Regulations for Hospitals

Chapter I. General Regulations

Section 1. The purpose of these regulations is to establish a uniform system of management and control for all hospitals under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Health.

Section 2. These regulations shall apply to all hospitals, whether public or private, and to all persons connected with the same.

Section 3. The State Board of Health shall have the right to inspect and visit all hospitals at any time, and to require the production of any records or accounts kept by the same.

Section 4. The Board of Health may suspend or revoke the license of any hospital which fails to comply with these regulations.

Section 5. The Board of Health may make such other and further regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.

Section 6. Any person who violates any of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of not more than \$100, or to imprisonment for not more than six months, or to both.

Section 7. These regulations shall take effect on the first day of January next.
