20 Nurses attached to the Institution; to-day there are 121. This change has been largely necessitated by the discovery that successful surgical treatment depends on the exclusion of hostile germs from all wounds, and it may be said that at the present day the Nurse has almost as important a part to play in the recovery of the patient as the Surgeon himself.

**Nurses' Home.**

The new Wards will require new Nurses, and the additional accommodation which it is proposed to provide will be sufficient to supply rooms for these Nurses and to leave a few extra rooms for emergencies. The new Building will also form a connecting link with the small house at the end of Sunny Bank Street which is now occupied by 10 Nurses but completely isolated from the other Nurses' Homes. The existing Nurses' Homes are now rather overcrowded.

The last item, the New Boiler House and Laundry, will be a great addition to the comfort and economic working of the Infirmary.

**Boiler House  
and Laundry.**





The existing Boilers will soon have to be renewed, and are located in an inconvenient position in the centre of the Infirmary. This causes annoyance and distress to the Patients. The Laundry is most inconvenient, being made up of a range of rooms in the basement, and the steam and smell produced by it find their way into the Nurses' Dining Room and the passages leading to the Wards. It is most desirable that a new system should be inaugurated, so that the Laundry can be worked on better lines, and that the new Boilers which must be provided in any case shall be put up in a position where they can be isolated from the rest of the Infirmary.

It is therefore evident that at least £150,000 must be raised by Leeds to ensure the completion of the Buildings, and that an additional sum will be required for the annual upkeep of the Infirmary.

Towards this sum £109,279 was raised by the first appeal, and the following promises have since been received, several of these increased donations being expressly given as a mark of the donor's approval of the excellence of the scheme and of its benefits to the Infirmary.
