The second mess to dine from 2.20 pm. 3. O'clock until 2.50.
3. At each mess a senior Charge Attendant shall preside, who will be held responsible for the general good order which should prevail.
4. In order to facilitate the general comfort of the Attendants, the messes shall alternate each week commencing on Sunday.
5. No attendant shall be absent from the mess unless through illness, leave of absence, or by permission of the Medical Superintendent.
6. No food, plates, knives & forks, or any utensils or property shall be removed from the Dining Table.
7. The Attendants are expected to see that all the property in this Room which has been provided for their comfort, is used with every proper care, and on all occasions the attendants are expected to behave with every decorum whilst using the Room.

8. No furniture, Books, papers or other property shall be removed from the sitting Room, and the Room must be closed at 10.15 pm. Every evening, except under any special circumstances, for which the permission of the Medical Superintendent must be obtained.

In reference to your letter of the 24th ultimo, I beg to state that the Town Council resolved some months ago to erect a Dust Destructor but there being a difficulty in obtaining a suitable site they determined to temporarily deposit the House Refuse at Nether Court Farm. The tenant is under a covenant with the Corporation to deal with it immediately upon its being deposited in such a manner that no nuisance shall arise from it, and this he is now doing. The great distance of the spot from any other premises or dwelling houses and the conditions under which the deposit is dealt with prevent the possibility of any nuisance excepting under almost improbable circumstances which the Corporation by exercising their powers will take every care to prevent and they consider the present place a suitable and proper place for the purpose while they are making their further arrangements. I should add that the whole of the fish offal is collected daily including Sundays by a separate Contractor and conveyed immediately from the Borough. The deposit of fish offal you refer to took

place on one occasion only and by an oversight.
 To day the Corporation agreed to purchase a
 piece of land, part of Whitehall Farm, upon
 which to erect a Dust Destructor and in
 the course of a very few months the work will
 be carried out, and any cause of fear - really
 quite groundless, which your Clients may
 have from the present deposit will be removed.
