Three Circumstances are to be attended to:

Whether the Distortion is in the upper or lower Aperture, or in both.

Thus, the *Cranium* can enter the *Brim*, or it can not enter the *Brim*; or the *Head* will be kept fixed within the lower Aperture of the *Pelvis*.

According to these various Degrees, become necessary,

The *Forceps*, the *one Blade* of the same, *Roonbuisen's Lever*, or my own. *Dr. Smellie's Perforating Scissars*, the *Cæsarean Operation*, or the *Sectio Ossis Pubis*.

A few Hints and Suggestions thrown out, as probably more adviseable for the Mother's and Child's Preservation, and therefore more eligible.

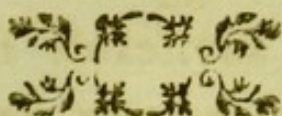
