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





The lease was purchased by Edward Alleyn, esq., founder of Dulwich College, and he formed it into a theatre, which he denominated 'The Fortune,' and finished it in 1621; the whole building and the theatrical property were destroyed by fire. After being rebuilt, it was offered for sale in 1661, and then was of sufficient space to afford twenty-three tenements and gardens, and a street, now called Playhouse yard, which at present exhibits a scene of poverty, and is an avenue from Golden lane to Whitecross street."

"Lud-gate, antiently Lud's gate, from King Lud, who is said to have built it sixty-six years before Christ; it was repaired by the barons in 1215, and forty-five years afterwards beautified with the images of Lud and his two sons. In 1586 it was quite taken down and rebuilt with ye images of Lud, &c., on ye east side, and Q. Elizabeth on ye west. It was much damnified by ye great Fire, but since then beautifully repair'd. In 1378 this gate was made a prison for freemen of this city, for debts, &c., and has continued so ever since."

It is a strong and large building, and was first erected about the year 1100, at which time the Cathedral of St. Paul's was rebuilding and its Cæmitery greatly enlarged, which occasioned ye crossing and stopping up of ye passages in those parts, to remedy which inconvenience this New-gate was erected. The devouring flames in '66 quite consumed this gate, but since then it is rebuilt much more commodious and strong."






