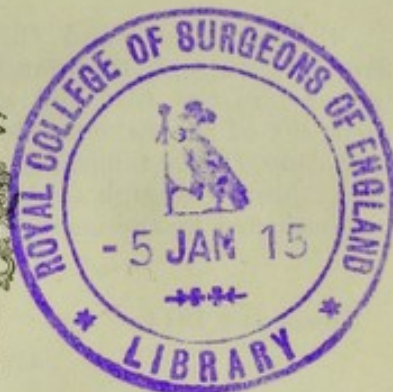

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EXPLANATORY NOTE.

1. Part I of this List includes all the Schools certified by the Board of Education under the Elementary Education (Blind and Deaf Children) Act, 1893, and the Elementary Education (Defective and Epileptic Children) Act, 1899, and recognised under the Board's Regulations applicable to Schools for Blind, Deaf, Defective, and Epileptic Children. A list of the Boarding-out Committees approved by the Board under the Acts mentioned is also included. The information is made up to 31st July, 1914.

2. The previous List was made up to 31st January, 1914. The changes which have taken place in the interval are due to the closure of Schools, to the opening of new Schools, and to alterations in the accommodation of Schools. The names of Schools opened or closed during the period, with any particulars relating to the latter, are printed in italic type.

3. Throughout Part I of the List the letters "M.D." and "P.D." are used as abbreviations for "Mentally Defective" and "Physically Defective" respectively. The addition of the letter "C" (Council) to the name of a School indicates that the School is maintained by a Local Education Authority.

4. The Schools and Classes for Blind, Deaf, Defective, and Epileptic Students recognised under the Regulations for Technical Schools, &c., are included in the List, and will be found in Part II, which contains a complete list of the Schools and Classes so recognised for the year ending on 31st July, 1914. Schools and Classes which do not work under the direction of a County Borough or Administrative County Local Education Authority are indicated by the mark § preceding the name of the School.
