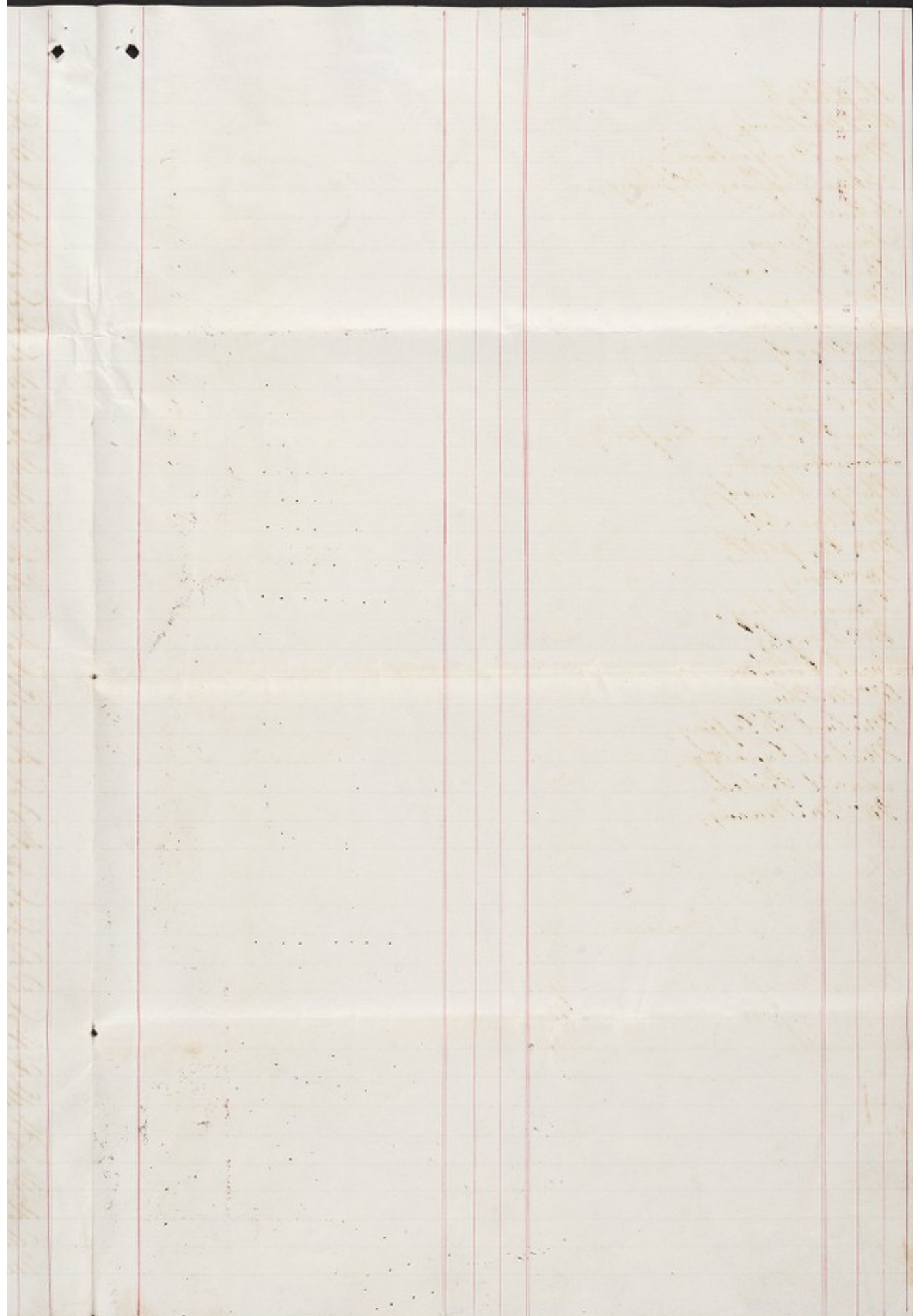

Sub-Committee appointed on 19th
March 1867. "to enquire into the cost of
maintaining the Pauper Patients, as also
the relative Profit and Loss of the East
and West Houses, and whether any savings
can be effected."

The Reporters regret that so long a time
should have elapsed without their submitting
a Report to the Weekly Committee. Various
circumstances have prevented them, the
chief unquestionably being the want of a
proper Clerk at the Asylum to assist
Mr. Caldwell, the Steward, in preparing
the necessary Returns, which they had
ordered.

The Statements founded on
these Returns and presented along with this
Report, shew very favourably for the
Asylum for the current year. But it
must be borne in mind, that at best
they are simply rough approximations.

With the view of having the
means of obtaining at all times Statements
that

that, can be relied upon, as also of preventing waste, we propose that there should be immediately procured a qualified Clerk whose duty it would be to register all supplies received at the Institution, and to record in separate Books, all Issues to the East and West Houses respectively, keeping also a third Book for Issues supplied to Officials and Visitors. Further, the Stock on hand, which is taken quarterly at present, but with no practical result, should be balanced with the Receipts and Issues.

Until some such plan is adopted it will be impossible to shew the net cost of each Patient in either of the Houses. Besides, the Steward would be enabled to give more particular attention to the affairs of the Asylum, and to prevent loss in many ways, if, instead of having so much of his time consumed in the mere mechanical labour of writing, he were free to exercise close and vigilant supervision, early and late, over every detail in his department. He would be at his post from the opening of the Store in the morning, until it was closed in the evening

evening, when not otherwise engaged in the business of the Institution.

If the Weekly Committee should approve of the recommendation above made, and have it carried into effect, it will be comparatively easy, when distinct Accounts on the plan indicated are kept of Supplies received, and balanced by issues and Stock on hand, - to ascertain the cost of the Patients, and the Profit or Loss on each House; while, at the same time, such accounts will furnish the means of checking any waste that may be going on.

Report of Sub Com^{tee} to Truckly Com^{tee}
Your Committee, ^{regret} the length of time that has
elapsed since their appointment, but various
circumstances connected with their own business
have prevented them from giving that attention
which it required but the facts and circumstances
brought before them will they trust warrant the
Committee in ~~in some~~ losing no time in acting
on their recommendation.

As you are aware they were surprised to find out
that there appears to be a loss of £27.9/- per
week on the West House. This was so contrary
to all preconceived notions that it was difficult
to give it credit but all their enquiries tend
only to confirm its truth, and this can only
be met by either increasing the rate for
board or reducing from 4/- to 10/- per patient
per week or reducing the expenditure, something
may require to be done in both directions.
The latter ^{is} the much more desirable. In
looking at some of the larger items of expen-
diture they find that every attendant in the
West House consumes $18\frac{1}{2}$ pounds of beef per day
 $4\frac{3}{4}$ ounces Tea and $3\frac{1}{2}$ half quarton ^{sup} soup per week.
Every patient consumes $15\frac{1}{4}$ ounces Beef per day 2 oz
of tea and 2 half quarton bowls per week. We
are not prepared to say what modification
is proper in these items. The Committee
will be as able to judge as we are
but they believe some modification ought to be made.
Our first recommendation is that a proper
Clerk be appointed and a sett of books
opened for West and East houses and a correct
debtor and creditor acct exhibited half yearly.
