

Students intending to be Candidates for the Degree are required to pass Entrance Examinations in the following branches, before admission into the Classes of the several years:—

FIRST YEAR.—Latin—Greek Grammar—and Translating and Analyzing the Greek of St. John's Gospel, or of Xenophon's Anabasis, Book I.

Second Year.—Latin—Greek—Arithmetic, extending to Simple and Compound
Proportion, Vulgar Fractions, Decimals, and Extraction of Roots—First
Three Books of Euclid—Algebra, extending to Simple Equations—and Elements of Geography, including Physical Geography.

THIRD YEAR .- Latin-Greek-Mathematics-and Natural History.

FOURTH YEAR -Mathematics and Natural Philosophy.

Students having no view to the Degree, are admitted into any Class without Entrance Examination.
