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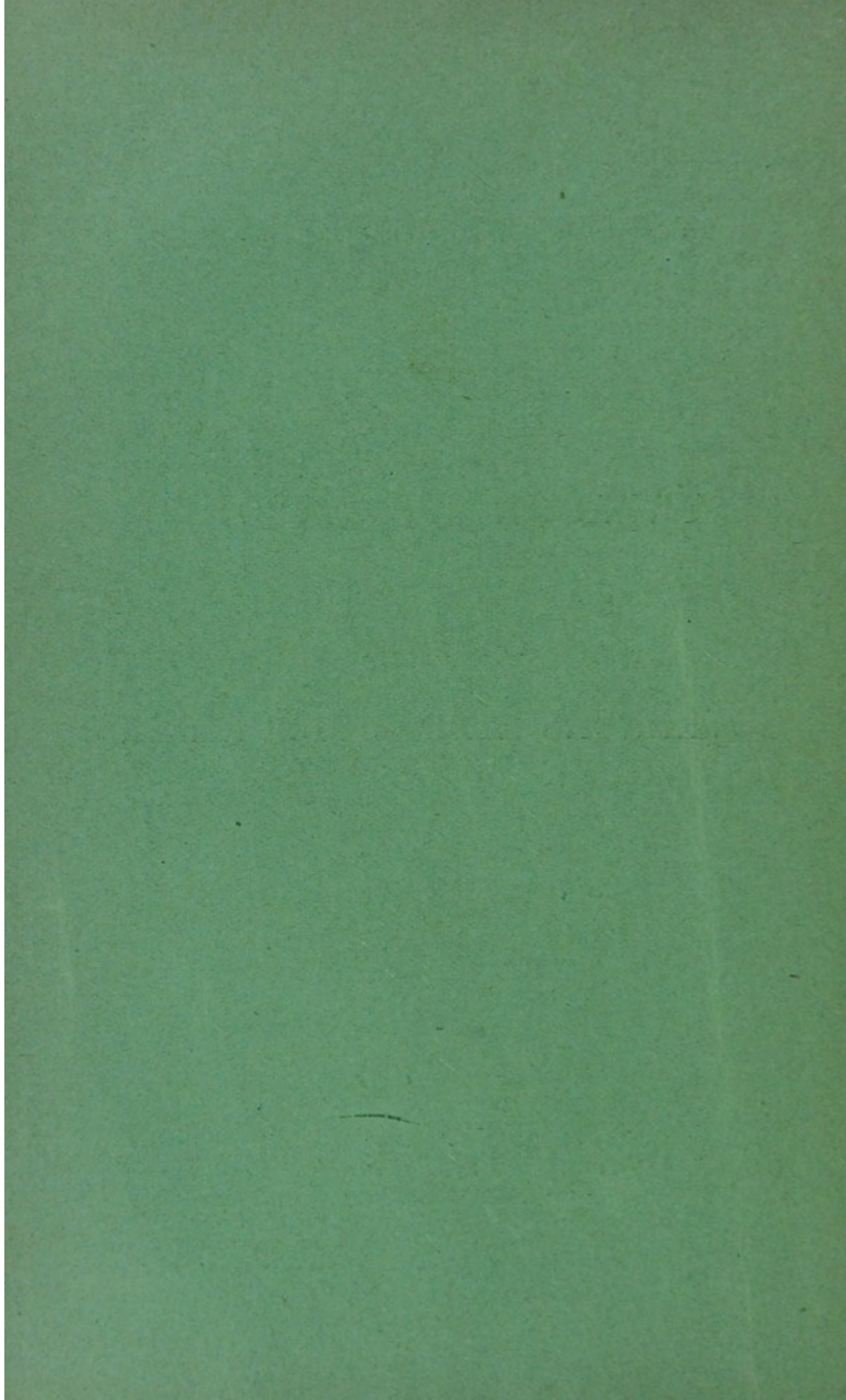
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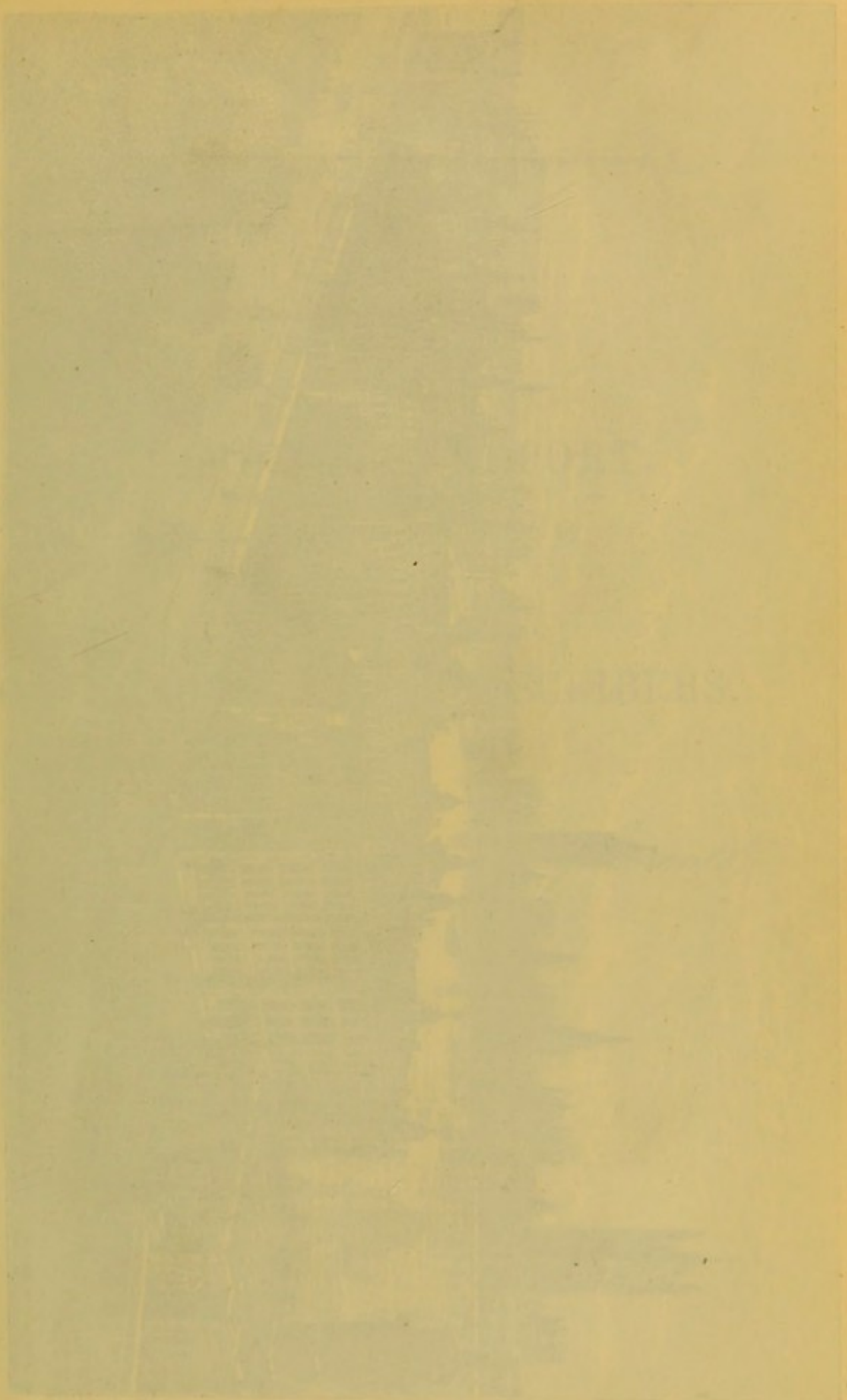

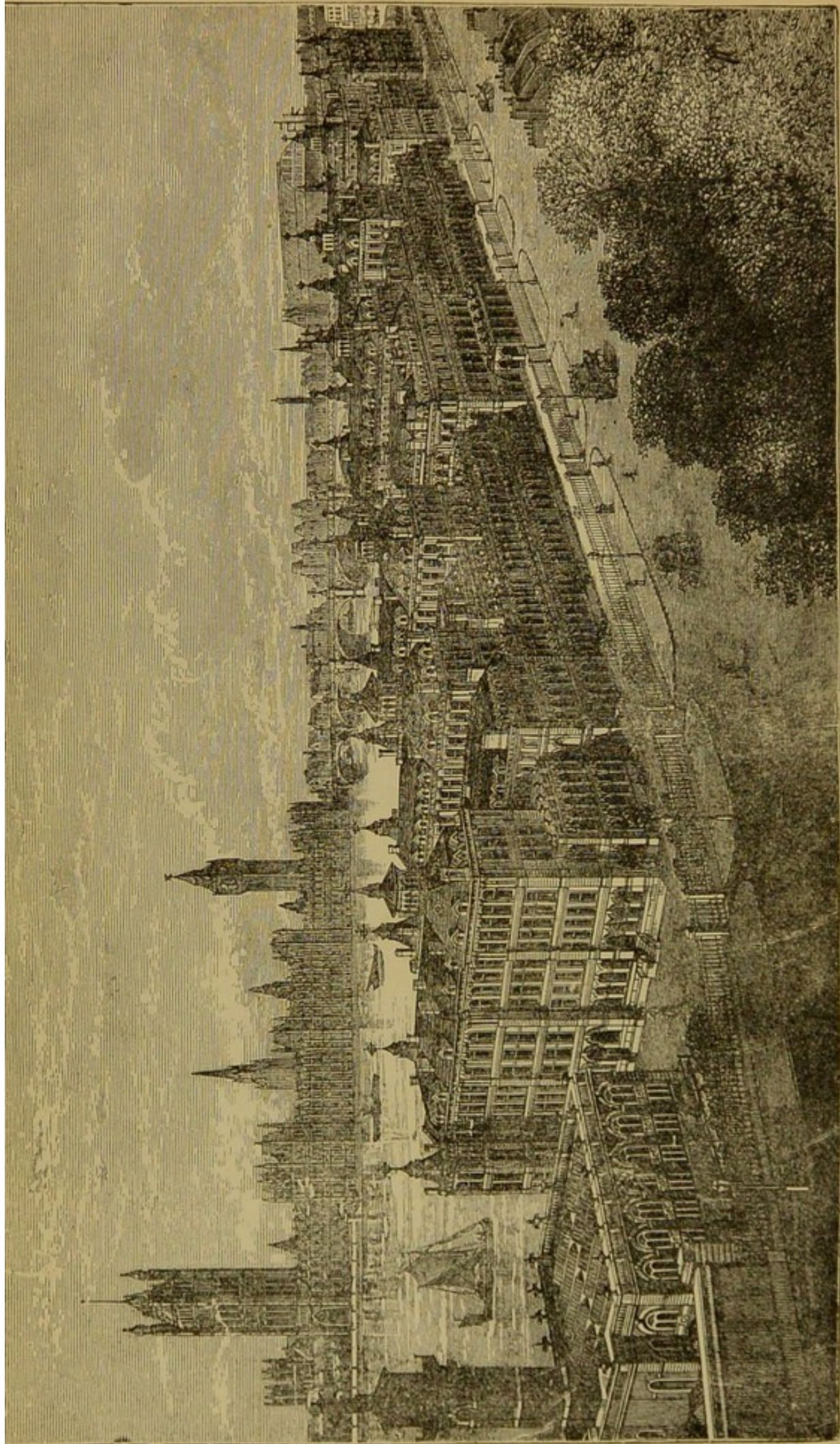

VIEW OF ST. THOMAS'S HOSPITAL FROM THE SOUTH-EAST.

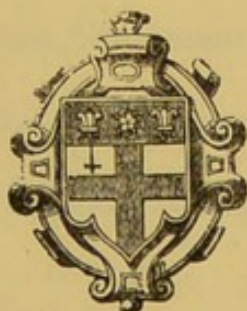

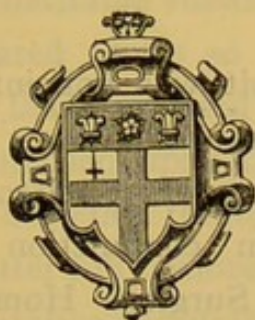

TREASURER'S REPORT.

In my last Report I drew attention to some structural alterations and improvements which the modern requirements of operative surgery and the increase in the number of the patients and the Nursing Staff had rendered urgent. I am glad to be able to say that considerable progress has been made with some of these alterations.

Two operating theatres are rapidly approaching completion, and as soon as these are in use the other two will be taken in hand, when an opportunity will be afforded of dealing effectively with the Casualty Department, the congested condition of which renders it impossible to deal satisfactorily with this large class of patients.

I am glad to say we have now completed an efficient system of steam disinfection for bedding and clothing, another of the wants I referred to in last year's report.

I am hoping that we may shortly be able to turn our attention to providing better accommodation for our nurses, particularly by the erection of a Nurses' Dining Hall. At present the Matron's offices have to be used for this purpose, and, in consequence, considerable inconvenience and discomfort is experienced.

During the year the following have been the changes in our staff:—

Mr. F. C. Abbott was appointed Assistant-Surgeon, and amongst our Nurses we have lost Miss K. Wrigley, who was appointed Matron of Cheltenham Hospital; Miss M. Allardice, who, in conjunction with Miss J. Boyd-Carpenter, opened a Surgical Home for Children; Miss Strangman, who offered her services to the War Department for work in South Africa, and Miss J. James, who was appointed Matron of Halifax Infirmary.

In response to an appeal by H.M.'s Secretary of State for War shortly after the outbreak of hostilities, twenty-five beds were placed at the disposal of the War Department, but so far no cases have been received.

I am sure all will appreciate the self-sacrificing devotion shown by our late Senior Surgeon, Sir William MacCormac, and Mr. G. H. Makins, one of our present staff of surgeons, in placing their services at the disposal of the Government.

I am also pleased to report that in addition to these, our Resident Assistant Surgeon, Mr. C. Wallace, and some twenty-five other old students, together with five of our Nursing Staff, are devoting themselves to the care of our wounded and sick soldiers in South Africa.

Many will, no doubt, remember the appeal of the Governors to the House of Lords, some years ago, for the exemption of this hospital from the payment of rates, the failure of which largely contributed to the closure of some of the wards. Until 1865 Hospital buildings were not considered to be rateable, but in that year it was decided by the House of Lords in a case relating to the Mersey Docks, that properties producing no profit to the owners were under the Act of

Queen Elizabeth rateable to the relief of the poor, and thus Hospitals and other Charitable Institutions were for the first time incidentally declared to be so rateable. The Central Hospital Council has lately devoted much attention to the serious burden thus imposed upon the hospitals, and at its invitation a number of hospitals throughout the country have joined in laying the matter fully before Her Majesty's Government. A very representative deputation recently waited upon the President of the Local Government Board, when the matter was very fully laid before Mr. Chaplin, who in response assured the deputation of his sympathy with the movement, and promised that it should receive very careful consideration.

Owing to the necessity of carrying out some important sanitary changes in some of the wards during the year there has been a slight falling off in the number of In-patients treated; but some idea of the present demands upon the resources of the Hospital will be gathered from the fact that in 1872 the number of patients treated was only 46,496, whilst this year no fewer than 71,771 cases have been relieved. This large increase in the number of patients and the consequent necessary increase of the nursing staff, combined with the modern requirements of surgical and sanitary science, have necessitated large outlays on the internal rearrangements of the building, and added considerably to the ordinary annual expenditure. The latter cannot now be taken at less than £49,000, and the average income during the past five years from the ancient endowments and invested funds has been about £42,000. The Charity is therefore largely dependent upon voluntary contributions and legacies, not only to meet the Ordinary Expenditure, but also the occasional Extraordinary Expenditure required to enable the Hospital to maintain its position among the leading hospitals of our country.

I would therefore plead earnestly with our large body of Governors to use their influence to attract a greater interest in this ancient and Royal hospital, for whilst I am thankful for the help already afforded, I desire it to be noticed in the list of contributors the regular subscribers number only 136, and the amount received from this reliable source amounts to only £631 10s. per annum.

Turning to the Bed Endowment Fund it will be noticed that two beds were anonymously endowed in perpetuity in the early part of the year by two of our Governors, who have been on other occasions most liberal supporters of the Fund, and another Governor has generously undertaken to maintain a bed by an annual subscription of £50.

Legacies this year show an increase of £9,823, above the average for the preceding five years, and have proved of considerable service towards meeting the Extraordinary Expenditure now being incurred, but as the completion of the works in hand will entail an expenditure of upwards of £26,000, I sincerely hope that some large contributions will be received this year to supplement the falling off in the legacies and benefactions which, partly owing to the calls upon the public for help in connection with the needs of our soldiers and sailors engaged in the maintenance of the Empire in South Africa, must, I fear, be expected.

The numbers given in the above returns are those of the new cases only. The attendances at the Out-patient Department for the year 1899 numbered 55,098, which, added to 94,836 casualties attended to and dispensed for at the Surgery, give a total of 149,934 patients who were seen at the Hospital during the year, or an average of 479 persons per day.

The attendances at the homes of the maternity cases are estimated at 17,297, the number of women attended being 2,471.

The following Extract from the Register of Patients under treatment at the Hospital on one day shows the great importance of this Charity to the country at large, for whilst most of the Out-Patients were inhabitants of the Metropolis, more than $\frac{1}{4}$ th of the In-Patients came up from the provincial towns and villages scattered throughout the United Kingdom.

3. The ordinary Puddings are made with Bread, Rice, Sago, Tapioca, Hominy, Corn Flour, Vermicelli, or some such material.
4. Beef and Mutton are given in rotation. The Mutton is alternately roasted (or baked) and boiled.
Cold Meat on Sundays.
5. For Children under 10 years of age, the above Diets are modified in the following respects ; for Breakfast and Tea, Milk, O $\frac{1}{2}$; for Dinner, Barley-Water, Gruel or Milk, O $\frac{1}{2}$, and half rations of Meats and Soups.

Wine, Brandy, Gin, Porter, Mutton Chops, Fish, Eggs, Beef Tea, Soda Water, Lemonade, and other extras to be served when specially ordered, such order being renewed at each regular visit of the Physician or Surgeon.

N.B.—Each Patient on admission is to be placed on Milk or Fever Diet, until the proper Diet is ordered by the Physician or Surgeon.

On the Full Diet the larger quantities are for Males, and the smaller for Females.

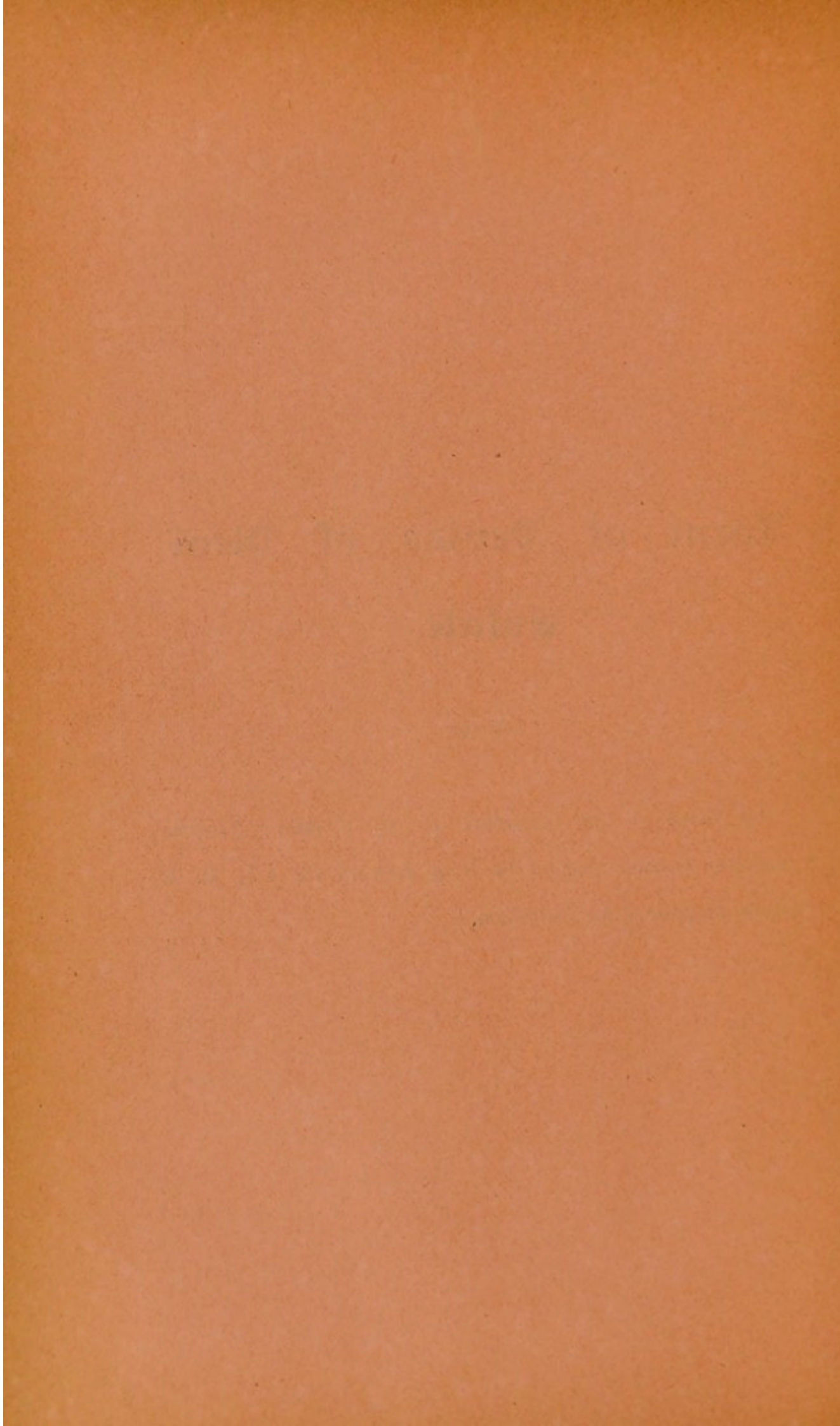
