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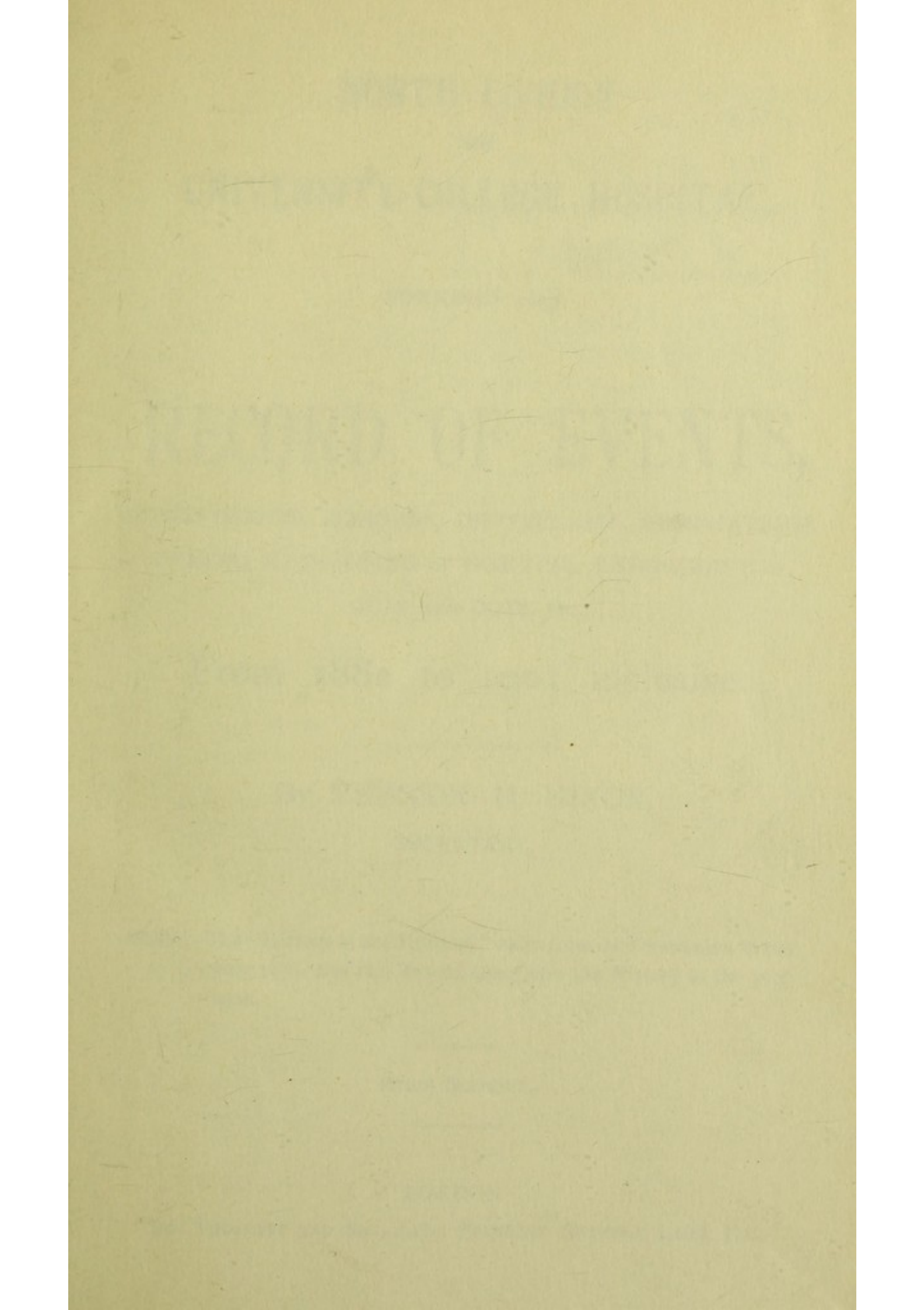
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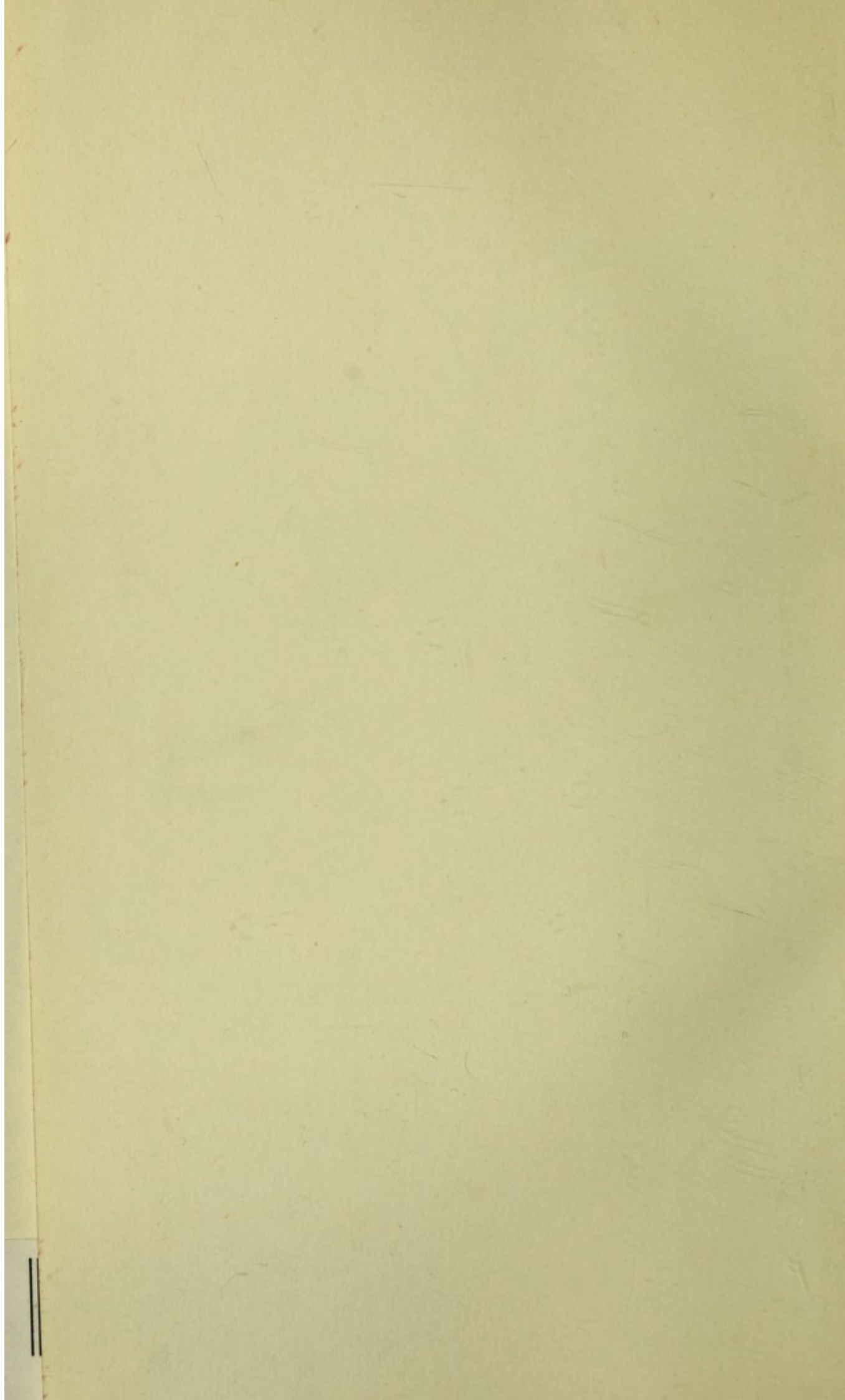

IN January, 1882, I published, with the permission of the Hospital Committee, a History of the Hospital from its foundation to the year 1881. Looking at the fact that the old Hospital buildings are rapidly giving place to the new Hospital in course of erection through the generosity of Sir J. The surplus proceeds of sale, after the expenses of publication have been liquidated, will be paid into the Hospital funds.

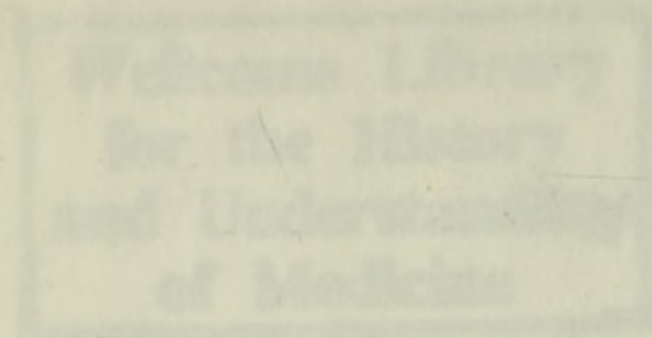

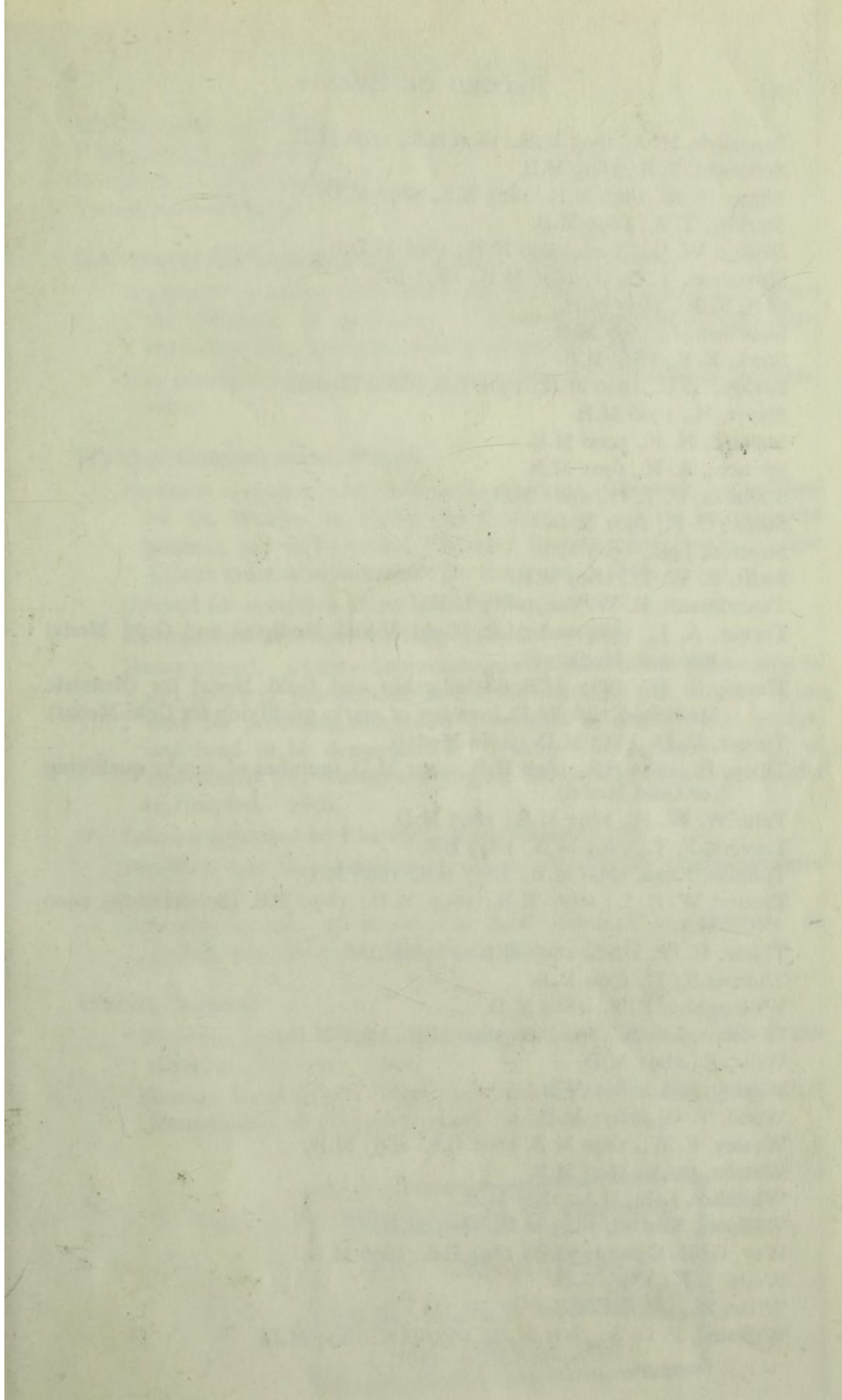

Opened for reception of patients in May. 1888.

Re-organised to reduce working expenses. 1889.

Home closed. Charity Commissioners applied to for permission to sell property, proceeds of sale to be invested and income to be used for procuring admission of patients to convalescent homes, and fund to be denominated "Wakley Convalescent Fund," as memorial of Dr. Wakley's kind gift. Memorial tablet to be erected in Hospital. 1890.

Scheme approved by Charity Commissioners. 1891.

Property sold in pursuance of scheme of Charity Commissioners. 1892.

Proceeds of sale of house and land invested in purchase of £2,825 11s. 1d. India 3 per cent. stock. 1893.

"Emma Montefiore" Ward, in recognition of Mrs. Nathaniel Montefiore's liberality on many occasions. 1894.

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
