That eight thillings per week and upwards, according to circumflances, be the terms for Patients who come from the compais of any other Quarterly Meeting than Yorkshire, unless privileged agreeable to the 4th Propofal .- Thele Terms for Patients to be fubject to future alteration, if found necellary.

That a contribution of One Hundred Pounds, from any Quarterly Meeting in its collective capacity, paid to the Treafurer of this Infitution before the year 1794; or a donation at any time of Twenty-five Pounds from any Friend; or a fubfeription of Fifty Pounds for an annuity, fhall entitle fuch Quarterly Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, respectively, to the privilege of nominating one *Poor* Patient at a time on the loweft terms of admittion.

5th. That the name of every Annuitant, Donor, and Subferiber, be recorded in a book to be kept for that purpofe; and that every Annuitant, Donor of not lefs than Two Guineas, and Subferiber of Sums in any manner equal to Two Guineas, in the first three years, (being and continuing a Member of our Society) fhall be a Member of the Meetings which are to be held for the government and Superintendance of the Inflution.

6th. That there be paid for board, wafhing, medical advice and medicines, and all other things neceffary except cloathing, according to the circumflances of the Patients or their friends, from four fhillings to fifteen thillings per week, or higher in particular cafes; and fix thillings per week for the board of the Servant of a Patient, in cafe the friends of any Fatient thould incline to fend one; which Servant mult be approved by the Committee.

7th. That eight fhillings per week and upwards, according to circumflances, be the terms for Patients who come from the compais of any other Quarterly Meeting than Yorkfhire, unlefs privileged agreeable to the 4th Proposal--Theie Terms for Patients to be fubject to future alteration, if found necellary.

It having been objected that, according to the expression of the 7th Proposal, there appears to be an ex-traordinary privilege intended to Friends in Yorkshire, this Meeting thinks proper to difclaim having had fuch an intention. The profpect in forming the fame was, that as the Subferiptions were fet on foot in this County, they would amount to, at least, as many handred Pounds as there would be poor Patients belonging to this Quarterly Meeting, at any one time in the Houfe. But, in order to remove all doubts on that head, it is agreed, that the Quarterly Meeting of York shall not enjoy any privilege fuperior to other fubferibing Counties; it being intended, that all Subferibers, whether they consist of Quarterly, or other Meetings, or of Individuals, shall enjoy the privilege of recommending poor Patients, in proporti-on to their Subferiptions, notwithstanding any expressions in the 4th or 7th Proposals, that may bear a different Construction.

In cafe any Quarterly Meeting be fo fmall, or its Members not in an eligible fituation to raife One Hun-dred Pounds, the General Meeting of Subferibers fhall have a power, on application, to extend the pri-vilege of the 4th Proposal to fach Meetings, on contributing a fmaller fum, at the difference of the faid General Meeting.

It is agreed, that when the Annuities and Donations amount to One Thoufand Pounds, the application thereof be taken under confideration by a General Meeting of Subferibers.

As feveral objettions have been made, especially by Friends at a diffance, to fome parts of the foregoing Plan, the following Remarks and Explanations are added, in order to remove them.

Some have thought that accomodations for fo many Patients fhould not be aimed at: But it is obvious, that the quantity of ground for exercise, ought not to be much, if any, lefs for fifteen, than for thirty: that Kitchens, Parlours, and almost all parts of the Building, except the number of Patients' Rooms, ought to be nearly the fame; and that it would make little difference with respect to Phylician and dometic Managers: So that to accomodate the proposed number would not only leften the expense of each Patient, but extend the benefits of the Inflitution to Friends at a greater diffance.

The fituation at York, and its diffance from fome parts, both in the North and South, have been flated as principal objections. With refpect to the place, it was thought belt to fix it at the beginning, as the confideration of fo material a point afterwards, might have afforded a fubject of much altercation; and the different views of Subferibers might then produce divertity of fentiments, to the great embarraffment of the Undertaking. It fhould be attended to, that the Proposal originated in Yorkfhire; and that, though the views of Friends there were not confined to that County, they did not confider the Unfitution as likely the views of Friends there were not confined to that County, they did not confider the Inflitution as likely to accomodate the whole Nation; and therefore, whilft they judged York to be an eligible fituation for a limited Undertaking of this nature, they have been defirous that its privileges fhould be extended to Friends in general, upon reafonable conditions; as Patients, even in low circumflances, are often fent very far; one in particular having been lately conveyed about 200 miles to Manchefter, and divers have been fent from Yorkshire to London.

It appears neceffary, that General Meetings of the Subfcribers fhould be held once a Year, to receive Reports of the preceding Year's Accounts, make Rules, and appoint Committees, &c. To colleft Sub-fictibers for thele purpoles might be difficult, unlefs they were drawn together on fome other occafion : The Quarterly Meeting of York affords fuch an occafion better than any other, becaufe it is larger, and Friends come to it from more diffant parts. Befides, if a Committee fhould meet quarterly, it may then be conveniently appointed of Friends refiding in various and diffant parts of the County. This Committee may appoint Vifitors, and a Sub-committee of Friends conveniently fituated to take the immediate overfight of the Inftitution, and to make report to them once a Quarter.

The price of land fuitable for the purpofe is much lower near York, than it is equally near moft other populous places; and at fuch only a good choice of medical affiftance can be expected. The air is also healthy, and much more free from fmoke, than fituations near manufacturing towns; and the country being generally fruitful, and not populous, provisions are confiderably cheaper than at fuch places. If may be further observed, that at a General Conference fince the Proposals were circulated, it was reconfidered whether York was the most proper place? when there appeared a general acquiescence, and not a diffenting voice.


With refpect to the objections to the 4th Propofal, it may be proper to remark, that a Quarterly Meet-ing being a flanding body, its privilege is perpetual; but the right of a fingle Friend dies with him; and therefore, a Donation of 100L is required from the former, in its collective capacity, when only 25L Do-nation, or 50L Subfeription for an Annuity, is required to entitle a Friend to a fimilar privilege with a Quarterly Meeting. It fhould be attended to, that Patients whole connections are of ability to pay eight fhillings per week or upwards, according to circamflances, cannot be privileged under the 4th Propofal. As to the other part of the objection to that Propofal, it is apprehended, that the minute now made will entirely remove it. entirely remove it.

It hath been faid, that there are already many public Inftitutions of this kind, which render this un-neceffary. But it is evident, belides what has been remarked on this head in the former publication, that feveral peculiar and important advantages will accrue from an Inflitution confined to ourfelves. For as the feveral peculiar and important advantages with accrue from an initiation conduct. To be different is a mental one, and people of regular conduct, and even religiously difposed minds, are not ex-empt therefrom, their confinement amongit perfons in all refpects ftrangers, and their promifcuous expo-fure to fuch company as is mostly found in public Infitiations of this kind, mult be peculiarly difgufting, and confequently augment the diforder. Nor is this idea merely chimerical; for it is well known, that the fituation of divers Members of our Society, hath, from this caufe, been unfpeakably diffreffing. A circumflance which it needs no arguments to prove, muft greatly retard, if not totally prevent, their cure.

It has hitherto been judged beft not to trouble any Meeting of Difcipline with the eftablifhment, or fu-ture management, of fuch an Inflitution, becaufe matters of this fort are often worfe than unedifying to thefe Meetings. So large a number of Subferibers as there is likely to be in the compafs of York Quar-terly Meeting, with others from diffant parts who may attend, are likely to be fully competent to direct the memory of memory and before the unequarity in subfer in number, it will up terly Meeting, with others from diftant parts who may attend, are likely to be fully competent to direct the management for many years to come; and before they are materially reduced in number, it will un-doubtedly become their concern to provide for a regular fucceffion. But though it would not be proper to introduce the *whole management of the bufinefs* in any Meeting for Difcipline, yet the fimple confiderati-on of aiding the Eftabliftment by Subferrations, may not be an improper fubject for fuch a Meeting. If one or more hundred pounds fhould be raifed and paid in its name (the fums given by each Friend being fpecified or not, as they may chufe), fuch Meeting will not be fubject to any future trouble, except keep-ing up an appointment of a Friend or two, as Agents, to correspond with the Committee, and recommend Patients, &c; fimilar to what has been done by divers Meetings, towards the fupport of Holpitals in dif-ferent parts of the Nation. ferent parts of the Nation.

To conclude-an Inflitution of this nature must be fixed fomewhere, and, unlefs it be on a very fmall To conclude—an Inflitution of this nature muft be fixed fomewhere, and, unlefs it be on a very fmall fcale, many Patients muft be fent from a confiderable diffance. Friends who think the object worthy their attention, may be encouraged to promote it, not only on a principle of Charity to the Poor, but even of Compafion to thofe in easy and affluent circumflances, who will doubtlefs think themfelves benefitted, though they may pay amply for it. Thofe who have embarked in this Undertaking, have not been influen-ced by interefted views, nor are they requefting or defiring any favours for themfelves. A Malady, in ma-ny inflances, the moft deplorable that Human Nature is fubject to, hath excited their fympathy and attention; and they invite fuch Friends as approve of their defign, to co-operate with them in an Effa-blifhment, which hath far its object, the mitigation of mifery, and the refloration of thole, who are loft to Civil and Religious Society : In the profecution whereof, they humbly rely on the favour of Him, whofe tender Mercies are over all his works. whole tender Mercies are over all his works.

RETREAT FOR PERSONS AFFLICTED WITH DISORDERS OF THE MIND.

THIS Meeting being apprehenfive that, nothwithftanding the endeavours which have been used to circulate information relative to this Inflitution, Friends in many Counties are but little acquainted with the defign: It is therefore agreed that 1500 copies of the Rules, with fome fmall variations and explanations, and a lift of Subferiptions, be printed and circulated as much as may be into the compafs of every quarterly and monthly Meeting; and the attention of Friends is particularly requested to the recommendation of a folid religious Friend, with some medical knowledge, who may be capable of superintending the Inflitution under the direction of a Physician. Application to be made to William Tuke of YONK.

A Meeting of Friends was held here the 28th of 6th Month, 1792, for the purpole of taking into confideration the propriety of providing a retired habitation, with necellary advice, attendance, &c, for the Members of our Society, and others profelling with us, who may be in a flate of Lunacy, or fo detanged in mind (not Idiots) as to require fach a provision.

Perfons of this defcription (who are truly objects of great (ympathy and compatition) are often, from the peculiar treatment which they require, necefarily committed wholly to the government of people of other Societies, by which means the flate of their own minds, and the feelings of their near connections, are rendered more diffatisfied and uncomfortable, than would probably be the cafe were they under the notice and care of those with whom they are connected in religious Society. It appeared, therefore, very defirable that an Inflitution fhould be formed, wholly under the government of Friends, for the relief and accomodation of fuch perfons, of all ranks with refpect to property: This would doubtlefs, in forme degree, alleviate the anxiety of their Relations, render the Minds of the Patients more eafy in their lucid intervals, and confequently tend to facilitate and promote their recovery. Friends in divers parts of the Nation uniting in the fame featurents, have contributed towards this Effablifhment. About 11 acress of Ground, in a very eligible lituation near York, are purchaled, and the building is in fuch forwardnefs, that it may probably be ready for the accomodation of Fatients in the courfe of the Summer 1795. Divers Meetings of the Subferibers have been held, and the following Rules were agreed to, and are now confirmed.

aft. THAT the Inflitution be effablished and supported by Annuities, Donations, and annual Subscriptions; and that the fame (which should be altogether voluntary) be promoted amongs Friends within the compass of any quarterly Meeting.

ad. That each Subferiber, by way of annuity, contributing a fum not lefs than twenty pounds, fhall receive an Intereft of 5 per cent. per annum, during life; and as the undertaking may not be able to pay this Intereft, and otherwife maintain itfelf, for the firft three years, that those entered as Subferibers for annual payments be engaged for three years certain, in cafe the Subferiber fhould fo long live.

3d. That a contribution of one hundred Pounds, from any quarterly or other Meeting in its collective capacity, or a donation of twenty-five Pounds from any Friend, or a fubfeription of fifty Pounds for an annuity, fhall entitle fuch Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, respectively, to the privilege of nominating one poor Patient at a time on the loweft terms of admiffion.

4th. That the name of every Annuitant, Donor, and Subferiber, be recorded in a book to be kept for that purpofe; and that every Annuitant, Donor of not lefs than two Guiness, and Subferiber of fums in any manner equal to two Guineas (being and continuing a Member of our Society), thall be a Member of the Meetings which are to be held for the government and inperintendance of the Inflitution.

5th. That there be paid for Board, Wathing, medical Advice and Medicines, and all other things neceffary except cloathing, according to the circumflances of the Patients or their Friends, from four fhillings to fifteen fhilling per week, or higher in particular cafes ; and fix fhillings per week for the board of the Servant of a Patient, in cafe the Friends of any Patient fhould incline to fend one ; which Servant muft be approved by the Committee,

6th. That eight fhillings per week and upwards, according to circumflances, be the terms for Patients who may not be privileged agreeably to the 3d Rule. Thefe terms for Patients to be fubject to future alteration, if found neceffary.

7th. As the benefit of the propofed Inftitution is intended to extend to those who are not flriftly Members of our Society, it is agreed that fubfcriptions may also be received from fuch perform.

8th. In cafe any quarterly Meeting be fo fmall, or its Members not in an eligible fituation to raife one hundred Pounds, the General Meeting of Subferibers fhall have a power, on application, to extend the privilege of the 3d Rule to fuch Meetings, on contributing a fmaller fum, at the difference of the faid General Meeting.

As feveral objettions have been made, effectially by Friends at a diftance, to fome parts of the foregoing Plan, the following Remarks and Explanations are added, in order to remove them.

Some have thought that accomodations for fo many as thirty Patients flould not have been 'aimed at: But it is obvious, that the quantity of ground for exercife, ought not to be much, if any, lefs for fifteen, than for thirty; that Kitchens, Parlours, and almost all parts of the Building, except the number of Patients' Rooms, ought to be nearly the fame; and that it would make little difference with respect to Phylician and domellic Managers: So that to accomodate the proposed number would not only leffen the expence of each Patient, but extend the benefits of the Institution to Friends at a greater diffance. It appears neceffary, that General Meetings of the Subferibers fhould be held once a Year, to receive Reports of the proceeding Year's accounts, make Rules, and appoint Committees, &c. To collect Subferibers for thefe purpoles might be difficult, unleis they were drawn together on fome particular occafion : The Quarterly Meeting of York affords fuch an occafion better than any other, becaufe it is larger, and Friends more frequently come to it from diffant parts. Belides, if a Committee fhould meet quarterly, it may then be conveniently appointed of Friends refiding in various and diffant parts of the County This Committee may appoint Vintors, and a Sub-committee of Friends conveniently fituated to take the immediate overfight of the Inflitution, and to make report to them once a Quarter.

With regard to the objections to the 3d Rule, it may be proper to remark, that a Quarterly Meeting being a flanding body, its privilege is perpetual; but the right of a lingle Friend dies with him; and therefore, a Donation of 100l, is required from the former, in its collective capacity, when only 25l. Donation, or 50l. Subfeription for an Annuity, is required to entitle a Friend to a fimilar privilege with a Quarterly Meeting. It flould be attended to, that Patients whole connections are of ability to pay eight fhillings per week or upwards, according to circumflances, cannot be privileged under that Rule.

It hath been faid, that there are already many public Infittutions of the kind, which render this unneceffary. But it is evident, befides what has been remarked on this head in the former publications, that feveral peculiar and important advantages will accrue from an Infitution confined to ourfelves. For as the diforder is a menual one, and people of regular conduct, and even religiously difpofed minds, are not exempt from it, their confinement amongft perfons in all respects firangers, and their promifeuous expolure to fuch company as is moftly found in public Infitutions of this kind, muft be peculiarly difgufting, and confequently augment their diforder. Nor is this idea merely chimerical; for it is well known, that the fituation of divers Members of our Society, hath, from this caufe, been unfpeckably diftreffing. A circumflance which it needs no arguments to prove, muft greatly retard, if not totally prevent, their cure. On the other hand, when returning reafon indicates a refloration of the mental powers, it may greatly tend to advance and effablith this definable event, to be under the direction of perfons who, whilf they are careful to promote cheerful and faluary anufements, will, at the fame time, be concerned, at fuitable feafons, to cherifh in them the fitnegthening and confolatory principles of Religion and Virtue, inflead of diffipating thefe imprefions, by fuch diverfions as enfecible the mind, and difqualify it for that folid reflection which leads to fublitantial peace and comfort.

It has hitherto been judged beft not to trouble any Meeting of Difcipline with the eftablifhment, or future management, of fach an Inflitution, because matters of this fort are often worfe than unedifying to thefe Meerings. So large a number of Subfcribers as there is likely to be in the compafs of York Quarterly Meeting, with others from diffant parts who may attend, are likely to be fully competent to direft the management for many years to come; and before they are materially reduced in number, it will undoubtedly become their concern to provide for a regular fucceffion. But though it would not be proper to introduce the whole management of the buffinefs in any Meeting for Difcipline, yet the fimple confideration of aiding the Eftablifhment by Subfcriptions, may not be an improper fubjett for fuch a Meeting. If one or more hundred pounds thould be raifed and paid in its name (the fums given by each Friend being fpecified or not, as they may chufe), fuch Meeting will not be fubjeft to any future trouble, except that of keeping up an appointment of a Friend or two, as Agents, to correspond with the Committee, and recommend Patients, &c ; fimilar to what has been done by divers Meetings, different prover the trainer.

To conclude—an Inflitution of this nature muft be fixed fomewhere, and, unlefs it be on a very fmall fcale, many Patients muft be fent from a confiderable diffance. Friends who think the object worthy their attention, may be encouraged to promote it, not only on a principle of Charity to the Poor, but even of Compafion to those in easy and affluent circumflances, who will doubtlefs think themfelves benefitted, though they may pay amply for it. Those who have embarked in this Undertaking, have not been influenced by interested views, nor are they requessing or defiring any favours for themfelves. A Malady, in many inflances, the most deplorable that Human Nature is fubject to, hath excited their fympathy and attention; and they invite fuch Friends as approve of their defign, to co-operate with them in an Effablishment, which hath for its object, the mitigation of misery, and the reftoration of those, who are loss to Civil and religious Society : In the profecution whereof, they humbly rely on the favour of Him, whole tender Mercies are over all his works.

YORK, ift of 7th Month, 1796. Retreat for Perfons afflicted with Diforders of the Mind.

PA MEETING of Friends was held here the 28th of 6th Month, 1792, for the purpose of taking into confideration the propriety of providing a retired habitation, with neceffary advice, attendance, &c, for the Members of our Society, and others profeffing with us, who may be in a flate of Lunacy, or fo deranged in mind (not Idiots) as to require fuch a provision.

PERSONS of this defeription (who are truly objects of tender fympathy and compation) are often, from the peculiar treatment which they require, neceffarily committed wholly to the government of people of other Societies ; by which means their own minds, and the feelings of their near connexions, are rendered more diffatisfied and uncomfortable, than would probably be the cafe, were they under the notice and care of those with whom they are connected in religious fociety. It appeared, therefore, very defirable, that an Inftitution thould be formed, wholly under the government of Friends, for the relief and accomodation of fuch perfons, of all ranks with refpect to property. This would, doubtlefs, in fome degree, alleviate the anxiety of their Relations, render the minds of the Patients more eafy in their lucid intervals, and confequently tend to facilitate and promote their recovery.

THOUGH it may be faid, that there are already many public Inftitutions of the kind, which render this unneceffary, yet it is evident, belides what has been remarked on this head in the former publications, that feve ral peculiar and important advantages will accrue from an Inftitution confined to ourfelves. As people of regular conduct, and even religiously difposed minds, are not exempt from this diforder, their confinement amongst perfons in all refpects ftrangers, and their promifcuous expolure to fuch company as is mostly found in public Inflitutions of this kind, muft be peculiarly difgufting, and confequently augment their malady. This idea is not imaginary : for it is well known, that the fituation of divers Members of our Society, hath, from this caufe, been unfpeakably diffreffing : a circumflance which muft doubtlefs greatly retard, if not totally prevent their cure. On the other hand, when returning reafon indicates a reftoration of the mental powers, it may greatly tend to advance and eftablish the patient's recovery, to perceive himself under the direction of perfons who, whilft they are careful to promote cheerful and falutary amufements, will be concerned, at fuitable feafons, to cherifh in them the ftrengthening and confolatory principles of Religion and Virtue, inftead of diffipating thefe impreffions, by fuch diversions as enfecble the mind, and difqualify it for that folid reflection which leads to fubstantial peace and comfort.

Subscription

IN conformity to thefe views and fentiments, Friends in divers parts of the Nation have contributed towards this Effablifhment. About eleven acres of ground, in a very eligible fituation near York, have been purchafed, and a Houfe erected, with apartments fuitable for the accomodation of Friends in any circumftances of life. The following are the Regulations which have been adopted.

.ift. THAT the Inflitution be effablished and supported by Annuities, Donations, and annual Subscriptions; and that the fame (which fhould be altogether voluntary) be promoted amongst Friends within the compass of any quarterly Meeting.

2d. THAT each Subscriber, by way of Annuity, contributing a fum not lefs than twenty pounds, shall receive an intereft of five per cent, per annum, during life : and as the undertaking may not be able to pay this intereft, and otherwife maintain itfelf, for the first three years, that those entered as Subscribers for annual payments, be engaged for three years certain, in cafe the Subfcriber fhould lo long live.

gd. THAT a contribution of one hundred pounds, from any quarterly or other Meeting in its collective capacity, or a donation of twenty-five pounds from any Friend, or a fubfeription of fifty pounds for an annuity, fhall entitle fuch Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, refpectively, to the privilege of nominating one poor Patient at a time, on the loweft terms of admiffion.

4th. 

> In again laying before the Subferibers, the flate of this Influtution, we feel encouragement, from the liberal fupport which it has this year met with from Friends in different parts of the Nation, as well as from repeated proofs of the advantages de-rived to the Pattern. he here the the strategy derived to the Patients, by being under the care and government of perfons who are Members of our Society. We think it, however, proper to obferve, that out of twenty-three cafes now in the Houfe, all of them, except two or three, were, at their admitfion, of to long flanding as to be confidered incurable. Moft of the Patients appear much im-proved, and fome of them may be confidered in a flate of recovery ; but from their liability to relaple, and their remote fituation from home, their friends wait for further confirmation previous to their removal.

9

Since the laft report, two Patients have return-ed home recovered; one of whom having relapted has been readmitted, which has allo been the cafe with one returned laft year. Nine others have been admitted this year; one of them, a few days after his admiftion, died of a fever. The number of Pa-tients now in the Houle, is nine men and fourteen womens eight of their avera the low terms of four women; eight of them are en the low terms of four fullings pee week; the refl from eight fhillings to one guines. — The income from the whole, is f 9, 155, od, per week. We are now in expectationthat the income from the Patients will be nearly fufficient for their fupport and attendance; but the pay-ment of Annuities and Intereft, as well as the gra-dual reduction of the debt, will full require the pecuniary aid of those who approve of the Inflitution.

aft. THAT the Inflitution be effablished and sup-ported by Annuities, Donations, and annual Sub-feriptions; and that the same (which should be al-together voluntary) be promoted amongst Friends within the compass of any Quarterly Meeting.

2d. That each Subferiber, by way of Annuity, contributing a fum not lefs than twenty pounds, fhall receive an intereft of five per cent per annum, during life.

3d. That a contribution of one hundred pounds, from any quarterly or other Meeting in its collective capacity, or a donation of twenty-five pounds from any Friend, or a fubbeription of fifty pounds for an annuity, fhall entitle such Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, respectively, to the privilege of nominating one poor Patient at a time, on the loweft terms of admithon.

4th. 8th. In cafe any quarterly Meeting be fmall, or its Members not in an eligible frustion to rate one hundred pounds, the General Meeting of Subleribers thall have power, on application, to extend the privilege of the third Rule to fuch Meeting, on contributing a fmaller fum, at the difference of the faid General Meeting.

9th. For the fatisfaction of Subferibers on life aquaities, and thole who have lent, or may hereafter lend, any money to this Inflitution, this Meeting declares, that the whole real and perfonal property therecurto belonging, acquired, and to be acquired, thail fland and continue a fecurity to the laid bife Annuitants, for the annual payment of their intereft, and to the Lenders aforefoid, for the regular payment of principal and intereft.

10th. That the privilege of Meetings or Perfons to recommend poor Patients on the loweft terms of admiffion, according to the third and eighth Rules of 9th. month, 1794, fhall not be taken away or diminifhed, notwithflanding any general powers which are or may be invelled in the future directors.

11th. That a Meeting of the Subferibers qualified according to the fourth Rule of the fame date, be held in the latter end of the 6th. month, or beginning of the 7th, month of every year, onlets tonce other time thould hereafter be found more convenient; which Meeting thall be denominated the General Meeting; and the Friends who may compole it thall, from time to time, have a general line

If, at any future period, by means of fome unforcisen or unexpected events, in thould appear to the General Meeting, that the original purpole of the Undertaking cannot be accomplifhed or parfieed, the faid General Meeting fhall give due notice in writing to all the Directors, and allo to every quarterly or other Meeting of our Society, which according to the Rules, may be interelled therein, that the difpold of the property of the Inflimited is to be taken under confideration at their next Meeing; at which Meeting two Agents or Reprefentives, appointed by any of the General Meeting; and in cafe two-thirds of the Meeting fo converse fhall agree thereto, they may fell or diffice of the whole citate and property of the Inflimiten, or d any part thereof, or appropriate the fame, or the next produce thereof, to fuch juft, equitable, or haritable ules, as they, on ferious and deliberate confideration, fhall judge beft.

a6th, A quarter of a year's maintenance for each Patient is to be regularly paid in advance; and in cale the Patient floodd be cured, or die before the expiration of the first quarter, no part thereof is to be returned; but, after the first quarter, return is to be made for the number of whole weeks upexpired, at the time of removal, or decease of a Paticnt.



A General Meeting shall be held in the latter end of the 6th month, or the beginning of the 7th month of every year, unless some other time should hereafter be found more convenies; and the Friends who may compose it shall, from time to time, have a general state of the family, and accounts of the Institution, laid before them and, except the two minutes which relate to securities to Annuitants, to Lenders of money, and to privileged Meetings and Subscribers, shall have power to alter or make Rules, and give such directions, as they may think best adapted to promote the designs of the Institution; and to appoint a Treasurer, who shall keep and dispose of the money entrusted to him, as the said Meeting shall direct; they may also confirm, alter or ab-rogate, the Orders and Regulations of the Quarterly Meetings; and shall choose annually a Committee for the immediate care and management of the Undertaking .- This Committee are to meet once a month, oftner if necessary : fix the the terms of admission for the different Patients: make out clear and distinct accounts of the state of the Institution; and carry into execution the Rules and Orders made for promoting its welfare.

2d. During, or after the conclusion of, each Quarterly Meeting of Friends for Yorkshire, a Meeting is to be held to receive a report of the said Committee's accounts, read over all their minutes, advance or reduce the weekly payment of any of the Patients, and give the Committee

such advice and direction as they may think preper, consistently with the general Rules and Orders that may have been established.

3d. The General Meeting in the year 1800, according to the original plan of the Institution, made provision for a perpetual succession of Directors. Forty Subscribers, members of our Society, were nominated and appointed, who, with their successors, as hereafter directed to be appointed, together with any other Donors or Subscribers, qualified according to the fourth Rule, and Agents that may be appointed by any qualified Meeting, that may from time to time choose to attend, are to be the General Meeting, and continue the Directors of the Institution, m whom the government of it is perpetually to vest and remain; any ten of whom are to be sufficient to do business. The said forty Directors, or any eight of them, with any other qualified Donos or Subscribers, are to meet quarterly for the purposes of the preceding Rule.

4th. At the expiration of each year, the first named eight on the list are to cease to be Directors, and eight others members of our Society, are to be appointed by the General Meeting in their place; with an addition for such as may be deceased or disowned; any of whom may be chosen from the number of Donors and Subscribers, or others, as shall, in process of time, be judged most convenient and best.

5th. If, at any future period, by means of some unforescen or unexpected events, it should appear to the General Meeting, that the original purpose of the Undertaking cannot be accomplished or pursued, the said General Meeting shall give due notice in writing to all the Directors, and also in every Quarterly or other Meeting of our Society,

Rules and Regulations.

CHAPTER I.

CONTRIBUTIONS.

1. HE Institution was established and is supported by Annuities, Donations, and annual Subscriptions; and the same may be further promoted amongst Friends within the compass of any Quarterly Meeting.

2d. Each Subscriber, by way of Annuity, con-tributing a sum not less than twenty pounds, shall receive an interest of five per cent. per annum, during life.

3d. A contribution of one hundred pounds, from any Quarterly or other Meeting in its collective capacity, or a donation of twenty-five pounds from any Friend, or a subscription of fifty pounds for an Annuity, shall entitle such Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, respectively, to the privilege of nominating one poor Patient at a time, on the lowest terms of admission.

4th. In consideration of the smallness of a quarterly Meeting, or of its members not being in an eligible situation to raise one hundred pounds, the General Meeting of Subscribers shall have power, on application, to extend the privilege of the third Rule to such Meetings on contributing a smaller sum, at the discretion of the said General Meeting.

5th. The privilege of Meetings, or persons, to recommend poor Patients on the lowest terms of admission, according to the third and fourth

Rules, shall not be taken away or diminished, actwithstanding any general powers which are or may be invested in the future Directors.

6th. As it is necessary to ascertain the Sub-scriptions of each meeting that may have a right to recommend poor Patients, Donors of twenty-five pounds and upwards, are desired to explain, whether they wish to enjoy the privilege, during life, of recommending poor Patients, or that their Donations should be considered as the Subscriptions of their Quarterly or other Meetings : and it is agreed, that all Donations of individuals (not elaiming such right of recommendation,) shall be considered as the Subscription of their Quarterly Meeting, whether reported to such Meeting, or not; and every Quarterly Meeting shall enjoy the privilege of recommending poor Patients, in proportion to the Subscriptions of their respective members.

7th. The name when sent up, of every Annui-tant, Donor, and Subscriber, shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose ; and every Annuitant, Donor of not less than two guineas, and Subscriber of sums in any manner equal to two guineas, (being and continuing a member of our Society) shall be a member of the meetings which are to be held for the government and superintendence of the Institution.

Sth. For the satisfaction of Subscribers on life annuities, and those who have lent, or may hereafter lend any money to this Institution, this Meeting declares, that the whole real and personal property thereunto belonging, acquired, and to be acquired, shall stand and continue a security to the said life Annuitants, for the annual payment of their interest, and to the Lenders aforesaid, for the regular payment of principal and interest,

which, according to the Rules, may be interested therein, that the disposal of the Property of the Institution is to be taken under consideration at their next Meeting; at which Meeting two Agents or Representatives, appointed by any of the said Meetings, shall be admitted as Members of the General Meeting; and in case two-thirds of the Meeting so convened shall agree thereto, they may sell or dispose of the whole estate and property of the Institution, or of any part thereof, or appropriate the same, or the next produce thereof, to such just, equitable, or charitable uses, as they, on serious and deliberate con-sideration, shall judge best.

CHAPTER III.

PATIENTS.

1st. The Terms for Board, Washing, medical Advice and Medicines, and all other things necessary, except clothing, are for every poor Patient privileged agreeably to the third Rule, a sum not less than four shillings per week.

2d. Notless than eight shillings per week shall be paid for other Patients, and more according to circumstances ; and a reasonable sum for the board of the servant of a Patient, in case their friends should incline to send one: which servant must be approved by the Committee. The terms of admission to be subject to future alteration, if found necessary ; and as the wearing of washing gowas and skirts is at present so much increased, that the washing of them in so large a family is attended with considerable inconvenience, it is agreed, that those belonging to the Patients shall

he washed out of the House, and the expense charged to their respective accounts.

3d. A quarter of a year's maintenance for each Patient is to be paid in advance ; and in case the Patient should be cured, or die before the expiration of the first quarter, no part thereof is to be returned ; but, after the first quarter, return is to be made for the number of whole weeks unexpired, at the time of removal, or decease of a Patient.

4th. As experience demonstrates, that the recovery of insane Patients frequently depends on their being removed from their connexions, and put under proper care and treatment, in the early stages of the disorder, it is earnestly recommended to their friends, to remove them at an early period after the disorder appears to be fixed. And, as an additional inducement to persons in straitened circumstances, to adopt this salutary measure, it is concluded, that, in derangements not exceeding six months from their first appearance, those members of our Society whose circumstances, in case of continuance, would not conveniently admit of their paying more than eight shillings per week, shall be entitled to an abatement of four shillings a week for one year, if not sooner recovered. Those Patients who, by the former rule, would have been rated at four shillings per week, will, under this regulation, be admitted gratis, for a year, if necessary ; but as some Patients have come with disorders unconnected with insanity, and which require additional expense or attendance, it is judged neces-sary, that, in such cases, an additional charge shall be made at the discretion of the Committee.

5th. On the admission of Patients, the Committee should, in general, require a cettificate, (15)

signed by a medical person, to the following import : I do hereby certify, that A B of C, aged - years, is in a state of In anity, and proper to be received into a house provided for the relief of persons of that description. It should also be stated whether the Patient is afflicted with any complaint independent of insanity. It is also desirable, that some account should be sent, how long the Patient has been disordered ; whether any, or what sort of medical means have been used ; and whether any disposition has appeared in the Patient to injure him or herself, or any other person ; with any other circumstances likely to throw light on the case relative to his or her treatment.

6th. As the Committee is not to admit any Patient, on lower terms than eight shillings per week, unless recommended by the Agent of a privileged Meeting, or a Subscriber qualified according to the third Rule respecting Contributions, it is hoped that individual Subscribers will be cautious of recommending Patients whose maintenance, or any part thereof, is paid by a monthly or other Meeting, to the saving of the expense of the members of such Meetings collectively, thereby rendering it unnecessary for them to subscribe to the Institution : but no discouragement is hereby intended to the assistance of Friends whose circumstances, or those of their near connexions, are too strait, to pay eight shillings per week.

7th. As, in many cases, it may be difficult for the friends of Patients to procure suitable persons to conduct them to the House, it is agreed, that on application, a proper person shall be sent from the Retreat, when it is convenient ; the expences only being paid by the Patients' friends.

8th. Though it was the original design of this Institution, to accommodate such insane persons as are members of our Society, yet it was also considered that cases might arise, wherein it might be desirable to extend such accommoda-tion beyond the line of strict membership; but as an indiscriminate admittance of persons not in membership, would defeat the special design of the Institution, by the exclusion of those who are members, the admitting, or not admitting of them, must always be left to the discretion of the Committee, and consequently time given for that purpose.

9th. It also appears necessary, that the sending of Patients without previous application, should, in all cases, be avoided, lest suitable accommodation be not ready for their reception; and Friends are also requested to avoid bringing Pa-tients at late hours of the night.

10th. As circumstances may sometimes occur, wherein it is proper that the Committee should have a discretion to decline the admission of Patients, though members of our Society, especially when the House is nearly full; it is agreed to vest such discretion in the Committee, until the Quarterly or General Meeting can be consulted; which Meeting shall determine the propriety of admitting or refusing such applications.

N. B. There are apartments in which Patients with a Servant may be accommodated, without mixing with the others.

There are now 63 Palients undercare; (viz) 25 then and 38 Women: of whom 4 Men and 7 Women are at the Appendage-In concluding the 19th Report of the State of the Refrect, the Directors can hardly refrain from expressing the feelings of gratitude and valisfaction, with which they contimplate the prosperous state of this hilution, the blane fits which, have resulted from it to the immediate objects of its care; and the Stimulus which its example has given to the improve: ment of Establishments for Similar purposes.

From the opening of the Retreat to the end of the Year 1814. 177 Palients were admitted; of whom 100 had been disordered more than 12 Months. Of these latter cases, which are generally denominated incurable, 26 have been happily restored to society: and of the 77 recent cases, 59 have been so restored. It is also worthy of remark, as affording satisfactory

evidence of the good management of the Institution, and of the importance of early attention to cases of Insanity, that, of the 16 recent cases admitted in the last 3 years, 15 have already been discharged recovered.

The Directors cannot but attribute, under the Divine Aleping, much of the prosperity and success of the Institution, to the openness with which its affairs have been conducted; the uniform interest for its welfare evineed by its Patrons and magers; and in an eminent degree, to the conscientious and indicious dis charge of their and wous duties, by the Persons who have; for so many years, had the immediate superintendance and management of the Establishment. A steady attention to these causes of success, they trust will long support the flarac: tor and usefulness of the Rebreat, and ensure a continuance of that liberality by which it has hither to been supported.

-----CHAPTER I.

CONTRIBUTIONS.

HE Institution was established and is supported by Annuities, Donations and annual Subscriptions; and the same may be further promoted amongst Friends, within the compass of any Quarterly Meeting.

2d. Each Subscriber, by way of Annuity, contributing a sum not less than twenty pounds, shall receive an interest of five per cent. per annum, during life.

3d. A contribution of one hundred pounds, from any Quarterly or other Meeting in its collective capacity, or a donation of twenty-five pounds from any Friend, or a subscription of fifty pounds for an Annuity, shall entitle such Meeting, Donor, or Annuitant, respectively, to the privilege of nominating one poor Patient at a time, on the lowest terms of admission.

th. In consideration of the smallness of a sterly Meeting, or of its members not being anguin eligible situation to raise one hundred nds, the General Meeting of Subscribers I have power, on application, to extend the lilege of the third Rule to such Meetings, on tributing a smaller sum, at the discretion of said General Meeting.

1th. The privilege of Meetings, or persons to mmend poor Patients on the lowest terms dmission, according to the third and fourth i cs, shall not be taken away or diminished, aithstanding any general powers which are, may be invested in the future Directors:

7th. The name when sent up, of every Annuitant, Donor, and Subscriber, shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose; and every Annuitant, Donor, of not less than two guineas, and Subscriber of sums in any manner equal to two guineas, (being and continuing a member of our Society,) shall be a member of the meetings which are to be held for the government and superintendence of the Institution.

8th. For the satisfaction of Subscribers on life annuities, and those who have lent, or may hereafter lend any money to this Institution, this Meeting declares, that the whole real and personal property thereunto belonging, acquired, and to be acquired, shall stand and continue a security to the said life Annuitants, for the annual payment of their interest, and to the Lenders aforesaid, for the regular payment of principal and interest.

CHAPTER II.

GOVERNMENT.

1st. A General Meeting shall be held in the latter end of the 6th month, or the beginning of the 7th month of every year, unless some other time should hereafter be found more convenient; and the Friends who may compose it shall, from time to time, have a general state of the family, and accounts of the Institution, laid before them ; and, except the two minutes which relate to sccurities to Annuitants, to Lenders of money, and to privileged Meetings and Subscribers, shall have power to alter or make Rules, and give such directions, as they may think best adapted to promote the designs of the Institution; and to appoint a Treasurer, who shall keep and dispose of the money entrusted to him, as the said Meeting shall direct. They may also confirm, alter or abrogate, the Orders and Regulations of the Quarterly Meetings; and shall choose annually a Committee of Seven Subscribers, any three of whom may act, for the immediate care and management of the Undertaking .--- This Com-mittee are to meet once a month ; oftener if necessary ; fix the terms of admission for the different Patients; make out clear and distinct

accounts of the state of the Institution ; and carry into execution the Rules and Orders made for promoting its welfare.

OF THE RETREAT.

2d. During, or after the conclusion of, each Quarterly Meeting of Friends for Yorkshire, a Meeting is to be held to receive a report of the said Committee's accounts, read over all their minutes, advance or reduce the weekly payment of any of the Patients, and give the Committee such advice and direction as they may think proper, consistently with the general Rules and Orders that may have been established.

3d. At each Quarterly Meeting, two Subscribers shall be appointed as Visiters to the Institution, who are authorized to inspect every part of the House, at such times, and as often as they may think proper. They shall enter in a Book, to be kept for that purpose, the time of their atttendance, and such remarks as may appear to them necessary or desirable. The minutes of the Visiters to be read at the meetings of the Committee, and at the Quarterly Meetings. The Committee are to appoint three Female Visiters, one of whom is to be changed every month.

4th. The General Meeting in the year 1800, according to the original plan of the Institution, made provision for a perpetual succession of Directors. Forty Subscribers, members of our Society, were nominated and appointed, who, with their successors, as hereafter directed to be appointed, together with any other Donors or Subscribers, qualified according to the seventh Rule of Chapter 1st, and Agents that may be appointed by any qualified Meeting, that may from time to time choose to attend, are to be the General Meeting, and continue the Directors of the Institution, in whom the government of it is perpetually to vest and remain; and ten of whom are to he sufficient to do business. The said forty Directors, or any eight of them, with any other qualified Donors or Subscribers, are to meet quarterly for the purposes of the preceding Rule.

5th. At the expiration of each year, the first named eight on the list are to cease to be Directors, and eight other members, of our Society, are to be appointed by the General Meeting in their place ; with an addition for such as may be deceased or disowned; any of whom may be chosen from the number of Donors and Subscribers, or others, as shall, in process of time, be udged most convenient and best.

If at any future period, by means of some unforeseen or unexpected events, it should up. pear to the General Meeting, that the original purpose of the Undertaking cannot be acces. plished or pursued, the said General Meeting shall give due notice in writing to all the Directors, and also in every Quarterly or other Meeting of our Society, which, according to the Rules, may be interested therein, that the disposal of the Property of the Institution is to be taken under consideration at their next Meet. ing. At such Meeting two Agents or Repr. sentatives, appointed by any of the said Meet. ings, shall be admitted as Members of the General Meeting ; and in case two-thirds of the Meeting so convened shall agree thereto, they may sell or dispose of the whole Estate and Property of the Institution, or of any part thereof, or appropriate the same, or the neat produce thread to such just, equitable, or charitable uses, as they, on serious and deliberate consideration, shall judge best.

CHAPTER III.

Luninitio out a. PATIENTS.

1st. The Terms for Board, Washing, Medical Advice, and Medicines, and all other things necessary, except clothing, are, for every poor Patient privileged agreeably to the third Rule, a sum not less than four shillings per week.

2d. Not less than eight shillings per week shall be paid for other Patients, and more according to circumstances; and a reasonable sum for the board of the servant of a Patient, in case their friends should incline to send one; which servant must be approved by the Committee. The terms of admission to be subject to future alteration, if found necessary; and as the wearing of washing gowns and skirts is at present 'so much increased, that the washing of them, in so large a family, is attended with considerable inconvenience, it is agreed, that those belonging to the Patients shall be washed out of the House, and the expense charged to their respective accounts,

3d. A quarter of a year's maintenance for each Patjent is to be paid in advance; and in ease the Patient should be cured, or die before the expiration of the first quarter, no part thereof is to be returned: but, after the first quarter, return is to be made for the number of whole weeks unexpired, at the time of removal, or decease of a Patient.

4th. As experience demonstrates, that the recovery of insane Patients frequently depends on their being removed from their connexions, and put under proper care and treatment, in the early stages of the disorder, it is earnestly recommended to their friends, to remove them at an early period, after the disorder appears to be fixed. And as an additional inducement to persons in straitened circumstances, to adopt this salutary measure, it is concluded, that in derangements not exceeding six months from their first appearance, those Members of our Society whose circumstances, in case of continuance, would not conveniently admit of their paying more than eight shillings per week, shall be entitled to an abatement of four shillings a week for one year, if not sooner recovered. Those Patients who, by the former rule, would have been rated at four shillings per week, will, under this regulation, be admitted gratis, for a year, if necessary; but as some Patients have

me with disorders unconnected with insanity, ad which require additional expense or atindance, it is judged necessary, that, in such uses, an additional charge shall be made at its discretion of the Committee.

成正在な 5th. On the admission of Patients, the Comittee should, in general, require a certificate gned by a medical person, to the following mport: I do hereby certify, that A. B. of C, ged - years, is in a state of Insanity, and roper to be received into a House provided for he relief of persons of that description. It hould also be stated, whether the Patient is dilicted with any complaint independent of inanity. It is also desirable, that some account hould be sent, how long the Patient has been lisordered ; whether any, or what sort of mefical means have been used; and whether any the position has appeared in the Patient to inthe rate of the ra the circumstances likely to throw light on the case relative to his or her treatment.

6th. As the Committee is not to admit any Patient, on lower terms than eight shillings per week, unless recommended by the Agent of a privileged Meeting, or a Subscriber qualified according to the third Rule respecting Contributions, it is hoped that individual Subscribers will be cautions of recommending Patients whose maintenance, or any part thereof, is paid by a monthly or other Meeting, to the saving of the expense of the members of such Meetings collectively, thereby rendering it unnecessary for them to subscribe to the Institution : but no discouragement is hereby intended to the assistance of Friends whose circumstances, or those of their near connexions, are too strait to pay eight shillings per week.

7th. As in many cases, it may be difficult for the friends of Patients to procure suitable persons to conduct them to the House, it is agreed, that on application, a proper person shall be sent from the Retreat, when it is convenient: the expenses only being paid by the Patient's friends.

Sth. Though it was the original design of this Institution, to accommodate such insane persons as are members of our Society, yet it was also considered that cases may arise, wherein it may be desirable to extend such accommodation beyond the line of strict membership; but as an indiscriminate admittance of persons not

in membership, would defeat the special design of the Institution, by the exclusion of those who are members, the admitting, or not admitting of them, must always be left to the discretion of the Committee, and consequently time given for that purpose.

9th. It also appears necessary, that the sending of Patients without previous application, should, in all cases, be avoided, lest suitable accommodation be not ready for their reception; and Friends are also requested to avoid bringing Patients at late hours of the night.

10th. As circumstances may sometimes occur, wherein it is proper that the Committee should have a discretion to decline the admission of Patients, though members of our Society, especially when the House is nearly full; it is agreed to vest such discretion in the Committee, until the Quarterly or General Meeting can be consulted; which Meeting shall determine the propriety of admitting or refusing such applications.







THE Committee, in conjunction with the Friends appointed to assist in examining the Accounts of the Institution for the year ending the 31st of 3d month last, have presented a statement, by which it appears, that the Expenditure, on account of the Patients, has exceeded the Income derived from them by the sum of £641. 2s. 3d. There is also, we regret to say, notwithstanding the continued liberality of our Friends in the way of Annual Sub-

scriptions, a diminution of the property belonging to the Institution, of £261. 17s. 4d.

IT APPEARS that the House Expenses have been less during the last year than in the previous one, and that the average number of Patients has been very nearly the same. The income from them has, however, been materially less than in the preceding year, which circumstance, with the unusually small sum we have now to report under the heads of Donations and Legacies, will account for the unfavourable result of the present statement.

The Institution still remains subject to a debt of £2837. 11s. 2d. and to the payment of 5 per cent. on the sum of £4430.

Sixteen Patients have been admitted during the last year, most of them within the last three months; six have been discharged, of whom four were recovered, and the other two in rather an improved state; two have died, one of whom was 90 years of age, and had been 21 years in the Institution.

DIRECTORS AND SUBSCRIBERS

THE RETREAT,

Held at York, the 26th. of 6th. Month, 1823.

The Committee, in conjunction with the Friends appointed to examine the accounts of the Institution, up to the 31st. of 3rd. mo. last, have presented the following statement, from which it is very satisfactory to find, that the income from the Patients has considerably exceeded the expenditure on their account.

This favourable circumstance may be attributed chiefly, to an extraordinary increase in the income from the Patients, owing to there having been, in the course of the past year, an unusual proportion of

those on the higher terms. There is also a considerable diminution in the House Expenses, owing to the low prices of provisions during the past year.

The continuance of these sources of advantage is, however, obviously uncertain. During the ten years preceding the last, the expenses of the Establishment have exceeded the income derived from patients by upwards of £4300. And when it is also considered that the Institution remains subject to a debt at Interest of more than £3700, and to an annual payment of £210. 5s. 6d. to annuitants, we trust that our friends will perceive the necessity of continuing undiminished, their kind and liberal aid to the Establishment.

Agreeably to a decision of the General Meeting, the Premises occupied as an Appendage to the Institution have been let, and the patients removed to the main building. A considerable sum has been necessarily expended on the alterations and additions required by this change, but we feel no doubt that it will prove beneficial to the Establishment, as regards economical and other considerations.

A special General Meeting was held in the 3rd. month last, for the purpose of electing a Superintendent, in the room of our aged friend George Jepson, when Thomas Allis was chosen to fill the

office. He came to the Institution in the early part of the fifth month, and has had, since that time, the benefit of G. Jepson's advice and instruction. The office of Matron is to be filled by Hannah Ponsouby, who has been for many years the assistant to Catherine Jepson; and though we trust the Institution will not suffer materially by the change of its officers, we do not think it right to allow our valued friends to retire from the posts which they have filled for upwards of 26 years, without thus publicly expressing our sense of their faithful and beneficial services to the Institution.

During the past year twelve Patients have been admitted—seven have been discharged, of whom six were recovered, and one improved—two Patients have died, one of whom was 55, and the other about 84 years of age.

We mentioned in our last Report, the change of Officers which had then recently taken place; and we feel gratified in stating, that the hopes we then entertained, as to the qualifications of those who had been selected to fill the important stations of Superintendent and chatron, have not been disappointed. by a years expensence of their services. Comfact combined with economy, appears to mark the domestic management of the Establishment; whilst the system of gentlen efs united with fumnels. in the heatment of the Patients, is fully supported, and is found in the new hands, no lefs influential than it was under the administration of those, who so long proved its importance and efficiency.

At the Quarterly cheeting of the Directors and Subscribers in the 3rd month last, it was agreed to make some alterations and additions to the Buildings, which will affaid some very desirable accommodation to the Institution in the Men's side of the House, as well as provide a suitable dwelling for the family of the Superintendent.

In the course of the year we are now reviewing, 17 patients have been admitted, eight have been discharged, of whom seven were reported to be necessand. Four patients have been removed by death in the same period.

Fince the Summary of cases given in the year 1820, the proportion of recoveries has not been less satisfactory than it was in that statement, as will appear from the following table:
