

Dental College of the Province of Quebec.

The Dental College of the Province of Quebec was established in the year 1892, by the Dental Association of the Province of Quebec, and was affiliated to the University of Bishop's College in 1895, for the purpose of conferring the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery (D.D.S.)

The course of instruction is in accordance with the requirements of the National Association of Dental Faculties of the United States, to which Association the College is applying for membership.

MATRICULATION.

All candidates for admission, except those who are graduates in Arts or Medicine of any British or Canadian University, must pass the matriculation examination of the Dental Association of the Province of Quebec, before they can register as students of this College.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

FOR

ADMISSION TO THE STUDY OF DENTISTRY,

FOR ENGLISH-SPEAKING CANDIDATES.

Latin—Cæsar's Commentaries, Book I, with Virgil's Aneid, Book I. Questions of Grammar and Construction.

English—Writing from Dictation. Grammar and Analysis. A critical knowledge of one of Shakespeare's Plays. Julius Cæsar for 1894. Cymbeline for 1895.

French—Translation into English of extracts from Fénélon's "Aventures de Télémaque." Questions of Grammar.

Literature—Elements of the subject, with the History of English Literature from the reign of Queen Elizabeth to the present time.

History- Britain, France, Canada.

Geography—Modern, especially of Britain and France, and of their Colonies and Possessions.

Arithmetic—To the end of Square Root, and to include a knowledge of the Metrical System.

Algebra—To Simultaneous Equations of the first degree, inclusive.

Geometry—Euclid, Books I, II, III, and the first twenty Propositions of Book VI; also the measurement of the Surfaces and Volumes of the regular geometrical figures.

Note.—The above subjects are obligatory. In addition to them, Candidates must choose one of the two following:—

Philosophy-Logic, and Intellectual and Moral Philosophy.

Physics—Elementary Statics and Dynamics of Solids and Fluids, with the Chapter on Heat.

Français—Dictée. Questions sur la grammaire. Analyse critique du Bourgeois Gentilhomme pour 1895.

Histoire d'Angleterre, de France et du Canada.

Géographie moderne, principalement de l'empire Britannique, de la France et de leurs colonies.

Littérateur—Eléments ; Histoire de la littérateur française depuis le règne de Louis XIV.

Arithmétique, jusqu'à la racine carrée inclusivement; système métrique. Algébre, jusqu'aux équations à deux inconnues du premier degré inclusivement.

Géométrie—Euclide, livres I, II, III, et les vingt premières propositions du livre VI; mesure de la surface et du volume des corps géométriquement réguliers. On peut remplacer Euclide par Esséric, chapitres I, II, III de la géométrie plane, et chap. II de la géométrie dans l'espace.

Note.—Les matières qui précédent seront obligatoires. Les candidats devront, en outre, choisir un des deux sujets suivants :

Philosophie—Logique, Métaphysique, Morale.

Physique—Statique et Dynamique des corps solides, liquides et gazeux ; chaleur.

INDENTURES.

Students who intend to practice in the Province of Quebec, must sign indentures with a licentiate of Dental Surgery in active practice in the Province, at the beginning of their College course. The Dental Act requires three full years as an indentured student after the matriculation has been passed.

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

FIRST YEAR.—Anatomy (including dissection), Physiology, Chemistry, Histology and Embryology, Dental Technique.

Second Year.—Anatomy, Physiology, Chemistry, Operative and Mechanical Dentistry, Dental Technique, Dental Pathology and Therapeutics, Surgical Pathology, Dental Surgery and Anæsthetics, Orthodontia, Dental Materia Medica.

THIRD YEAR.—Operative and Mechanical Dentistry, Crown and Bridge Work, and the Dental subjects of the Second Year.

ANATOMY.—Gray, Quain, Tome's Dental Anatomy.

Histology—Schæfer's Essentials.

Physiology.—Foster's, Kirke's Handbook. Chemistry.—Wittham's Medical Students Manual of Chemistry, Mitchell's Dental Chemistry.

Surgery.—Harris' Dental Surgery. Smale and Colyer's Diseases and Injuries of the Teeth. Garretson's Oral Surgery.

Dental Pathology.—Miller's Micro-Organism's of the Human Mouth.

Dental Surgery and Anæsthetics.—Tomes' Dental Surgery. Anstie's

Stimulants and Narcotics.

OPERATIVE DENTISTRY. -- American System. Fillebrown's. MECHANICAL DENTISTRY.—Richardson's. Kingsley's Oral Deformities.

INSTRUMENTS.

Extracting instruments, vulcanizers and lathes are supplied by the College. The student will be required to furnish all other instruments for Operative Dentistry and tools for laboratory. Lists of necessary tools and instruments may be obtained from the Superintendent.

DISCIPLINE.

The following rules have been adopted:

1.—No smoking or spitting will be permitted in the building.

2.—Every Student must attend at least 80 per cent. of the lectures unless specially excused by the Faculty.

3.—Students will be held responsible for any breakage or injury to

4.—No patient will be assigned to any Student until he has satisfied the

Superintendent that he has the necessary appliances and instruments.

5.—Students are required to attend promptly to every patient assigned to them, to be punctual in keeping their appointments, kind and courteous in their manner. Any failure in these respects will render the Student liable to be removed from the list of Infirmary Operators.

6.—No student shall engage in practice for his own pecuniary benefit either in the Infirmary or elsewhere. Violation of this rule will subject the

offender to immediate suspension.

7.—The Superintendent will keep a record of all operations performed

by each Student.

8.—The Dean is authorized to suspend any Student for violation of any of the above rules.

REQUIREMENTS FOR DEGREE.

The University of Bishop's College will confer the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery on all Students who have fulfilled the following requirements:-

1st. - Must be of full age of 21 years. 2nd.—Must be of good moral character. 3rd, -Must have passed matriculation.

4th. —Must have completed full term of three years.

5th. —Must have paid all fees, and passed all examinations.
