Successful Candidates will be allowed to choose as a prize a Book (or Books), from a selection which has been made for that purpose, and which may be inspected on application to Miss Shaw, at the Museum Library. Candidates must be under eighteen years of age, but there will be no restriction as to place of residence.

## CONDITIONS.

- I. The Examination will be in writing.
- II. Candidates may apply to be examined to Mr. Swanton, at the Museum, any Monday, Thursday, or Saturday, between nine and four.
- III. Candidates will receive one of the following pages, and will be required to answer the questions in writing before leaving the room, and to sign name and address. One hour allowed.
- IV. Candidates are at liberty to get up the questions beforehand, either from books or from friends, and, to some extent, information respecting them will be afforded at the Museum.
  - V. If unsuccessful at a first attempt Candidates will be allowed to try again, but the Examinations will close on December 16th.
- VI. Candidates must not bring with them to the examination any books or written memoranda.
- VII. Great importance will be attached to the ability to recognise the Specimens and Portraits.
- VIII. Every one of the questions must be answered, but a few mistakes will not necessarily lead to rejection.
  - N.B.—The names of those who pass will be posted in the Museum within a week of their examination, and the selection of a prize may be made at once.
