PREFACE.

The following List of Outlines, etc., has been compiled for the Society of Medical Phonographers.

A special acknowledgement is due to Messrs. Sir Isaac Pitman & Sons for permitting the issue of the List. Thanks are due to them also for permitting a few slight deviations from the authorized system which are rendered desirable by the exigencies of some medical terms. These are enumerated in the Introduction.

It is probable that some inconsistencies in outlines will attract attention. These have been adopted after careful consideration, for reasons which would be probably satisfactory to all, did space permit them to be mentioned. It should be added that, in every case, great weight has been given to the outlines in the "Phonographic Dictionary," and these have been departed from only where such departure is rendered necessary by the frequency of certain words, or by the great importance, in many cases, of absolute distinction between outlines liable to be confounded in medical writing.

Although this List of Outlines has been the subject of almost continuous attention for twelve months, the compilers are conscious that it leaves much to be desired. They wish it to be known that the List has been compiled for general professional use; those members of the profession who are accustomed to employ terms not needed by the majority, must not expect to find them in the list. It is hoped that such needs may be hereafter met.

INTRODUCTION.

The words are arranged in alphabetical order, with the exception of the singular and plural forms of the same words, which are placed together.

The shorthand outlines within brackets, after the first outline and before the longhand, are contractions. Those within brackets *after* the longhand words are outlines which involve danger of confusion. These will often show the reason for the choice of the special outline.

Words in general use, the outlines for which are well known, are not given.

The deviations from the authorized system are the following:—

1. The use of the reversed *thl* necessary for *ophthalmia* and its compounds, and convenient for *thalamus*, etc.
2. For the diphthong *ui* an old and convenient sign is used (see *acuity* and *bruit*).
3. The use of the downward initial *r* in a few cases.
4. The use of the upward final *r* in some cases, as in *tumour*, *mature*, on account of the frequency of the words, and the inconvenience of the downward *r*.
5. The employment of the double length *ng* to add *tr*, as in *tincture*, *sphincter*.

Other deviations are unimportant, such as the freer use of the initial downward *h* instead of the tick *h* when needful emphasis or distinctness can be thus conveyed.

CONTRACTIONS.—The object of this list is to furnish writers with the best outlines, rather than to give contracted forms on an extensive scale. Many frequent words, however, need contractions, and, in a considerable number of words, single and compound, the best contractions are given. In addition to these, certain systematic contractions often needed have been indicated. Since they may be used extensively, they are here enumerated.

Tumour or *Tumour of*.—The stroke for *t* may be employed for *tumour* before, or immediately after an outline, or intersected through the first or last consonant of a word consisting of at least two full consonants. Prefixed or intersected through the first consonant it indicates *tumour of*; affixed or intersected through the last consonant it indicates *tumour*.

Tincture of.—The same letter *t*, prefixed or intersected, indicates *tincture of*.

It will not be found that confusion arises from this double use of *t*, the related words being wholly distinct.

In no case should this or any contraction-consonant be intersected through an outline which consists of a single full consonant; the contraction must be then prefixed or affixed. If it were intersected through *brain*, it would be doubtful whether *tumour of the brain* or *brain tumour* was meant.

In the same way, and subject to the same limitation :—

Hypertrophy (of the) may be indicated by the tick *h pr* ;

Paralysis by the hooked *pr* ;

Reflex by the upward *r* ;

Murmur by the hook *mr*, affixed.

Regurgitation may be indicated by the contraction given under the word, joined to the preceding word.


Other points to which attention may be directed are the following :—

The termination *sis* is indicated by a large circle without a vowel, and *ses* by the same with the vowel within it. Whenever convenient, the words ending in *sis*, which have a plural form in *ses* have been written with a small circle *s* and the downward terminal *s*, on account of the convenience of thickening the letter to indicate the *z* sound, which is invariable in the plural and absent in the singular.

Acid and *soda* may be represented with perfect safety by the joined circle *s* and *d*, because the word *acid* invariably follows the letter *k*, while (*of*) *soda* invariably follows a word ending in *t* and signifying a compound of the acid.

There is a tendency, which is not unnatural but is not wise, to the premature adoption of contractions and phraseograms by those who would do better to be content for a time with the brevity and ease obtainable without special contractions, which diminish legibility. It is proposed, however, to issue subsequently a list of the more useful phraseograms and of some further contractions.


