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

GENTLEMEN,

. I have the honour to present to you the Annual Report on the Health and Sanitary condition of the Urban District of Barrowford, during the year, 1919.

BIRTHS (see Tables I and II).

During the year ending 31st December, 1919, there have been 62 births registered—36 males, and 26 females.

This gives an annual birth rate of 10.9 per 1,000 of the population.

The average rate for 1918 was 9.2. The mean rate for ten years—1909 to 1918—was 17.2. Of the births in 1919, 1 male and 5 females were illegitimate.

DEATHS (see Tables I and II).

The number of deaths registered during the year was 72, giving an annual death rate of 12.9 per 1,000 of the population, compared with 15 of the previous year, and a mean rate of 12.5 for the 10 years 1909–1918.

The following table shows at what ages the deaths occurred:—

Included among the deaths were Bronchitis, 9; Organic Heart Disease, 15; Influenza, 5; Pulmonary Tuberculosis, 2; Pneumonia, 3; Cancer, 4. (See Tables I and II).

The death rate of infants under one year per 1,000 births was 80, as compared with 58 of the previous year, and a mean rate of 97 for the 10 years 1909–1918.

There were no deaths of infants from the principal epidemic diseases.

Infectious Diseases.

Under the Infectious Disease Notification Act there have been 26 cases notified.

In addition to the above there has been one case of Tuberculosis notified.

SANITARY CONDITIONS.

During the year there has been a good supply of water from the Nelson Corporation reservoirs.

SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

There are five Slaughter-houses which have been inspected during slaughtering. Their condition is satisfactory. The garbage is removed twice a week. During the Control of Meat, the Slaughter-houses have not been in continual use.

DAIRIES AND COWSHEDS.

These are kept clean but some of the Cowsheds are short of air space.

FACTORIES.

Defective W.C.'s at one factory were remedied, and additional W.C.'s were provided.

WORKSHOPS.

These have been regularly inspected and their condition found satisfactory.

The time allowed for the emission of black smoke is ten minutes. Ten observations have been taken and none exceeded the time limit.

Sewage Disposal Works.—Method of treatment:— Sedimentation; Sprinklers; Final Sedimentation; Tank and Land Treatment of Storm-water.

Drainage System, Character of.—Earthenware Pipes.
Refuse, Disposal of.—Ashes to tips, night soil on land.
Houses newly erected are provided with portable galvanised iron ash-bins.

DEAR SIR,

I beg to forward you my Annual Report, being a report on the administration and work of the Sanitary Department during the year ended 31st December, 1919.

NUISANCES.

Sixty-nine Nuisances were detected and dealt with. These consisted chiefly of choked drains, and waste waterclosets, and minor structural defects.

HOUSING: INSPECTION OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, 1910.

Houses Inspected 61

Houses in which defects were remedied without Closing Order 21

The nuisances and defects found in these inspections were chiefly structural, and dampness.

NOTICES.

Two Preliminary Notices or Letters, and One Statutory Notice have been served. Verbal notice proved sufficient in the majority of the Nuisances.

PREMISES OVER WHICH THE DEPARTMENT HAS CONTROL.

SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

The slaughter-houses were visited and found to be kept in a satisfactory condition. The Council's workmen remove garbage twice weekly during slaughtering, but the slaughterhouses have not been in continual use during the control of meat.

BAKEHOUSES.

These were kept clean, and limewashed regularly.

Dairies and Cowsheds.

The clean condition of both sheds and cattle has been fairly good.

WORKSHOPS.

The workshops were inspected and found satisfactory.

Infectious Disease.

In connection with the cases of infectious disease notified, nine rooms have been fumigated and disinfectants supplied.

CANAL BOATS.

Three inspections of canal boats were made. No contraventions were met with, the cabins in each case being satisfactory.

I have the honour to present to you the Annual report on the health and Sanitary condition of this district

During the year there have been Sixty three births registered - Thirty seven males and twenty six females (of these one male and five females were illegitimate) With an estimated population of six thousand, the barth rate was therefore 10.5 per thousand

Deaths

The number of deaths registered during the year, of people belonging to the district was as shewn in the following lable :-
