
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

P R E F A C E .

THE following Tables have been compiled with a view of facilitating the comparison of the internal economy of the various medical charities in the kingdom. They were originally intended for publication in the "Journal of the Statistical Society," but as it was found that they would occupy too much space in that periodical, it was thought advisable to publish them in a separate form. They are taken in all cases from the annual reports of the institutions, and are, unless otherwise stated, for the year 1863.

Table I. will show the number of cases treated, the rate of mortality, average cost of In and Out patients, and per bed, with the total expenditure, and the cost of the various articles of diet, medicine, &c. Here it may be observed, that the sum of the items and the total expenses will differ slightly, as it was not thought necessary to enter the small bills.

The average cost per Out-patient has been taken from a proportion of the amount expended in drugs, printing and advertising, and salaries and wages. The In-patients' mean cost from the remainder of the expenditure. This, though open to many objections, has been deemed the fairest division that could be obtained for the sake of uniformity.

The mean rate of mortality per cent. is taken from the number of deaths, and the total number of cases treated; no "bed-rate" has been given, as it is obvious that in many country hospitals, where perhaps only half the number of beds are occupied at a time, the rate would be much lower than it should be, while in others, where the beds are constantly full, it would be correspondingly high. The *average* number of In-patients can only be obtained in a few instances.

The number of persons on the staff of each establishment has been added, also, in some cases, a few notes taken from Dr Richardson's very interesting "Medical History of England" now publishing in the "Medical Times and Gazette."

Table II. shows the operations performed during the year, with the results and rate of mortality. Unfortunately but few charities furnish information of this kind.

Table III. is a list of the diseases, &c., for which a large number of the cases were treated, some as In, but principally as Out, or Home patients. The exclusive rules of the provincial charities account for the small number of cases of Venereal Disease, Phthisis, Dropsy, &c. The same cause partly explains the variation in the death-rate.

Table IV. shows the number of operations performed in the larger hospitals, with the results.

It will be observed that in some charities the domestic arrangements and nursing are placed under the control of a lady-superintendent, having a housekeeper under her. This plan seems to give the greatest satisfaction to all concerned, and a much higher moral tone pervades the establishment than when under the management of a matron.

The number of patients a nurse is supposed to be capable of attending to varies most widely;¹ one nurse to every ten patients (provided that they are all in one ward and can be properly overlooked) at least, is required.

The wards are generally much smaller in the provincial hospitals than in London. In St Bartholomew's they all contain 26 beds. In Lynn the largest ward contains only 8; the average 4.72 beds.

"The least administrative form of hospital," says Miss Nightingale, "is the long corridor with wards of from eight to ten patients, opening off one side, attendance—meaning, of course, due attention to the patients, suitably superintended—becomes almost impossible, especially at night."²

The cubic space allowed ranges from 350 cubic feet, as at Lynn, to 1852, as at Brighton. In the new Herbert Hospital¹ at Woolwich, 95 superficial, and 1300 cubic feet are allowed, and in the Lariboisière Hospital, Paris, 1760 cubic feet per bed. In some of the London hospitals even 2000 cubic feet is not thought too much.²

The dietaries vary greatly. St Bartholomew's full diet (male) consists of half a pound of meat, and half a pound of potatoes (when cooked), two pints of beer, one ounce of butter, two pints of tea, and fourteen ounces of bread, daily. Lynn—full diet, of two pints of milk, fourteen ounces of bread, and half an ounce of butter; with, on alternate days, six ounces of meat and six ounces of potatoes (when cooked). The other days the men have twelve, and the women eight, ounces of pudding, instead of meat and potatoes—a much cheaper scale.

The wide variation in the average cost of patients, or, in other words, in the utilisation of the funds, would point to a great necessity for a general inspector, appointed by Government or some central body, to act as a check upon the local committees, and to endeavour, by annual comparison with other institutions similarly situated, to economise or obtain the greatest good out of the least possible expenditure of money; or, at all events, to secure a proper and uniform set of records being kept in each charity. In a medical point of view, it would be of the greatest advantage to obtain the results of the practice of the various hospital physicians and surgeons, the operations, &c., as at present no sufficient account is kept of the cases treated in most Hospitals.

That some institutions are susceptible of great improvement, is shown in the case of the Lynn Hospital, where the average costs have been reduced nearly fifty per cent. as compared with the previous twelve months.

² Dr Parkes (Practical Hygiene, p. 299) says: "Each bed to have from 87 to 110 feet of superficial space (viz. for strict regulation 12 feet in the width of a ward of 24 feet, and 7.25 feet in its length = 87 square feet), and 1500 to 2000 cubic space. The medical regulations fix 1200 of cubic space. A ward to have only two rows of beds—20 patients—should be 80 feet long, 25 or 26 broad, and 15 or 16 high. But as the regulations give only 1200 cubic feet, a ward for 20 men is 72.5 feet long, 24 wide, and 14 high; one window to every two beds; each window to be about 10 feet high, to be double, or of plate glass; to open near the ceiling. The walls to be of impermeable material, so as to be non-absorbent and easily washed. The floor to be of dense wood (oak preferred); the joints to be perfectly closed with impermeable cement; *not to be scoured; to be kept clean by waxing and rubbing.*"

In the year 1863 there were treated in the hospitals, dispensaries, &c., of England and Wales (exclusive of clubs, poor-law medical relief, &c.), nearly two millions of patients, at a cost of about half a million sterling. Surely this sum is large enough to warrant careful supervision.¹

The practice of admitting patients who are in receipt of parish relief is much too common; it merely burdens the charity with expenses which should properly be met by the unions.

Dr Richardson very justly remarks that the average cost per patient per week in asylums, where the medical men are remunerated, is about eight shillings, while a patient in an hospital where the professional staff attend gratuitously, costs twelve shillings, or fifty per cent. more. Would it not be well to try if having a paid medical staff in a general hospital would not really be to the interest, financially, of the institution?




