When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

That the United States of America, are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection with them is, and ought to be, totally dissolved; and that as a free and independent State, they have full power to levy war, conclude peace, contract alliances, establish commerce, and to do all other acts and things which independent States may of right do.
