THE Weekly Board of Governors of St. George's Hospital having balanced the Receipts and Expenditure of the past year, deem it highly desirable that the result of their proceedings should be submitted to the numerous Benefactors and Subscribers to an Institution which, from its commencement, has been supported solely by the voluntary contributions of an enlightened and benevolent Public.

The principal object of this Charity is to relieve the poor and laborious classes of society, who are entirely dependent on their manual exertions for the precarious subsistence of themselves and their families. While blessed with health and strength, industrious habits may possibly exempt them from the extremes of absolute destitution; but when disabled, by accident or disease, from following their humble occupations, they are necessarily at once reduced to the most abject poverty, and become objects of the greatest sympathy and commiseration.

It appears, however, by no means desirable that the benefits accruing from this Institution should be restricted to individuals of the foregoing description—on the contrary, it is obvious that there are numerous instances of persons in better, and in cases of accident, still superior circumstances, to whom this species of relief may prove

highly beneficial, if not absolutely necessary—take for example the small shopkeepers, or the inferior artizans, who may possibly be just enabled to support themselves and their children in comparative decency and comfort, till disease or other infirmity visit their humble dwelling. In such instances, the means of subsistence become (from a variety of circumstances) necessarily diminished, while the expenditure must as unavoidably increase, and, in cases of protracted suffering befalling either the father or the mother, a whole family may be too frequently reduced to either a lower situation in society, or be suddenly brought to a state of actual starvation and ruin, if left unaided by an Institution of this description.

It must also be remembered that individual benevolence, singly exerted, cannot prove of very extensive benefit in a large and populous city like London, since any direct benefaction in money to the poor and afflicted, unless applied on so large a scale as can rarely be expected, must prove wholly inadequate to defray even the common charge of proper diet, medicine and attendance; on the other hand, in an establishment of this nature, every single contribution is rendered fully effective; for the amount so collected, being large enough to establish and maintain an extensive system of relief, is calculated to afford a far more efficacious and permanent benefit to a larger number of distressed objects than could be derived in any single instance, from the insulated exertions of individual benevolence.

By bringing together into one place the numerous objects of public charity, they are placed within such limits

as to insure them the best medical and surgical advice; and, in all cases of difficulty and danger, the sufferers have the advantage of a course of treatment formed on the deliberate consultations of the most eminent men in the profession. They are at once removed from all the misery and embarrassments with which they would probably have to contend in their own humble abodes, and are regularly supplied with proper food, of good quality, while the best medicines are sure to be skilfully administered on every emergency; besides the great advantage of having clean and regular attendance from females well practised in nursing the sick, and of approved diligence and tenderness.

Another important feature in this Institution is, the provision which exists for the spiritual instruction of its inmates. There is a Resident Chaplain appointed, whose duty it is constantly to instruct and to administer the consolations of religion; prayers are daily read in the wards; Divine Service is performed twice each Sunday, and the Lord's Supper is administered on the first Sunday of every month.

The patients are all supplied with Bibles, and with religious and instructive books, during their residence in the House. A season of affliction has been often found to be peculiarly suited for the reception of the great truths of Christianity; and as it is the object of this Institution to impart relief to the poor and the distressed, and consequently to many who have perhaps had but little opportunity of attending to the duties of religion, it is to be hoped that through the blessing of Almighty God it may thus be made instrumental in imparting to them the

knowledge of the Gospel, and in stimulating them to a walk and conversation becoming its profession.

These are some among the advantages afforded by St. George's Hospital to the general cases of distress which are continually received within its walls. About 350 patients are now constantly accommodated in the House, and no trouble nor expense is spared, which can administer to their comfort, or insure their recovery; but after all that had been accomplished by the zeal and benevolence of the supporters of the Institution, something appeared to be still wanting which might give greater effect to the Charity. It was found that many of those patients who had received benefit, were, on their discharge from the Hospital, temporarily disabled from resuming their customary occupations, and were in consequence involved in deep distress, when least able to encounter its pressure; it being frequently noticed that those who were dismissed in a convalescent state (though still suffering from the debilitating effects of recent sickness and long confinement, and incapable of immediate exertion) were exposed to all the miseries attendant upon helpless poverty; a recurrence of their complaint, with increased violence, became almost the necessary consequence, and, in some instances, the unhappy sufferers again returned to the Hospital merely to die-all of which melancholy results might have been avoided, could a small pecuniary assistance have been afforded when the patients were first discharged from the House.

A deep sense of the importance of the facts contained in this statement, induced the Governors some years ago to establish a Convalescent Fund, and the attention of the wealthy and benevolent is respectfully, but most earnestly called to a consideration of the claims which that Fund possesses to the support of the Public.

Donations and Annual Subscriptions are received in aid of this Fund.

The funds are applied by the Weekly Board for the benefit of convalescent patients and others, for or towards any of the following objects:—-

Sending patients to the sea-side or the country, and, when necessary, boarding them.

The purchase of clothing.

The expense of removing patients to their homes.

The expense of boarding convalescents in the neighbourhood of the Hospital, or elsewhere, until they shall be able to work, and of supplying small sums of money to patients leaving the House, to assist in maintaining them until they are able to return to their ordinary work.

The expense of trusses, or other instruments for the security or convenience of such poor persons as any of the Physicians or Assistant Physicians, or Surgeons and Assistant Surgeons shall recommend; provided that the person so applying shall pay one half of the cost thereof unto the Treasurers, for the use of the Fund, except that where special circumstances shall occur, the Weekly Board shall have power to order the payment of the whole or any part thereof out of the Fund.

Hitherto, in this Account of St. George's Hospital, it has been viewed altogether as an organized system of charity, the benefits of which are chiefly extended to the distressing cases of the indigent and the helpless, and this indeed is the *direct* object of the Institution; but there are other collateral advantages to the Public in general which ought not to be passed over unnoticed.

The sciences of Medicine and Surgery are mostly of a practical nature, and although skilful and elaborate treatises may be written on these subjects, yet like treatises on Chemistry they must be comparatively useless unless the study of them has been repeatedly combined with practical illustrations of the truths they discuss. Viewing, then, St. George's Hospital in the light of an extensive school for the study of medicine and surgery, it has an additional claim on the liberality of the Public for its support. It is principally by Institutions of this kind that the desideratum just alluded to in the education of the medical and surgical student must be supplied. In them illustrations of almost every peculiarity of disease are constantly presented to the contemplation of the pupil, who not only has the opportunity of watching it through all its stages, but also the advantage of observing the course of treatment adopted by the most celebrated men in the profession, and of having their views on the subject explained to him.

It is by these means that the skill of the most eminent practitioners of the day is ultimately made subservient to the benefit of the ensuing generation. Students educated under such advantageous circumstances may afterwards with safety be distributed over the country as the guardians of the lives of the Public; and while the *direct* benefits of such Institutions are visible in their effects upon thousands, their indirect advantages may probably be felt by millions.

One circumstance which, under the blessing of Providence, has tended greatly to increase the prosperity of this Institution must not pass without acknowledgment—St. George's Hospital, from its commencement, has always been favoured by Royal Patronage; and surely nothing can be more worthy of the countenance and encouragement of Monarchs than charities through which such extended opportunities are afforded for alleviating the afflictions of their subjects. It was doubtless from motives of this nature that our present most gracious Sovereign has been pleased to continue that exalted patronage which had previously been granted to this Institution by her illustrious predecessors.

The Laws of the Hospital are printed, and are accessible to every Governor on application to the Secretary; it has been, therefore, deemed unnecessary to insert in this Address any partial and incomplete statement of the Rules by which the Hospital is governed.

All Governors have a right to act at every Board, and inquire into all the affairs of the Society; and they are hereby earnestly entreated to make frequent use of this power, especially by attending at the Weekly Boards; and they may be assured that such attendance will be deemed a considerable addition to their charity, and a very great service to the Hospital.

It is thought right to mention, for the information of those benevolent persons disposed to benefit this Charity by any testamentary bequest, that it is incorporated by Act of Parliament, and is empowered to hold (in addition to personal property) land, houses, money on mortgage, and all other real property, to the amount of Twenty Thousand Pounds per annum.

Having thus stated the claims of this Society upon public encouragement, the Weekly Board of Governors feel confident that this appeal in behalf of their suffering fellow-creatures will meet with that cordial and liberal support which the increasing number of afflicted poor in the Metropolis imperatively demands; and that the same munificence which has provided an extended accommodation for the reception of patients, will be found ready to meet the necessarily increased expenditure.

All Contributors are desired to take Notice:-

I. That every Gentleman subscribing Five Guineas a year or upwards, or giving one benefaction of Fifty Pounds, is thereupon put in nomination to be a GOVERNOR; and at the first General Court that is held one lunar month afterwards, is accordingly balloted for by the Governors.

II. That on account of the number of Contributors, the following Laws have been found necessary:—

- (1.) That no GOVERNOR can have more than one In-patient, and two Out-patients on the books at the same time.
- (2.) That Subscribers of *Three Guineas* send in *three* Inpatients only *annually*, and have no more than *two* Outpatients on the books at the same time.
- (3.) That Subscribers of Two Guineas send in two In-patients only annually, and Out-patients as before.

III. That the Contributors are requested to send their subscriptions to the Treasurer at the Weekly Board, held every Wednesday morning in the Hospital; and in order to supply the current expense of the Charity, the Subscribers are requested to continue to pay their yearly subscriptions in advance.

IV. That to prevent uncertainty and confusion in the estimate of the revenue and accounts, it was ordered by a General Board, that circular letters should be carried, or sent by an Officer of the Society, to give notice to those whose Subscriptions are in arrear, which it is hoped no Subscriber will take amiss, inasmuch as the consent of every one of them to be thus reminded is included in the act of their representatives, the General Board, who made this order.

V. That no person is to be admitted a patient (except in cases of accident) without a note from a Governor or Contributor, specifying the name and place of abode of such patient, and that he, or she, is a proper object of charity.

VI. That all recommendations for In-patients are to be delivered every Wednesday morning by half-past eleven o'clock, and that none will be received after twelve.

VII. That in case any Out-patient shall neglect coming for two weeks successively, on the day and hour when ordered to attend, such Out-patient shall be discharged for irregularity, except leave has been had from the Physician or Surgeon.

VIII. That no patient discharged for irregularity is to be ever again admitted into the Hospital upon any recommendation what-soever.

IX. That no patient is to be suffered to go out of the Hospital without leave in writing.

X. That patients who may have money, or other valuables, are to deliver the same into the custody of the Chaplain, otherwise the Hospital will not be answerable for the loss thereof.

XI. That no Governor or Officer must at any time presume (upon pain of expulsion) to take of any tradesman, patient, or other person, any fee, reward, or gratification of any kind, directly or indirectly, for any service done, or to be done on account of this Hospital.

XII. That if any Nurse or Servant receive any money, treat, present, or gratuity, either from a Patient, or any relation or friend of such Patient, or from any other person, in respect for the services of such Nurse or Servant in the Hospital, such Nurse or Servant shall be dismissed.

XIII. And that when there is not room for the patients recommended at one time to be received into the Hospital, those are taken in whose admission the Board are of opinion will most effectually answer the end of the Charity; and the rest, if proper objects, are postponed, or made Out-patients, till there is room for them in the Hospital.

N.B. That most consumptive and asthmatic cases are more capable of relief as Out-patients than as In-patients.

At a General Court of the Governors, held 7th January, 1852, it was resolved, that all persons shall, in future, have all the benefit of Out-patients of this Charity, without being required to bring a

Governor's letter of recommendation.—The hour for such persons to attend at the Hospital is Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, every Monday, Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday.

At a General Court of the Governors, held 26th August, 1853, it was resolved, that a Maternity Department, for the delivery of married lying-in women at their own homes, be established at this Hospital. In accordance with this resolution, the working of the Maternity Department commenced on the 6th April, 1854. Letters of Recommendation, to be signed by Subscribers, may be obtained on application at the Hospital.

A General Caution to Governors.

It having been ascertained that Letters of Recommendation for this and other Hospitals have been continually obtained under false pretences, and afterwards sold at a regular price, it is strongly recommended to Governors to make every inquiry in their power into the cases of all applicants, in order to prevent imposition.


