

ADDRESS OF THE COMMITTEE.

THE Committee of Management in making their Annual Report to the Governors and Subscribers, desire to express their sincere thanks to the many kind friends who have so liberally responded to the appeals that have been made on behalf of this Charity during the past year. The constantly increasing demands on the Hospital compel a continuation of appeals for assistance, and the Committee encouraged by the success which has attended their past efforts, trust that these renewed calls for aid will not be made in vain. Forty-four years have now elapsed since the foundation of the Institution. From the year 1816, to the 1st January, 1860, 135,376 persons have availed themselves of the benefits of the Charity; of these 2,811 have been restored to sight by the operation for Cataract, and that for the formation of an Artificial Pupil, the sight as well as the personal appearance of 10,825 persons has been improved by the operation for Squinting. During the past year 6,307 persons have been received as Patients, of whom 162 were admitted as In-Patients. The Committee hope that the advantage these poor afflicted persons have derived from the treatment of the Medical Officers has been satisfactory to the supporters of the Hospital; the number of Patients now attending exceeds 700 weekly.

The Institution has been supported at an expense of £1061 6s. 1d., for the year 1859, the receipts during that period being £966 15s. 9d. leaving a deficit of £94 10s. 4d. to be provided for. The Committee of Management earnestly entreat assistance for this useful Hospital, the first in London to set the great example of receiving the

afflicted poor on their own application without letters of recommendation. The Hospital is situate in the West Centre of this great Metropolis, and surrounded by a densely populated neighbourhood inhabited chiefly by a class of poor mechanics, artisans, Needlewomen, &c., whose occupations are extremely trying to the eyesight. The large number who attend when necessity compels them to seek medical aid, clearly establishes the importance of the Institution. On these grounds the Committee anxiously urge its strong claims for support, and appeal to the public to assist them in making the benefits of the Charity of still greater use, not only to the Metropolis but to the United Kingdom.

The Committee, upon the report of the Surgeons as to its necessity, have commenced extensive alterations on the ground floor of the present building, for the purpose of giving better accommodation to the Out-Patients, who were so inconveniently crowded together, both in the Waiting Room and Consulting Room, as seriously to impede the Surgeons in the discharge of their duties. Apartments lately occupied by the House-Surgeon have been taken for this purpose, and others assigned for his use in another part of the Hospital. One room has been fitted up as a Dispensary for medicines, and the other as a darkened room, for the use of the Ophthalmoscope; an instrument which has now become a most important adjunct in the study and treatment of diseases of the eye. The Committee have not, from want of funds, been able fully to complete the contemplated improvements. They solicit contributions to enable them to carry out these indispensable works.

The Committee have with sorrow to record the severe loss the Institution has sustained during the past year, by the death of two of the Vice-Presidents, the late Earl de Grey, K.G. and the late Colonel Thomas Wood, old benefactors and warm supporters of the Charity. They have also to deplore the loss of Mr. Charles Gardiner

Guthrie, Surgeon of the Hospital, and son of its late eminent founder. The Committee desire to testify their sincere respect for his memory, and their deep sense of the loss the Hospital has sustained in his death.

An Inalienable Fund, and also a fund called the "Guthrie Fund," has been formed in the names of Major General Wood, Sir John Swinburne, Bart., and Lewis Powell, Esq., Trustees. The money from time to time contributed to the Inalienable Fund, has been invested in the Three per Cent. Consols, and the *interest only* is permitted to be appropriated for the general purposes of the Hospital.

The "Guthrie Fund" is a new Fund, formed at an annual meeting of the Governors, held on the 3rd June, 1856, in order to perpetuate their regard for the memory of the late Mr. Guthrie; a subscription was entered into (by the Noblemen and Gentlemen then present), to be applied in aid of the Inalienable Fund, the principal of these two funds forming a permanent capital. The amount at present invested of the Inalienable Fund is £5,000 stock, and that of the "Guthrie Fund," £450 stock, making a total of £5,450 stock.

Donations of Fifty Pounds and upwards must, by the Rules of the Institution, be applied to the Inalienable Fund, unless it is otherwise desired; so that the benevolent object of the Donors will endure as long as the institutions of the country. A Subscription of One and Two Guineas a year constitutes an Annual, and a Donation of Twenty Guineas, a Life Governor.

The Medical Officers of the Army, the Navy, and of the East India Board, are admitted as a privilege to the practice, &c., of the Hospital.

RULES,

ETC.

This Charity was formed at a meeting of Noblemen and Gentlemen, at the Thatched House Tavern, St. James' Street, on the 5th December, 1816, General LORD LYNEDOCH in the chair. It was established first in Marylebone Street, but afterwards removed to Warwick Street, Golden Square; and upon a piece of ground being obtained, originally intended to be held on a lease for 99 years, from the Commissioners of Woods and Forests, the present Hospital was erected, and opened for the reception of patients on the 1st of January, 1832; but in the year 1852, the Fee Simple of the site of the Hospital was purchased of the Crown, for the sum of £3,060. The objects of this institution are to relieve the Poor of every description labouring under Diseases of the Eye on their own application; and it is greatly to the satisfaction of the subscribers to, and supporters of, this Hospital, that they have set the example, in the metropolis, of receiving these poor perons without letters of recommendation from each individual Governor. thus showing that their object has been pure and genuine charity.

On the opening of the Institution in December, 1816, and for several years afterwards, there were, in London and its vicinity, great numbers of soldiers and sailors, pensioners and otherwise, with their wives and children, who were labouring under inflammations of the eye. The greater part of these applied for assistance, and many who would have remained miserable and wretched objects wandering in poverty through the country, have been enabled, from the relief obtained at this Hospital, to support themselves and their families decently by their labour. There is no national institution in this country in which those who have suffered,

and are suffering, from diseases acquired in the public service, can apply for and obtain advice. They must depend on the charity of individuals for that assistance, through the medium of the different general hospitals supported by them in various parts of the kingdom. His late Royal Highness the Duke of York, in becoming the first patron of this Institution, and setting on foot the subscription for the erection of the present Hospital, was graciously pleased to take that special interest in it, on account of its being open at all times for the reception of those persons, their wives and children, not only as Out-patients, but as In-patients, without any letter of recommendation, whenever the wards of the Hospital would admit of their reception. It remains for those who survive His Royal Highness to continue and carry into effect his charitable intentions; all other Inpatients being admitted only on the recommendation of a Subscribers, or on the application to the Committee, of the Mayor, Magistrates, or Clergyman of the place in which the poor person resides for whom they are desirous of obtaining admission.

If the funds of the Institution were equal to its support in full operation, great advantages would result to the poor; and many an unhappy person, who is now lingering out a miserable existence, in the possession of health and strength, but without sight to enable him to apply those advantages, would be relieved, and others prevented from falling into such a distressing state, from the timely and careful assistance which they would receive as In-patients, but which cannot be given to Out-patients-and many a wretched infant devoted to misery from the hour of its existence through loss of sight, would be rendered a useful member of society. The prevalence of a destructive inflammation among the infants of the poor, which deprives them of sight almost from the first hour of their birth, has been too fatally exemplified in the Reports of this Charity, and who, by timely assistance, would have been saved from blindness, and in many instances from death.

It is from the mothers of families that the means of relief are especially to be hoped for by these poor creatures—it is to their feelings this statement is addressed, in the full confidence that the blessings bestowed on their own offspring will not fail to suggest to them the propriety of contributing a small portion of their superfluous wealth in affording relief to the distressed poor, afflicted with maladies affecting the most gracious of all gifts-the sight.

The Hospital forms a school of instruction for students of every description, who are enabled to see the treatment of diseases of the eye on so large a scale, that they cannot fail, within a short time, to obtain a competent knowledge of them; and thus the advantages which originate in this Charity are disseminated over the whole face of the earth; and there is already no quarter of the globe in which surgeons educated at this Hospital have not rendered the most important services to mankind, in having restored sight, and with it, health, vigour, and happiness to thousands.

In order to ensure the continuance of this course of practical instruction, and for the general good management of the Hospital, the following Rules have been adopted:-

I.-1. That every Surgeon and Assistant Surgeon of the surgeons. Hospital, shall also be the Surgeon or Assistant Surgeon to a recognized Metropolitan or Provincial Hospital for the treatment of diseases generally; or shall be, or have been a Lecturer or Demonstrator of Anatomy in any such Hospital, for a sufficient length of time to satisfy the Committee that he is fully competent to continue the Lectures on the diseases of the Eye, in combination with the principles of Surgery.

2. That the Medical Officers of the Army, the Navy, the Medical Officers Ordnance, and of the East India Board, are at all times to be admitted gratuitously to the Lectures, as well as the Practice of the Hospital, on obtaining the recommendation of the heads of their respective departments.

of the Army, &c., admitted to Lectures, Practice, &c.

II.—That the Honorary Officers shall be, a Patron, Vice- Honorary Officers.

Officers.

Patron, President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Chaplain. Executive The Executive Officers shall be, two Surgeons, two Assistant Surgeons, and one or two House Surgeons, as circumstances may require; a Secretary, a Collector, a Dispenser, a Cupper, and a Housekeeper.

Executive Officers to be elected by the Governors.

III.—That all the Executive Officers shall be elected by the Governors, after the manner hereinafter described, except the House Surgeons and the Housekeeper, the latter of whom must be a female, and who shall be appointed by the Committee of Management, subject to the approval of a General or Special Board summoned for the express purpose, and who shall be removeable in a similar manner.

Management.

IV .- That the due government of the Hospital shall be effected by an Annual and four Quarterly Meetings of the Governors, the time for holding which shall be settled from time to time by the Committee of Management; and by a Monthly Meeting of the Committee of Management, which shall take place on the first Thursday of every month, at which Meeting every Governor shall be entitled to attend, should he think proper.

Election of Committee of Management and Auditors

V .- That the Committee of Management shall consist of a Chairman and not less than Twenty Governors, including Two Auditors, all of whom shall be elected at the first Quarterly Meeting in each year by marking names, and those forming the Committee shall be placed on the List of such Committee alphabetically, and the Medical Officers shall be ex officio members of such Committee.

Executive Officers: or otherwise.

VI.-1. That whenever a vacancy shall take place, by vacancy by death death or otherwise, of any of the Executive Officers (excepting those of the House Surgeons and Housekeeper), the Committee of Management shall appoint a day for the Candidates to send in their testimonials to be examined by them; and after they have selected such persons as they may consider eligible for such office, the Committee shall direct the Secretary to give the usual notice to the Governors of the same, the respective names and residences of such Candidates, and of the day appointed for the election.

2. That a Candidate for the office of Surgeon or Assist- Qualification of ant Surgeon shall be a Fellow or a Member of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.

VII.—That no Special Meeting of the Governors shall Special take place in a less period than fourteen clear days from the date of the summons; and every summons shall be delivered within three days after its date at the usual residence or address of the Governor in London.

VIII.—That the Treasurer, or Chairman of the Com- General mittee of Management, or any five of the Governors, shall have power to direct the Secretary to summon a General Meeting of the Governors, who shall do so accordingly, and in the Notices state the business for which such Meeting is summoned; but no other business shall be considered at such Meeting than that for which it is especially summoned, and the decision of such Meeting must be confirmed by another General Meeting, or at the next Quarterly Meeting, before it shall be valid.

Meetings.

IX .- That every Election shall take place by marking Election. Lists, and shall be final; and that Peers, Peeresses, Members of Parliament, Judges of the Equity and Common Law Courts, Ladies, the President and Vice-Presidents. the Treasurer, the Trustees, the Chairman and Deputy-Chairman of the Committee of Management, and Governors residing twenty miles and upwards from the Hospital, may vote at all Elections by proxy; but that on all other occasions personal attendance shall be necessary.

Governors being Sub-scribers. Excluded from at Elections Subscribers for 3 Calendar

X.-1. That all Life-Governors shall be entitled to vote at all General Meetings immediately upon their becoming such, and all Governors, subscribers of one guinea and upwards annually, shall be entitled to vote at all General Meetings, provided they have been three calendar months Subscribers to the Hospital.

2. That no Annual Subscriber shall be entitled to vote at any Election for the Executive Officers, unless his or her renewal Subscription due for the current year shall have been first paid up.

Donor Subscribers eligible for Vice-Presidents.

3. That a donation of one hundred guineas, or an annual contribution of five guineas, shall render the Donor Subscriber eligible for the office of Vice-President.

Governors entitled to Vote at Elections.

XI.—That Subscribers of one guinea and upwards annually shall be Governors, and shall be entitled to a vote for each guinea, and all Donors of ten guineas and upwards shall be Life-Governors and entitled to a vote for each ten guineas.

Donation of £50. otherwise directed.

XII.—That unless the Donors otherwise direct, all to be applied to the Inalienable Donations and Legacies of £50 and upwards, given for the benefit of the Institution, shall be placed to the account of the Inalienable Fund, and all other Donations and Legacies shall be placed to such an account, or applied towards the general purposes of the Hospital, as the Committee of Management shall, in their discretion, think fit.

Admission of In-patients.

XIII .- That whenever, from the scarcity of beds, a selection of patients shall become necessary, admissiontickets for in-patients will have a preference according to the rate of subscription of the Governor giving the same.

Receipts to be signed by the Treasurer.

XIV.—That all receipts for subscriptions or donations shall be signed by the Treasurer, who shall supply the Secretary monthly with such blank receipts as may be necessary.

Secretary to pay all money to Bankers.

XV.—That all money received by the Secretary shall be received by him paid into the hands of the Bankers, to the account of the Treasurer, previously to the Meeting of the Committee of Management, on the first Thursday of every month.

Payment of Bills.

XVI.—That no Bills shall be paid without the order of the Committee of Management, and then only by cheque of the Treasurer on the Bankers.

Subscriptions to be paid in advance.

XVII.—That all subscriptions shall be considered as paid in advance, and the names of Subscribers whose Subscriptions remain unpaid at the end of three years, shall be removed from the list-due notice of the same being given to such Subscribers previously to the two last Quarterly Meetings terminating the third year.

XVIII.—That all appointments of Honorary Officers or Appointment of Governors to the Hospital shall be recommended by the Committee of Management at one Meeting-confirmed at a second—and approved at the subsequent Quarterly Meeting, before such appointment shall become valid.

Honorary Officers.

XIX .- That a List of Annual Subscribers shall be regu- List of Annual larly kept by the Secretary, stating the day on which the first subscription was paid, and the date of the last payment; and the Collector shall wait upon each Governor for his annual subscription at the time of its becoming due, or as soon after as convenient, and if the payment thereof shall be delayed for a longer period than three months from the time of such application, the same shall be reported to the Committee of Management.

Subscribers to be kept by the Secretary, &c. &c.

XX.—That the Secretary shall keep all books and papers belonging to the Institution in a proper depository in the Hospital.

Secretary to have charge of all Books, &c.

XXI.—That the Surgeons shall be answerable on every point for the charge and treatment of those entrusted to the treatment of their care; and, in order to insure to them the assistance most satisfactory to themselves, they shall be at liberty to appoint one or even two House Surgeons, and to remove them whenever they think fit, reporting such appointment and removal to the Committee of Management at the first Monthly Meeting, at which Meeting, or at the next subsequent one, the Committee shall have the power of objecting to such appointment, under which circumstances the same shall be invalid; but the removal of the House Surgeons shall be at all times at the pleasure of the Surgeons.

Surgeon to be answerable for Patients, and may appoint House Surgeons, &c.

XXII .- That every Surgeon of the Hospital shall, on consulting Surattaining his sixtieth year, be appointed a Consulting Surgeon.

XXIII .- That one of the House Surgeons shall reside House Surgeon. in the Hospital in the apartments prepared for him, and coals and candles shall be allowed for his use.

Secretary's

XXIV.—That the salary of the Secretary shall be at the Salary, and Collector's discretion of the Committee of Management, and shall be settled by them for the ensuing year at their last Monthly Meeting in each year, and shall be payable quarterly; and that the Collector shall be paid five per cent. on all annual subscriptions.

Housekeeper's Salary, &c.

XXV.—That the salary of the Housekeeper shall be forty pounds a-year, payable quarterly, with rations, and that such Housekeeper must reside in the apartments provided for her, and shall also be allowed coals and candles.

Porter and Nurses.

XXVI.—That a Porter, Nurses, &c., shall be provided, under such arrangements as the Committee of Management may, from time to time, think necessary.

Visitors to the Hospital.

XXVII.—That the Hospital shall be at all seasons in perfect order for the reception of visitors between the hours of ten and four, and a book shall be kept by the Housekeeper, to be entitled the Visitors' Book, in which Subscribers shall be at liberty to enter any remarks relative to the Hospital or its management which may appear to them necessary.
