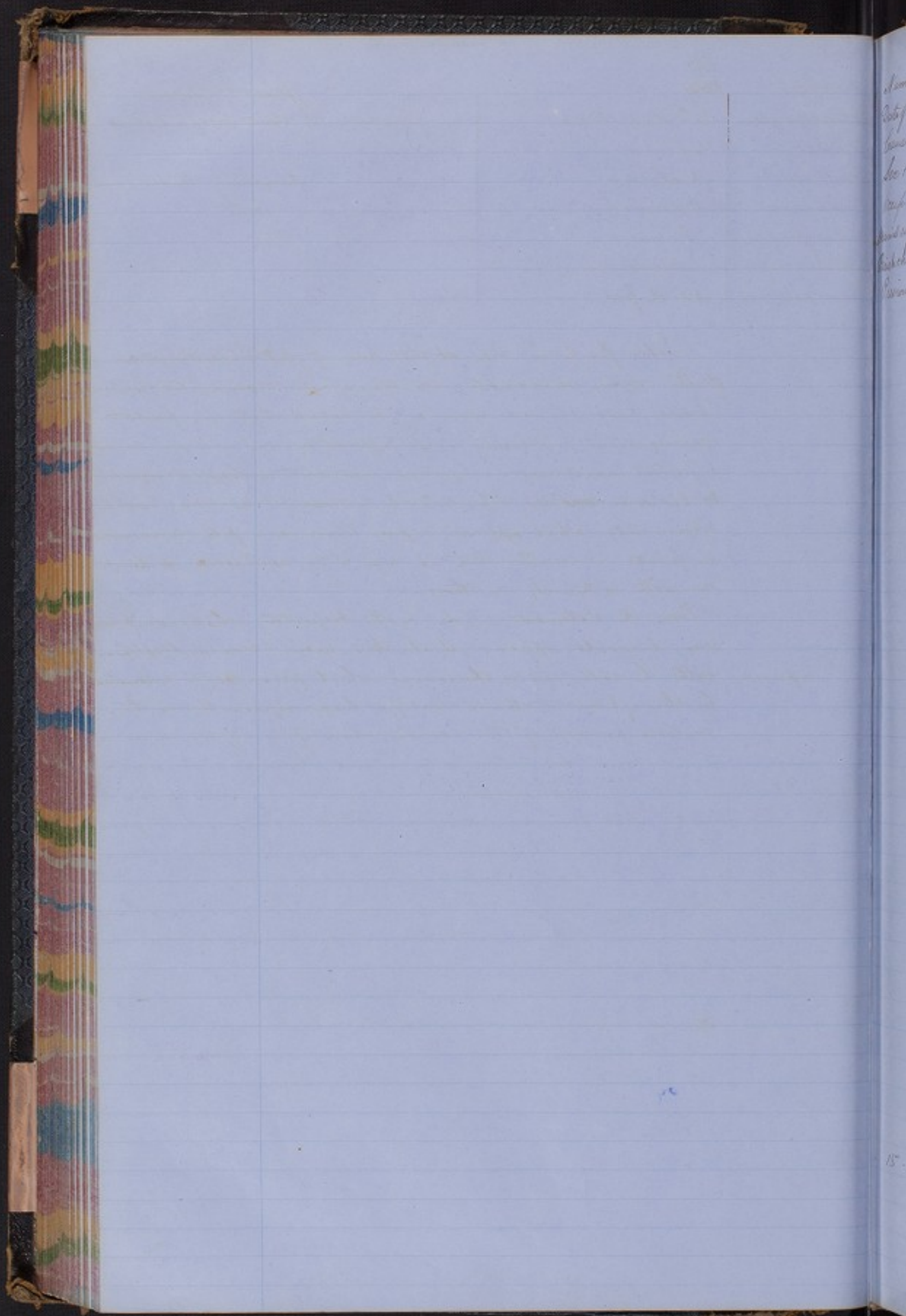
When Graham was at the time of admission one of the most miserable, wretched, & exhausted creatures I have ever almost seen. So weak that he could scarcely stand; flinching as if suffocation was imminent; his pulse numbering about 140, and with a heart so impulsive & violent ~~as~~ as to be audible and visible at a distance of 10 or under what appeared pure terror as to fully warn his friends in asserting that he was to be considered as dangerous both to himself & others.

From the statements made by the Inspector, who accompanied him, it would appear that this man became deeply impressed with the religious enthusiasm which prevails so extensively by this part of Scotland, and perhaps especially in the southern portion of this country, about four years ago.

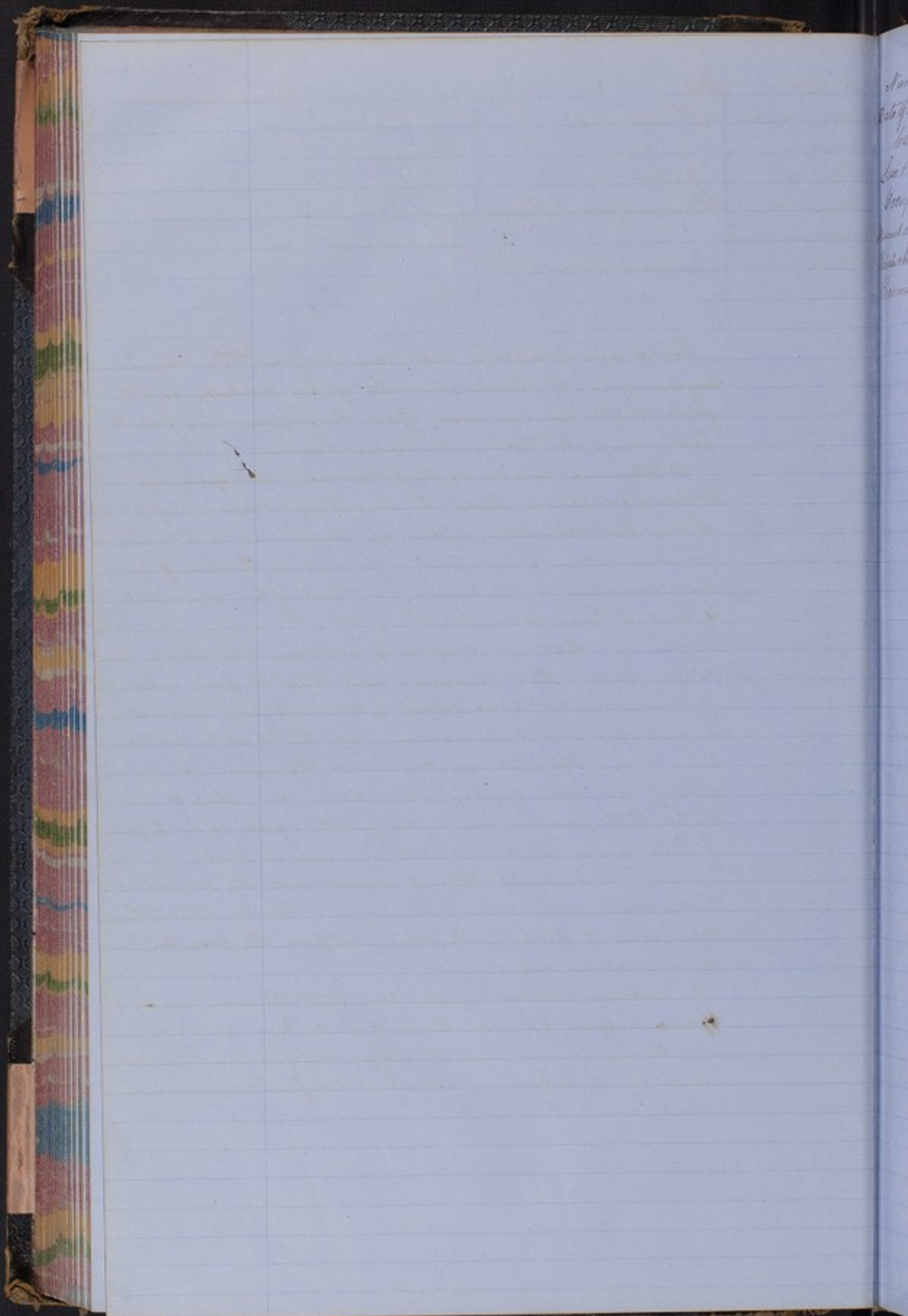
The coming of J. M. G. was preceded <sup>hours</sup> by a telegram, announcing the serious character of his malady, and the fact that he was sent off in the "Emergency", for the Governor of the Prison at Kilkenny.

Statement made by the policeman accompanying Mr Guinness shows that he has been suspected of poaching & been stealing, taken up, examined and committed for trial some ten days or a fortnight - the date of his incarceration is not known, but that of his committing is said to have been the 18<sup>th</sup> of Nov. or six days ago - before admission; that no symptoms of madness had shown themselves until that morning, and that the first indication of illness consisted in an attack of maniacal fury culminating in a savage and brutal attempt upon the life of the Governor of the prison. This state was maintained throughout the day in spite of the means employed to restrain him. And it was stated that fangs were made of teeth & feet upon the persons of those coming into contact with him when his hands were being pinioned. He had partaken of no food until they arrived at Castle Douglas on their way to the asylum. This was stated to have been about 9 o'clock in the evening and from this point of time his violence abated and struggling ceased.

The medical certificate simply bears that the man was in prison suffering from an attack of acute mania, and in a state threatening immediate danger to life - one that could not be treated in prison and whose continued confinement would cause death.

J. D. is said to have been always of weak intellect, but was supposed to be able to take care of himself until recently. He is said to be not epileptic, nor suicidal, ~~but~~ <sup>not</sup> dangerous, but very excited and passionate. Dr Dunbar White certifying him thus: "I have known him to be an imbecile and excitable person for many years. During the last 10 days he has laboured with delusions - viz. that magicians and enchantments are employed to do him injury, that his turner sometimes into wood and sometimes into stone, that his legs are taken off and put on again, that his getting new teeth on, and he has been so excited as to require attendants by night and by day." And Mr McWilliam Surgeon says "I have known him for many years and always considered him of very weak mind, but of late he has been bereft of reason; he tells me when he was born he was all cut into pieces that he is under enchantment, that the man who watched <sup>him</sup> last night had spoiled his watch - had made her not worth three half pence that he the man was to be taken to Wigtown tried by the Sheriff and hanged first. One medical certificate says she has a desponding appearance; - is in great concern about her eternal salvation; - has no idea as to what month this is; - is not sure whether it is February; says that when quite awake at night she hears voices speaking to her, threatening her with after torments - all the punishments inflicted in Hell, believes in and has a fear of their threatenings being carried out. and adds "some time ago she struck her husband on the head with an iron bar, because he had entered a ring which she had traced on the forehead within which she declares none but the good were to enter; - she is inclined to wander from home and has to be restrained from doing so"

Another medical certificate bears that "she talks excitedly, maintains that she is not clothed with her own skin, but is clothed with the skin of Christ; - that she is saved and happy that she hears people speaking in her ears day and night; that she believes in them and is frightened by them; and continues that the month of the woman's husband "a few weeks ago she struck me on the head with an iron rod because I attempted to take her home from a ring she had made in a wood she asserting that at the time <sup>she</sup> was enchanted." Other certificates state "that this is a case of mania" (and it is on the strength of them that she is at first admitted); "is a melancholic, at present depressed and anxious; Has delusions of hearing, and believes that spirits visit her at night and address her in obscure language; - she is in great anxiety about the future - expecting hourly the destruction of the world and the immediate coming of a host of blackness to swallow all up. Hallucinations are said to exist and her nights to be sleepless and full of terror. She is given to wandering and appears suspicious."

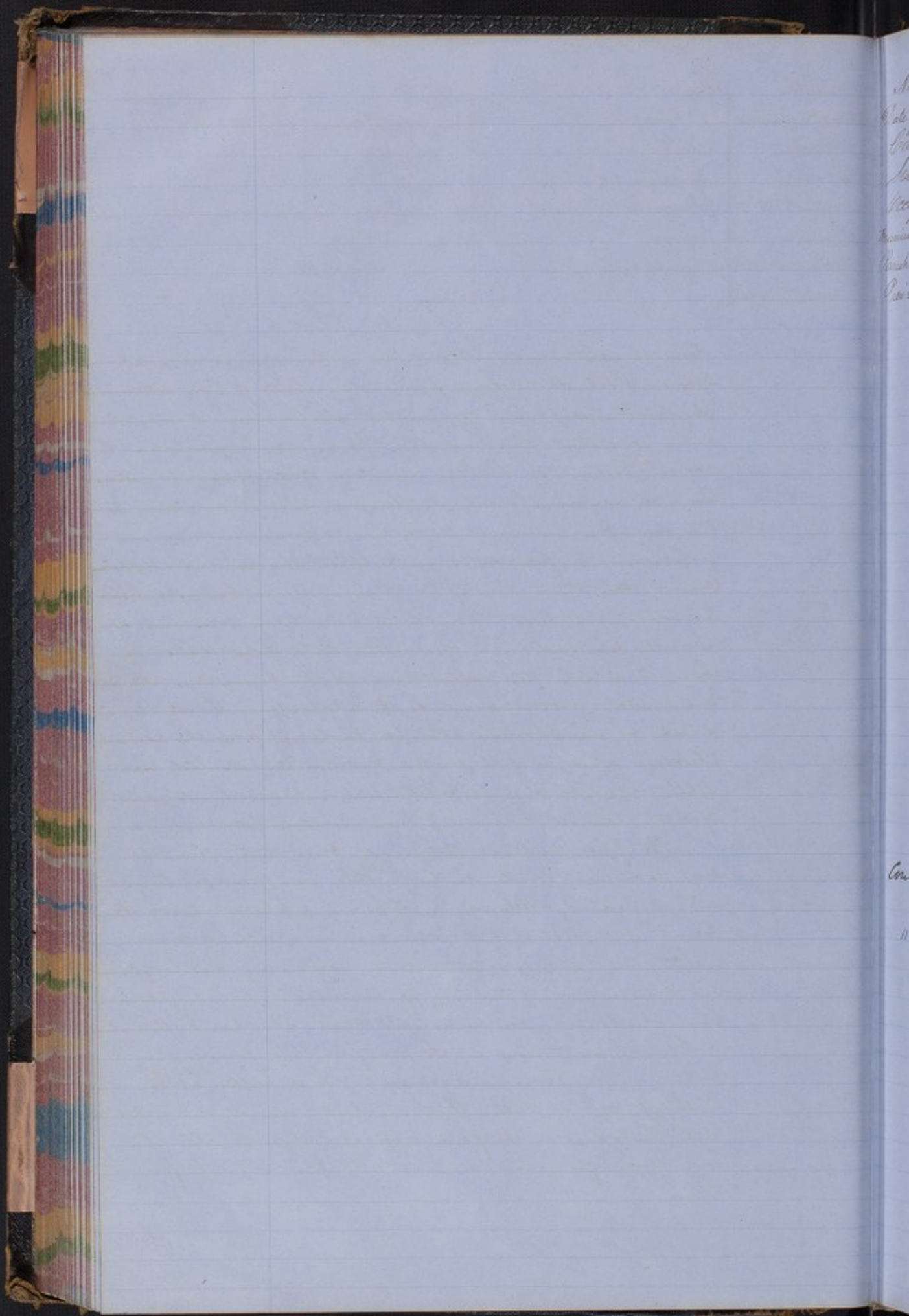
From the statement of the sister of this woman it would appear that three days preceding that of her admission the first symptoms of mental disturbance showed themselves, and that she had been permitted to perform the various <sup>duties</sup> pertaining to her situation of nursing maid in a clergyman's family in Glasgow up to the evening of the day preceding that of her admission.

Religious impressions of an intense character are supposed to have been the cause of her illness. She is believed to be suicidal, and stated to be dangerous; but a suicide is not usually characteristic of such a state of exaltation as that in which the patient was at the time the statement was made and moreover as the only evidence thereof consisted in <sup>her having made</sup> an abortive attempt to leap from the railway carriage when in full motion, and when in a similarly excited state, it may be questioned whether such is the correct interpretation of that act - or likewise of the statement of danger.

The first medical Certificate bears that when she was examined at the railway <sup>station</sup> there was "Great excitement and incoherence; + delusions as to persons & places;" and in the second it is stated that "she was in a state of great restlessness and excitement - screaming, and laughing and dancing, and tearing of her own or her neighbours' hair or clothes by turns; and that she has hallucinations or illusions - seeing in the ceiling her ravings, her brother or the Devil and so on: It is further <sup>stated</sup> ~~stated~~ the authority of her sister that she had been in a similar state <sup>to that</sup> embodied in the first medical Certificate all the way from Glasgow and had attempted to jump from the train

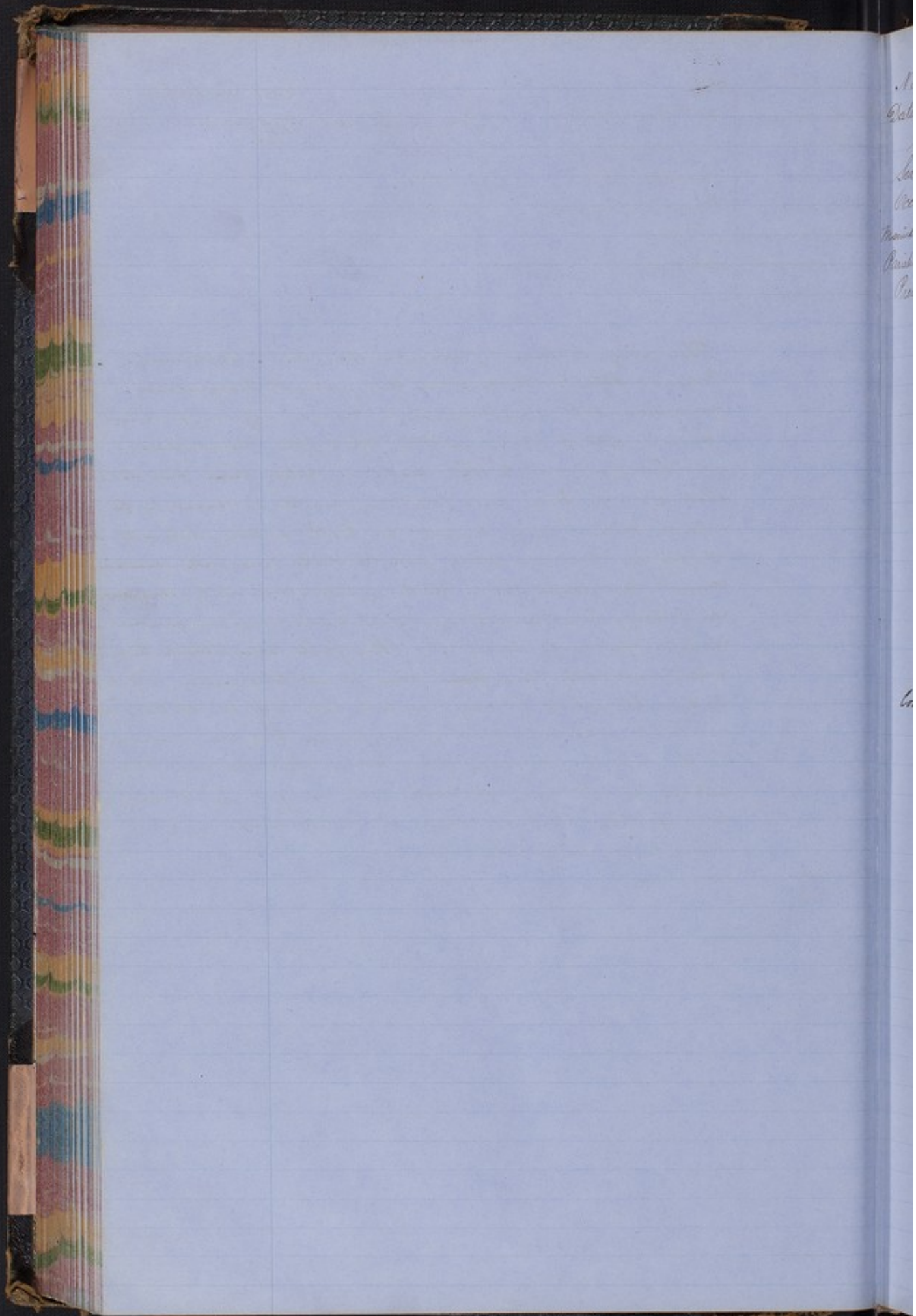

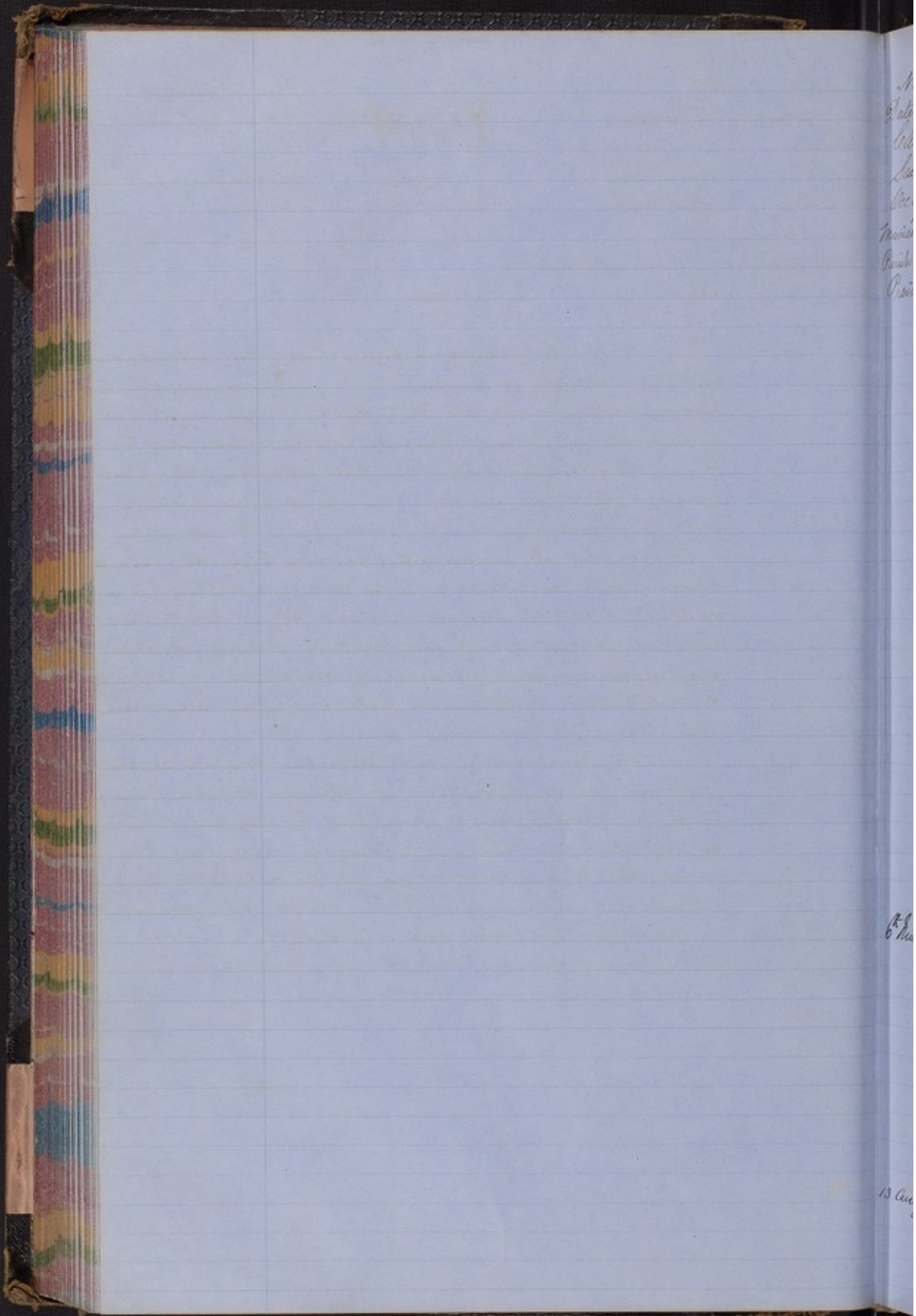

He is said to have lived an unblemished life - an exemplary husband, father, and servant for forty years and upwards, but that during the previous autumn an unfortunate faux impugning his honesty attached itself to him. Whether the charge was true or untrue, the effect appears to have been every way baneful as it led neither to a committal nor ~~to a removal~~ from society. He nevertheless wishes under the accusation; becomes low-spirited; is observed to be so by his neighbours and acquaintances; is shaken on the ground that this is evidence of guilt; eats less and loses weight; forgets himself and wallows in sorrow. Hebores himself with vinegar is the agent of destruction, but the quantity taken, or the means adopted to free him from the consequences are unknown.

The letter of A. G. tells me that she had an illness which necessitated her confinement in this Asylum about nine years ago; that she was under treatment six or seven months and was then removed in an imperfectly recovered state; and that she has been ever since dull, silly and not like a woman with all her wits about her.

The medical certificate under which the warrant for admission was obtained states first: that she has a rambling and incoherent way of talking - laughing when there is no reason and then becoming very quiet; that she works about the farm in an unnecessary way; that she attempted to strike and pull her father and mother; that she left her service and went to another farmhouse to live at. 2<sup>d</sup> That she labours under various delusions of a religious character; has an imperfect memory and speaks as if her language was among the things forgotten; complains of a feeling of heaviness about the head which confuses and distresses her &c

March 1872 This patient is very excited occasionally. She is somewhat morose. All her intellectual faculties are impaired. She is easily pleased with trifles & takes a great pleasure in decorating her person in a what she supposes to be great finery. She is very violent sometimes. She is daily engaged in the Laundry.

From the certificates and statement accompanying this woman (and they constitute <sup>the</sup> only history we can procure), we learn that she has been ailing and showing symptoms of madness since October last: that she labours under various absurd delusions as stated in the medical certificates thus: "Thinks her face has changed and become like a beast - thinks often that her face is like a dog's face; and is afraid that there is a tail growing from the lower part of her body between her legs. That there are things growing in her bowels which produce musical sounds" &c. Besides, we have the many irregularities of thought words and act, all certified, which constitute her the proper person to be detained under care and treatment - "She thinks that the people she meets make faces at her; is restless during the night; gets out of bed and can't be advised back to it; makes a large fire and wants to sit down upon it; wants to go up the chimney or lay down in the ash-pit" or "she threatens to hang her self; wishes her friends to kill her; beats various articles in the fire and tries to burn her tongue; is afraid she lives too long, and imagines she would be better if the hair were shaved from <sup>the</sup> genital organs"

On the right of the right eye has to be removed from the dismounting  
 1<sup>st</sup> March 1872 This patient is the picture of health - she never speaks unless when she is very excited & it is impossible to ascertain her mental condition. - She is quiet & orderly & is not reported to be dangerous in her fits of slight excitement.



- 13 August 1873 J.A. varies much in her mental condition. She is usually quiet and works steadily. Often excited, and she is then degraded in her habits and given to fighting. She seldom speaks.

Like too many Mary M<sup>c</sup> Taggart or M<sup>c</sup> Caudlish comes to us with no other information than that contained in the telegraphic despatch which requires whether we can admit a female pauper or in the medical certificate which have procured the sheriff warrant for her reception and detention. From these latter we learn that this patient has had a previous attack, and been under treatment for months in the Asylum years ago; that her madness is hereditary; that on the present occasion it has been excited by drink; that she has delusions and hallucinations; has a wild and excited appearance; is erratic in her conversation, and is determined to suicide.

7<sup>th</sup> March 1871

The physical condition of this patient is much impaired. She is very melancholic & disposed to suicide. She is coherent & sensible in her conversation. But she is unable to take care of herself & requires attention.

3 August 1874

M<sup>c</sup> C. sustained a fracture of the femur on the 3<sup>rd</sup> May 73. From this she has recovered slowly. She is now in good general health. Though thin in habit of body. She is still confined to bed.

7 November 1874

Patient, who was none the worse for the small operation, has once more come to grief, another patient knocked her over, by a park, on a stone floor - she being very lame and "fitter", and she has sustained a fracture of the neck of the sound femur. The prognosis is very grave in patient's feeble condition and at her age, complicated as well by weak heart and some chronic Bronchitis.

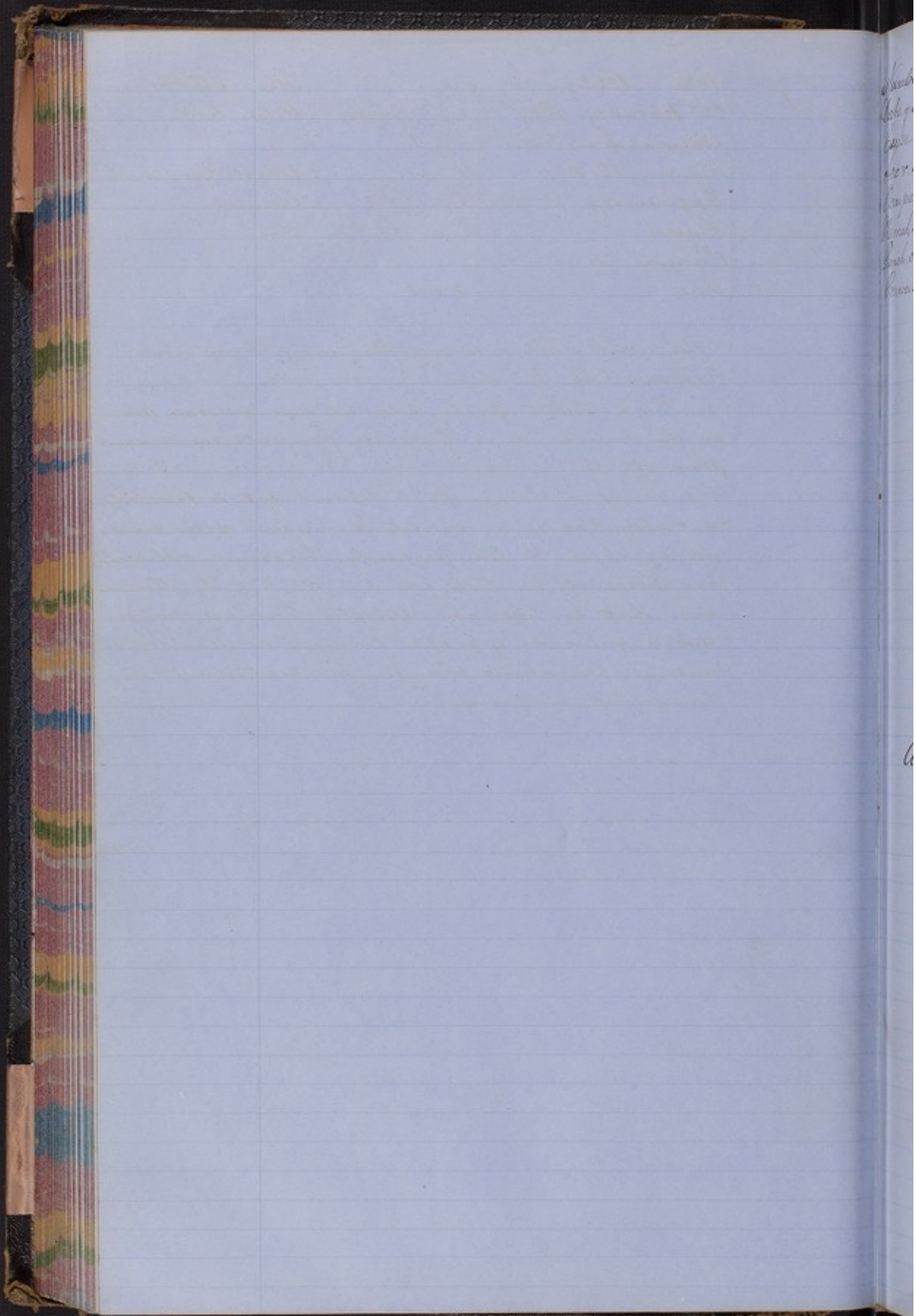

M. H. is placed for the first time in our Asylum. She has been under treatment, however, according to the statement of the medical man for a period of twenty-one weeks at her own home.

From the medical certificates it appears that she "is mullen and will not speak except when roused up; is given to collect all sorts of things into heaps; labours under deep depression; has a bewildered and lost like look; answers all questions with a "yes; and seems altogether void of the power of reasoning". Moreover she "pulls at things" and strikes, takes the fire out of the grate and puts it inside the bed."

At the time of admission she was mentally deeply "under a cloud". Nothing roused her from lethargy until she was presented to an infant stroller when her emotions lifted her, carried her to it, and supported her thru a noisy (but) scene of kissing, caressing & hugging.





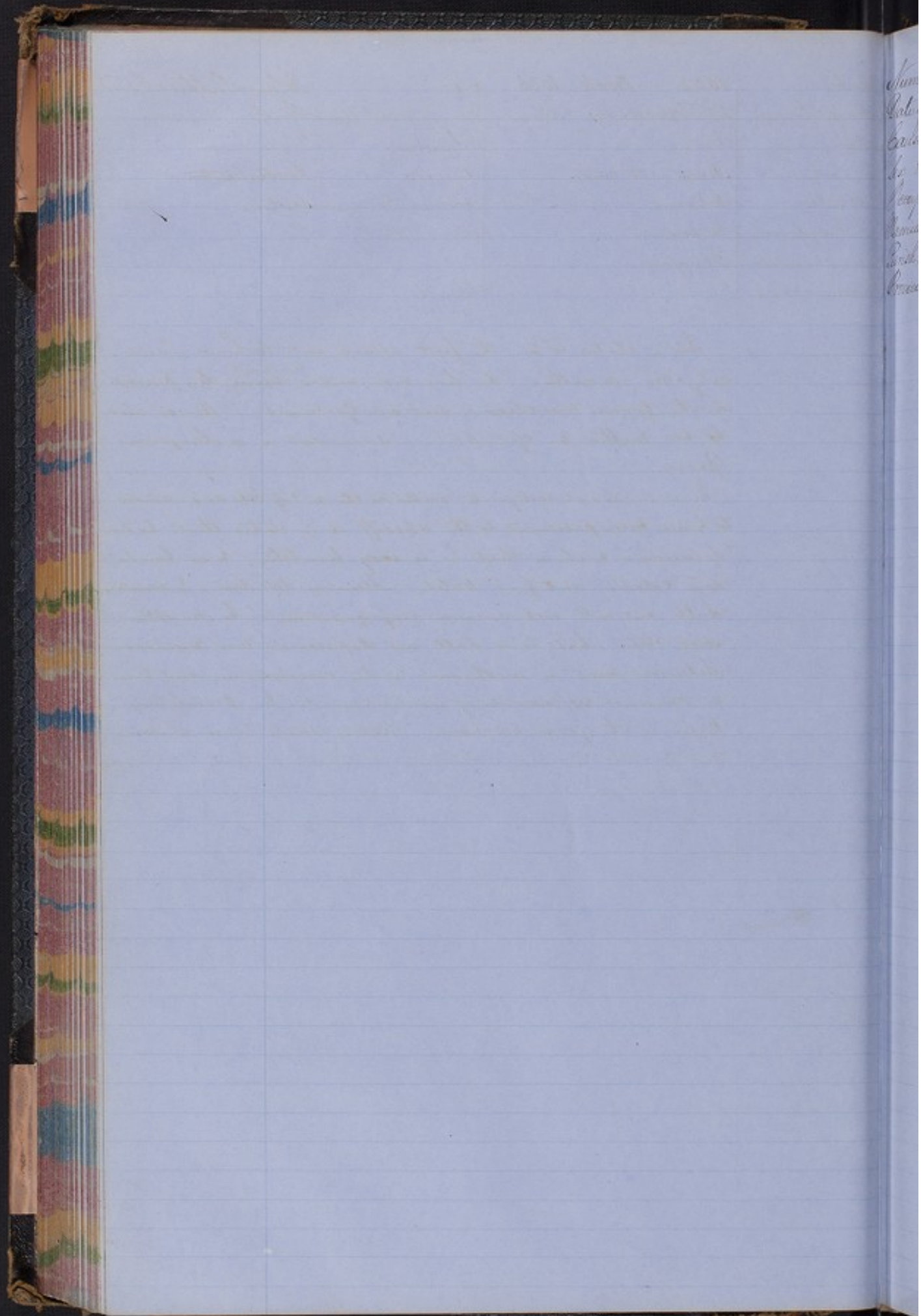

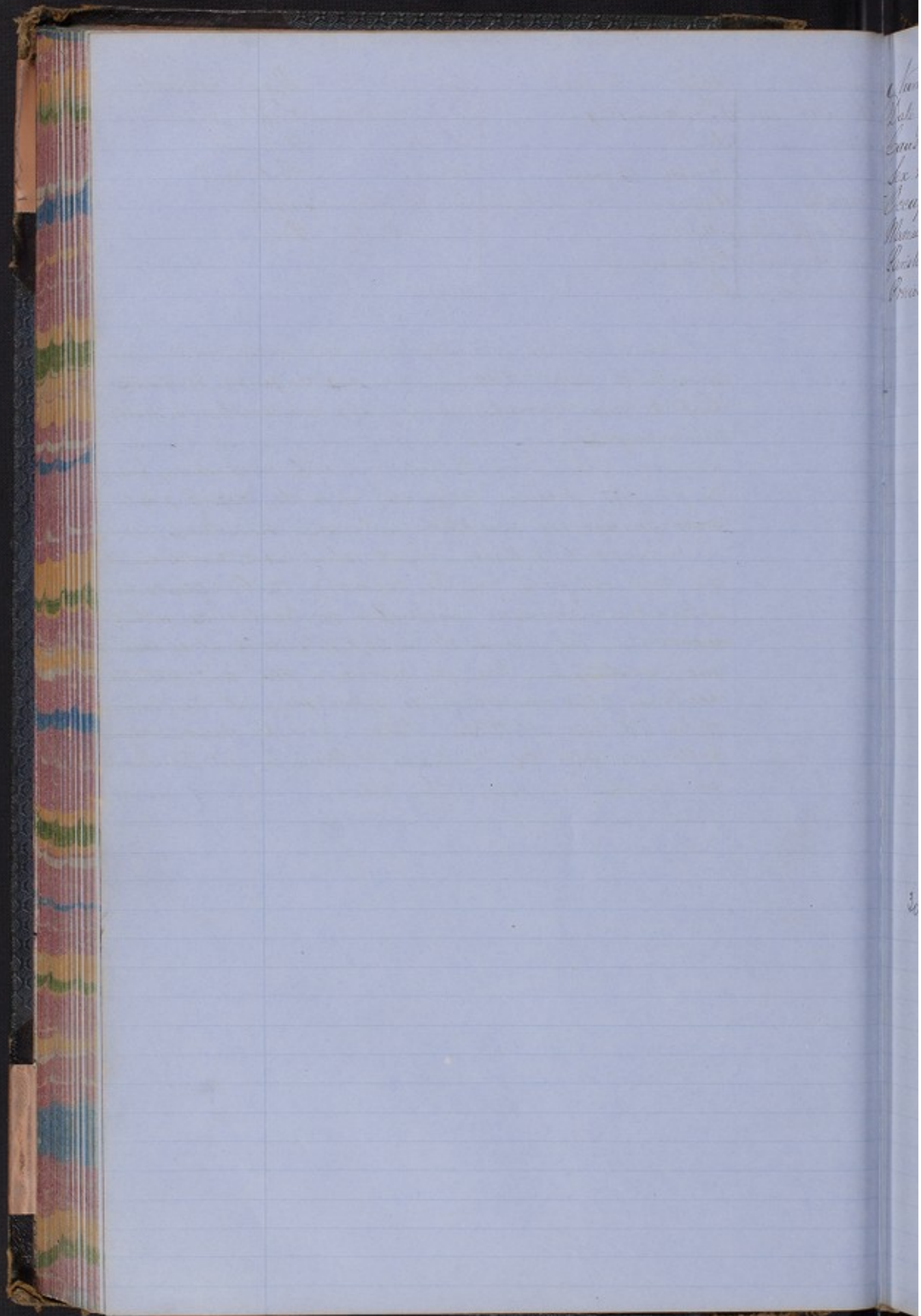

M. S. when admitted was labouring under an attack of acute Peritonitis and so feeble of body that it was scarcely expected she would have held out many days.

From the papers which accompany her, & from the medical certificate upon the sheriff's warrant for her reception we learn that the present is a second attack; that she had arrived at the age of fifty on the occasion of the first attack; that she was in an asylum for treatment on that occasion. At present she is said to be noisy sleepless and incoherent; that her memory is gone and that she declares she was 60 or 70 years of age at the time of the Cholera of 1832. 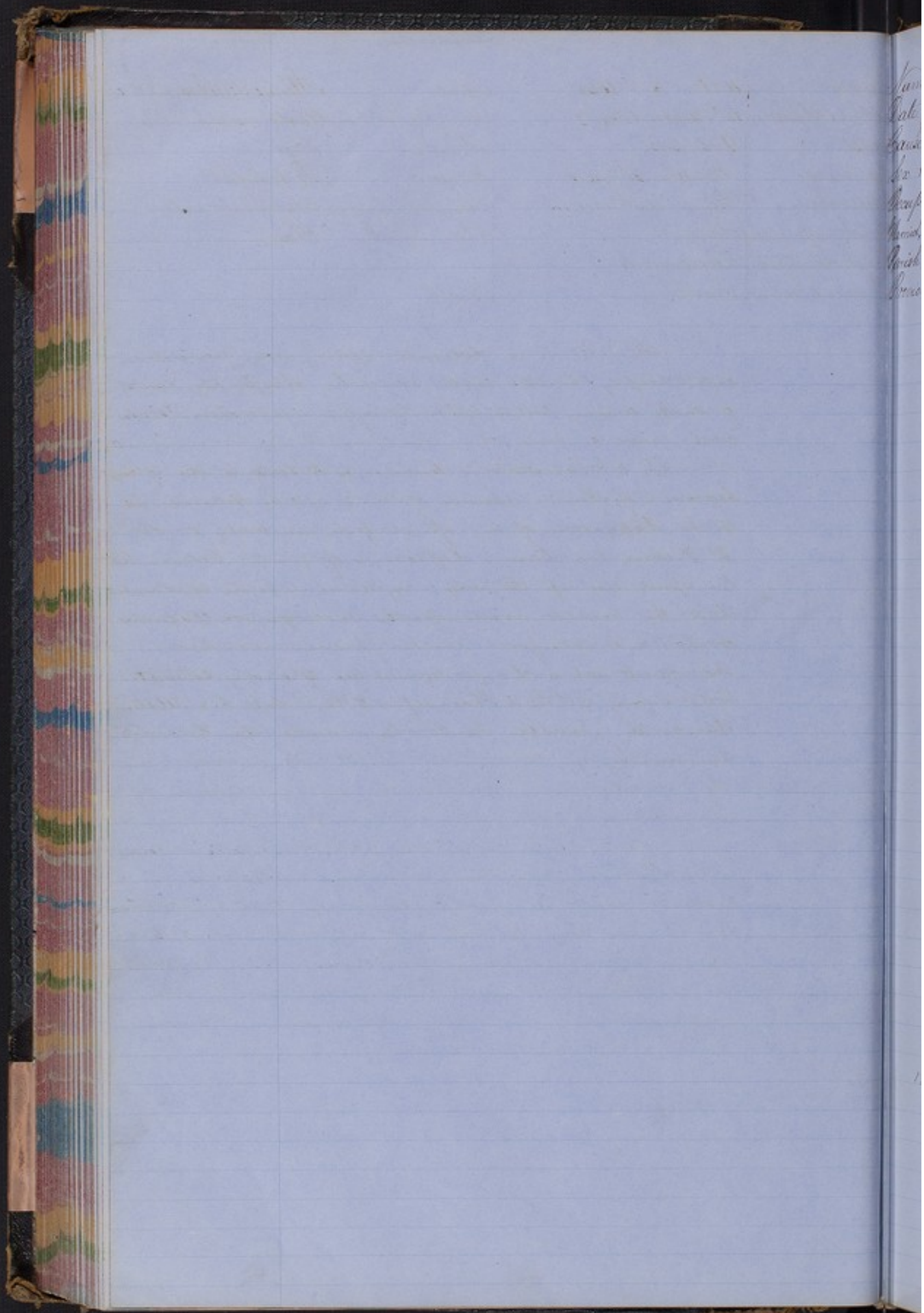

M. N. is a delicate looking young woman and deeply tanned with seropula spots, suggestive of a short nursing life in the Asylum and the Conscriptives early grave.

The mental state is described by Dr. West as one of deep depression of spirits, absence of mind, and by delusions as to the departure of her spirit from her body, &c. &c. Dr. Dickson says there is depression of spirits; believes that her spirit has left the body; expresses a desire to die; that the mental preoccupation is so great that she would not take food unless pressed upon her. No overt act is charged against her of having attempted to do injury either to herself or others, but her mother "thinks it probable that she would do herself an injury".

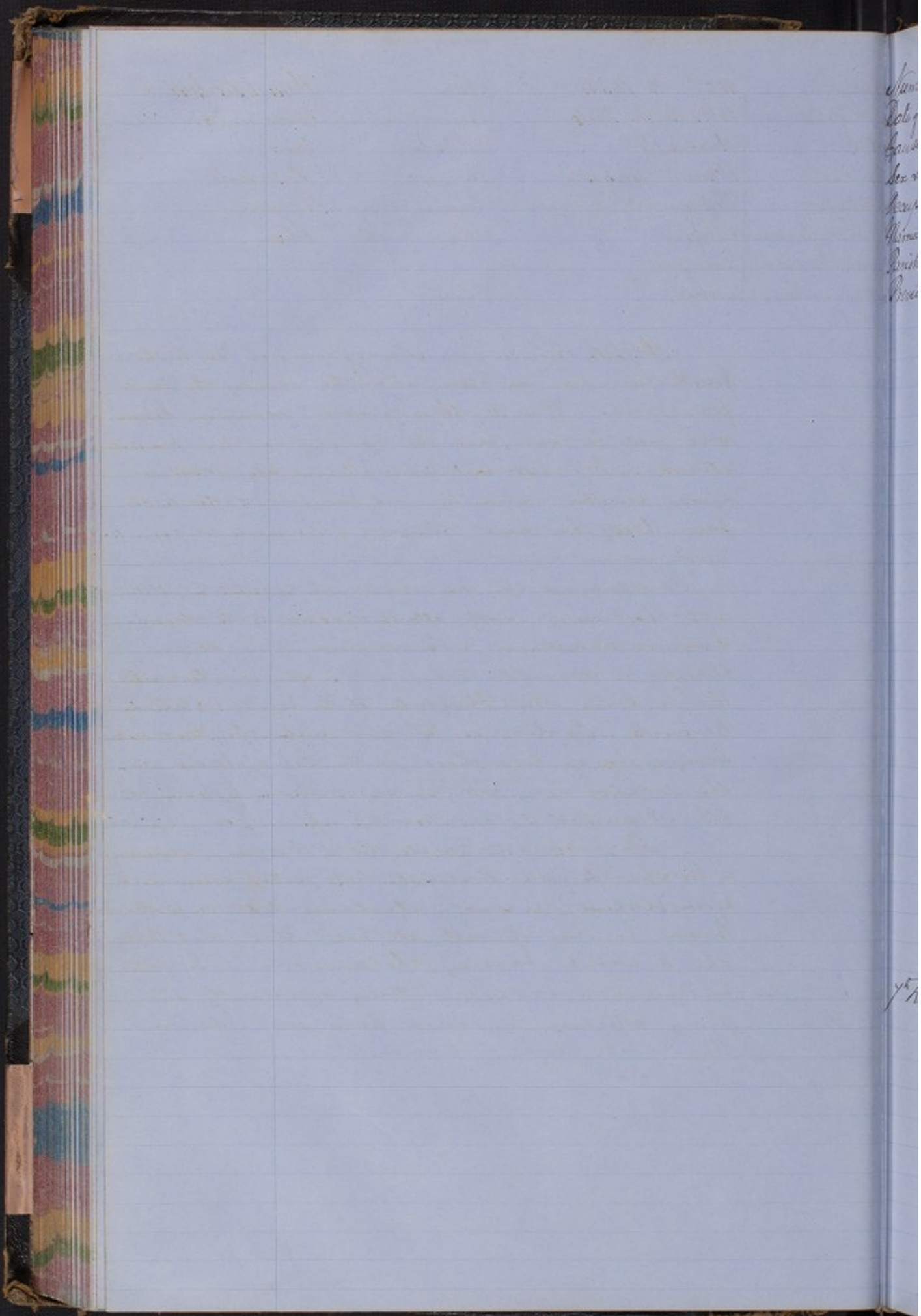

It is not said to be attributable to the like source on this occasion and we find opposite the query "Supposed cause" the very frequent reply of "Not known"

On admission she was very much excited, hyperstimulated and declaimed with all the fervour and eloquence of injured innocence. Gods and men must do her behests or succumb to her will, she would write to her sister Mrs Plumkett of the Royal Artillery Barracks, Exeter, or to her uncle the Reverend somebody of somewhere in the Isle of Man and she would see, <sup>and take offence</sup> whether Sir William Brown or Mrs Dinwoodie would trample upon her.

The medical certificate states, that she is incoherent in her speech, and that she acts and speaks in a most violent manner: declares that Sir William Brown has run off with all her "illan", and that she is about bearing children &c. "Is restless incoherent & violent, talking incessantly and giving utterance to various delusions" "Has been thus in the Asylum previously"

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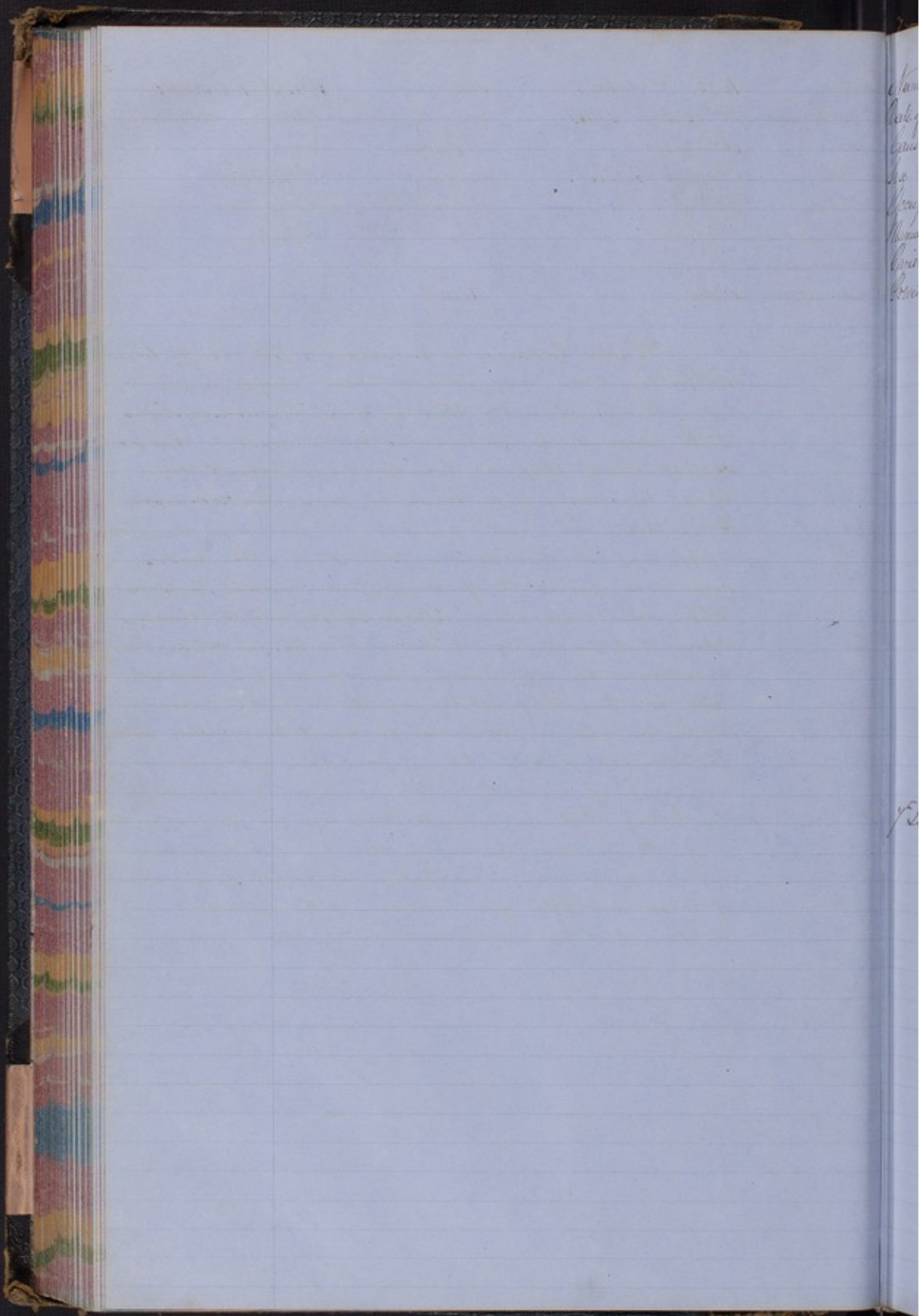

Charles Erskine was removed from the Crichton Institution in an unrecovered state about two months ago by his friends and the story of his behaviour during that period is unknown to the writer. Now it is at all likely that we should have been called upon to report upon him so soon had it not been that he had made a criminal assault upon a girl thirteen years of age. The medical man who grants the first certificate — and he is one who has served along apprenticeship to the observing, care, and treatment, of the morbid mind — charges the assault to the intent to commit a rape. But while fully admitting the possibility, nay the probability — even in a person who is said to be "lucid, calm and determined" — who has a peculiar expression in — "duration of insanity" I must confess to a leaning to the belief that the assault was less for the gratification of a desire than the satisfaction of a worse — a homicidal impulse — so much in anticipation and perhaps extenuation of what must follow of our intercourse with our care and treatment of this unfortunate man.

7<sup>th</sup> March 1864. There is no improvement in this man's mental condition. He is silent & depressed & never speaks to any one. He answers questions which are put to him in a very polite manner & he is daily engaged in work. His health is very good.

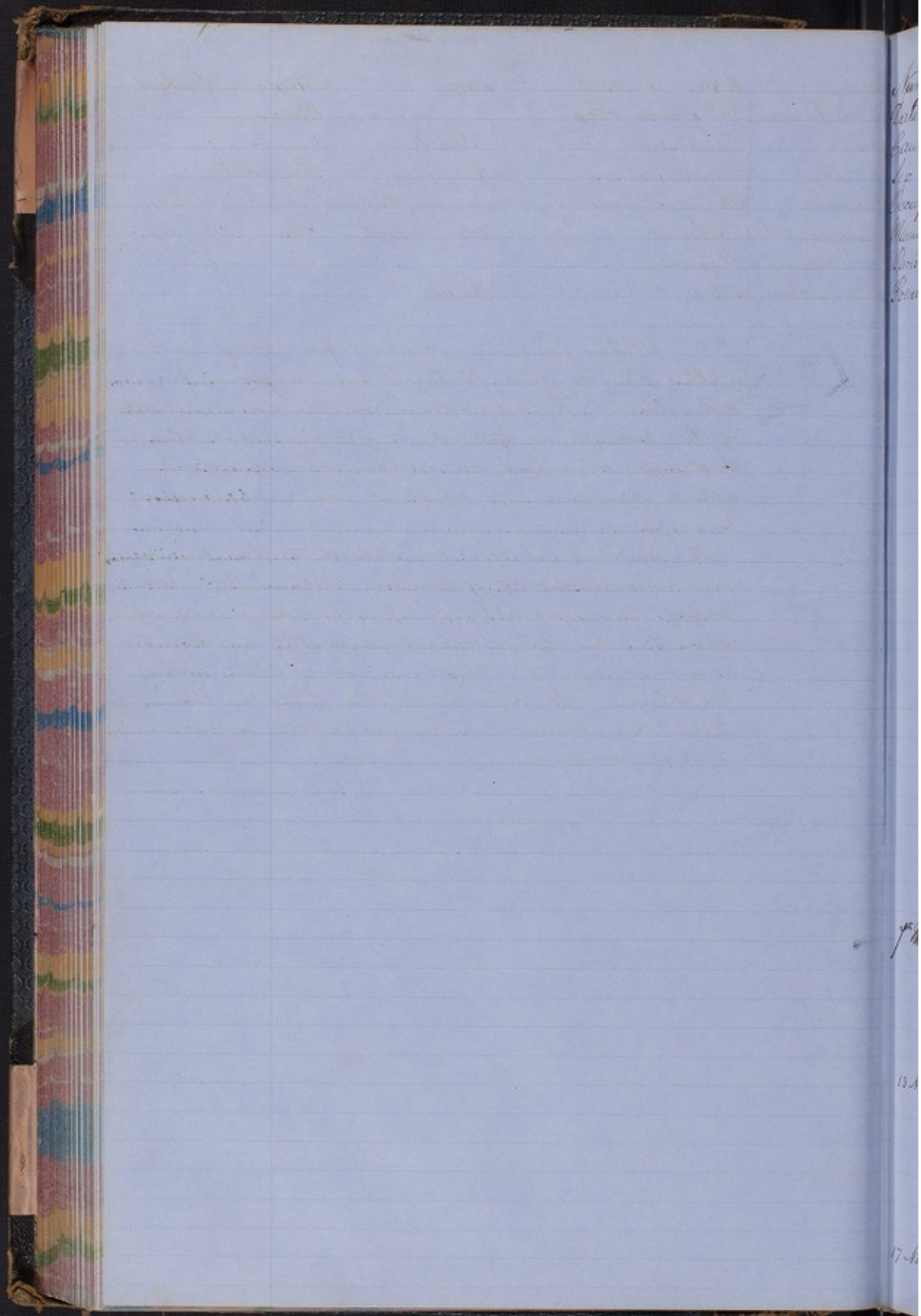

"William Kennedy has been subject to epileptic fits since he was ten years old, and his mind appears to have been always weak, tho' he has been gradually getting worse"; he suffers at times "very much from epilepsy and is at present a prisoner in the Wexford prison on a charge of having assaulted his mother." Such is the statement accompanying this patient, and from the medical certificates we are further told that his "appearance is of a nature altogether indicating imbecility"; that he "labours under delusions" and is "erratic in his conversation" — that his conversation is filthy and obscene in the extreme, & that too, especially in the presence of females, and that when checked hereunto he becomes "furious and threatens danger to his mother &c. He exposes his person in the presence of females and at times goes out in a state of nudity". He has been convicted of theft and confined in the Perth general Prison in consequence, there, during his confinement, it was observed by the medical officer that he was "addicted to the practice of masturbation".

1<sup>st</sup> March 1872

There is no improvement in W. K.'s condition. He is as stupid as ever. He is said to be very irascible and his fits are frequent & during that period his habits are filthy. His bad habits continue.

C. has been ailing since the Sunday preceding her admission; and in the first medical certificate the grounds on which it is believed that <sup>she</sup> is maniac are stated to be her incoherence and her stating "that she believes her soul to be in great danger, and owing to this impression is kept in constant misery &c." The second medical <sup>certificate</sup> says that "there is considerable excitement, morbid domination of religious ideas, incoherence, and a restlessness evidencing alternately great timidity and great self satisfaction"; and by the way it is given as evidence of unsoundness of mind, on the strength of a statement by a same sister, that she had broken several panes of glass, and during the <sup>day</sup> preceding the examination so interfered with the nursing of the invalid mother as to have prevented her from either food or drink during the entire day.

Altho this is the first appearance of Miss B in this house it appears that it is not the first time it has been necessary to have her placed under restraint. It seems that she was placed in the C. N. S. some time in 1863 and only removed therefrom quite recently in an unrecovered condition. The change to home life does not seem to have benefited her, for we have her brother and sister asserting that they can live with her; and one of the medical certifiers bears that there exists "great excitement, constant and incoherent talk - chiefly about religious matters - the use of violent language, great restlessness and a disposition to walk about all night." The second medical certifier repeats the tale of the "great excitement" and adds that "she accuses her relatives of conspiring with the Evil one, and conspiring to her hurt" that her "delusions are numerous and all absurd."

21 May 1873 J. B. is often excited and pours out a stream of words, in which no connection is obvious. She suffers from erotic tendencies in her quieter intervals. She is in good health.

2 December 1873 J. B. does not make any change in her general condition. She is still given to talking in her fluent, vociferating, incoherent manner. Her general health is good. She sometimes suffers from Diarrhoea.

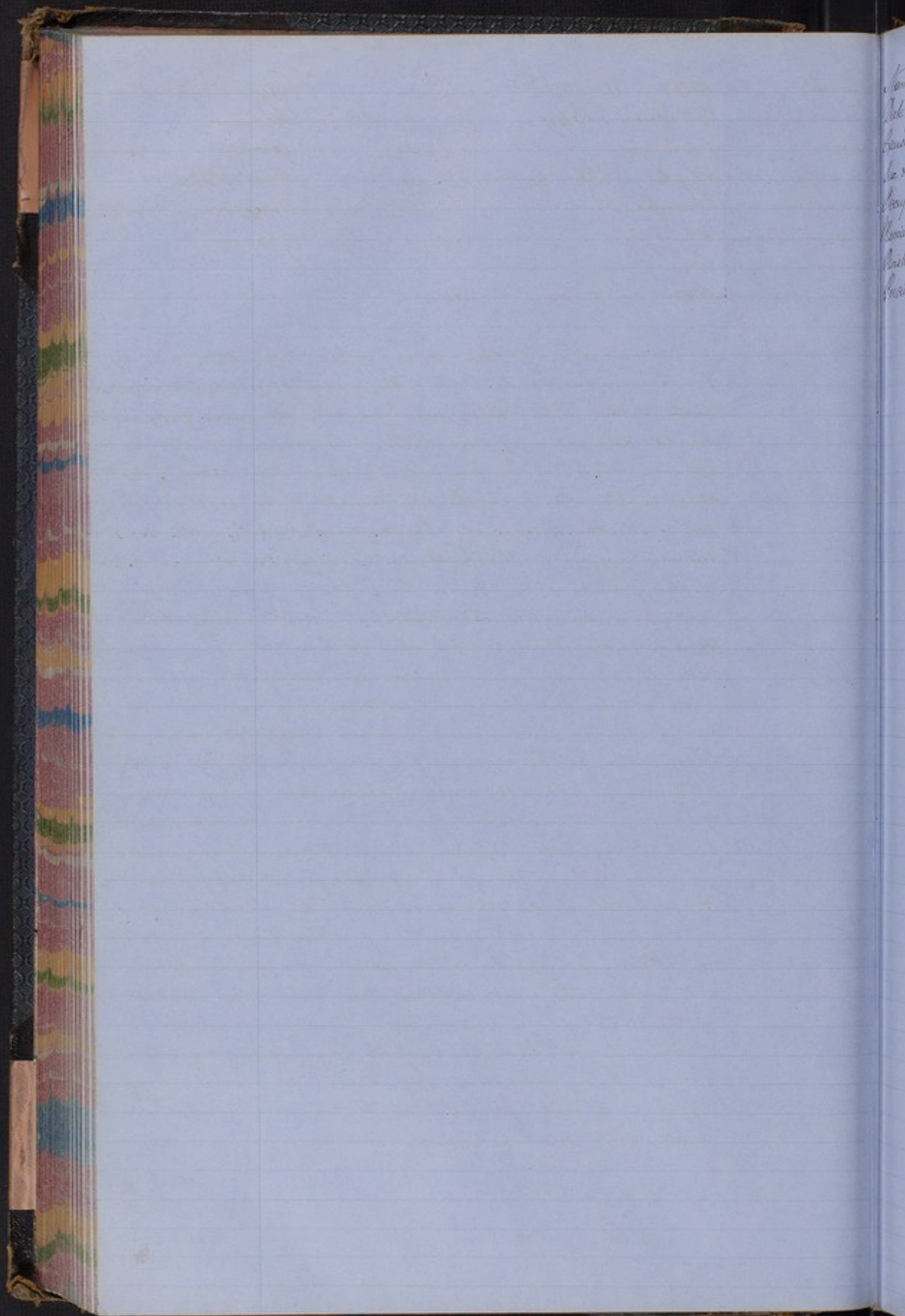

How far this disposition may be in fact the product of active disease, and an outward manifestation of a newly born reality - or how far it may have been the creation of outward or unkindly treatment it is difficult to determine.
