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



Mr Lyster said:- Mr FitzRoy came into my bedroom last night as I was getting into bed. He talked a lot of language about girls. I think he was ill. He petted me and tried to interfere with my private parts. He kissed me several times. He made some rude suggestions to me,. It is my opinion that he wanted to use me like a woman. I didn't say anything to him, but made every excuse to get away. I was disgusted.

Mr Middleton said:- FitzRoy came into my bedroom while I was dressing

one morning, so I asked him to go away as I had not room to dress. He came in to talk I suppose. He has been in my bedroom once or twice before. He has tried to cuddle me as he would a girl, and I have had several rows with himaabout it. He has never tried to kiss me and he has never interfered with my private parts, but if I had allowed him to continue in his methods he probably would have done so. He has rather objectionable manners that way. When I asked him to go out of my room this morning he kicked me.

TheCharge Attendant said:- I walked down the gallery last night and called "bedtime", turned out the lights in the smoke room, walked up the gallery to the sitting room and did the same there. I then walked down the gallery and got out the gentlemen' clothes. Mr FitzRoy was not in his robm and he had not undressed so I looked for him in the smoke room, but he was not there. As I came out I caught a glimpse of him in Mr Lyster's doorway. Mr Lyster was sitting on the side of the bed and Mr FitzRoy was patting him on the shoulder. Mr Lyster was in bed when I went by 5 minutes before. Mr Lyster said Mr FitzRoy seemed to have mistaken him for a girl, he seemed so very affectionate and messed him about. When Mr FitzRoy was in his own room he said something about reporting, and seemed mesmerised. I fancy he was asking me not to report him. Extracts from the Case Book re Mr V.R.C.FitzRoy;

oct 18, 1902. Escaped from Wales on Sept 24th. Recaptured at Gloucester on October 12 by Police. Returned here October 14. Is very dull and depressed. Bodily health good. W.Miller. Jan 10. 1903. Much more cheerful and contented lately. Health good. W.M. Aprl 20, Continues cheerful and contented. Childish at moments. July3. Has had outbursts of restless ness, using abusive and filthy language. Bodily health good. W.M.Robson.

Oct 3 1903. Went to Wales but had to return because he was abusive. Of late has been much upset by his father's death. W.M.R. Jan 3, 1904. Is very variable, becomes angered and abusive on slight provocation. His conversation is childish and not of an

intellectual order. W.M.Robson.

Feb 3, L904. Last night patient broke his "parole on the grounds" and disappeared at 4.30. He tried to borrow money from the Manager of the Plough Hotel in order to get to London, without success. He, however, paw ned his gold watch chain. He was found with a woman at the Pheasant Public House in an intoxicated condition at 8 o'clock. On his way home he was very violent and kicked the cab, damaging it a good deal. His language in his return was very foul. W.M.Robson.

Mar 9 1904. Patient was allowed in the town with his mother and an attendant yesterday. They were to dine at the Grand Hotel and then go on to the theatre. At the Grand Hotel the patimanaged ent **xxiss** to slip out at the back door and was lost. This occurred about 7.45 pm. He was found on the Towcester Rd about 9pm, the worse for liquor, but not drunk. His language again was very filthy, but he was not violent as on the previous accasion. He declared that all he wanted was a woman. Mar 10. 1904. Last night patient slipped from his own room while undressing into that of another patient and was very offensive in his behavior. 





Dear Dr Rutherford,

Messrs Anderson & Kerr showed me your letter with regard to Mr Forsyth, and I see that he wants to be released as otherwise there is nothing but ruin before him.

The delusion that he is ruined has been present in one form or another during the past three or four months.

Formerly Mr Forsyth was a man of determination, alert, and competent to protect himself and his interests, but at the beginning of the year he became morose, restless and hesitating, and the mismanagement of his business attracted attention. E.G. He would go to the market and hesitate as to the animal he would buy until he returned without making any purchase. Ultimately the shop was closed entirely because of this incapacity to act.

Since May he has wandered about his house, wringing his hands, bemoaning his fate and knocking his head against the door, He wants to get on the rails again, but he is quite incapable of making any exertion to do so. He has also frequently stated that he ought to do away with himself, and has confessed that he has had terrible thoughts in that direction. Every effort has been made by his friends to get him to go a holiday, but without success. His capacity for sensible action seems/- seems to be totally paralysed, and all he does is to keep harping on the delusion that he is ruined. This, with the fact that a brother committed suicide, has given considerable cause for anxiety in dealing with him. Yours sincerely,





He has been ill for a month.

On admission, it was difficult to get him to speak. He was very restless and refused all food. Very restless and noisy through the night.

On July 8th, Mr. McGregor showed signs of improvement. He took some interest in what was going on in the ward and slept well at night. He was now talking cheerfully to those round him. On July 20th, he had a relapse. He was noisy, sleepless, restless and boisterous in his manner.

This condition lasted until the middle of September when he began to show considerable improvement. Towards the end of January 1906, he had another relapse. He now showed great impulsiveness and frequently attacked his attendants. On one occasion he threw a knife at one of the doctors.

He was quieter about the end of February but in the following month he again became very impulsive and excited. He is now in very much the same condition.

y Dear Dr. Jeffrey,

I have most carefully examined Mr. R. Balfour, and ave heard all about his attack from his brother-in-law. My conclusions re -

1. He suffers from melancholia of the delusional and suicidal type.

2. It is not likely that he will recover at once. It will obably take some months.

3. For his present safety and to give him the best chance of timate recovery, I advise that he should be placed in the Crichton stitution, and the sooner the better.

4. There are certain motor symptoms in his tongue, his eyes, is face, and his walking, and hand grip which show that his motor centres be involved - probably through some degree of <u>arterio Sclerosis</u>. It mentally he is not incurable.
