## ROYAL INFIRMARY

OF

### EDINBURGH,

AND

### FEVER HOSPITAL CONNECTED WITH IT.

For the Year 1822.

THE ROYAL INFIRMARY OF EDINBURGH has been established above 80 years; and during that period, it has uniformly maintained its claim to the public favour. Its benefits have not been confined to Edinburgh or its neighbourhood, but have been extended to the relief of poor persons, suffering from sickness and disease, from whatever part of the kingdom they may offer.

By means of this Institution, the poor under the pressure of disease are provided with every thing that can tend to their comfort and relief; and many lives are anually saved to society through the attention and abilities of the Medical Gentlemen to whom the care of the Patients is committed. And although the cases of the persons admitted into the Royal Infirmary and Fever Hospital are generally attended with difficulty and danger, yet the Managers have the satisfaction to state, that the success of the medical and surgical practice in these Establishments continues undiminished.

The benefits of this Institution, into which during the last year, 2381 Patients have been received, must in a particular manner be felt by every Inhabitant of Edinburgh; and it has therefore a peculiar claim on them for support. Their servants are liable to sickness and accidents,—they may be seized with contagious diseases, when it would be unsafe to accommodate them in their own houses. The Royal Infirmary affords the means of seeing every faithful servant, under the pressure of pain or disease, properly cared for, and his case treated by Medical Practitioners of abilities and experience.

Besides the great benefit received by the sick poor of the country from this useful charity, the Managers beg leave to press upon the attention of the Public the vast importance resulting from it in the advancement of medical knowledge. The connection which has been always maintained betwixt the Royal Infirmary and the Medical School in the University of Edinburgh has tended essentially to the advantage of both. The students of Medicine in the University are permitted (upon paying a small gratuity to the House,) to attend the ordinary Physicians and Surgeons of the Hospital, who visit the Patients every day, examine their cases, and prescribe in presence of the Students; keeping regular journals of the progress of each disease, -of the various prescriptions, -of the effects of the Medicines, -and of the final issue of the case. The journals are open to the inspection of the Students, and they are at liberty to make extracts from them. The Managers have also, from an early period of the establishment, authorised two Professors of Medicine in the University to give Clinical Lectures on the cases of certain select Patients

in the Infirmary, entrusted to their care; and they have likewise given the same permission to the Professor of Clinical Surgery. Thus the plan of Medical education in the University has been greatly improved; and several hundreds of Students have annually an opportunity of seeing the principles and doctrines delivered in the Lectures of their Professors illustrated by practice.

Several years ago, the expense of the establishment rose to a height which its ordinary revenues were unable to bear. This was occasioned by the increased price of all sorts of provisions, of fuel, wine, and medicines, and the wages of necessary attendants.

In these circumstances, the Managers, several years ago, suggested to the Public, that after the example of various similar charities in England, the scheme of a Subscription of small sums of money, to be annually contributed for that purpose, appeared to them to be the only effectual mode of securing the permanency of this most useful Institution, and of preserving it in that flourishing state which it had hitherto maintained. For while it is by no means wished, by this suggestion, to set bounds to the benevolence of those who may be inclined to aid the Royal Infirmary by legacies, or occasional donations, the effect of an annual contribution is highly beneficial to the management of such an establishment; which, although little felt by the Contributors, insures to the Royal Infirmary a certain regularity of income, and enables the Managers to make steady, and even prospective arrangements for extending to the utmost the benefits of the establishment.

THE MANAGERS beg leave to return their most grateful thanks to the Contributors for their liberal support since that period, which has enabled them to meet all the increased expenses, without restricting the number of Patients, or diminishing the benefits of the Institution in any instance whatever, either in the Royal Infirmary, or Fever Hospital at Queensberry House Barracks. But as many of the reasons which induced the Managers to apply at that time still continue, they are under the necessity of again requesting the attention of the Public to the important Institution under their care, and that beneficent countenance which may enable them to carry forward its most useful designs. And the Contributors may rest assured, that while the comfort and well-being of the Patients are the objects of the care and solicitude of the Managers, the funds which may be placed under their charge will be carefully and faithfully applied for the relief and comfort of the diseased poor.

CONTRIBUTIONS for this purpose will be received by Francis Wilson, Writer to the Signet, Treasurer; and at all the Banks and Banking-houses in Edinburgh and Leith.

THE Contributions will be regularly called for from the Contributors residing in Edinburgh and Leith: And it is particularly requested, that the Annual Contributors who reside at a distance, would be pleased to signify the names of their agents, or other persons in Edinburgh, to whom applications for payment of their contributions may be made.

N. B.—Linen Rags, Old Sheets, Shirts, or Table-Cloths, are constantly required in the Infirmary, and will at all times be most thankfully received by the Matron.
