REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT,

For the Year ending 31st of December, 1865.

ALTHOUGH the Board made earnest appeal to the County, for new and increased Subscriptions in the two last Reports, there has been no response whatever to them. The usefulness of the Hospital must consequently be as much limited in the year to come, as in the two preceding years: it is much to be

regretted that more Subscribers do not come forward from all ranks of Society, it may be with their mites only, to help such a really useful Institution.

"The Report of the financial position of the Hospital is not altogether satisfactory, comparatively it is favourable, as the outstanding accounts do not amount to quite so much as in the foregoing year, and the balance at the Bank is larger; while the income arising from all sources has been considerably less than the average income of the last four years, proving thus that the resolution of the Board to assimilate the expenditure to the income, though at a great sacrifice of the public advantages of the Hospital, has been strictly adhered to.

"The Subscriptions for 1865, were only £581 19s. 6d. against £594 15s. 6d., in 1864. This is somewhat below the average of the last 8 years.

"The donations also shew a decrease of £129 Os. 5d., as compared with those of the previous year. The total sum received as donations was £219 9s. 3d., £77 8s. 1d. of which was given by the Artisans, Mechanics, and Shipwrights, employed in her Majesty's Dockyards, at Chatham and Sheerness, to whom the Board again offer their special thanks, as well as to the workmen in the employ of the South Eastern Company, at Ashford, for their Contribution of £14 Os. 2d., the proceeds of their Annual Ball.

"Only £39 17s. 7d. was collected after Sermons in the whole of the Kentish Churches and Chapels.

"The legacies bequeathed this year to the Hospital, amounted to £250, making the whole sum now invested £3369 16s. 7d.

"The Surgeon has introduced several alterations and improvements to the previously existing means for examining the eye, and scientifically testing the sight for glasses; making the appliances of the Hospital equal to those of any similar Institution in the Kingdom.

"371 in-patients were admitted during the year.

"1940 out-patients attended in the same period, and the whole number of visits of out-patients to the Hospital for advice and medicine, was 8091.

"334 operations have been performed in the year, being 90 more than last year. Mr. Adams having performed no less than 120 operations for Cataract alone.

"A conference of Sub-committees of this Hospital and the West General Kent Hospital was arranged, to consider the desirableness of obtaining more and more clearly defined spiritual advantages for both Hospitals, such as regular visitation, Sunday services and daily prayers, and it has been decided that a Chaplain shall be appointed jointly, at a stipend of £100 per annum, £20 per annum of which sum will be paid from the funds of this Hospital.

Under these circumstances the Board trust that Subscriptions may be forthcoming to defray this new but most necessary charge on the scanty funds.

"Thanks are due to those Clergymen who have officiated as Chaplain during the last year, as well as to the few Clergymen and Ministers who have advocated the claims of the Hospital from their Pulpits.

For the third time the Board ask earnestly for more Subscriptions. They beg to remind the Farmers, Tradesmen, and the working classes themselves, that this Hospital is open to all indigent persons, and directly or indirectly benefits all classes in the County; therefore all should contribute according to their means, to its maintenance.

In laying before you the Medical Returns for 1865, permit me to call your attention to the great demand there has been on the beds of the Institution, this in a great measure was caused by the large number of Patients requiring operation, and more especially for the removal of Cataract. Many times I was obliged to refuse admission for the want of room, and also in several instances compelled to discharge In-patients before I otherwise should have done, to make way for more urgent cases.

The facilities for scientifically testing vision, and accurately choosing glasses, being far behind the requirements of the day, we have during the year made several alterations and introduced important improvements into this department, which I doubt not will add materially to the usefulness of your valuable Institution.

RULES

OF THE

KENT COUNTY OPHTHALMIC HOSPITAL.

Ι.

Objects.

This Institution shall be open for the reception of Indigent persons afflicted with Diseases of the Eye, who, upon their own application, shall be admitted into, or attended at the Hospital, as their case may require.

II.

Government.

The Government of this Hospital shall be vested in the Patron, the President, Vice-Presidents, and Governors.

III.

Presidents and Vice-Presidents.

The Presidents and Vice-Presidents shall be elected from the Governors.

IV. Officers.

The Officers shall consist of Two Consulting Physicians, Two Consulting Surgeons, One Surgeon, Treasurer, and such other Officers as the Board shall from time to time deem requisite for the services of the Hospital.

V.

Qualification of Governers.

A Donation of Ten Guineas and upwards shall constitute a Life Governer and a Yearly Subscription of One Guinea and upwards an Annual Governor, during payment. The Consulting Physicians, Consulting Surgeons, and Surgeon of the Hospital, shall be Governors by virtue of their office.

VI.

Subscription when due.

All Subscriptions shall become due on the First day of January in each year, and shall be paid in advance.

VII.

General Annual Meeting.

A General Meeting of the Governors shall be held annually at such time as the Board shall appoint. At this Meeting the President, Vice Presidents and Treasurer of the Hospital shall be elected as vacancies occur—alterations in the Rules made when deemed advisable—a report presented by the Board of Management of the past year—a Board of Management elected for the ensuing year—and such other business transacted as may be necessary. Notice of the said Meeting shall be given in such of the Kent Newspapers as the Board of Management may determine upon, fourteen days previous to such meeting being held.

VIII.

Special Meeting of Governors.

A Special Meeting of the Governors may by convened at any time by the President, or three Vice-Presidents, or Board of Management, of which fourteen days' notice, stating the objects of such Meeting, shall be given in writing to each Governor.

IX.

Governors Voting.

Each Governor, at a General or Special Meeting, shall be entitled to one vote for every ten guineas given as a donation, and each Annual Governor shall be entitled to a vote for every guinea subscribed. All Governors shall be allowed to vote by proxy in writing at all elections, such proxies to be used by Governors only. The Consulting Physicians, Consulting Surgeons, and the Surgeon, shall be entitled to the privileges of a Life Governor, and no Person shall be entitled to vote who shall not have been a Governor three calendar months, or whose subscription shall be in arrear.

Χ.

Election of Consulting Physicians, Consulting Surgeons, and Surgeon.

The Consulting Physicians, Consulting Surgeons, and the Surgeon shall be elected by ballot. The election shall be held between the hours of twelve, at noon, and three in the afternoon; and no election of such officer shall take place until at least twenty days after the declaration of a vacancy shall have been published in such newspapers as the Board of Management may determine upon.

XI.

Register of Minutes.

Minutes of the proceedings at all general and special meetings shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

XII.

Constitution of Board.

The Board of Management shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Consulting Physicians, Consulting Surgeons, Surgeon, the Trustees, and not more than twenty other Governors.

XIII.

Monthly Meeting of the Board.

A meeting of the Board shall be held once in every month, of which three day's notice shall be given to every member, and three shall constitute a quorum. If three do not attend any one member then present may adjourn the meeting to any day which may be deemed convenient, of which adjourned meeting notice shall be given to each member.

XIV.

Special Meeting of Board.

The President, or two Vice-Presidents, or any three of the Board, shall have power to call a special meeting of the Board, of which three days' notice, stating the objects of such meeting, shall be giving in writing to each member.

XV.

Duties of Board.

The Board shall have power to make, alter and revise bye-laws for the general Management of the Hospital, and shall examine the accounts of the Treasurer, Secretary, and House Keeper, and direct all matters which concern the expenses, government, and conduct of the Hospital, and servants, belonging to it, and fix the salaries and wages,

XVI.

Board to appoint Auditors.

At a Meeting of the Board after the Annual General Meeting in every year they shall appoint two Governors, to be auditors for the year, who shall examine the books and accounts of the Hospital, and shall audit and sign the same previous to the General Annual Meeting of the Governors.

XVII.

Board to make an Annual Report to the Governors.

The Board shall, at the General Meeting of the Governors submit a report for the past year, showing the number of patients

receivep and discharged; their several trades, employment, or condition, the parishes and places from whence they have applied, a statement of the audited accounts, and of any important business transacted by them during the year.

XVIII.

Power to Engage and Discharge.

The Board shall engage a Secretary and Housekeeper, and provide such nurses and servants as may from time to time be deemed requisite, and shall have the power of suspending or discharging any of them when they think proper.

XIX.

Power to Suspend or Discharge the House Surgeon or Dispenser.

The Board shall have power to suspend or discharge the House Surgeon and Dispenser.

XX.

Mode of Proceeding for the Election of Surgeon.

When a vacancy occurs in the Office of Surgeon to the Hospital, the Board, at their first meeting after such vacancy shall direct notice of it to be given in such newspapers as they may deem advisible, and at the same time summon a special meeting of the Governors for the election of a successor; and no person shall be eligible unless his testimonals shall have been laid before the Board seven days at least before the day of election, and the same or a copy thereof left at the Hospital for the inspection of the Governors.

XXI.

Board have authority to invest and appoint Trustees.

The Board shall have power to lay out any sums in their hands on such securities as they think fit, and to appoint any three of their number Trustees, in whose names the property is to be invested.

XXII.

Register of Minutes, which are open to Inspection of Governors.

The minutes of the proceedings of the Board shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose, and shall at all reasonable times be open for the inspection of any Governor.

TREASURER.

XXIII.

Duties of Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall make such payments as a General Meeting of the Governors or the Board of Management shall direct, by an order to be signed by the Chairman.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.

XXIV.

Qualification of Consulting Physician.

No person shall be eligible for the office of Consulting Physician to the Hospital, unless he be a member of the Royal College of Physicians, London, or a Medical Graduate of one of the Universities of England, Scotland, or Ireland; nor shall any one be eligible who practises or is connected in partnership with any one who practises Surgery, Pharmacy or Mid-wifery.

XXV.

Qualification of Consulting Surgeon.

No person shall be eligible for the office of Consulting Surgeon to the Hospital, unless he be a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of London, and shall produce certificates of having regularly attended the practice of an Ophthalmic Institution for a period of not less than twelve months; nor shall any one be eligible who practises or is connected in partnership with any one who practises Pharmacy or Mid-wifery.

XXVI.

Qualification of Surgeon.

No person shall be eligible for the office of Surgeon to the Hospital, unless he be a member of the Royal College of Surgeons of London, and shall produce certificates of having regularly attended the practice of an Ophthalmic Institution for a period of not less than twelve months; nor if elected continue to hold the office, unless he reside within two miles of the Hospital.

XXVII.

Duties of Surgeon.

The Surgeon shall visit the In-patients as often as may be required; he shall prescribe for, and attend the Out-patients every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday at twelve o'clock at noon; and shall be answereable on every point for the charge and treatment of the cases.

XXVIII.

Surgeon to appoint House Surgeon.

The Surgeon shall appoint the House Surgeon or Dispenser and shall have power to suspend him whenever he may think fit, reporting such suspension and the cause thereof to the Board of Management at their next monthly meeting. During such suspension the House Surgeon shall not reside in the Hospital. During any suspension, sickness or vacancy, the Surgeon may appoint another person to act as House Surgeon until the decision of the Board is known.

XXIX.

Qualification of House Surgeon, &c.

No person shall be eligible for the office of House Surgeon to the Hospital unless he be a member of the Royal College of Surgeons of London, and Licentiate of the Apothecary's Company. He shall not practice out of the House, nor attend to any other business than that of the Hospital, and shall reside in the apartments provided for him, and receive such salary as shall be agreed upon by the Board of Management.

XXX.

Duties of House Surgeon.

The House Surgeon shall be under the entire control and direction of the Surgeon, to whom he shall report any misconduct or irregularity on the part of patients or Servants. He shall keep a General Register, in which he shall enter every case applying for relief.

SECRETARY.

XXXI.

Duties of Secretary.

The Secretary shall attend at all Boards, enter the minutes of all proceedings, and perform such other duties as the Board may direct.

IN-PATIENTS.

XXXII.

In-Patients' Admission.

In-patients shall at all times be admitted and discharged at the direction of the Surgeon; and if, from the scarcity of beds, a selection of patients shall become necessary, preference shall be given to those whose cases admit of the least delay.

XXXIII.

In-Patients Discharged, &c.

In-patients discharged for irregularity or bad conduct shall not again be admitted into the Hospital without an order from the Board.

XXXIV.

In-Patients shall be Clean, &c.

All persons admitted into the Hospital shall be clean, and shall bring with them proper changes of linen and other necessaries.

OUT-PATIENTS.

XXXV.

Out-Patients' Days for Attendance.

Out-patients with diseases of the Eye requiring advice and relief, shall attend at the Hospital on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, form twelve to one o'clock in the afternoon, or such other days as may be appointed by the Surgeon.

GENERAL RULES.

XXXVI.

No Officer or Person connected with the Hospital to Receive any Gratuity, &c., &c.

No officer, or other person, connected with the Hospital shall at any time presume, on pain of expulsion, to give to, or take from, any tradesman, patient, stranger, servant, or other person, any fee, reward, or gratuity of any kind, either directly or indirectly, for any service done or to be done on account of the Hospital, other than the appointed salaries or wages, except in cases of emergency in the service of the Institution, which cases shall be reported to the next meeting of the Board.

XXXVII.

Any Person applying for Relief at the Hospital shall be required to give Names, &c. &c.

All persons applying to the Hospital for relief shall give their name, age, and address, together with trade, employment, or condition of life, and shall receive a Surgeon's prescription paper, upon which each day's attendance and treatment shall be entered which prescription paper shall be delivered up to the House Surgeon on their discharge.

Hospital Open to Inspection of Donors Daily.

XXXVIII.

Subscribers and Donors shall be permitted to visit the Hospita at all times, subject to such restrictions as the Board of Manage ment in their bye-laws shall direct.
