PREFACE.

erfor cretie hot winds cen

IT is neceffary to premife, that the following cafes occurred in the general hospital at Chunar, in the province of Benares. In general each cafe was written at the bed of the patient, in the form in which it is now printed. Some of them, however, were compleated on recollection in the closet. All, it is hoped, are accurate.

Chunar has been long efteemed a very unhealthy fituation, perhaps with injuftice. On one fide the river Ganges runs; ftony hills form a boundary on the other. The foil is ftony. In the rainy feafon the water foon runs off into the Ganges, and leaves it drier than the lower country of Bengal. In the hot feafon, the heat is proportionally more A 4 intenfe. viii PREFACE.

intenfe. The cold feafon is free from every peculiar inconvenience.

The feafon of the hot winds generally commences in the month of March; and encreafes in intenfity until the periodical rains begin, during the courfe of July. Thefe generally continue till towards the end of October; when the cold weather gradually comes on, and lafts until the period of the hot winds. The weather is generally cool during the rainy feafon; yet, occafionally, it is very clofe and oppreffive, particularly for a few hours after fun-fet.

The hofpital was a fpacious mofque, raifed confiderably above the level of the ground, and built in a very open and elevated fituation. From the nature of the edifice it was not poffible to prevent a very free ventilation at all feafons.

All the patients afflicted with Fevers or Dyfentery must be understood to have been on low diet, and without an allowance of wine, unless where the contrary is noticed.

The hour of vifiting the hofpital was generally between fix and feven in the morning, or about fun-rife. From the commencement of the year 1788, the patients principally confifted of invalids.

The periods of the moon were not marked during the treatment of the Cafes; but were afterwards directed to be added from a London almanack. It is prefumed that the difference is not fo confiderable as to render a greater degree of accuracy neceffary.

The medical world may draw their own inferences, and make their own comments, • on the cafes which are fubmitted to their examination. The perfon who has treated and compiled them fhall defer his, until the public may have formed fome unbiaffed opinion of them: he fhall only venture at prefent to vouch for their authenticity. The reader will perceive that there are only two cafes of Fever of an unfortunate termination : they are the only two which occurred in the treatment of about four hundred cafes. plication of fymptoms existed in each; and one of them was certainly not treated according to the purgative plan. It was thought neceffary to felect fuch cafes, as would rather exhibit the effects, than the fuccefs of purging in Fevers; confequently, many of the cafes, descriptive of the former, are incomplete. It is to be prefumed that these cases may prove a body of evidence, by which the fystem of lunar influence in Fevers may be judged. As no further attention could be paid for a great length of time to render this SELEC-TION of CASES more worthy of the public . eye; their immediate publication was deemed more eligible than a delay, that might deprive the medical world of fome very important facts: If they prove fuch in the estimation of the public, the numerous imperfections will be readily overlooked.

MEDICINES

PRINCIPALLY USED IN THE CASES.

THE folution of falts was fometimes an ounce, fometimes an ounce and a half, of either Glauber or bitter falts, to twenty ounces of water, fometimes alone, fometimes combined with cream of tartar, manna, or fugar, effence of peppermint, &c. This folution was generally taken in dofes of two ounces every hour, more or lefs, until it operated very freely by ftool. If the firft quantity failed, the general rule was, another fupply, until the effect enfued. To this folution one grain, or two grains, of tartar emetic, was often added.

The febrifuge faline mixture, or folution of tartar emetic, was fometimes a fimple folution of tartar emetic in water; two, three, or more grains to a pint; fometimes this quantity was diffolved in a pint of the neutral mixture; but the difference was efteemed perfectly immaterial. When the intention was to vomit, an ounce or more of the folution

was

was taken every five, ten, or fifteen minutes, until the effect was completely produced; when to perfpire, which was very feldom the cafe, it was taken in finaller quantities, and at longer intervals, with other appropriated means; when to promote the fecretions in general, particularly the inteftinal, which was most frequently the object, an ounce was taken every hour or two hours, as circumftances permitted, during the twenty-four.

The infusion of sena, generally with half an ounce or more of fome purging falt diffolved in it, was taken in the fame manner as the folution of falts.

The caftor-oil of the East Indies is probably not fo ftrong as that which comes from the West, and may be taken in larger quantities.

Purging pills. During the cafes which occurred in 1787, each pill was composed of two grains of calomel, and three of laxative mercurial pill (P. E.) In the remainder, each pill contained two grains of calomel and three of cathartic extract, fcammony, or refin of jalap, indifferently. Sometimes, but very feldom, a finall quantity of tartar emetic was added.



CASE I.

REED. Age 30. Admitted 1ft March 1787.

March Ift.

H IS pulfe is very quick, and his fkin very hot; his tongue extremely foul. He complains of a very violent pain in his bowels and in his breaft. He difcharges very offenfive fæces involuntarily, but in very fmall quantity.——The folution of falts, rendered palatable with fyrup and peppermint-water, and with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken three ounces every half hour, until it fhall have operated by ftool. Let his bowels be fomented frequently until the pain abate; and a clyfter be injected every half hour, till ftools be procured. Sago diet to be allowed.

2d. He has had fome little evacuation by ftool, extremely putrid and bilious. The

pain

pain in his belly is ftill very fevere; his pulfe is very quick and very fmall; and he is occafionally fomewhat comatofe.——The folution of falts, as above, to be taken every hour till twelve o'clock; and clyfters to be hourly injected to the fame period. Let him ufe the warm bath immediately; on coming out of which he is to have cataplafms of muftardfeed applied to his feet.——He vomited a little this morning.

Four o'clock P. M. The retching has vanished.——Clysters to be given every hour, until a stool be procured, and the above solution of falts to be taken, one spoonful every half hour, should his stomach retain it.

Six o'clock P. M. His breathing is ftill more painful and difficult. His ftomach rejects the folution. He has not had a ftool;

and

and he will not receive the clyfters. He is fenfible that the blifter takes effect. His propenfity to fleep is very great, during which he is in a profuse cold fweat.—Let a vein be opened, and if his pulse rife as the blood flows, eight ounces may be taken. Let two ounces of infusion of fena be taken every half hour or hour, till a stool be procured.— His pulse is fcarce perceptible.—At nine o'clock P. M. let him take one purging pill; and if this remain on his stomach, let him take another at ten o'clock. In the morning let him take the infusion of fena as above.

3d. He had feveral very offenfive and copious stools during the night, during which he vomited occafionally. His pulfe is much more perceptible. His skin is perfectly cool for the first time, except during the cold fweats, which have vanished. He was very reftless last night; his head is confused at intervals; his breathing is exceffively painful, and his spittle is mixed with blood. The blifter has taken effect. He appears to be very weak. Very little blood flowed from his arm yesterday.---- The infusion of sena to be difcontinued. Endeavour to get a little blood from his arms, with the former precautions. Let him inhale frequently the steams of warm water .--- He now feels a dif-B 2 ficulty

ficulty in making water, which is very hot. —Let him have fome nitre in his common drink; and let the region of the bladder be occasionally fomented.

At noon he was vifited by two practitioners of great character and experience, who prefcribed the following decoction :

Take of powdered bark one ounce, Virginian fnakeroot two drachms, boil them in water, three pints down to two pints, ftrain: an ounce to be taken every hour or every two hours, with a little camphor in each dofe, if the ftomach will bear it. No blood flowed from his arm.

4th. Full Moon. He took about eight dofes of the above medicine during the courfe of the day, fome of which were thrown up. He was much worfe laft night, but appeared confiderably relieved by a ftool, which a little infufion of fena procured. He appears rather better this morning, yet his pulfe is fcarce perceptible.—Let as much laudanum be added to each dofe of the decoction as will make it ftay on his ftomach. Let a clyfter be injected at noon, and repeated during the courfe of the evening. His feet to be bathed twice or thrice in warm water during the courfe of the day, and afterwards well covered.

Six o'clock P. M. He was confiderably better

better during the forenoon, when he had another fetid stool, but has not passed any thing fince. He now appears much worfe. He has been comatofe and delirious at intervals .---- Bottles of hot water to be applied to the foles of his feet, and renewed as they become cool. Let him take an ounce of the infusion of fena with some foluble tartar every half hour till nine o'clock. The decoction to be difcontinued in the interval, and taken as usual from nine o'clock. The fago and wine to be taken as frequently as possible. At ten o'clock the following report was received from the compounder.

« Sir,

" Reed is much as when you faw him. " His pulfe is irregular; at intervals high " and ftrong, and in half an hour funk again " very much. He at times complains more " than ever I heard him of the pain in his " right fide, fo as to fcream out. He has " taken at fmall intervals half a pint of the " ftrong infusion of sena, with one drachm of " foluble tartar; and every dofe ftayed on his " ftomach except the laft, which he threw " off again; but he has had no motion yet. " He does not fpit blood as he used to do. " He remains infenfible, with that doing " and

" and flumbering which he is fubject to. " His feet are not fo cold as they were; he has had the applications of hot water to them, agreeable to your order. He has left off taking the opening mixture, and now takes the decoction of bark with fnakeroot. I am, fir, &c.

General Hofpital, 4th March, " ten o'clock P. M."

5th. The pain in his fide was intolerable all night. A clyfter has procured one very fmall fetid ftool; his pulfe is the fame; his head indiftinct; the cough gives him exceffive torture, and it is not accompanied by any difcharge; but he appears to have fomething which he has not courage or ftrength enough to evacuate by cough.——The decoction to be continued without the laudanum, if it remain on his ftomach. Let his fide be fomented for an hour, and afterwards a large blifter applied to the part. Let him have clyfters every hour, until fome confiderable evacuation be procured by ftool.

Six o'clock P. M. 'The blifter was applied. He has not had any ftool from the clyfters. He has fpit up fome matter tinged with blood. He has a hiccough. His pulfe is fuller; his head confufed; his fkin and fweat

fweat cold as ufual.——The decoction to be continued. Two grains of calomel to be taken every hour till eleven o'clock, when two or three dofes of the fena may be taken. The decoction to be omitted while he takes the fena. At nine o'clock the following report was received from the compounder:

« Sir,

" Reed is in the fame state; his hiccough " very bad; he gets no ftool, nor will take " any thing. He has only taken two fpoon-" fuls of the opening mixture. I tried four " feparate times to perfuade him to take one " of the pills you prefcribed, but he would " not; he would put it in his mouth, and if " I ftayed an hour he would not fwallow it, " but when I turned my back take it out " and throw it away. His pulfe does not " drop; but he is cold, with clammy fweats. " His averfion is as great as ever to clyfters " or medicines; when they are mentioned " he comprehends; in every other shape " perfectly infenfible. He is not able to fit " up now. I am, fir, &c.

" Nine o'clock."

6th. He has not had any ftool, and refufes to take any thing whatever. His pulfe B 4 is

is as ufual; his skin very warm, which it has not been for some time. He has a rattling in his throat.

He expired during the course of the day.

CASE H.

LEE. Admitted 8th March 1787.

March 8th. He complains of great pain in the cheft, and very fevere cough; he has much fever in his pulfe, fkin, tongue, &c. He has had regular attacks of an intermittent.——Eight ounces of blood to be immediately taken from his arm. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion of fena with falts, in the ufual manner, to-morrow morning.

10th. He has had copious evacuations by ftool, and is much relieved in every refpect. His cough, however, is troublefome at night.——The folution of falts to be taken fo as to operate largely by ftool. The anodyne antimonial draught to be taken at bedtime.

11th. The feverish fymptoms have not returned. His cold is still better. His pulse, however, is somewhat quick. His intestinal discharges

difcharges have been very confiderable.—— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day, and the antimonial anodyne draught at bed-time.

12th. Laft Quarter. He flept well, and has not had any fymptoms whatever of his former complaints fince yesterday.

Discharged; exemption from duty for two days is recommended.

CASE III.

OSBERN. Age about 50. Admitted 13th March 1787.

March 13th. He has fymptoms of violent fever, with a fevere colic, accompanied by a fpafmodic cough. His fkin is very hot and dry; his tongue furred and dry; his pulfe quick, though rather ftrong and full. He complains of much thirft.

Noon. He has vomited, after taking fome tartar emetic, and has had ftools from a clyfter. The colic has difappeared.——Let the clyfters be continued every hour, and let him take the folution of falts until very copious evacuations by ftool fhall have taken place.

14th.

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14th. He has had during the night large and very fetid difcharges by ftool, which have given him much relief. The folution of falts to be continued during the day; three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and one ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow morning.

15th. His evacuations by ftool continue copious.——After the caftor-oil shall have operated, let him take the febrifuge mixture during the day.

16th. He had many ftools during the day. All his complaints have left him. He is free from fever; but his cough difturbs his reft at night.—Let him continue to take the febrifuge mixture during the day; three purging pills, with one grain of opium, at bed-time, and the folution of falts to-morrow in the ufual manner.

17th. His cough troubled him very little laft night. He flept well. His evacuations by ftool continue abundant.——Let him take twenty drops of laudanum at bed-time.

18th. He has been drinking fpirits during the night.—Let him take three grains of tartar emetic immediately, and after its operation let him be difcharged for drunkennefs.

OSBERN. Re-admitted 20th March 1787.

New Moon, 19th. March 20th. He has returned with a cough more violent than the former; a great difficulty of breathing; pain in the region of the liver; hardnefs in the region of the bladder, and fever. His fkin is hot and dry; his tongue foul and clammy; his pulfe full and ftrong.—— Ten ounces of blood to be immediately taken from his arm. The folution of falts to be taken in the ufual manner, until it fhall have operated well by ftool. Clyfters to be given every third hour until bed-time. Let him have nitre in rice-water for his common drink.

21ft. He is confiderably relieved; his pulfe is still strong, full, and rather hard; he has had many fetid stools.——Eight ounces of blood to be taken. Let him have the pectoral decoction with nitre. Four purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

22d. His fever is much diminished. He breathes freely; makes water copiously; has had many stools; feels no pain in the liver, nor hardness in the region of the bladder. His cough, however, continues troublessome. ——The pectoral decoction to be continued.

23d.

23d. His evacuations by ftool were finall yefterday; his cough only troubled him at night.——The folution of falts to be taken immediately in the ufual manner, until it fhall have operated well by ftool. The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at bedtime. The pectoral decoction with nitre to be continued.

24th. His cough was less troublesome last night.

First Quarter, 26th. 30th. He has not had fever or any other complaint fince the 23d, except the cough, which is now better. He has continued fince the 24th to take ten grains of mercurial laxative pill every night for obstructed liver.—Transferred to another practitioner.

CASE IV.

Lie is confiderably relieve

OVERTON. Age 43. Admitted 15th February 1787.

March 2d. He has had regular returns of an intermittent fever every fecond. He has been allowed full diet, and fix glaffes of Madeira daily. Half an ounce of bark has been given every day. The paroxyfms ftill continue to return, and he is confiderably debilitated.

debilitated.——The wine is countermanded, and low diet only allowed. The bark to be continued for this day. The infufion of fena with falts to be taken in feparate dofes, three ounces every half hour, early to-morrow morning, until it fhall have operated well by ftool.

4th. Full Moon. He thinks himfelf much lighter and better from the purging. ——The pills and infufion to be repeated.

6th. He continues better.——One ounce of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning. ——He acquires appetite.

7th. He has thrown up the oil; and thinks his ftomach is rather foul.——Let him take immediately the infufion of fena as before, with the addition of one grain of tartar emetic to a pint of the infufion.

8th. The medicine operated well downwards.

wards. He fays he is free from all complaint, except a degree of weaknefs.

9th. Difcharged. Recommended to an exemption from duty for two days.

CASE V.

ESHURWOOD. Age 27. Admitted 24th February 1787.

March 2d. He has complained for a long time of a low continued fever, with exacerbations every evening, which has confiderably impaired his ftrength and fpirits. Since his admiffion he has been allowed feven glaffes of wine daily, and middle diet. He has taken the common bitter infufion daily with the infusion of linfeed, and an anodyne draught every night. From these he has not experienced any benefit.----Let him be ftrictly confined to low diet, and his allowance of wine reduced to two glaffes. The anodyne draught to be difcontinued, as well as both the infufions. The infufion of fena to be taken immediately, two ounces every half hour, until it shall have operated well by ftool. His pulfe is fmall and quick; his fkin dry, and rather too warm; his tongue white

white and moift; his urine natural, and he thinks the number and quality of his ftools are likewife natural.

3d. The infufion has procured feveral offenfive ftools, from which he has experienced fome relief.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion of fena to-morrow morning, one ounce every half hour, until it fhall have operated well downwards.

4th. Full Moon. He has copious difcharges by ftool, apparently very bilious. His fymptoms of fever are much diminished; his skin is cool, and somewhat moift; tongue less white, and pulse less quick. — Let him take the febrifuge mixture daily, in the usual manner, and so as to promote the intestinal discharges.

5th. He feels rather debilitated. The mixture procures feveral calls to ftool.—— Let him alfo take half a drachm of bark three times every day.

6th. He feels the feverifh heat, he fays, only for an hour in the evening now; he thinks this was encreafed by the bark yefterday. At prefent his pulfe is rather quick, and his fkin rather too warm.——The bark to be difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftoroil to-morrow morning. 7th. He is now under the copious effects of the purgatives. His skin is again somewhat hot, and his pulse rather quick; his tongue also is less clean than it has been for some days.——The sebrifuge mixture to be taken during the day.

8th. The mixture to be continued. He had frequent calls yefterday, and is better today. Two ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken thrice every day.

It now appears that he was fome time ago fubjected to a confiderable degree of falivation in the hofpital; but he does not fay for what complaint. It is most probable that the obstinacy of his feverish fymptoms proceeds from visceral obstructions, and vitiation of the various fecretions, for his evacuations are always particularly offensive.

10th. The tartar emetic operated downwards only.— Two grains of tartar emetic and one drachm of ipecacuan to be added to four ounces of water; and a table fpoonful to be taken every five minutes, until it shall have operated powerfully by vomit.

11th. He difcharged by vomit much vifcid yellow matter. He does not perceive his ufual ficknefs at ftomach this morning. He thinks himfelf much better in every refpect. His pulfe, however, is a little quick. —The febrifuge mixture to be taken daily; two purging pills at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

Last Quarter, 12th. 13th. The purgatives operated well. The mixture to be continued daily. He is free from feverish fymptoms.— Five grains of the common mercurial pill to be taken every morning and evening.

16th. He has continued free from all feverifhnefs.——The common mercurial pills to be omitted for one day. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning, in the ufual manner.

18th. The purgatives operated very copioufly. His tongue is very foul this morning, and his pulfe quick. It is poffible he may have had accefs to fpirits.——The common mercurial pill to be continued as before.

19th. New Moon. He was feverifh during the courfe of the night.——Before bedtime let him take a mixture of tartar emetic and ipecacuan, the fame as formerly, and in the fame manner, until it shall have operated C well

well by vomit, when he is to take twenty-five drops of laudanum.

20th. The mixture has operated well both ways. The difcharges appear much vitiated. His pulfe is quick; his tongue foul, and his mouth fore.——An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning. The mercurial to be continued.

21ft. His faliva is difcharged in confiderable quantities. The oil has not operated freely. He has been freer from his feverish fymptoms.——The mercurial to be difcontinued. One drachm of rhubarb to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning, until copious stools shall have been procured.

23d. Two scruples of rhubarb to be taken at bed-time.

26th. First Quarter. He continues free from feverishness.——One ounce of castoroil to be taken in the morning.

27th. His mouth ftill continues fore, but the fpitting decreafes. He has not had the most trifling degree of feverifhness during the day for some days; at night a very infignificant degree of heat sometimes occurs for a few moments.

30th. He continues free from all fymptoms of fever. His mouth is better. He is rather costive.——The folution of falts to

be

be taken in the morning.—He is not much reduced fince the 1st of the month.

On the 1st of April he became the patient of another gentleman.

CASE VI.

TIMBRILL. Age 22. Admitted 24th February 1787.

March 3d. He has complained for fome time of fevere pains in his joints and limbs, particularly at night, accompanied with the common fymptoms of fever. He has been allowed high diet, and has ufed a drachm of mercurial ointment every night fince his admiffion, as well as two grains of calomel. He had one dofe of falts only.——To be confined to low diet. Two purging pills, with one grain of opium, to be taken at bed-time, and two ounces of infufion of fena every half hour to-morrow morning, until it fhall have operated well by ftool. The calomel pills to be difcontinued. The ointment to be ufed as before.

6th. Full Moon. The fena operated copioufly on the 4th. His pains are greatly better, and the fymptoms of fever have most-

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ly vanished.——An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

7th. His difcharges by stool are offensive, and principally bilious.

11th. His pains, and every feverifh fymptom, have difappeared.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

12th. Last Quarter. Discharged. Recommended to be exempted two days from duty.

CASE VII.

ADAMS. Age 26. Admitted 21ft March 1787.

March 21ft. He complains of fevere pains " in all his bones," accompanied with a very confiderable degree of fever.— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; the folution of falts in the morning, and afterwards the febrifuge mixture.

23d. He has evacuated much putrid, bilious matters by ftool. He is greatly relieved, has no fymptoms of fever, and feels very little of the pains in his bones.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning.

25th. The medicines operated well. He is perfectly free from his complaints.

Difcharged.

CASE.

CASE VIII.

GIDLEY. Age 50. Admitted 2d March, 1787.

March 3d. He has complained of a high fever for feveral days. His pulfe is full, ftrong, and rapid; his tongue foul; his fkin very hot and dry; his thirft great; his urine of a very high colour. He has been coftive. He has not been free from the fever fince the firft attack.——The folution of falts to be taken immediately in the ufual manner, until it fhall have operated well.

4th. Full Moon. The falts have evacuated a very large quantity of putrid, bilious, glareous matter.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; two purging pills at bed-time, and the infufion of fena with falts in the morning.

5th. He is greatly better; and has very little fever now.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued; two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

6th. His evacuations by ftool are copious, but not of a bad quality, though bilious,—An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.—He has no degree of fever whatever.

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8th.

8th. The febrifuge mixture to be continued.—He has not had the flighteft return of fever; and fays he is perfectly well in every refpect, except a little weaknefs.

9th. Difcharged. Recommended to be excufed from duty for three days.

CASE IX.

MCORMICK. Age 33. Admitted 11th February, 1787.

March 2. He has had attacks of an intermittent fever every fecond day fince his admiffion. He has not been entirely free from fever in the intervals; and has had conftant, though not very fevere, pains in his joints during the whole time. He has been allowed middle diet, and three glaffes of wine daily. He took fome bark at firft, and latterly a great deal of the febribruge mixture, daily. Camphorated oil was conftantly rubbed on his joints. He has benefitted very little by thefe medicines.—. To be confined to low diet, and one glafs of wine daily. Two ounces of fena to be taken every half hour, until it fhall have operated copioufly by ftool.

3d. His evacuations from the fena have been large, bilious, and very offenfive. He feels

feels himfelf much relieved.____The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

4th. Full Moon. He had feveral ftools yefterday of nearly the fame kind. The paroxyfm was flight; nor does he appear now to have any feverifhnefs in the intervals. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena with falts in the morning. His pains have entirely left him.

6th. His evacuations have been abundant, and of a better kind. He has not had any fymptom of fever.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued during the day; three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce and an half of caftor-oil in the morning.

8th. He continues perfectly well in every refpect.

Difcharged. Recommended to be exemped from duty two days.

CASE X.

FERGUSON. Admitted 11 March, 1787.

March 11th. He has complained for fome days of a violent cough, pain and difficulty of breathing, and hoarfenefs. He has now a high fever in addition to those fymptoms; C_4 and

and fevere pain, on preffure, in the region of the liver.——Eight ounces of blood to be immediately taken from his arm; two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning.

12th. Laft Quarter. He has paffed much vitiated matters by ftool; and is confiderably relieved. He feels a great tendency to vomit. The mixture of ipecacuan and tartar emetic to be taken in the ufual manner, until it fhall have operated well upwards.

13th. His difcharges by vomit were large, green, yellow, and bitter. He had feveral ftools, and thinks himfelf much relieved. His fever is much reduced; his cough and pain lefs; and his breathing perfectly free.——The folution of falts to be taken during the day.

Evening. His ftomach rejects the falts. ——Three purging pills, with one grain of opium, to be taken at bed-time, and one ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

14th. His fever has entirely left him. He threw up the oil.——The folution of falts to be taken, until it fhall have operated downwards.

15th. He was feverish last night. His other symptoms have disappeared, except a degree of pain in the region of the liver. He passes much bile.

New

New Moon, 19th. First Quarter, 26th. -30th. The feverishness returned no more. He has taken the mercurial and other purgatives *daily*; and now rubs in mercurial ointment for the liver complaint.

CASE XI.

MOORE. Age 38. Admitted 3d March, 1787.

March 3d. He has had a fever for fome days without remiffion. He has now the general fymptoms of fever in a pretty violent degree. The fickness of stomach is very confiderable. The folution of tartar emetic to be immediately taken, fo as to operate principally upwards.

5th. Evening. During the courfe of yefterday and to-day he has evacuated large quantities of bile of various colours, and of other vitiated matters, by vomit and stool. He feels great weakness from the violence of these

these operations.———Let him have an anodyne draught at bed-time; and an ounce and an half of castor-oil in the morning.

6th. He fays the draught afforded him much eafe last night. He has fearcely any degree of fever at prefent; but his eyes and skin are much suffused with yellow. He complains of weakness.—Let him take a few spoons full of fago occasionally. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

7th. He has had feveral bilious ftools; but his ftomach appears very irritable, and it has rejected fome of the oil, but no bile. His fever has left him. One ounce of a mixture of thirty drops of laudanum, with half a grain of emetic tartar in half a pint of neutral mixture, to be taken every half hour.

Evening. Let him take frequently a little panada with lime-juice and fugar; two purging pills at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

8th. He has paffed much bile. The colour of his eyes and ikin is much improved. He feels more ftrength; and is better in every refpect.—The folution of falts to be taken fo as to operate once in the morning.

10th. He is free from all complaint, but ftill paffes bile.——Two purging pills to be taken

taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning. To be allowed fome milk diet, at his own request.

12th. Laft Quarter. He fays he is quite well, and not very weak. His laft ftools were not bilious.

Difcharged. Recommended to be excufed two days from duty.

CASE XII.

SWINNY. Age 27. Admitted 20th December, 1786.

March 2d, 1787. He has been afflicted fince his admiffion with regular paroxyfms of a tertian. In the intervals he is not entirely free from fever. During infpiration he feels pain at the pit of his ftomach; and thinks he perceives fome degree of hardnefs there on preffure. He is always worfe at night. His tongue is foul, his pulfe rather fmall and quick; his fkin dry. He has taken large quantities of bark.——One grain of emetic tartar to be added to a pint of infufion of fena, and two ounces of this to be taken every half hour, until it fhall have operated well downwards.

3d. He has had large and fætid difcharges
 by ftool, and thinks himfelf much relieved.
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---- The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day.

4th. Full Moon. The paroxyfm was much lefs fevere than ufual yefterday. He had feveral ftools of the fame kind. He is at prefent pretty free from feverifhnefs.—— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning.

6th. His evacuations by ftool have been copious, but ftill composed of very vitiated matters. He had fcarcely any degree of feverishness yesterday, and is at present perfectly free from every feverish symptom.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

7th. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce and an half of caftoroil in the morning.

8th. No fymptoms of the paroxyfm occurred yefterday. He ftill feels fome pain and hardnefs at the pit of the ftomach, which are worfe at night.——Three purging pills with half a grain of opium to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning, fo as to procure one copious ftool. Let him take fix ounces of decoction of bark to-day, at three feparate dofes.—His appetite has not returned in the degree in which it might be expected.

9th.

9th. His feverifh heat was rather more confiderable laft night; he has had it only in a very flight degree lately. His tongue is foul.—.The febrifuge mixture to be continued; the bark omitted.

10th. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

Last Quarter, 12th. 15th. He has taken every night fince the 11th, for the liver complaint, ten grains of the mass of common mercurial pill. He has not had any feverishness fince the 10th.

CASE XIII.

HOWELL. Age 54. Admitted 4th March, 1787.

March 4th. Full Moon. He complains of hoarfenefs; difficulty of breathing; pains in his joints, particularly his wrifts, attended with a high degree of fever.——Eight ounces of blood to be immediately taken from him. The folution of falts, with two grains of tartar emetic, to be taken, until it fhall have operated upwards and downwards..

5th. The folution difcharged much bilious offenfive matters by ftool; but did not operate by vomit. He is much relieved. His hoarfenefs continues fevere.—The folution of

of tartar emetic to be taken in fmall and frequent dofes, until it fhall have excited vomitting.

6th. He had many copious putrid ftools yefterday; and vomitted a little bilious matter. He is much better to-day in every refpect. The fever has difappeared altogether. The hoarfenefs and difficulty of breathing have decreafed greatly.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce and a half of caftor-oil in the morning.

8th. His difcharges by ftool continue frequent and bilious. The pains continue only in his wrift, and in a lefs degree.——The wrift to be rubbed with a warm and dry hand for half an hour twice a day.

9. An embrocation of equal parts of oil and fpirits of hartfhorn to be applied to the throat at bed-time. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

10th. The embrocation to be continued. —The pains in his wrift have vanished.

11th. His throat is rather fore ftill; but he is free from every other complaint.—— Let him wear a piece of flannel round his neck, and use a gargle of the pectoral decoction, with a little of the fpirit of fal ammoniac in it.

Laft

Laft Quarter, 12th. 13th. His throat is nearly well.——The gargle to be continued ; and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

16th. Discharged perfectly well.

CASE XIV.

JONES. Admitted 21ft March, 1787.

March 21ft. He complains of very acute pain, as well as great oppreffion, in the region of the liver; particularly when he coughs. His cough is very fevere. He has much irritability of ftomach. His thirft is great; tongue parched; pulfe full, rapid, and ftrong; fkin dry, and exceffively hot; urine of a high colour; and he is coftive.——Let him take immediately the folution of falts, until it fhall have operated copioufly, and clyfters every half hour. The common fomentation to be ufed until a blifter can be applied.

22d. His difcharges by ftool have been abundant, but exceffively difcoloured and fetid. His ftomach, however, rejected part of the folution; and his cough deprived him of reft all night. He is much relieved, and his fever much decreafed.—A draught of thirty-five drops of laudanum, with half a grain

32

grain of emetic tartar, in two ounces of water, to be taken at bed-time.

24th. His cough and his fide are greatly better. His ftomach feems to be ftill too irritable for the febrifuge mixture, which evacuates nothing material by vomit; it is therefore to be difcontinued.——The folution of falts to be taken in fuch fmall dofes as not to be rejected by vomit. The former anodyne antimonial draught to be taken at bed-time.

25th. He has not had any degree of fever fince the 2d. His cough and the pain in his fide are very trifling. The falts operated well. His fleep has been pretty composed. He is however confiderably debilitated.——The folution of falts to be taken, until one stool shall have been procured. A clyster to be given immediately.

26th. First Quarter. He was feverish yesterday, and felt himself very hot.——Fifteen grains of the mass of laxative mercurial pill to be taken every night, so as to keep his body very open, and until it shall have affected his mouth considerably.

30th.

30th. He has not had any return of fever.

CASE XV.

CALLEN. Age 20. Admitted 10th February, 1787.

March 2d. He ftands admitted for rheumatifm. He has taken Dover's powders every night, and occafionally a dofe of falts. His pains are fomewhat diminifhed; but he is feldom without feverifhnefs during the day, with fevere exacerbations every night, when his pains deprive him of all reft. —Two purging pills to be taken at bedtime, and the infufion of fena in the morning, until copious evacuations by ftool fhall have taken place; let his diet be reduced from middle to low diet; and the three glaffes of wine be difcontinued.

3d. He fays he has had the feverifh fymptoms and the pains about fix months. —The Dover's powders to be taken as ufual every night.

4th. Full Moon. The purgatives had very copious effects, of a bad quality. He is much relieved; and flept better last night than any night fince his admission.

D

6th.

8th. He had copious difcharges by ftool yefterday. He has not experienced feverifhnefs or pains thefe two days.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; two purging pills at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning, until one large ftool fhall have been procured.

9th. He is perfectly free from all his complaints; but is rather debilitated. He has now a confiderable fhare of appetite.—— Two ounces of decoction of bark to be taken every two hours during the day.

12th. Laft Quarter. He continues perfectly well, and acquires ftrength daily. The decoction has been taken every day. His appetite is good.——Difcharged. Recommended to an exemption from duty for two days.

CASE XVI.

WADSWORTH, Invalid. Admitted 7th March, 1787.

March 7th. He has had a fever without intermiflion for fome days. He complains of very acute pain in his right hypochonder; and pains in his limbs. The warmth of **a** bed always encreafes the latter, which again diminifh, and fometimes difappear, on expofure to the cold air. He had a fimilar complaint during the laft feafon of the rains, and often before that period. His pulfe is ftrong, full and frequent; his tongue white, and rather dry; his fkin parched; his urine of a very high colour. He is very coffive.——The infufion of fena to be taken early in the morning, until it fhall have operated well downwards.

8th. The infufion operates freely, and has difcharged much bilious, putrid matters. ——Sixteen leeches to be immediately applied to the right fide, on the fpot where most pain is felt.

9th. His fever is greatly diminished, as well as the pains in his limbs, but not the

pain

11th. The pain in his fide is confiderably leffened by the bleeding.——One drachm of ftrong mercurial ointment to be rubbed on the right hypochonder every night. The febrifuge mixture to be continued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

Laft Quarter 12th.—13th. He has no fymptoms whatever of fever; but the pains in his limbs continue, th ugh in a lefs degree.—The febrifuge m².ture to be continued; and an embrocation of camphorated oil to be ufed every night.

14th. New Moon 19th. First Quarter 26th. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning, in the ufual manner. Milk diet to be allowed, at his own request.

30th. He has not had any return of the feverish fymptoms, or the pains in his limbs, fince those mentioned last: but the pain in his fide encreased confiderably about the 19th.

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It is now greatly diminished. He has used the ointment, a blifter, once venefection, and frequently purgatives, fince the 14th. His mouth is not affected.

He became the patient of another practitioner on the 1st of April.

CASE XVII.

WHITE. Age 14. Admitted 7th March, 1787.

March 8th. He has complained of continued fever for feveral days. The attack commenced with fome degree of a cold ftage. His pulfe is full, ftrong, and frequent; his fkin dry and hot; his tongue of a dull white; his face flushed; his eyes fuffused with red; his thirst excessive; great pain in his head; his urine of a very high colour. He is coftive.--Let him take a folution of emetic tartar in fmall and frequent dofes, until it shall have operated both ways.

Evening. The folution has operated freely both ways; and he is confiderably relieved. -Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

9th. He had a very reftlefs night; and his fever is very high at prefent.---- The folution of falts to be taken immediately, in the ufual

usual manner, until large discharges by stool shall have been procured.

10th. His ftools were numerous, large, very fetid, confifting of bile and various vitiated matters. The fever is much reduced to-day; the pain in his head has nearly vanished.——The pills to be repeated at bedtime, and the oil in the morning.

12th. Laft Quarter. The fuffusion has difappeared. He had feveral stools, apparently bilious, yesterday.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and the oil in the morning.

14th. Discharged.

CASE XVIII.

SPEECHLY. Age 21. Admitted 7th March, 1787.

March 7th, He has complained of a continued fever for feveral days, encreafing in ftrength daily. His pulfe is full and frequent; his eyes much fuffufed; cheeks flufhed; thirft exceffive; tongue parched, and furred with brown; fkin very hot and dry; 7 great

8th. The folution operated yefterday both ways; and difcharged much black, hot, fetid matters by ftool. He feels himfelf greatly relieved; and the naufea has vanifhed. —Two purging pills to be taken at bedtime, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

9th. His difcharges by ftool continue hot and black.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken in the ufual manner.

10th. His ftools continue much the fame. He has very little fever. All his pains have difappeared. — Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

11th. His ftools are yellow, and not hot. ——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day.

12th. Laft Quarter. The fever has entirely left him. His appetite returns.—— The mixture to be continued; the pills and oil to be repeated.

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13th.

13th. He is quite well.——The mixture to be continued.

14th. Discharged.

CASE XIX.

HERRETT. Admitted 7th June, 1787.

June 7th. Laft Quarter 8th. The general fymptoms of fever are confiderable.——Early in the morning let him take the folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar.

9th. The falts have not had any operation as yet.—On all occafions, when the ufual quantity of the folution fails, let it be repeated until it produce the defired effects. —He has not had a ftool as yet. His tongue is much furred.—Let him have immediately a folution of an ounce and an half of falts and one grain of emetic tartar in a pint of water, to be taken in feparate dofes in the ufual way. Clyfters to be injected every half hour, until copious difcharges by ftool be procured.

10th. He has had confiderable evacuations from the inteftines, of various colours, and a very offenfive quality.——Let him take immediately a folution of emetic tartar, in fmall and frequent dofes, till it operate abundantly

dantly by vomit; three purging pills at night, and the folution of falts early in the morning.

12th. He has had ftools. The fever is much lefs. He complains of weaknefs. A few fpoonfulls of panada, with a little wine, to be taken every three or four hours. Eight ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken during the courfe of the day.

13th. His tongue is covered ftill with fur, but has now become more moift. His pulfe is full and ftrong. He complains of pain and difficulty in paffing his urine.— Let clyfters be injected every two hours till two o'clock P. M. A vomit of ipecacuan to be taken immediately: if this fhould not operate downwards alfo, it muft be fucceeded by a dofe of one ounce of caftor-oil; in either cafe, after the operation of the vomit or caftor-oil, the folution of falts muft be taken, until

until fix or feven copious ftools are procured. After the operation of thefe medicines, he may continue to take the bark.—He utters deep and frequent fighs, and complains of a fhooting pain in the cheft.—Let him have an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning alfo.

14th. He has ejected much green and bitter matters by vomit. His ftools have been abundant. He is much eafier this morning in every refpect. His tongue, however, has the fur still, though in a less degree. His pulse natural. His skin cool and moist. —The fame quantity of the decoction of bark to be continued, with the addition of one drachm and an half of elixir of vitriol.

15th. New Moon. His pulfe is pretty regular. His tongue is extremely foul, but moift. His body is perfectly open. Complains of great weaknefs. —— The panada with wine to be taken more frequently. The decoction with the elixir to be continued.

16th. He is rather coffive. Feels more ftrength.——Let him have a clyfter occafionally. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time. Let him continue the decoction and elixir.

17th. He has had ftools. He acquires appetite and ftrength.—Let him have a chicken

chicken for dinner daily. The decoction and elixir to be continued.

18th. He is free from all complaint. Only half the quantity of the decoction and elixir to be taken to-day.

19th. The fame quantity of the decoction and elixir to be taken to-day.

20th, Discharged,

CASE XX.

WILLETT, Age 23. Admitted 27th May, 1787.

June 1ft. Has taken emetic tartar, and then bark, by the prefcription of the preceding practitioner. His fever is of an intermittent form.—Let him take immediately the folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, until it shall operate by stool.—The paroxyfms recur every night.

2d. Much offenfive matters have been difcharged by ftool. The feverifh fit is expected to-day.——About half an hour before the acceffion of the fit let him take thirty drops of laudanum and half a grain of emetic tartar in an ounce of water; and an ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow morning.

3d. The paroxyfm came on with fhivering at night.——Three purging pills to be taken

taken at bed-time, and a draught of fix ounces of the infusion of fena early in the morning.

4th. The folution of falts to be taken in the ufual manner.——The paroxyfm came on laft night.

5th. The medicines have procured feveral ftools. The paroxyfm was very fevere laft night. He is not entirely free from a degree of fever even in the day-time.——Let him take the folution of emetic tartar in finall and frequent dofes, that it may operate by vomit before bed-time.

6th. He vomitted freely. The paroxyfm did not return laft night.—— Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and fix ounces of the infufion of fena to-morrow early.

7th. The fit did not return last night.

8th. Laft Quarter. The fever returned with fhivering, and continued all night.—— The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

9th. The fever returned with fhivering laft night, but with lefs violence. The medicines have operated well.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time.

1 oth. The fever returned again at night. ——Let the mixture of ipecacuan and tartar emetic

emetic be taken, fo as to excite vomiting, on the approach of the fit. After the operation of the vomit, let him take three pills, and the folution of falts in the morning.

11th. The medicines have oceafioned copious difcharges both ways.

12th. The paroxyfin recurred laft night. —One drachm of the powder of bark to be taken every two hours.

13th. The bark to be continued during the day. Two pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena early in the morning. The bark to be again continued immediately after the operation of the pills and fena.

14th. The fever came on later than usual last night.——The bark to be continued.

15th. New Moon. No return of the paroxyfm laft night.———The bark to be continued during the day. Three pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

16th. The paroxyfm recurred laft night. ——Let him take an emetic on the approach of any fymptoms of a paroxyfm to-night; till when let him take the bark as ufual.

17th. The paroxyfm did not come on laft night; confequently he did not take the emetic,—Let him have chicken-broth for dinner on the days of the interval. Three 2 pills

pills to be taken at bed-time, fix drachms of caftor-oil in the morning, and after its operation the bark. One ounce and a half of bark to be taken daily.

18th. The paroxyfin came on without fhivering yesterday evening. There are no fymptoms of fever during the intervals.—— The bark to be continued.

19th. The bark to be continued.—— His body is pretty open.

20th. He has complained of a purging with ftraining fince yefterday.——The bark to be omitted. A vomit of ipecacuan to be taken immediately; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

21ft. He difcharged much green and bitter matter by vomit. His ftools are very hot and offenfive.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts to be repeated in the morning.

22d. First Quarter. The feverishness was fcarcely perceptible last night.——Should the fever come on to-night, the emetic must be repeated.

23d. No paroxyfm occurred laft night. His pulfe, however, this morning is frequent, and rather ftrong. His fkin is very warm, but moift. His tongue is ftill foul. His pulfe is alfo confiderably hard. There is a fufpicion of fome degree of obftruction in the bowels. bowels. —— Let him lose eight ounces of blood.

25th. He has not had any return of the paroxyfm.—Eight ounces of the decoction of bark, with one drachm of fweet elixir of vitriol, to be taken daily. Six grains of the London laxative mercurial pill to be taken every night.

26th. The mercurial keeps his body open, but not confiderably.

27th. His fkin is very warm and moift. His pulfe is quick, and lefs ftrong. He is not fenfible that he has had any feverifhnefs for fome days.—The folution of falts to be taken in the morning, fo as to procure one or two copious ftools. Should any fymptoms of fever recur, let him take one pill of the cut colleygee.

28th. He took the pill on feeling a degree of feverifhnefs laft night, and imagines it had fome effect in diminifhing the feverifh heat. It did not excite naufea.——Two cut colleygee pills to be taken at night.

29th. Full Moon 30th. The pills purged him all night, but did not excite naufea. The feverifh fymptoms are fcarce perceptible. — I difcontinued attendance. He took the mercurial for fome time.

CASE XXI.

JONES, a Private. Age Admitted 3d June, 1787.

June 3d. Symptoms of fever. — Let him take the folution of falts until he be purged. The folution to be taken in feparate dofes. Low diet.

4th. Purged confiderably yefterday.— Two mercurial purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and one ounce of caftor-oil very early the enfuing morning.

5th. Much better. — The febrifuge mixture to be taken frequently during the day.—The medicines have had copious effects by ftool.

6th. Discharged.—One day's exemption from duty recommended.

CASE XXII.

HOPKINS. Age Admitted 6th June, 1787.

June 6th. Fever,—A folution of tartar emetic to be taken in the ufual dofes.—This operated by vomit and ftool.—Low diet. 7th. The folution of falts, with one grain

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of tartar emetic to be taken in the ufual way, until it take effect by vomit or ftool .---- Fever continues.

8th. Last Quarter. Fever all night .-----Two mercurial purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and one ounce of caftor-oil next morning. - The medicines have had fome operation by ftool.

oth. Less fever last night .--- Three of the pills at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infusion of sena next morning.

10th. An encrease of the fever last night. The medicines have operated. ——The pills to be repeated at bed-time. A folution of falts to-morrow morning.

11th. Fever continues, with a parched and furred tongue .--- Two ounces of ftrong fherbet to be taken every hour. The pills to be repeated at bed-time. An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken early in the morning.

12th. The medicines have not operated with their ufual activity. The evacuations are not very copious. The fever was very fevere all yesterday and last night. Some operation by stool has taken place this day. Pulse tense, and in some degree strong. Skin ftill dry and hot.----Let the sherbet be continued. The folution of falts, with two grains of tartar emetic, to be taken immediately E

diately in the ufual dofes, until it operate by vomit or stool, or both.

13th. No intermiffion of the fever yefterday. Confiderable difcharges from the medicine. Fever high at prefent.——The anodyne antimonial draught to be taken immediately. In two hours a folution of emetic tartar in the ufual way. A repetition of the purging pills at bed-time, and a folution of falts to-morrow early.

14th. A confiderable difcharge by vomit. Fever continues.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken to-day in the ufual manner. Clyfters to be injected every two hours.

15th. New Moon. A remiffion of the fever laft night. It has returned this morning.——The febrifuge mixture and the clyfters to be continued during the day. A repetition of the pills at night; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

16th. No fever laft night, or at prefent. His eyes are fuffufed with yellow. His fkin is perfectly cool. His tongue moift, and freer from fur.——Let the purging pills be repeated at night; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

17th. No return of the fever.

18th. Three drachms of foluble tartar in a pint of the decoction of Peruvian bark, to be taken during the course of the day.

19th.

19th. The above medicine to be continued.—He is coftive.——If no evacuation take place before the morning, let him have an ounce of caftor-oil.

20th. The decoction to be continued. ——He now complained of gonorrhœa, for which he remained in the hofpital till the 24th; when he was difcharged, free from all complaint.

CASE XXIII.

SMITH, Private. Age 23. Admitted May 12, 1787.

June 1ft. Since the period of admiffion he has been treated for an intermittent fever, with naufeating dofes of emetic tartar, one or two laxative medicines, and the Peruvian bark in the intervals of the paroxyfms, by the preceding practitioner. He has been allowed, during that time, middle diet, and two glaffes of wine daily. He has not perceived any favourable alteration. His eyes are particularly fuffufed with bile, or a yellow tinge. His head is much affected.——The wine is to be omitted, and low diet only allowed. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil early in the morning.

2d and 3d. The medicines operate copioufly downwards.——Let a fcruple of ipecacuan and one grain of emetic tartar be added to twelve ounces of water, and two drachms of the mixture taken every two hours, until it fhall operate by vomit.—His eyes are lefs fuffufed.

4th. He has vomited well, without benefit to his head. In other refpects he is better, and has had no return of the paroxyfm fince the 2d.—Let him take the fourth of a grain of elaterium at bed-time, and fix or eight ounces of the folution of falts tomorrow morning.

5th. The medicines operate abundantly. His head is greatly relieved. The fuffution has entirely difappeared.

6th. Difcharged, free from all complaint.

CASE XXIV.

HILSDON. Admitted June 6, 1787.

June 6th. Fever.—Low diet. Let him have the folution of emetic tartar.

7th. He has vomited abundantly. The fever continues.——Let him take the folution of falts, containing one grain of emetic tartar, during the day.

8th.

8th. Laft Quarter. The fever difappeared yefterday. The fever has encreafed greatly every fecond night, without any perceptible cold fit. The medicines have operated copioufly by vomit and ftool.—___Let him take two purging pills at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow morning.

9th. The fever came on later, and with much lefs violence, last night.—— Three of the pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

10th. The medicines have operated.—— The pills and the folution of falts to be repeated.

11th. The fever has not returned fince the 8th at night. —— Let him take two ounces of the decoction of bark every three hours.—Has a return of appetite.—— The pills and the folution of falts to be repeated.

12th. The difcharges by ftool are not confiderable, nor vitiated. —— Difcharged, and recommended for an exemption of duty for two days.

CASE XXV.

BULL. Admitted 12th June, 1787.

June 13th. Has had the fever without remiffion three days in the barracks, accom-E 3 panied

panied by vomiting. The regimental furgeon gave him fome medicines, which operated both ways. His tongue is very foul. His pulfe full and quick .---- Let him take the folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, immediately, in the usual way. After the operation of this medicine, let him take a pill of fix grains of calomel and half a grain of opium.

14th. Six ounces of the infusion of sena to be taken immediately.

15th. New Moon. Copious difcharges by ftool have taken place. The irritability of the stomach continues in some degree. The fever is confiderably lefs.---Let the region of the ftomach be fomented frequently during the day. The pill of calomel and opium, and the infusion of sena, to be repeated.

16th. The medicines have difcharged much offensive matters. The fever has difappeared. --- The pill to be repeated at night, and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken early in the morning.

17th. He appears in every refpect well: fome degree of irritability, however, in the stomach remains. He fays, he has not perceived any perspiration as yet .--- The anodyne antimonial draught to be taken at bedtime ;

time; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning, until one ftool be procured.

18th. He perfpired last night.——Middle diet.

19th. Discharged.

CASE XXVI.

BAILY. Age 48. Admitted 2d June, 1787.

June 3d. He has the general fymptoms of fever pretty fevere. ——The folution of falts, with one grain of tartar emetic, to be taken immediately.

4th. The medicine has occafioned copious evacuations by ftool. His fever is confiderably diminisched.—Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of castoroil early in the morning.

5th. The evacuations are copious. The fever has difappeared.—Let his body be kept open by the febrifuge mixture.

6th. Difcharged, and recommended to be exempted from duty two days.

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CASE XXVII.

CONNER. Age 45. Admitted 20th April, 1787.

June 1st. He has taken fince his admiffion occafional laxatives, neutral draughts, folutions of emetic tartar, but particularly bark. He has been allowed middle diet; and four glaffes of wine daily. He appears to be feldom, perhaps never, free from fome degree of fever; but he has regular and fevere exacerberations every evening. He is weak and low. He is not particularly coftive; and his urine is natural in quantity and appearance. ---- Let him be put on low diet, and his wine countermanded. Eight grains of the laxative mercurial pill to be taken every night, commencing on the 2d at night. To-night let him have two purging pills; and an ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow early.

2d. The medicines have operated freely.

4th. Six ounces of the infusion of sena to be taken to-morrow morning.

5th. He is confiderably better fince the operation of the fena.

6th. The mercurial laxative pill to be omitted whenever the purging pills are prefcribed.

fcribed.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and fix ounces of the infusion of fena to-morrow morning in two doses.

7th. The medicines have operated copioufly. The exacerbation has not come on with any degree of violence for two days.—— The folution of emetic tartar to be taken in frequent and fmall dofes, until it excite vomiting freely.

Sth. Laft Quarter. He was much purged as well as vomited by the folution. He was not fenfible of any feverifh heat yefterday evening.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and fix ounces of the infufion of fena to-morrow morning.

9th. He has no feverifh fymptoms at any period of the day. The exacerbations have entirely difappeared. His ftrength is rather encreafed.——The laxative mercurial to be continued, as ufual, every night, till countermanded. His appetite improves.

10th. He felt fome feverifh heat last night.——Four or fix ounces of the folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

11th. The medicine has had fome operation. No feverifh heat was perceptible laft night; but his pulfe is quick and finall this morning.——Two ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken every two hours daily.

13th. He was feized last night with a violent

violent fit of vomiting and purging; and has a confiderable degree of fever this morning. —Let him have immediately the folution of falts; but if the vomiting fhould recur, let him take the antimonial anodyne draught in lieu of the falts. An hour after the draught he may again take the folution of falts. The bark to be omitted. A pill, of five grains of calomel and one of opium, to be taken at night.

14th. The vomiting continued all yefterday. He neglected to take the draught. ——Let him begin immediately to take the folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, until it take effect by ftool. Should the vomiting recur, it must be promoted by drinking plentifully of warm water.

15th. New Moon. His difcharges by ftool have been frequent, large, and very hot. The vomiting ceafed yefterday.—— The fimple folution of falts to be taken in fmall dofes, fo as to procure three or four liquid ftools during the day.

16th. His ftools are ftill bilious and hot. His fkin is preternaturally warm and dry, but he has no other fymptoms of fever.— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in fimilar dofes tomorrow morning.

17th. He continues to be much worked by

by the medicines. His ftools are ftill thin, hot, and of a bilious colour. He feels himfelf confiderably weakened by the purging. He has not had any perfpiration as yet.—— Let him have the anodyne antimonial draught at bed-time; and four ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

18th. He felt himfelf much refreshed by a found sleep in consequence of the draught.——The draught to be repeated at bed-time, and the sena in the morning.

19th. The infufion occasions three or four stools daily, of a lefs bilious nature.——The draught to be repeated at bed-time.

20th. His fkin is apparently natural. He has perfpired every night rather freely fince he began to take the draught. His ftools are ftill very bilious. His appetite is not confiderable; yet he has no perceptible feverifhnefs.—Four or fix ounces of the aromatic bitter laxative to be taken daily; the draught to be repeated at night; and the ufual draught of the infufion of fena every fecond morning, fhould the bitter laxative prove infufficient to promote a free difcharge from the inteftines.

21st. The bitter laxative operates confiderably by stool, and occasions fome encrease of

of appetite.——The bitter laxative and the draught to be continued.—He attributes much benefit to the draught.

22d. First Quarter. The aromatic bitter laxative to be made with less of the laxative in it, as it appears to operate too frequently. The draught to be repeated at night.

24th. Still lefs of the laxative to be ufed. Let him take fix grains of the mercurial laxative pill every night; and in future the fimple bitter infufion only, fix ounces daily. The draught to be omitted.

28th. He has taken daily the medicines prefcribed on the 24th. He has had conftant evacuations of bile by ftool; and occafionally naufea. His general health, however, is much improved, although his ftrength is not confiderably encreafed; nor have any fymptoms of fever occurred lately.——The mercurial laxative pill may now be difcontinued, and one pill of colleygee taken every morning, with the bitter infufion, as ufual.—— Full Moon 30th. On the first of July he became the patient of another practitioner.

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CASE XXVIII.

SHEARLING. Age 32. Admitted 16th April, 1787.

June 1ft. He has complained of pains in all his limbs, griping, and purging, attended with the general, though flighter, fymptoms of fever from the period of his admiffion, with very little relief from the medicines he has taken. He has been allowed high diet, with two glaffes of wine daily; and has taken fome mercurial medicines.— To be put on low diet. His wine to be difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and one ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d. The medicines have operated well, and relieved the griping. He difcharges faliva confiderably to-day.—The folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

3d. Very little fever or griping, and lefs pains in the limbs remain. The difcharge of faliva has ftopped.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

5th. The fever, the purging, except from the physic, and the griping have all disappeared. The pains are now very trifling. ——His

——His limbs to be rubbed twice a day with warm camphorated oil.

8th. Last Quarter. Discharged, free from all complaint.

CASE XXIX.

FRAMPTON. Age 20. Admitted 10th June, 1787.

June 10th. He has had general fymptoms of fever for fome days. He has alfo a gonorrhœa. — The folution of tartar emetic to be taken in finall and frequent dofes, until it fhall operate by vomit. The folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

11th. He vomited abundantly yefterday. His pulfe is quick and fmall. His fkin dry. His tongue rather foul. — Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

12th. The fever has difappeared.—— Let him use the usual injection for the gonorrhœa fix times every day.— He was purged abundantly yesterday.

13th. His pulfe is now quick, and his tongue more foul.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

14th.

14th. The medicines have operated copioufly. His pulfe is ftill quick and fmall, his tongue foul, his fkin rather dry. He is not, however, fenfible that he has any degree of fever.——The pills to be repeated at bedtime, and a draught of fix ounces of infufion of fena to be taken in the morning.

15th. New Moon. His fkin is perfectly cool and open, his pulfe lefs quick, and his tongue very white. He has had ftools this morning.

20th. His feverish fymptoms entirely disappeared, and his skin, tongue, and pulse became natural on the 16th and 17th. He has continued the injection to this day, and his gonorrhœa has entirely disappeared, with its several symptoms.——Discharged.

CASE XXX.

DAUM. Age 20. Admitted 26th May, 1787.

June 1st. He has had regular paroxyfms of an intermittent fever every fecond day for fome time. He has fome degree of pain, fwelling, and hardnefs in the regions of the liver and fpleen. Confiderable debility attends his complaints. Two glaffes of wine have

have been allowed daily.— The wine to be omitted. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d. He has had feveral fetid ftools.— Let him take half a drachm of the powder of bark every two hours.

3d. The paroxyfin returned with its ufual feverity yefterday.——The bark to be omitted. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

4th. The medicines have had a copious operation. The affection of the regions of the liver and fpleen is confiderably diminifhed.——The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken about half an hour before the expected period of the paroxyfm, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

5th. The paroxyfm returned as ufual. The caftor-oil has had fome operation.—— Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infufion of fena in the morning.

6th. Copious evacuations have taken place by ftool. The fwelling and hardnefs in the regions of the liver and fpleen are not perceptible; fome degree of pain, or rather of uneafinefs,

uneafiness, remains. ---- The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at noon.

7th. The paroxyfm did not vary much from its usual strength or period of accession yesterday .---- Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

8th. Last Quarter. He has had several stools. The general debility has not encreafed confiderably.----An emetic of ipecacuan to be taken on the first symptoms of the approach of the paroxyim; two purging pills at night, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

oth. His stools have been much freer than usual from offensive and vitiated matters.—One drachm of the powder of bark to be taken every two hours .- The emetic operated well. The feverity and duration of the paroxyfm were confiderably lefs.

10th. He has not had a ftool fince yefterday morning.----An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken immediately, and the bark, as prefcribed, after its operation.

11th. The paroxyfm did not recur yefterday, although fome fymptoms of its approach were felt about the usual time. --- The bark to be taken as usual during the day; two purging pills at bed-time; fix ounces of the infusion

infusion of sena in the morning; and afterwards the bark again.

12th. The bark to be continued.

1 3th. There was no appearance whatever of the paroxysm yesterday. He complains that his gums are rather fore. His strength appears to be much the same. The folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning, until one or two stools be procured.

14th. The bark to be continued.

15th. New Moon. No fymptoms whatever of the fever have recurred. The affection in the regions of the liver and fpleen has entirely difappeared.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning; and afterwards the bark as ufual.

16th. His throat is much fwelled and painful this morning. He has had a ftool. ——Twenty-five leeches to be immediately applied to the part affected. Three clyfters to be given during the courfe of the day. His throat to be gargled frequently with an ounce of fpirit of hartfhorn in a bottle of water, more or lefs, as he may bear it.

17th. Three drachms of the bark only to be taken daily.—His throat is much better. —An ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

20th. He continued to take the bark, and to use the gargle, on the 18th and 19th. ——Discharged, free from all complaint.

CASE XXXI.

KING. Age 45. Admitted 26th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He has had feveral returns of a paroxyfm of intermittent fever before and fince his admiffion. An emetic, a laxative, and the bark, have been taken with fome degree of benefit. High diet and wine have been allowed.—Low diet only to be allowed, and no wine. An anodyne antimonial draught to be taken about half an hour before the expected approach of the paroxyfm; two purging pills at night, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

2d. The draught, by miftake, was taken at night towards the termination of the hot ftage, which it appeared to fhorten. He perfpired and flept well. He has had feveral ftools this morning.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor; oil in the morning.

3d. His appetite is confiderable. He F 2 feels

feels himfelf perfectly well. The medicines have produced feveral ftools.——The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken about half an hour before the ufual period of the paroxyfm.

4th. The draught was taken. No fymptom whatever of the fever occurred.—— Difcharged.

This patient had not a relapfe during the courfe of the month.

CASE XXXII.

CROOKHORN. Age 22. Admitted 20th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He has complained of regular paroxyfms of an intermittent fever before and fince his admiffion; with very little, if any, relief from the medicines he has taken. He is particularly affected with head-ach; and is troubled with ftraining at ftool. His pulfe is more than ufually tenfe and rapid. Middle diet and three glaffes of wine have been allowed daily.——Low diet, and no wine to be allowed. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

2d. The paroxyfm returned yefterday. Copious evacuations by ftool have taken place. The ftraining is confiderably diminifhed.——The pills to be repeated at bedtime, and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

3d. The medicines operate freely.——An emetic of ipecacuan to be taken on the approach of the paroxyfm; and after its operation twenty drops of liquid laudanum.

4th. The paroxyfm was lefs fevere, and the perfpiration copious. The emetic took effect. The straining has disappeared. The head-ach is still troublesome.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the solution of salts in the morning.

5th. Eight grains of the London laxative mercurial pill to be taken every night; and the febrifuge mixture during the course of the day.

6th. He was much purged yefterday. The paroxyfm returned with much lefs feverity, and later.——Six ounces of the infufion of fena to be taken to-morrow morning.

7th. His head-ach continues with very little remiffion, although with lefs violence;
it is chiefly diffreffing at the commencement Laft Quarter 8th.
F 3 of the night. He is not fenfible that it is F 3 accompanied

accompanied at that hour by any additional feverifhnefs.

9th. The head-ach has only recurred at night fince the 6th .--- Six ounces of the folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

10th. The paroxyfm has not returned fince the 5th. He complains of having been troubled with fevere purging and griping yesterday, during the whole day and night. -----The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken in the ufual way, until it shall operate freely. Twenty drops of liquid laudanum to be taken after its operation.

11th. He vomited freely. The purging and griping have difappeared.---Six ounces of the infusion of sena to be taken in the morning.

13th. An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning.

14th. He has taken the laxative mercurial every night, and has had feveral ftools. His complaints have entirely difappeared for fome days. His appetite has returned; but he complains of confiderable weaknefs .---- The

laxative mercurial to New Moon 15th. be omitted. Six ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken daily. 16th.

16th. Difcharged, and recommended for three days exemption from duty.

CASE XXXIII.

DECRUSE. Age 20. Admitted 22d May, 1787.

June 1ft. He has had returns of a paroxyim of fever every night, which on the first attack commenced with shivering. The hot stage alone recurs now, with very little, if any, fweat. He does not appear to be entirely free from feverishness during the day. Middle diet and two glasses of wine have been allowed; both are now countermanded, and low diet prescribed.—Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

2d. He thinks himfelf much "lighter" and better fince the operation of the phyfic; but complains of a violent pain in the front part of his head.—The pills and oil to be repeated; and eight leeches to be applied, four to each temple.

3d. He fays he had not any return of fever laft night, and that his head is quite well. He would not permit the leeches to be applied. He has not any fymptoms of F_4 fever fever on him at prefent. The physic ope-

Laft Quarter 8th. rated copioufly. Difcharged at his own requeft; and recommended for an exemption of three days from duty.

10th. Re-admitted. The fever returned two days ago, and has continued without any confiderable remiffion.——The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken during the day.

11th. The medicine operated copioufly downwards, and made him very fick. He has no very confiderable feverifhnefs on him this morning.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

12th. The fever was very fevere all night. He refufed to take the pills.——The folution of falts to be taken in the ufual way until it fhall operate copioufly by ftool. Three clyfters to be taken during the courfe of the day.

13th. He refufed to take the clyfters, and was with great difficulty prevailed upon to take the folution, which, however, operated well. He complains of weaknefs.——The folution of falts to be continued.

14th. No fymptoms, or very trifling, of fever have appeared thefe two days.— Two

Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and four ounces of infufion of fena in the morning.

15th. New Moon. The medicine operates freely.——Six ounces of decoction of bark to be taken daily, and an ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow morning.

16th. No feverish fymptom whatever has recurred.——The decoction to be continued.

17th. He was not vifited till evening. The fever returned to-day with fhivering. —Two purging pills to be taken at bedtime; eight ounces of the folution of falts, in two dofes, to-morrow morning; and, after their operation, an ounce of the powder of bark daily.

20th. He has had no complaint whatever fince the 17th, and has taken the bark, as prefcribed. His appetite has returned, and his ftrength encreafed, — Difcharged.

CASE XXXIV.

BUDDUFF. Age 25. Admitted 24th April, 1787.

June 1st. He has been afflicted for near two months with a constant feverishness, accompanied by daily exacerbations in the evening,

evening, terminating in fweat. He has taken antimonial anodyne draughts, occafionally an emetic, naufeating dofes of tartar emetic, laxatives feldom, but particularly the bark. High diet, and four glaffes of wine, have been allowed daily. He is confiderably reduced, and complains of great weaknefs. His eyes are fuffufed with a yellow colour; his pulfe quick and finall; his fkin dry, and preternaturally warm; his tongue white and moift. He is not coftive.—No wine, and low diet only to be allowed. Five grains of the mafs of laxative mercurial pills to be taken every night.

7th. He has taken the laxative mercurial pill every night, which has preferved his body open, and has occafionally procured feveral ftools in the day. His complaints are greatly relieved; but the exacerbations continue to recur, with lefs flufhing of the cheeks.——Eight grains of the mercurial pill to be continued, and a pint of the decoction of cheretta to be drank daily.

8th. Laft Quarter. Milk diet to be allowed, at his own requeft. The medicines to be continued.

9th. The exacerbations continue, but with lefs feverity.——The mixture of ipecacuan

cuan and emetic tartar to be taken at bedtime, until it shall operate gently by vomit.

10th. The emetic evacuated much yellow and green matter. He feels himfelf much "lighter and better." His appetite returns.—The laxative mercurial and the cheretta to be continued.

11th. He has had no fymptom whatever of fever.——Six drachms of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

12th. The mercurial to be continued.

13th. Difcharged, and recommended for three days exemption from duty.

CASE XXXV.

LOGAN, Age . Admitted 15th June, 1787.

June 15th. New Moon. He was feized with a fever on the 13th, which has continued without any fenfible remiffion, accompanied by vomiting almost inceffantly. His pulse is full, strong, and rapid; his skin dry and hot; his cheeks flushed; his tongue difcoloured; his urine of a high colour.— The folution of falts to be taken immediately.

16th. Part of the folution remained on his ftomach, and occafioned fome evacuation downwards.—

downwards.——To be continued in fmaller and more frequent dofes.

17th. The folution has operated pretty freely. He is much relieved.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

19th. The oil was rejected by his ftomach. No confiderable inteffinal evacuations have occurred fince the laft vifit, yet all the fymptoms are more mild.——The folution of falts to be taken immediately, until it operate abundantly by ftool.

20th. The irritability of the flomach is flill confiderable; copious evacuations, however, have taken place, and all the fymptoms are greatly diminifhed.——A pill, of five grains of calomel and one of opium, to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

21ft. The feverifhnefs is fcarcely perceptible. The irritability of the ftomach has entirely difappeared. Appetite returns. ——Two purging pills to be taken at bedtime, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

22d. First Quarter. No complaint whatever remains, except weakness. The evacuations by stool have been copious these two days.—

days.——A pint of cheretta decoction to be taken daily.

23d. Discharged.

CASE XXXVI.

CUMMINGS. Age 26. Admitted 29th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He has had for fome time returns, every fecond day, of the paroxyfm of an intermittent fever, and is much debilitated. He has been allowed high diet thefe two days, which is now countermanded.— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

2d. The medicines have operated freely. The paroxyfm returned yefterday.—The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

3d. The medicines have procured feveral ftools.—The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken on the approach of the paroxyfm.

4th. The paroxyfm did not return. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

5th. The medicines have had a copious operation.

operation. The paroxyfm has not returned. ——Difcharged, and recommended to an exemption from three days duty.

CASE XXXVII.

BEECKLY. Age . Admitted 7th June, 1787.

June 8th. Laft Quarter. He has been for fome days ill of a continued fever, accompanied with fevere purging and griping, pain on preffure in the regions of the ftomach and liver, in the latter of which it has been of confiderable duration. He alfo complains of being "fhort-winded," efpecially on motion; and is much troubled with frequent vomiting. His pulfe is full and rapid; his fkin hot and dry; his face flufhed, and his tongue much difcoloured.—The folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken to-morrow morning.

9th. The folution of falts and emetic tartar to be continued till two o'clock P. M. Three purging pills to be taken at bedtime, and eight ounces of infusion of fena in the morning, in three doses.

10th. The medicines have operated downwards most copiously. The fever is

not much diminished, and his griping continues.——The pills to be repeated at bedtime; and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

11th. His fever has difappeared. The purging and griping continue.——The pills and folution to be repeated.

12th. He has had many fetid, hot ftools. The fever returned laft night, commencing with rigours, or terminating in fweat.—— The pills to be repeated, and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

14th. His ftools are ftill very hot.— An ounce of the folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken every hour. Let his belly and fide be fomented occafionally, when the pain is particularly troublefome.

15th. New Moon. The pain in his fide is confiderably encreafed. His ftools are ftill very hot, and his ftomach irritable.—Let a large blifter be applied to his fide. The pill of calomel and opium to be taken at bedtime,

time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

16th. The fever did not return fince the 11th at night, till this morning. He is now in the cold ftage. He has had a great many ftools daily. — The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken as foon as the hot ftage has come on.

18th. The folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

19th. His ftools are copious, lefs bilious, and fetid. He complains of much weaknefs, and no appetite.——An ounce of the powder of Peruvian bark to be taken to-day.

20th. He has not had any return of the fever, but his pulfe is rather quick.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infufion of fena in the morn-ing.

21st. His appetite returns in fome degree. He has no fymptom whatever of fever, or any other complaint, except an obtufe pain in the region of the liver.——Six grains of First Quarter 22d. the mass of mercurial laxative pills to be

taken every night, and fix ounces of laxative bitter infufion daily.

23d.

23d. He is ftill in fome degree " fhortwinded" on motion. — Half a drachm of mercurial ointment to be rubbed into the right fide every fecond night. Eight ounces of blood to be taken from him. The pill and infufion to be continued.

30th. Full Moon. He continued the ointment, and was free from all complaint on the 1ft of July, when he became the patient of another practitioner.

CASE XXXVIII.

CLWIN. Age 22. Admitted 23d May, 1787.

June 1ft. He stands admitted for a continued fever; no mention is made of his other fymptoms. Middle diet has been allowed, and two glasses of wine daily. He complains of pain in the regions of the stomach and liver, with frequent retching and vomiting. He is greatly debilitated, and has used bark and other medicines with apparent differvice. His pulse is extremely quick and small; his G fkin hot and dry; his tongue furred with brown. He has had very little difcharge by ftool lately.— Wine to be difcontinued, and fago diet prefcribed. A large blifter to be immediately applied over the painful part. Five grains of calomel and one of opium to be formed into a pill, and taken at bed-time; in the morning very early a folution of two ounces of manna in a pint and a half of water, to be taken in fuch dofes, and at fuch intervals, as his ftomach will allow, until it fhall operate downwards.

2d. No alteration appears to have taken place in his complaints. He has not had ftools as yet. The folution of manna remains on his ftomach.——To be continued until it fhall have procured one or two ftools. A draught of half a grain of emetic tartar, with forty drops of laudanum to an ounce of water, to be taken at bed-time; and the folution again to-morrow morning.

Seven o'clock, P. M. He is now in a cold fweat, and very faint.——Let him use the warm bath immediately, and take the above draught when he comes out of the bath.

Nine o'clock, P. M. He threw up the draught, and continues retching. — Two grains of folid opium to be taken immediately.

Eleven

Eleven o'clock, P. M. His ftomach retained the pill. The cold fweat has difappeared; the vomiting ceafed, and he is much eafier in every refpect.

3d. He is extremely faint, and has not had any ftools.——Let him take every two hours three or four table fpoonfulls of warm panada, with a little wine, &c. in it. A clyfter, with two or three ounces of caftor-oil, to be thrown up every three hours, until he fhall have ftools; and a wine-glafs full of the folution of manna to be taken every hour, or oftener, if it fhall remain on his ftomach.

Eleven o'clock, A. M. The vomiting has been inceffant and violent fince the morning vifit.——A clyfter to be injected immediately. Forty drops of laudanum to be taken every hour in an effervefcent neutral mixture, until the vomiting ceafe.

Six o'clock, P. M. The vomiting ceafed about two hours ago. He has not had any ftools as yet.——Pills of fix grains of calomel and two of opium to be taken to-night. 4th. He had ftools during the night, but they have not been kept, as directed, for infpection. He appears lefs faint; but the retching returns occafionally, though with lefs violence. His fkin is hot and dry; and his pulfe extremely quick, yet fomewhat G 2 ftronger.

ftronger.—Let him take immediately two tea-fpoonfulls of the folution of emetic tartar every ten minutes, until he begin to vomit freely; this may be promoted by tickling his throat with a feather, and drinking a warm and ftrong infusion of chamomile flowers. The fteward of the hospital will attend him during the operation of the vomit, and give him thirty drops of laudanum in half an ounce of water, when the ftomach shall be pretty well cleared. The clysters to be continued, except during the operation of the vomit.

Eleven o'clock, A. M. The vomit has difcharged a most extraordinary quantity of bile, and some other matters. He has not had any retching fince its operation. His skin is not so hot, but his pulse is extremely quick. —He must be made to swallow occasionally a little of the panada with wine.—Some some figns of wandering appear.

5th. Bark would not ftay on his ftomach, even in the effervescent mixture. The retching returned with equal violence; the cold sweats came on; his delirium encreased. Wine and every thing else were rejected by his ftomach. The warm bath, blifters to the head and thighs, and bottles of warm water, were used in vain.—He died early this morning.

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CASE XXXIX.

HOWLETT. Age . Admitted 9th June, 1787.

June 9th. He has been afflicted for three months with a flow and continual fever, with daily exacerbations in the evening. The day before yesterday he was seifed with an agueish paroxysm. His pulse is rather small and quick; his skin hot and dry; his tongue not much discoloured; his face is always flushed after meals; his appetite very trifling, No pain, hardnefs, or fwelling are perceptible in any part of his belly, on examination; his body is not particularly bound .---- The fo-lution of emetic tartar to be taken, until it shall have operated freely by vomit .--- He has conftant pain in the fmall Last Quarter 8th. of his back and loins.

roth. The paroxyfm returned yefterday. The emetic operated well.——The folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken in the ufual manner.

11th. He had many ftools yefterday. The exacerbation recurred, as ufual.—— Should the agueifh paroxyfm return to-day, let the antimonial anodyne draught be taken twenty G 3 minutes

minutes after the commencement of the hot ftage. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

12th. The paroxyfm returned yesterday, but without rigours. The draught induced fleep, and a copious perfpiration. He has had stools this morning.

13th. Should the paroxyfm recur, let the antimonial anodyne draught be repeated. Two purging pills at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning,

14th. The paroxyfm returned with fevere rigours yesterday, but appeared to be much shortened by the draught. — Let one or two additional doses of the infusion of sena be taken, until it shall have operated smartly.

15th. New Moon. The hot ftage of the paroxyfm is now on him. The fit has recurred earlier than ufual. He was well purged yefterday.—The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken immediately; two purging pills at night, and the folution of falts in the evening.

16th. The pills and falts to be repeated. Chicken broth to be allowed.

17th. The pills, and four ounces of infufion of fena, to be repeated.

20th. The agueish paroxysm has not re-

turned fince the 15th, but the feverifh heat returns every evening; in the intervals, however, he is free from all fymptoms of feverifhnefs; and the pain in his back and loins is now very trifling. He complains, however, of a bitter tafte in his mouth.——The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken, until it operate by vomit.

21ft. The medicine operated abundantly upwards and downwards; and difcharged much bitter matter by vomit.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

22d. First Quarter. He has had stools. ——Should the exacerbation return this evening, let the vomit be repeated.—He feels fome encrease of appetite.

23d. Ten ounces of blood to be taken from him.

24th. The exacerbations are milder.—— The folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

25th. The feverifh heat came on with great feverity yesterday evening, commencing with a degree of rigour. His appetite, however, is better, yet he complains of much weakness.—Let him take one pill of cut G_4 colleygee colleygee in the usual manner. A chicken to be allowed in lieu of the broth.

26th. He had not any appearance of the paroxyfm or exacerbation yefterday, but he has now a degree of feverifhnefs.——Two pills of the cut colleygee to be taken.

27th. Three pills of the cut colleygee to be taken.

28th. He perceived the approaches of fever yefterday, and immediately took the pills; they appeared to retard the fever for three or four hours; and then it came on with encreafed feverity. The pills did not occafion naufea; but he had one large ftool about two hours after they were taken; and four or five more during the night.

30th. Full Moon. He continues to take the pills of cut colleygee daily. He is greatly better than on his admiffion; yet a degree of irregular feverifhnefs recurs occafionally. He is free from complaint in every other refpect; and his appetite is confiderable. —He will become the patient of another practitioner to-morrow.

CASE XL.

HANDLEY. Age 21. Admitted 10th May, 1787]

June 1ft. He is not entirely free from feverifhnels at any period of the twenty-four hours, but has evening exacerbations, and a regular paroxylm of an intermittent every fecond evening. His thirft and head-ach are conftant. He is confiderably debilitated, and has been allowed milk diet and three glaffes of wine daily fince his admiffion.——To be put on low diet, and the wine difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d. The paroxyfm returned laft night. The medicines operate well.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

3d. The exacerbation recurred in a lefs degree laft night. The feverifh fymptoms are not fo perceptible in the day-time. The head-ach, however, continues. The operation of the medicines continues.

4th. The paroxyfm returned laft night; but he had not the leaft feverifhnefs during the day.——The folution of emetic tartar to be

be taken in fmall and frequent dofes, fo as to operate abundantly by vomit before bedtime.

5th. The vomit operated freely, and brought on a perfpiration. He did not feel any exacerbation last night.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infusion of fena in the morning.

6th. The paroxyfm did not return laft night. The head-ach has entirely vanished. The medicines have operated. —— Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and five drachms of castor-oil in the morning. —He is not much weaker.

7th. The paroxyfm returned yefterday at two o'clock, P. M. with flight fhivering, but lafted till four with very violent heat. The medicines have operated copioufly.——Half a drachm of the powder of bark to be taken every two hours.

8th. Laft Quarter. There was no appearance of feverifh fymptoms yefterday.—— The bark to be continued. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infufion of fena in the morning,

9th. He has been well purged by the medicines.——The bark to be continued.

10th. He felt a degree of fever yesterday about three o'clock, P. M. He was very fick,

fick, and vomited much green, yellow, " nafty ftuff," this morning.——The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken immediately, till it shall have operated well by vomit. The bark to be difcontinued.

13th. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infusion of sena in the morning.

16th. The feverifh heat recurred with greater feverity yefterday. He has had many ftools.——The decoction of bark to be difcontinued. Eight grains of the mafs of laxative mercurial pills to be taken every night.

18th. The mercurial laxative keeps his body open.—Eight ounces of the decoction

tion of bark, with one drachm of elixir of vitriol, to be taken daily.

20th. His mouth is not fore. He coughs a little; his fpittle is tinged with blood, and has a faltifh tafte. His pulfe is quicker and fmarter than ufual.——Ten ounces of blood to be taken from him immediately.

21ft. The pain in his cheft, cough, and other fymptoms have vanished. — Two purging pills to be taken to-night in lieu of First Quarter 22d, the laxative mercurial; and fix ounces of infufion of sena in the morning.

23d. He felt a degree of feverifhnefs yefterday; and has now a yawning, and other fymptoms of the fever's approach.——The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken immediately.

24th. The draught appears to have prevented the accefs of the fever. —— Half the quantity of the laxative mercurial, the bark, and the vitriol, to be now taken daily. Two glaffes of wine in his common drink daily.

26th. An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

28th. The oil did not operate yesterday, but he took falts, which purged him a little. ——Middle diet to be allowed. The folution of falts to be again taken in the morning.—He has now a degree of tenefinus.—— A clyfter

A clyfter of forty drops of laudanum in fix ounces of rice-water, to be given at bedtime.

30th. Full Moon. He has not had any feverifhnefs fince the 23d. His appetite is now pretty good, though he is weak. He has taken the bark, mercurial, and vitriol, daily.——He ftays in the hofpital till he acquire a little more ftrength.

CASE XLI.

JONES. Age 42. Admitted 8th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He stands admitted for a Nervous Head-acb of confiderable standing. He has been allowed high diet, and two glasses of wine daily. A variety of medicines have been preferibed of those called nervous, and the bark, without relief. The head-ach is incessant, and is evidently accompanied by a constant feverishnes, with occasional exacerbations.—Low diet only to be allowed, and wine to be discontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and the folution of falts to be taken in the morn-ing.

4th. The medicines operate abundantly. He has not the least fymptom of head-ach, feverifhnefs, or any other complaint.

5th. He continues quite well.-Difcharged.

CASE XLII.

CRAIG. Age . Admitted 4th June, 1787.

June 6th. He complains of a confiderable degree of feverifh heat every night, with very fevere pains in all his limbs. He was fome time ago treated for venereal pains during a length of time.——The folution of falts with one grain of emetic tartar to be taken.—He has alfo a fevere pain in the anus.

7th. The medicine only operated once. The pain in his anus was particularly fevere laft night.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and three ounces of infufion of fena in the morning; to be repeated two hours after, if the firft fhall not have occafioned a copious difcharge by ftool.

8th. Laft Quarter. The medicines ope-2 rate

rate freely. He had flying pains in both his fides yesterday, as well as in his arms.

9th. The pains and feverifhnefs are not abated.——The folution of emetic tartar to be taken in fmall and frequent dofes in the evening, until it act freely by vomit.

10th. The emetic operated well. He flept better than ufual; and felt lefs feverifh heat.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of infufion of fena in the morning.

11th. He had not any return of the feverifhnefs laft night. His pains, however, are much the fame.——The warm bath to be used at bed-time, and the antimonial anodyne draught to be taken on coming out of it.

12th.—New Moon 15th. First Quarter 22d.—No fymptom whatever of the feverishness has recurred. He perspired last night. His pains continue much the same.

30th. Full Moon. The feverifhnefs did not return. He has taken the folution of corrofive fublimate, with the decoction of China root, fince the 12th, without much benefit to his pain.

CASE XLIII.

MOORE. Age

. Admitted 24th November, 1787.

December 1st. Last Quarter. He has been in a ftrong continued fever fince his admission. His symptoms at prefent are, an intolerable anxiety about the præcordia; deep breathing; fighing occafionally; countenance full and flushed; skin extremely hot, with that *pungency* which communicates an unpleasant fensation to the finger; a deep yellow fuffusion over the eyes, countenance, and whole body; an occafional dofing, or rather coma; befides the yellow fuffusion of the white of his eyes, a great muddinefs; tongue tremulous, with a thick, brown, dry fur; pulse full, rather strong, and not very quick. He has already taken a folution of emetic tartar, which has operated plentifully upwards. ----- The folution of falts to be taken, in the ufual manner, until stools be procured.

2d. The difcharge by ftool is very trifling, although he has taken much of the folution, which his ftomach retained with difficulty. —Let him take the folution of emetic tartar immediately, until it operate abundantly by

by vomit; two purging pills at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

3d. He has vomited freely, and is much eafier at ftomach; his tongue is ftill covered with the fame fur; but his fkin is cooler, and his countenance clearer. No evacuation by ftool has taken place.——The folution of emetic tartar to be repeated in the ufual dofes for fix hours; three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

4th. The medicines have not operated. The clyfters were returned without any or very little mixture of fæces. He does not, however, complain of any pain in his bowels. His tongue appears fomewhat lefs furred, his fkin hot, and his pulfe not very quick; but his fauces are extremely parched.——The folution of falts to be continued in as large and frequent dofes as his ftomach will bear, till fix o'clock, P. M. The purging pills to be repeated, and the folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic, again in the morning.

5th. Notwithstanding all the purgative me-H dicines

dicines which have been prefcribed, he has not had any material evacuation by ftool yet. He was delirious all night. His tongue is covered with a very thick, black, dry fur; he can scarce move it. His teeth are covered with fordes. He is comatofe; and lies, without the power of motion, as far as I can perceive, on his back .--- Let him be immediately put into the warm bath for half an hour : just before he is taken out of the bath to have a large draught of warm rice-water, with madeira in it; he is then to be put into bed, and well covered, after having had bottles of warm water applied clofe to the foles of his feet. Two or three fpoonfulls of panada, with one fpoonfull of madeira, fome fugar and orange-juice, to be given every hour during the course of the day. A blifter to be applied between the fhoulder-blades, and a large one on the infide of each thigh, as foon as he comes out of the bath. Let there be no delay in the application of the blifters. An ounce and a half of the finest powder of bark, and three grains of opium, to be added to two pints of a ftrong decoction of bark, and two ounces to be taken every half hour, if poffible, allowing an interval of two hours, after the bath, without it; when clyfters alfo are to be given every two hours, till night. Ten

Ten grains of calomel to be taken at bedtime.

6th. No evacuation has occurred. He appeared pretty eafy laft night; but he raves at intervals this morning. His tongue is pretty nearly in the fame condition; fkin warm, and not dry; pulfe foft, rather fmall, and not very quick.——The clyfters, panada, rice-water, and mixture of bark to be continued. Let him have as many oranges as he can eat.

Six o'clock, P. M. He has had, for the first time, two very large and intolerably fetid stools; fince when he has been easter.—— The medicines to be continued during the night, should he awake. Eight grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts, in the usual manner, early in the morning; the mixture of bark is to be difcontinued then.

7th. His ftomach rejects the falts: in other refpects he is much the fame.——The infufion of fena with foluble tartar to be taken in fmall dofes, and as frequently as his ftomach will bear, till two o'clock, P. M. The mixture of bark is then to be repeated till night.

Six o'clock, P. M. His stools are very fetid.——Five purging pills to be taken at H 2 bed-time, bed-time, and the infusion of sena repeated in the morning.

8th. He has not raved fince the morning of the 6th, except during fleep. His ftools are large, liquid, ftinking, brown, with yellow filaments. Skin rather hot and dry; pulfe not very quick; tongue ftill much furred. ——The infufion to be continued till noon, and then the mixture again.—His tongue, which an hour ago appeared covered with a thick dark fur, has been fince fcraped and cleaned, and is now nearly as clear as in health.

9th. New Moon. His ftools have been abundant, at first thick, latterly liquid. He did not take the mixture till night. His tongue is quite clean, skin rather warmer than natural. He fays he is greatly better in every respect.—Let the quantity of opium in the mixture be reduced to half the former quantity; two ounces of it to be taken every hour, till the evening; four purging pills at bed-time, and the folution of falts very early in the morning.

10th. He has had large and liquid evacuations this morning. He perfpired much yefterday and laft night. He eat fome fowl, and bread and butter, which one of his comrades gave him yefterday. His pulfe is 8 quicker

quicker this morning.— The folution of falts to be difcontinued. The mixture to be repeated without opium.

11th. He had not any fleep laft night. His pulfe is fomewhat quick; tongue perfectly clean; fkin natural.——The bark to be continued. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning, till one very copious evacuation be procured.

Six o'clock, P. M. His pulfe is quick; fkin dry, and warmer than ufual; countenance flushed.

12th. His pulfe is ftill quick; fkin natural; tongue clean. He flept well laft night, and has had feveral ftools this morning.—— The decoction of bark to be continued without the powder.

14th. He is free from all complaint but weaknefs. —— The decoction to be continued.

First Quarter 17th.—19th. He was allowed middle diet from the 16th. His pulse was quick last night, and his skin hot.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the infusion of sena in the morning; after the operation of which the decoction as usual.

21st. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time.

23d. Full Moon 24th. Difcharged. Recommended to an exemption from duty for three days.

CASE XLIV.

WHEELER. Admitted 9th November, 1787.

December 1st. Last Quarter. He has long complained of a flow and continual fever with exacerbations in the evening. He has not received any benefit from the medicines which have been prefcribed fince his admiffion; fome of them have operated freely by vomit and ftool. A hardnefs, with fome degree of fwelling, is perceptible in the region of the ftomach. He has fevere pains in the loins; and a conftant dry cough, which is fometimes accompanied by expectoration of green matter. His pulse is quick, and rather hard; his skin hot, dry, rough, and deeply tinged with yellow.----Half a drachm of ftrong mercurial ointment to be rubbed every night on the region of the ftomach.

2d. The fymptoms are the fame as yefterday.— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning,

morning, until he shall have been well purged.

4th. He fays he is greatly better fince the operation of the emetic and purgatives; but his pulfe still continues quick and fmart; and his skin constantly hot.—One purging pill to be taken at bed-time; and fix ounces of the folution of falts in the morning, in two doses.

5th. There is no great alteration in his complaints.——One purging pill to be taken every night, and the ointment continued as ufual.

12th. The folution of falts to be taken, fo as to keep up the purging.

13th. First Quarter. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution again in the morning.

15th. He has been free from complaints these three days.——Discharged.

CASE LXVIII.

PETER MCAY. Admitted 15th April, 1788.

16th. He has daily returns of fever, and is afflicted with tremors of the head and K 4 limbs; limbs; great giddinefs, noife in his ears, cramps in the lower extremities, and coftivenefs.——The folution of falts to be taken as ufual, fo as to operate copioufly by ftool.

17th. He has had fome ftools.——The folution to be continued, fo as to purge freely.

18th. The giddiness continues. He fays, "a "fluice could not make a greater noise than his "ears." The purgatives have not operated very freely. The fever recurred last night, —The folution of emetic tartar to be taken in fuch doses as to operate by vomit.

19th. He difcharged upwards much green matters, and had feveral ftools. The fever recurred in a trifling degree yefterday. All his other complaints have vanished, except the tremors, which remain in a trifling degree.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and four ounces of the folution of falts in one dofe in the morning.

21st. He fays he is quite well, and requests his discharge, Discharged.

MICHAEL PETTY.

21st. He has been free from his complaints fince the 19th.——Difcharged.

ROBERT PEARSE. Admitted 11th July, 1788.

14th. Since his admiffion he has been treated for fores about the pudenda and pofteriors; but laft night he was feized with a paroxyfm of fever. His tongue is foul, and his fkin hot and dry. He is coftive.—— The folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic tartar, to be taken immediately,

diately, so as to operate copiously both ways.

15th. He has only had two ftools from the medicine. The fever returned laft night. ——The folution to be continued until copious ftools be procured.

17th. The fever did not recur last night. The medicines have operated well.——The infusion to be continued during the day, fo as to promote the discharges freely by stool.

18th. Full Moon. The fever has not returned. His fores are nearly healed.

20th. He had fome feverifh heat laft night.——The folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic tartar, to be taken, fo as to procure feveral flools.

21ft. He has not had any appearance of feverish fymptoms fince.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning.

22d. The fores have healed. — Difcharged.

ROBERT SHAW.

27th. He fays the folution occafioned the evacuation of " a great deal of jelly-like ftuff" by vomit, which has greatly relieved him. He had only one ftool. His tongue is foul; his pulfe quick; but his fkin much cooler. His thirft was exceffive all night. ——The fimple folution of falts to be taken, until it fhall have operated copioufly by ftool.

28th. He has been much purged by the folution. At one time he was much freer from fever than before; but it recurred at noon, and continued all night. He is, however, free from all fever this morning; and feels greatly better. He complains that " his head is fo weak, he is ready to fall when he gets

gets up." He has been pretty free from the pains in his ears. His head fweats profufe; and he fays the pains return when the perfpiration is any way checked.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; two purging pills at bed-time; and the infufion of fena in the morning.

29th. He has not the leaft veftige of his complaints, except " a hiffing" in his ear. The medicines have purged him abundantly. — The pills to be repeated at bed-time, and the folution of falts taken in the morning.

30th. He is perfectly free from all complaint.——Six ounces of the infufion of bark in cold water to be taken daily.

31st. Discharged.

CASE LXXIV.

CHRISTIAN FREDERICK. Admitted 15th July, 1788.

15th. He has had a fever for fome days, which is much more violent at particular hours; great giddinefs or "fwimming in the head," fevere pain in the breaft, which is very acute during infpiration.—— The folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic tartar,

tartar, to be taken, until it shall have operated freely by vomit or stool.

18th. Full Moon. The fever continued high without remiffion all yefterday and laft night. It has now remitted.——The anodyne antimonial draught to be taken fhould any fymptoms of the exacerbation come on ; three purging pills at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.—He took the folution of falts, with a double proportion of emetic tartar, on the 17th. He continues to difcharge black fetid matters by ftool.

19th. The exacerbation recurred at night. The giddinefs, and the pain in the breaft, continue much the fame; but he fays he feels much better fince the operation of the falts this morning. He thinks the draught diminifhed the force of the fever.——The pills and folution to be repeated.

20th. The fever was confiderable all yefterday and laft night. The pain in the breaft continues; but the giddinefs has much decreafed.—A blifter to be applied over the part where the pain is felt.—He is much freer

freer from fever to-day.——Six ounces of the infufion of bark in cold water to be taken daily.—The purgatives continue to difcharge much.

21ft. The fever is much leffened, as well as the pain.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning.

22d. A degree of fever recurred laft night; it was very trifling during the day. —The pills to be repeated, and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

23d. He remained quite free from fever all yesterday and last night. The giddiness, pain, and other symptoms, have disappeared. The solution operates well downwards.

24th. He felt a very great heat for a fhort time this morning about two o'clock, which was fucceeded by a fenfe of cold.——Forty drops of the elixir of vitriol to be added to Laft Quarter 26th. the infufion of bark daily. Six ounces of infufion of fena to be taken in the morning.

27th. He has remained free from all complaint; but he did not reft well laft night, and was thirfty until morning. He is coftive.—The fimple folution of falts to be L taken

taken immediately, fo as to procure one or two copious stools.

28th. Difcharged.

CASE LXXV.

JOSEPH COOK. Admitted 13th July, 1788.

14th. He has had for fome days a conftant fever, with pain in the fide; difficulty of breathing; cough; conftant naufea; and coftivenefs. His tongue is remarkably white. —Let him lofe ten ounces of blood immediately. The folution of falts to be taken immediately, until plentiful evacuations by ftool be procured.

15th. His veins are fo fmall that only one table-fpoonfull of blood could be procured. His ftools have been very copious.——A blifter to be applied over the part where the pain is felt. The folution of emetic tartar to be taken in fmall dofes, fo as to operate chiefly by fweat.

16th. His complaints are much better. His fever is greatly diminisched. He sweated much, but had not any stools yesterday.—— The solution of falts to be taken immediately, fo as to operate freely by stool.

17th.

17th. He has had five copious ftools. He is free from all complaint, except a degree of naufea.——An emetic to be taken immediately.

18th. Full Moon. The emetic operated well; fince when he has continued free from complaint.——Difcharged.

CASE LXXVI.

WILLIAM HUMPHRIES. Admitted 17th July, 1788.

17th. He complains particularly of a violent "cramp in his infide," great pain in the bowels, and in all his limbs. His tongue is foul; fkin dry and hot; but his pulfe is pretty regular.—The folution of falts to be taken, with double the proportion of emetic tartar, until it fhall have operated both ways.

18th. Full Moon. The medicine operated abundantly both ways. He is now in a very high fever, with a most excruciating pain in the head.——Solution of falts to be taken during the day.

19th. He is rather better. He refused to take more than two doses of the folution; yet he has been ten times at stool fince yef-

terday.

terday. His ftomach feems to reject every thing but the fago.——Six grains of calomel and two of opium to be taken in pills at bed-time.

20th. He had no reft whatever laft night. He is fomewhat better this morning, and has had two ftools.——Two ounces of the fimple folution of falts to be taken every two hours, or oftener if it fhall ftay on his ftomach, till fun-fet, and two purging pills at bed-time.

21ft. One o'clock, P. M. The pain in his head feems to be intolerable. He is delirious, and the fever is very high.——Let his head be immediately fhaved, and a large blifter applied two hours after. Two ounces of the folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic tartar, to be forced down his throat every half hour, until the most plentiful evacuations by vomit and stool be procured. Clysters, with double the usual quantity of falt, to be thrown up every hour.

22d. The folution could not be given; but he has had feveral ftools from the clyfters. His head is much better; and his dilirium has fubfided.——Ten grains of calomel to be taken immediately, and the infufion of fena in the ufual manner, five hours after.

23d.

23d. The fever has fubfided. His pulfe is fmall and flow; his fkin cool; tongue moist and white. He fays the pain in his head is worfe. He had five stools from the medicine last night .---- The calomel to be repeated immediately, and the fena as before.

24th. The pain in his head continued fevere till about four o'clock, P. M. yefterday. He discharged by stool large quantities of black, fetid, hot matters .---- The calomel to be again repeated; and the folution of falts to be taken in lieu of the infusion; until very large evacuations be procured.

25th. His pulse is flow, but smart. He is much better in every respect. The headach, however, returns during the heat of the day .---- Four leeches to be applied to each temple. The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day, fo as to promote the inteftinal difcharges. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infusion of fena in the morning.

26th. Last Quarter. The head-ach did not return till four o'clock, P. M. yefterday; nor did it last above an hour and a half. He is free from every other complaint. The medicines operate well.---The infufion to be taken till the approach of the head-ach, L 3 when

when forty drops of laudanum are to be taken in a draught.

27th. He difcharged yefterday, as ufual, much brown fetid matters by ftool. The head-ach came on about five o'clock, P. M, yefterday, but was very trifling; he took the draught juft as the pain came on. He fweated much, and flept well laft night. He continues quite well in other refpects.—— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; three purging pills at bed-time, and fix ounces of the bitter laxative infufion in the morning.

28th. The head-ach is well. —— Six ounces of the infufion of bark in cold water to be taken daily.

29th. Discharged.

CASE LXXVII.

JOHN BUSBY. Admitted 17th July, 1788,

17th. He has had a fever for fix days without intermiffion. He has alfo an habitual flux of long ftanding.——The folution of falts, with double the proportion of emetic tartar, to be taken immediately.

18th. He fays the medicine " runs through

through him as he takes it," but his difcharges have been very green and yellow, as well as very large.——The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken immediately, and two purging pills at bed-time.

21ft. The fever has nearly vanished.—— The emetic and draught to be repeated.

22d. He was perfectly free from fever yefterday and laft night. — An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning; and after its operation fix ounces of infufion of bark in cold water, to be repeated daily.

24th. Discharged.

CASE LXXVIII.

MICHAEL PETTY.

(The account of two days is loft.)

May 3d, 1789. He has complained of griping, and a difcharge of flime, fince yefterday morning. The mixture was not taken L 4 in

in fuch quantities as to operate.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time.

4th. The pills have not operated as yet. —Let him take the folution of falts immediately, until it fhall have operated well.

Evening. The phyfic has operated freely, and has given him great relief.

5th. Yefterday evening he was feized with a very fevere pain in his ftomach. He had an attack of the fame kind once before. He took fome mulled wine and pepper, but it afforded him no relief.—— His wine to be difcontinued. The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken during the day, until it fhall have taken effect.

Evening. The mixture has only excited naufea; but it has procured three ftools.—— He had a very trifling degree of fever laft night.

8th. He had feveral hot and griping ftools from the medicine. He experienced, at the ufual period of the fever, yesterday evening,

evening, fome thirft, a drynefs and heat of the palms of his hands and foles of his feet; and his fkin was harfh and dry; but he had not any decided return of the fever.——Four Full Moon 9th. purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning. The wine to be difcontinued.

10th. The purgatives operated well. The feverifh fymptoms have been fcarcely fenfible for two nights.

12th. He has been coffive fince the 9th. His fkin is at prefent hot and dry; his thirft confiderable; but his pulfe is regular.—— The folution of falts to be taken until ftools be procured; and three grains of calomel at bed-time.

13th. The feverifh fymptoms continued during the day yefterday, and laft night. He had no material evacuation from the medicine.—— The folution to be continued in larger dofes, until ftools be procured.

Evening. The phyfic has operated largely once. He is at prefent perfectly free from every feverifh fymptom.

14th. He has no return of appetite, and feels confiderable naufea.——The folution of emetic tartar to be immediately taken, in fuch dofes as to excite vomiting; and five grains of calomel at bed-time.

15th.

15th. The medicine encreafed the naufea much, but did not excite vomiting. He had, however, two ftools during the night. The only fymptoms of fever which recur occafionally now are a hot and dry fkin.——Let the folution of falts, with three grains of emetic tartar, be taken, until it fhall have operated brifkly either by vomit or ftool.

16th. A degree of heat recurred laft night. He took eight grains of calomel at bed-time, and the folution of falts this morning, which was prefcribed yefterday. He is free from every appearance of feverifhnefs. He has had copious ftools. He has had a fcabby eruption on his arm, which breaks out every feafon of the hot winds.

18th. He thinks he had a flight degree of feverifhnefs yefterday evening, with a little griping. He had one ftool laft night, and one this morning. — The mixture to be continued; the bark omitted. Eight grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts, with the double proportion of emetic tartar, in the morning.

19th.

19th. He has not had any recurrence of the fever; but the medicines have not as yet operated by ftool. He flept perfectly well; and has appetite.

20th. The medicines did not operate till this morning, though he continued to take the folution all day.

21st. He fays he continues perfectly well, except in respect to strength.

22d. Difcharged. — Recommended to be excufed from duty for four days.

CASE LXXIX.

FREDERICK JANNO, Admitted 23d May, 1789.

24th. New Moon. He has had, feveral days, a confiderable degree of fever, which has not abated; accompanied by fevere pains in his back and all his limbs.——The folution of falts, with the double proportion of emetic tartar, to be taken immediately, until it fhall have operated well both ways.—His fkin is rather cool, confidering the ftate of his tongue and pulfe.

26th. He does not think the pains diminifhed. His ftools are liquid and brown.— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day. Camphorated oil to be rubbed over the pained parts twice a day.

27th. His pulfe is ftill quick. His fever is much leffened, as well as the pains in his limbs; but the pain in the back remains. ——The febrifuge mixture to be continued. Five grains of calomel to be taken at bedtime; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

28th. His complaints have nearly vanished.

29th. He is perfectly free from complaint.——Difcharged.

Re-admitted 19th May. Last Quarter 17th.

21ft. The medicine has operated entirely downwards; he fays "he cannot keep from the clofeftool." He paffes a great quantity of green and very hot matters.— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; five grains of calomel at bed-time; and the folution of falts again in the morning.

22d.

22d. He has paffed much flime and blood; and complains of weaknefs. The fwellings are confiderably leffened, as well as the fever. His pulfe is now full, foft, and flow. His fkin is ftill rather hot.

23d. His weaknefs he thinks is encreafed from the continuance of the purging of flimy and bloody matters. His pulfe is the fame; his fkin cool and foft; but there is ftill a degree of brown fur on his tongue. — Six grains of calomel, and two of opium, to be taken immediately in pills; and an ounce of caftor-oil five hours after.

24th. New Moon. The opium affected his head greatly; and he had not a fingle call to ftool, until the caftor-oil began to operate. He is much eafier and better in every refpect this morning. The fever feems to have entirely left him. His tongue is cleaner. ——Six grains of calomel, with half a grain of opium, to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

25th. The purging troubled him much laft night; but the fwellings and fever have entirely difappeared. 20th. Two ounces of caftor-oil to be taken immediately. Four leeches to be again applied to each temple.—He has little or no feverifh fymptoms at prefent.— The calomel to be repeated at bed-time.

22d. He had only two or three ftools yesterday. His eyes are greatly better.

23d. New Moon 24th. He had four or five stools during the last twenty-four hours. —Two ounces of castor-oil to be taken immediately.

Full Moon 9th.—10th. He has had regular returns daily of an agueifh paroxyfm in the evening for four or five days.—Let his diet be of fago, panada, or vegetables. The folution of falts, with one grain of tartar emetic, to be taken, until evacuations by ftool be procured.

Evening. The folution has operated well. The feverifh paroxyim has not recurred as yet.

He has from the beginning complained of pain acrofs his loins — Let him rub the camphorated oil on the part affected. —He had only one ftool yefterday.— Ten grains of calomel to be taken at night; and the folution of falts, with tartar emetic, in the morning. 9th. He was much purged and vomited yefterday. His tongue is foul; fkin warm and moift; pulfe quick. His recollection appears greatly deficient.——Five grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion of fena, with foluble tartar, to be taken in the morning, at one dofe of fix ounces.

10th. He was speechlefs, and in a cold fweat last night. ----- Should these fymptoms recur, let him be immediately put into the warm bath, and take a draught of warm rice-water, with a glafs of wine in it. When he is taken out of the bath let him take a draught of thirty-five drops of laudanum, and twenty of antimonial wine, in three ounces of water. Give him every hour a spoonfull or two of panada, with lime-juice, fugar, and wine in it. Let him have a little therbet to fip constantly .- He did not take the calomel last night. ---- The infusion of sena, with foluble tartar, to be repeated until two or three stools be procured. A blister to be immediately applied over the affected part of his cheft .- He had a fevere paroxyim of fever with fhivering yesterday.

11th. He had fome ftools yesterday. One ounce and a half of the powder of bark to be taken during the course of the day; and five grains of calomel at bed-time.

12th. Last Quarter. He is at present in a cold

a cold and clammy fweat. His tongue has a brown fur.---- To be put immediately into the warm bath, and to remain in it as long as he feels it comfortable. To drink warm rice-water, with a little wine in it. One or two clyfters to be injected while the bath is preparing. Let him take the former anodyne antimonial draught as before. An hour after the draught, to take the infusion of sena, with foluble tartar, till one ftool be procured. He has had four fimilar ftools this morning. His thirft, tongue, and pulfe are the fame; his fkin is lefs dry and warm. — Let him have an emetic of ipecacuan immediately. The calomel to be repeated at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.— He has had an eruption on his lips thefe three days. His eyes have a degree of yellow fuffufion.

4th. He difcharged much yellow bitter matter by vomit yefterday; to which he attributes much benefit. He has had this morning two copious, thin, reddifh ftools, accompanied with lefs heat. His fkin and pulfe are perfectly natural; his tongue clearer from fordes. He is not fenfible of the leaft return of fever. The calomel and extract of jalap to be taken at bed-time; and the folution

tion of falts in the morning.—He perceives a very trifling return of appetite.

5th. He had one bilious stool of a thicker confistence yesterday. He has not had a stool this morning. He is perfectly free from all complaint; but has not much appetite as yet.— Let him continue the solution of falts, until it begins to operate.

6th. Difcharged.

CASE CI.

ROBERT WEST. Age 56. Admitted 14th December, 1789.

15th. The ague feized him about eleven days ago, and has returned every fecond day. —The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken to-day.

16th. New Moon. Repeat the medicines.

17th. The paroxyfm returned yefterday, and terminated in cold fweat. — The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken immediately.

18th. He had a little feverifh heat laft night. His ftools were very black, hot, and fetid.—Two purging pills to be taken at O bed-time;

bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

19th. Medicines to be repeated.

20th. Noon. He had not the leaft fever yefterday, and only one ftool. Pulfe, fkin, and tongue natural.——The pills and caftoroil to be repeated.

21ft. He had a flight return of the paroxyfm laft night. His ftools, of which he has had four this morning, are black.—— The febrifuge mixture to be continued. The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

22d. He has had a great many ftools, yellow, and lefs hot.—— The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

23d. The paroxyfm was extremely flight; it came on about ten o'clock this morning; he has had one ftool fince the laft vifit.—— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

24th. First Quarter. He has had three brown, thick, fetid stools this morning.—— The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

25th. Noon. The paroxyfm recurred very flight about four o'clock, A. M. and lasted to about fix, A. M. this morning. He

He had a great number of green ftools yesterday and last night.——An ounce and a half of castor-oil to be taken early to-morrow morning.

26th. He had no feverifhnefs this morning. His ftools are green and frothy.

31st. He has not had any fymptoms of fever these three days.

CASE CII.

DANIEL KELLY. Age 46. Admitted 12th December, 1789.

13th. He has had a continual fever for fix days, which commenced with rigors, and is accompanied by daily exacerbations, at four o'clock, P. M. beginning with a fenfe of " chillinefs." He fweat a little for the firft time laft night. His pulfe is quick, and rather fmall; fkin warm, and not dry; tongue moift, with a brownifh fur; head giddy; limbs very weak; thirft conftant; urine at firft not very clear, and this morning " quite " yellow, the fame as beer."— The folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken, until it fhall have operated well by ftool.

14th. The exacerbation returned with O 2 "chillinefs"

" chillinefs" laft night. He had ten yellow ftools during the day. His pulfe is full, rapid, and rather ftrong; his fkin hot, but not dry; his tongue the fame. — The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken during the day. Two purging pills at night; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

15th. "He thought he fhould have died "yefterday, from weaknefs and the fever." The folution did not operate till night. He has been much purged ever fince. His ftools are yellow, brownifh, hot, and fetid; his pulfe is rather full and rapid; fkin dry and hot; tongue white, with a tinge of brown in the middle. He was fomewhat delirious yefterday.—The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; three purging pills at night. Should the fever come on with equal violence, let him have a draught of twenty drops of antimonial wine, and forty of laudanum.

16th. New Moon. The fever returned yesterday with some shivering, but was much less violent than the day before. He has been constantly purged since yesterday morning. His stools are the same; tongue the same; skin cool and dry; pulse rather small and quick.—Let him take a few spoonfulls

fulls of panada, without wine, four or five times daily.—He took the draught, which neither induced perfpiration nor checked the purging. Complains of great weaknefs.— The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

17th. The paroxyfm came on with lefs feverity yefterday. His ftools are the fame; pulfe, fkin, tongue, the fame as yefterday. ——The febrifuge mixture to be taken all day, and during the night when he awakes. Let him be allowed occafionally a fpoonful of fago with wine.—He complains of weaknefs.

18th. The paroxyfm returned at ten o'clock, A. M. yefterday, with very fevere rigors, and lafted till about two o'clock this morning. His ftools are yellow, " brownifh, " and as hot as fire." He threw up the fago. His pulfe, fkin, and tongue are the fame.— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; three purging pills at night; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

19th. The paroxyfm came on about four o'clock, P. M. with its ufual feverity. He had many ftools yefterday, and two this morning, yellow and brown, but not hot.

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His tongue is ftill brown in the middle; fkin dry; pulfe nearly natural.— The febrifuge mixture to be continued; and the folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

20th. His ftools are the fame as ufual. The paroxyfm returned about nine o'clock laft night, and continued to about three o'clock this morning. His tongue, fkin, and pulfe are the fame.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued; two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

21ft. The paroxyfm returned about feven o'clock yefterday evening. He was greatly purged the whole night; his ftools were very hot.—— The febrifuge mixture to be continued during the twenty-four hours.

22d. The paroxyfm returned about feven o'clock, P. M. but with much lefs feverity. ——The febrifuge mixture to be continued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

23d. He has had four ftools this morning. The paroxyim recurred at the ufual hour, but with ftill lefs feverity.——Let him have the mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar, until it operates by vomit, on the approach of the paroxyim this evening.

24th. First Quarter. The fever returned, x but

but was lefs fevere than the day before. He vomited and purged feveral times. His tongue is pretty clean; fkin and pulfe natural; his ftools are not hot.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

25th. Noon. The paroxyfm returned laft night with lefs feverity. He has had many thin yellow ftools this morning.— The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be used to-morrow morning.

26th. The paroxyfm returns, but with lefs feverity every night. His ftools are ftill yellow, but not hot. —— The anodyne antimonial draught to be taken as the fever approaches. An ounce and a half of caftor-oil in the morning.

31st. He has not had any fymptoms of fever these three days.

CASE CIII.

WILLIAM WHEELER. Age 40. Admitted 9th December, 1789.

Last Quarter 9th.—10th. He was difcharged fome days ago cured of venereal fores and pains, for which he has taken much mer-

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cury and bark. He was feized about five days ago with very fevere purging, griping, ftraining, and difcharge of blood and "corruption." He has calls every ten minutes, and is much weakened by the diforder. His difcharges "run from him" imperceptibly; his tongue is fomewhat difcoloured; his pulfe extremely fmall and quick; his fkin rather dry.—An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken immediately; and a vomit of ipecacuan at bed-time.

11th. The oil operated about fifteen minutes after it was taken, and brought away much bilious, mucous, hot matter, which "funk like rotten flefh." He vomited much " bitter flimy fluff." The purging, griping, and ftraining have not been alleviated by the medicines. His tongue is more foul; pulfe as quick, but rather more full; fkin the fame.— Let the caftor-oil be repeated immediately. A pill of five grains of calomel and one and a half of opium, to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

12th. The oil evacuated much yellow, hot, and fetid matter. He was feized with a fhivering yefterday at eleven o'clock, A. M. which lafted till noon, and was fucceeded by great heat, which did not terminate in fweat. His

His purging, griping, and ftraining are the fame; his pulfe is rather more full and ftrong, and lets quick; his fkin dry, and rather hot; his tongue fomewhat cleaner; his weaknefs encreafes.— Let him take frequently, during the day, a little fago. Let him have the infufion of toafted rice to drink. Let him take the febrifuge mixture during the day, and an emetic of ipecacuan at night; after the emetic, a clyfter of rice-water, with fixty drops of laudanum, to be thrown up.

13th. Noon. The paroxyfm recurred about eight o'clock, P. M. yesterday; but did not terminate in fweat. He vomited much bitter, yellow, green matter, and " nafty flime." His complaints are not in the least alleviated; his pulse is very small and quick; skin perfectly cool; tongue brownifh towards the root; urine "yellow." ----Let him have the warm bath at funfet; the antimonial anodyne draught when he comes out of the bath. Two purging pills at ten o'clock; and the folution of falts in the morning. On his coming out of the bath, let him be well covered; and give him one or two draughts of warm whey, a little after the antimonial shall have been taken.

14th. The bath and draught induced a little

little perfpiration. His ftools are ftill " nafty" and yellow. The griping is not better; but the ftraining has been lefs fince three o'clock this morning. He had a flight return of the fever, with very little fhivering, yefterday. — The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day. Two purging pills at bedtime; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

15th. He is not better. — The bath and antimonial draught at bed-time.

16th. New Moon. The bath and draught relieved the purging for about two hours. The fever returned with lefs feverity. The ftraining only is better.—Let him take the folution of white vitriol, in the ufual way, until it operates by vomit; and a ftrong infufion of chamomile flowers afterwards, to promote the vomiting.

17th. He vomited much bitter, green, yellow, "nafty ftuff." At the end of his ftools a few drops of blood appeared.—— The folution to be continued in fuch a manner as to keep up a degree of naufea.

18th. He vomited yefterday "fome nafty yellow ftuff." His calls are lefs frequent at night. The ftraining and griping are as fevere as ufual.—— A pill of one grain of opium, and five of calomel, to be taken at bed-time;

bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning. The folution to be continued during the day.

19th. He continued lefs troubled with the purging until four o'clock this morning, when it became very fevere. His griping and ftraining are not fo troublefome. —— The folution to be continued as ufual.

20th. His purging, griping, and ftraining are much better.——The folution to be continued. The pill of calomel and opium to be repeated at night.

21ft. He has no ftraining, and very little griping; the purging, however, is not equally abated.——The folution to be continued; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

22d. He has neither griping or ftraining. His purging is much the fame; but without any appearance of blood.——The folution to be continued as usual.

23d. The purging is not better; and he is griped occasionally. He complains of much wind in his bowels. The folution to be difcontinued.

24th. First Quarter. Noon. He has been easy fince four o'clock this morning. He is much troubled with a dry cough, particularly at night. No part of his belly is fwelled, fwelled, or fore on preffure.——One drachm of mercurial ointment to be rubbed into his right fide, below the ribs, every night. Let him wear a flannel jacket. An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

25th. Noon. His purging was better last night, but his cough worse. His stools from the oil are yellow and thin.

26th. The purging and griping were particularly fevere laft night. —— Two drachms of the ointment to be rubbed in every night.

27th. The medicines to be continued.

28th. His purging and griping are much better. His dry cough appears much more troublefome.—A blifter to be applied between the fhoulders. A clyfter, with fixty drops of laudanum, to be injected at bedtime.

29th. His purging and griping are again very fevere.——An ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

30th. His griping is better; not his purging.

LEWIS RATCHOVIE. Age 40. Admitted 7th December, 1789.

7th. Noon. He has had returns of an agueifh paroxyfm every day for four days, commencing at one o'clock, P. M. and lafting to about eight o'clock, P. M. He complains of a fenfe of much bile in the ftomach. —Let him take the folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, until it fhall have operated copioufly by ftool.

8th. He had three or four copious, yellow, glareous ftools yefterday. He had the paroxyfm at three o'clock, P. M. He has had a cough eight days; and complains of a bitter tafte in his mouth.— Let him take the mixture of ipecacuan and tartar emetic, until it shall operate freely by stool. Let him take two purging pills at bed-time; and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

9th. Laft Quarter. He vomited much yellow matter; and had many ftools yefterday. He paffed much yellow and glareous matter, and many "white lumps." The paroxyfm came on about four o'clock, P. M. yefterday, with lefs feverity.— The pills to be

be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.— An eruption appears on his lips.

10th. His cheeks have been much flushed fince his admiffion; and his fkin appears in fome degree tinged with yellow. He had fix stools yesterday; and passed much glareous, bilious, " lumpy" matters. The paroxyfm returned with shivering, but with still lefs feverity, about five o'clock, P. M. He has had one fetid, black, hot ftool this morning. His tongue is whitish, tinged with a degree of brown towards the root; his fkin dry, and too warm; his pulse quick, rather fmall, with a degree of tenfenefs; his urine of a very high colour, and hot; his thirst continues the fame ; his giddinefs continues. ----- The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day, after the falts. The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and two ounces of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

11th. The paroxyfm returned yefterday with equal feverity. His ftools, of which he had feven yefterday, were yellow, blackifh, glareous, and hot; he had three during the night, and three this morning, which were thin, yellow, and not as hot as ufual. The thirft continues; fkin natural; and pulfe is much lefs fmall, quick, and tenfe. A vomit of

of ipecacuan to be taken about one o'clock; thirty drops of laudanum as the fit approaches, the pills to be repeated at bed-time, and fix ounces of infufion of fena to be taken in the morning. Let him take a fpoonful of fago frequently.

12th. He had feven ftools yefterday, principally green, and not as hot as ufual. The paroxyfm did not return yefterday; his eyes have been much fuffufed with yellow fince his admiffion; he complains of fome pain in them two or three days paft; his pulfe is rather more full and ftrong, lefs quick; his fkin dry, and too warm; his tongue cleaner; the eruption on his lips has become fcabby; he has had one yellow ftool this morning; the confufion, giddinefs, and weight in his head continue on motion.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken until to-morrow morning, when he is to have two ounces of caftoroil.

13th, Noon. He had three hot, yellow, ftinking ftools yefterday; the paroxyfm returned yefterday about three o'clock, P. M. he has had five ftools of the fame kind this morning; he fweated much all night, and felt irregular fhivering this morning; his pulfe is not very quick, but gives a finarter pulfation than ufual; fkin moift, but too warm; tongue white;

white; eyes and fkin more fuffufed with yellow; urine of a very high colour; face more flufhed.——A vomit of ipecacuan to be taken at funfet, and worked off with a ftrong infufion of chamomile flowers. Three purging pills at nine or ten o'clock, and the folution of falts in the morning.—He has taken a little fago occafionally without appetite.

14th. The paroxyfm did not return yefterday; had four yellow ftools before he took the ipecacuan, which operated downwards four times during the night; he has had one yellow ftool this morning; his pulfe is rather quick, fmall, and fmart; tongue fomewhat browner; fkin cool and dry.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued after he has taken the folution of falts. Six ounces of the infufion of fena to be taken to-morrow morning.

15th. The fever returned with lefs violence.—. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning.

16th. New Moon. He had not any return of the fever yesterday; he had three stools, and four more this morning, of a black colour; his eyes have a greenish tinge, his skin is yellow; his cheeks still flushed; his skin in other respects, and his pulse, natural; tongue the fame.

fame. Some foup yesterday.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of castor-oil to be taken in the morning.

17th. His tongue is cleaner; fkin, pulfe, &c. the fame; his ftools are more natural, and of a better confiftence; his appetite returns a little.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken day and night when he awakes.

18th. The fever has not returned; his tongue, pulfe, and fkin, except its colour, are natural.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued, two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

20th. His eyes continue rather fuffufed with yellow; he complains of nothing but weaknefs now; he has had three ftools of a natural confiftence.—Two purging pills to be taken at night; the febrifuge mixture to be continued.

21st. An ounce of castor-oil to be taken immediately.—The febrifuge mixture to be continued as usual.

22d. His belly is tenfe, rather painful, P and

and fwelled.——An imbrocation of camphorated oil to be ufed twice a day.

23d. He had a regular paroxyfm of fever at five o'clock, P. M. yefterday; his ftools are of a natural confiftence. — Let him have the folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, till it operates well by ftool. Low diet only to be allowed. — The yellow tinge has never left his eyes or fkin fince his admiffion.

24th. Firft Quarter. The fwelling and tenfenefs of his belly continues; he has a dry cough, and feels pain, on preffure, under the falfe ribs of the right fide; he had fix watery ftools yefterday; his fever came on at the former hour.—Let a drachm of mercurial ointment be rubbed in upon the part that appears tenfe every night; let him take the mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar on the approach of the fit, until it operates well by vomit.

25th. Noon. The fever came on as ufual; he feels great pain in the part of the belly that is tenfe, as the fever leaves him; the mixture operated much by ftool, but not by vomit; his ftools are pale.

26th. His ftools are natural; the paroxyfm recurred as ufual.——Two drachms of mercurial ointment to be rubbed in every night.

31ft.

31ft. The steward fays he has neglected to take all or most of his medicines fince the 20th.

CASE CV.

JOHN WARREN. Age 50. Admitted 18th December, 1789.

19th. He was feized with a paroxyfm of an ague on the 11th, which has returned every fecond day; his ftomach rejects every thing, and he complains of fevere pain in his shoulders and back .---- The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken immediately, until it shall operate by vomit; two purging pills at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

20th. He vomited much green matter yefterday, and his ftools have been thin, green, and hot .--- The febrifuge mixture to be taken, and the folution of falts to-morrow .----He is of a fpare weakly habit of body.

21ft. He has been much purged; his ftools are ftill very green and hot; he had no return of the paroxyfm yesterday.

22d. His mouth is fore, and his cheeks fwelled; he has not had any return of the fever.----An ounce of castor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning.

23d. The oil has not purged him as yet. P 2 ---Let

--Let him take another ounce of it immediately.

24th. First Quarter. The oil purged him all night; his stools were green, hot, and offensive; he has not had any return of fever. ——The astringent gargle to be used.

25th. He has not had any fever; his mouth is a little better.——The caftor-oil to be repeated in the morning.

CASE CVI.

JOHN RYDER. Age 49. Admitted August 26th, 1789.

December 11th. He has been hitherto treated for a fore leg, for which he has taken much bark. Yefterday he was feized with a paroxyfm of fever about four o'clock, which lafted till fix, and terminated in cold fweat; his tongue is rather foul, and his pulfe rather quick; his fkin natural.—.The folution of falts to be taken immediately.

12th. He had three large fetid ftools yefterday "as black as ink." The paroxyfm returned with flight fhivering at four o'clock, P. M. and lafted with violent heat, terminating in a warm fweat, till two o'clock this morning. He has had one fetid, black ftool this morning; his pulfe and fkin are natural; his tongue has a brownifh fur.—— The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the

the day; two purging pills at night; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

13th. Noon. The paroxyfin returned with great violence, and terminated in a profufe fweat; he had no ftool till five minutes after he took the oil, when he had fix or feven black, hot ftools, but not very fetid; he has fweated copioufly, particularly from the head, after feveral of the ftools; he is much eafier.——The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

14th. The fever did not return yefterday; he had two fmall black ftools in the afternoon; his pulfe is rather quick and ftrong; his fkin rather hot and dry; tongue the fame.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; two purging pills at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

15th. The paroxyfm returned with violence yesterday.—Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

16th. Noon. New Moon. The paroxyfm returned yefterday, but with little of the cold ftage; he complains particularly of very violent pain acrofs his forehead and eyes during the fit, which has lafted to this hour.— Let him take the folution of emetic tartar frequently, until it fhall have operated well

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by vomit, and the folution of falts in the morning.—He has had eight brown and white ftools this forenoon.

17th. The tartar emetic operated both ways very copioufly; he brought up much flimy and bitter matter; his ftools were extremely offenfive and hot.——Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

18th. He felt a little feverifh heat only yefterday; he was purged much; his ftools were whitifh, brown, flimy, and glareous, but not fetid or hot.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken. Should the fever come on, let him have the antimonial anodyne draught.

21st. He has been perfectly free from all fymptoms of fever.

30th. The fever has not returned.

CASE CVII,

THOMAS PATRICK, Age 60. Admitted 13th December, 1789.

14th. He was feized with the ague yefterday about noon.——The folution of falts to be taken immediately; two purging pills at night, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

15th. The febrifuge mixture to be taken.

16th. New Moon. He had a very fevere return of the paroxyfm yefterday; he has had feveral brownifh ftools.——The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken immediately, until it fhall have operated well by vomit; and the folution of falts in the morning.

17th. The mixture operated well downwards, and very little by vomit; his ftools were black, hot, and fetid.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and fix ounces of fena in the morning.

18th. The paroxyfm returned later, and with lefs feverity, yefterday. Tongue and fkin natural, pulfe rather quick.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken.

19th. He had two ftools yesterday. Should the paroxysm return, let the antimopial anodyne draught be taken; two purging

pills at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

21ft. The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

22d. He felt a degree of chillinefs yefterday about the ufual period, but nothing more; he has had two ftools fince yefterday.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

23d. Discharged.

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31st. He continues free from returns of fever in the barracks.

CASE CVIII.

JOHN EDGAR. Age 56. Admitted 23d November, 1789.

December 7th. He has had a fevere cough with much expectoration; had an attack of ague yesterday.——Let him take an ounce of castor-oil now.

8th. He had a return of the paroxyfm in the evening.— Let him have the febrifuge mixture to-day, and one drachm of the powder of bark every hour.

9th. Last Quarter. The paroxysim was very triffing last night.——The febrifuge mixture and the bark to be continued.

10th.

10th. The paroxyfm was more fevere laft night than at any of the former periods; he is coftive; his cough is rather worfe.—— The bark to be continued; an ounce of caftoroil immediately.

11th. He had fix copious, yellow, green, then white and very hot, ftools. The paroxyfm did not return. — The bark to be continued to-day; and the caftor-oil to be repeated to-morrow morning. — His cough has been worfe fince the oily mixture was difcontinued. — Let him take it as formerly.

12th. He was feized with a violent fit of the cholic about four o'clock, P. M. which lafted till twelve at night; he has not had any evacuation by ftool or urine fince.— Let him begin immediately to take the folution of falts, until it fhall have operated by ftool, till when a clyfter may be injected every two hours. Should the cholic return, and fhould he not make water before noon, let him be kept in the warm bath as long as he feels it agreeable.—He was a little feverifh laft night, but this he attributes to the pain. —The bark to be difcontinued.

13th. Noon. He had five hot, fetid ftools, of various colours, after leaving the bath; he has felt occafionally a little "twitch-"ing," but very little cholic, or any fever; he has had two very white ftools this morn-

ing;

14th. He had two natural ftools yefterday; the paroxyfm returned with lefs fhivering, but with violent heat, terminating in a profufe fweat.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day, two purging pills at night, and the folution of falts in the morning,

15th. He is much better; he has an eruption on his lips.

16th. New Moon. His cough is the fame; he has not had any return of the fever; he feels fometimes a degree of pain under the ribs of the left fide.—Let half a drachm of mercurial ointment be well rubbed into the left fide every night. The febrifuge mixture to be taken daily.

24th. First Quarter. The medicines continued from the 16th to the 25th.

25th. His cough is much better.

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28th. Difcharged at his own requeft. He was invalided for the cough, of which he does not expect a perfect cure.

CASE CIX.

WILLIAM EARL. Age 53. Admitted 29th October, 1789.

December 1st. His purging has left him. Complains of ague. Has taken feveral times draughts of liquid laudanum, rhubarb, ipecacuan, the bark, a dofe of falts, caftor-oil, tartar emetic, &c. He expects the paroxyfm to-day about eleven o'clock, A. M. He fwells when he eats any thing; and complains of a pain below the ribs of the left fide. He expectorates much in the morning; and fay his " ftomach" is fore with it. His body is open; his urine is natural; he has no fymptoms of fever in the intervals. His pulse is rather small at prefent.----The bark to be omitted. An emetic of ipecacuan to be taken half an hour before the fit. Four grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time; and two ounces of caftor-oil early in the morning.

2d. Full Moon. He difcharged by vomit much yellow matter and phlegm. He had two yellow thin ftools from the ipecacuan, but has not had any as yet from the other medicines. His fever was not violent

as

as ufual. The cold ftage was most fevere; the hot ftage was trifling.—The folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken during the day; five grains of calomel at night; and the folution again tomorrow early.

3d. He had about feven liquid brown ftools yefterday; his firft ftools were hot. Says he feels the paroxyfm coming on now. His tongue is particularly clean and red; his eyes have a degree of yellow fuffufion. He has had about fix greenifh ftools this morning.—Let him have the anodyne antimonial draught immediately. The calomel to be repeated at night; and an ounce of caftor-oil to-morrow morning.—His urine is not high-coloured.

4th. He had the paroxyfm from twelve to four, P. M. The cold ftage was moft fevere; the hot ftage trifling, and he perfpired after it. He has had three ftools of a white colour this morning. His cough and expectoration are as ufual. — Let him take the neutral febrifuge mixture during the day. Five grains of calomel, and five of the extract of jalap, to be made up into pills, and taken at bed-time. The folution of falts early in the morning.

5th. He vomited fome phlegm yesterday; and

and had a naufea for about four hours. He had three ftools yefterday, flimy and mucous; laft night about five of a bilious and glareous nature; and this morning three perfectly watery. He had no perceptible perfpiration yefterday or laft night.—— Let him take the antimonial anodyne about half an hour before the fit is expected. The pills to be repeated at bed-time.— He thinks the cough is rather "harfher than it was;" and the expectoration is the fame. His urine is as ufual.

6th. He had the paroxyfm at two o'clock, three hours later than ufual. The cold ftage was lefs fevere. The cough was more troublefome laft night. Has had three ftools of "white froth."—Let him have the antimonial anodyne draught at night. Let him begin immediately to take two drachms of the powder of bark every hour and a half.

7th. Noon. Had two ftools yesterday, and passed a lump of " congealed blood." His mouth is fore, and he spit a little yesterday. His cough was much less last night.—Let the bark be continued.

8th. The paroxyfm came on, without the cold stage, about seven o'clock, P. M. he sweated much after it. His gums are fore, and he spits more.—Let him take an ounce and a half of castor-oil immediately. After

After its operation, let him continue the bark as before.

9th. Laft Quarter. He had a return of the feverifh heat, fucceeded by fweat, at four o'clock, P. M. yefterday. The caftor-oil procured feveral thin and "white" ftools. — Let him continue the bark to-day. A folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

10th. He was a "little chilly," had flight pains in his limbs, and fweated a little, at the ufual hour of the paroxyfim yefterday. He thinks himfelf much better in every refpect. His cough and expectoration is much better. He had one ftool yefterday.—The bark to be continued.

11th. He had feveral "flimy white" ftools yesterday; and "faint and ftinking" fweats at night. His pulse, skin, and tongue are natural. His cough is easier.—The bark to be continued.

12th. He has been much purged ever fince he took the falts; and had about a dozen white flimy ftools during the night. The paroxyfm returned, but flight, with a fenfe of cold in his back, inftead of the cold ftage. The paroxyfm came on at five, P. M. and continued about three hours. The cough troubles him very little. The fwelling

ling and pain in his throat have nearly vanifhed. Complains much of wind in his ftomach and bowels. Pulfe, tongue, and fkin natural; urine of a high colour during the whole of his diforder.— The bark to be difcontinued. The febrifuge mixture to be taken in the ufual way.—He has been allowed full diet by miftake; but he has not been able to eat any meat.— Sago diet, &c.

13th. Noon. He fays he has had a return of the feverifh heat, terminating in fweat, for the four preceding evenings, except the laft, when no fymptoms whatever returned. He had four ftools of a browner colour yefterday. The complaint in his throat has vanifhed.—The febrifuge mixture to be continued; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

14th. He had three yellowish stools yefterday. He felt a trifling degree of feverish heat last evening; but he passed the night much better than usual. He has had one stool this morning. Appetite does not return.—The febrifuge mixture to be continued.—He perspired a little last night.

15th. The fever has not returned.

16th. New Moon. His appetite is now good. He has not had any return of the feverifh

verish fymptoms. —— The mixture to be continued.—He has about three stools daily.

17th. Pretty well.

18th. Discharged.

First Quarter 24th.—27th. Re-admitted. The folution of falts, with one grain of emetic tartar, to be taken immediately.

28th. A fevere flux, with bleeding piles, are his fymptoms at prefent. He has lived very intemperately fince his difcharge. He fays he has a very "nafty tafte" in his mouth.—Let his piles be fomented occafionally, and fix leeches be applied round the inflamed parts. Let him have the ipecacuan mixture, until it vomits him freely.

Transferred to another practitioner.

CASE CX.

FRANCIS SEMMA. Age 40. Admitted 17th December, 1789.

18th. Cap. mist. ipecac. et tart. emet. donec ciet. vomitus.

19th. He has had attacks of fever, commencing with fevere rigors, for three days fucceffively, with a troublefome cough at night. He vomited much green ftuff yefterday.—The folution of falts, with two grains

grains of emetic tartar, to be taken until he be well purged.

20th. His fkin, tongue, and pulfe are natural; he vomited much flime yefterday, and his ftools have been white and glareous. ——Two purging pills at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.—His cough was particularly troublefome laft night.

21st. The mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken until it shall operate well by vomit.

22d. He vomited nothing but flime; he has had three watery ftools; his cough and the pain in his breaft are not abated.——Let him have the pectoral decoction, and a blifter applied over the pained part. The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time.

23d. The blifter did not allow him to reft laft night; it has difcharged much.—— Let it be kept open.

25th. Noon. He is better, but very weak.——Six ounces of the bark decoction to be taken daily.

26th. His cough is much better.

27th. The bark to be continued.

28th. His head is occasionally giddy; his

cough

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cough still troublesome at night.——A blister to be applied between the shoulders. 30th. Discharged.

CASE CXI.

WILLIAM BARR. Age 51. Admitted 19th October, 1789.

December 8th. He has had returns of a paroxyfm of an intermittent fince the 29th November every fecond day; he had it yefterday from about three o'clock till ten P. M. when a fweat broke out; he has been taking the decoction of bark and fnakeroot.—_Let him have immediately an ounce and a half of caftor-oil.

9th. Laft Quarter. He had three or four ftools yefterday.——The decoction of bark and fnakeroot to be continued.

10th. The paroxyfm returned; the cold ftage was very fevere, the hot ftage more moderate; during the fit he vomited much " bitter and four ftuff."——The decoction to be difcontinued.—He had one ftool during the cold ftage, and two this morning.—— Let him take the mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar, until it fhall operate well by vomit.

11th. The medicine operated both ways 1 copioufly.

copioufly.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; two purging pills at night.—He has confiderable appetite.

12th. He had five ftools during the night; he flept well, and is very eafy this morning; the paroxyfm was extremely flight yefterday.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued; the folution of falts to be taken to-morrow morning.

13th. He has had about nine ftools laft night and this morning; he fays he has not been able to keep his feet warm for a long time, till laft night and this morning.—— The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

14th. The paroxyfm did not return, but he was very thirfty about the ufual period of its recurrence.——The febrifuge mixture to be continued during the day; two purging pills at night; and fix ounces of the infufion of fena in the morning.

15th. Discharged.

31st. He has not returned.

CASE CXII.

ABRAHAM COOK. Age 47. Admitted 28th November, 1789.

December 5th. He was feized with a fever Q 2 yesterday

yefterday about two o'clock, P. M. commencing with fhiverings and tremors, fucceeded by a very fevere hot ftage, which did not terminate in fweat; the paroxyfm lafted about four hours; it has returned this morning, and the hot ftage is now beginning. His hands are very tremulous, and he complains of general pains, particularly in the head and loins. He has not had a ftool thefe three days. ——Let him have immediately the folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar.— The fever has made no change in the venereal running.

6th. He had four large yellow watery ftools yesterday.

7th. The paroxyfm came on about ten o'clock, P. M. it was more fevere, but of a fhorter duration, than the former. He had not any ftools yefterday or to-day; he loft much blood from his yard; he fays the urine ftopped near the root of the yard.——Omit the injection; let him have four grains of calomel and four of extract of jalap in pills at night; and the folution of falts, with one grain of tartar emetic, in the morning.

8th. Seven o'clock, A. M. He had two thin, yellow, very hot ftools laft night.—— After he has taken the folution, let him have the febrifuge mixture in the ufual way.

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9th. Laft Quarter. He had three yellow hot ftools yesterday; the fever did not return; he flept well.

10th. He has had no return of the fever; his gonorrhæa is much better; coftive.—— An ounce of caftor-oil immediately.

12th. Discharged.

CASE CXIII.

BENJAMIN TAYLOR. Age 46. Admitted 5th December, 1789.

6th. He was feized with a fever, commencing with fhiverings, about ten days days ago, and has returns daily without the fhiverings fince that time. He got fome fudorific medicines from the furgeon of the barracks. The fever comes on about ten at night, and lafts about four hours, when it difappears in a warm fweat. His pulfe is quick and fmall; his tongue difcoloured; his fkin hot and dry; his urine high-coloured.— Let him take the folution of falts, with one grain of tartar emetic, until it take effect by ftool.

7th. He had fix or feven yellow, green, and hot ftools, from the medicine yesterday; the fever did not return yesterday evening;

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he has fometimes cold and clammy, fometimes warm fweats; his fkin is not fo hot or fo dry; his tongue lefs difcoloured; his pulfe not fo fmall.——Five grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time, and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.—He fays he was very weak when he was admitted.

8th. He had not any return of the fever last night, but the alternate cold or warm fweats continue.——Let him take two drachms of elixir of vitriol in two pints of water during the day.

9th. Laft Quarter. He had four ftools yefterday; he had no return whatever of fever; the cold and warm fweats returned as ufual at night, "when the fog began to come on." ——The elixir of vitriol to be continued, and one drachm of the powder of bark to be taken every hour.—His tongue is perfectly clean, his pulfe regular, his fkin rather dry and hot.

11th. He had not the least appearance of the fweats last night; and is now in every respect

fpect well.——The ufual quantity of the medicines to be taken to-day. 12th. Difcharged.

CASE CXIV.

JOHN DUCRAW. Age 46. Admitted 28th November, 1789.

December 1st. Says he has had the fever for three weeks, without shiverings, every evening at fix o'clock. Within thefe few days it has come on about nine, P.M. and lafted with exceffive heat about two hours, accompanied by fevere pains in his limbs, back, &c. His skin is rather dry and warm at prefent; his tongue is a little foul; his pulfe is natural; he fays he has had ftools regularly every day, and that the folution of tartar emetic gave him about ten bilious stools .-----The bark to be omitted; let him take four grains of calomel at night, and the folution of falts to-morrow morning in the ufual way .---He fays he made very clear urine when he came in, but now it is of a very high colour.

2d. Full Moon. He has had four ftools entirely bilious. He had the fever as usual last night. He is troubled with uneasy dreams

His fever was confiderably lefs laft night; he has always a bitter tafte in his mouth, and has occafionally had naufea.— Let him have a vomit of ipecacuan and tartar emetic about eight o'clock in the evening.—His pains are greatly relieved.

4th. He had five glareous ftools fince he was vifited yefterday; he had no return of the fever laft night, except a trifling degree of heat; he vomited much green and bitter matter, from which he feels much relief, and fome return of appetite. 

OF A

SUCCESSFUL METHOD OF TREATING DYSENTERY IN BENGAL, &c.

CASE I.

LATHER. Age 23. Admitted 9th January, 1787.

March 2d.

E stands admitted for dyfentery; and I it appears that, on his first feizure, blood frequently accompanied his stools, with fevere griping and ftraining. The two laft fymptoms continue in fome degree, with very frequent, ineffectual, mucous, greafy, white, fmall evacuations, to the number of about forty during the courfe of the twenty-four The calls are most frequent at night. hours. He is greatly reduced and debilitated. The medicines employed latterly were bark and anodyne draughts. Three glaffes of redwine, and middle diet, have been allowed daily; both of which are countermanded, and low diet prescribed. ---- The bark and ano-

dyne

dyne draughts to be difcontinued. A pill of four grains of calomel, and one of opium, to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning, until larger and eafier ftools fhall have been procured.

4th. Full Moon. His griping and ftraining were better during the operation of the purgatives; which, however, have weakened him much. He fays his ftools were watery, and not very offenfive to the fmell.——Two ounces of decoction of bark, with three drops of laudanum, to be taken every hour; and twenty-five drops at bed-time in a draught.

5th. The fame medicines to be repeated; and one glafs of Madeira allowed daily in his drink.

6th. He paffes all his aliment in a perfect ftate of indigeftion. He has complained of this for fome time.—The fame medicines to be continued.

7th. Let him have an emollient clyfter immediately. Two ounces of an infufion of bark in lime-water to be taken thrice every day; and the decoction with laudanum to be difcontinued.

8th. He is worfe to-day, and attributes it to the lime-water infufion, and the want of laudanum. All the medicines he has taken appear to have very little effect on his comx plaints.

plaints. His belly is harder than ufual.— The fimple infufion of bark to be taken, with laudanum, in the fame proportion as the decoction; and the anodyne draught at night.

9th. The infusion to be continued, with double the proportion of laudanum; of which thirty drops may be taken in a draught at night.

10th. By a mistake, middle diet has been continued to this day.— Low diet only to be allowed in future. The medicines to be continued.

11th. His fkin continues very dry, rough, and frequently hot. He is not in any refpect better. — Wine to be difcontinued. Let the infufion of bark in lime-water be given, with the ufual quantity of laudanum, two ounces every hour. Two drachms of foluble tartar to be added to a bottle of the infufion. At his own requeft, let him have a little bread dipped in mutton gravy, perfectly freed from the greafe.

12th. Laft Quarter. The infufion difagrees with his ftomach and bowels.— To be difcontinued. Ten grains of columba-root in powder, with two drops of laudanum, to be taken every two hours.—It feems ipecacuan, and most of the medicines in common use, had been formerly tried in vain.

13th. The rice and barley-waters run R 2 through

through him as foon as fwallowed.——Let him have a flight infufion of toafted rice for his common drink; to a pint and a half of which a fpoonful of brandy may be added, if he chufe. The fimple infufion of bark to be taken, two ounces three times a day.—He requefts to be put on a milk diet.——Milk diet allowed, to which an equal part of limewater is to be added. The infufion of bark to be continued.

14th. He has not benefitted in any fenfible degree by the medicines which have hitherto been prefcribed; except that the griping and ftraining are lefs troublefome. He is much emaciated and weakened.— The columba-root to be difcontinued, but not the infufion. One drachm and a half of ftrong mercurial ointment to be rubbed in on the right hypochonder, and on the belly, every night.

15th. The fame medicines to be continued.

16th. The lime-water difagrees with him in every form.——Boiled milk alone to be his diet.—He refufes to take the infufion of bark, and thinks it makes him worfe.—— To be difcontinued. Ten grains of rhubarb in powder to be taken every three hours, until one ftool, larger and eafier than ufual, be procured. The inunction to be continued.

17th,

17th. Twelve grains of ipecacuan, one of opium, and one of aromatic fpices, to be formed into four pills, and one of them to be taken every four hours during the day .-- He is much better to-day.--- The inunction and pills to be continued.

19th. New Moon. The pills have not been taken as yet .---- Let them be given today. The inunction to be continued.

20th. He is aftonishingly better. Very little griping or straining remains.----Half a drachm of rhubarb, in powder, to be taken immediately; after its operation, the pills to be refumed, and the inunction continued.

21st. He has very little remains of the bowel complaint. He had no ftool laft night, in lieu of twenty and more ; nor had he more than two, and those unattended by griping or straining, during the whole course of yesterday.---- Two of the pills only to be taken during the day. The inunction to be continued.

24th. He remains free from all complaint but weaknefs .---- The pills to be difcontinued. A clyfter to be given whenever he shall not have had a stool during the day.

First Quarter 26th.—29th. His mouth is very fore; his throat fwelled a little. The

The inunction to be difcontinued. Five grains of rhubarb in powder to be taken every two hours, until a ftool fhall have been procured.

31ft. He continues quite free from his bowel complaint, and acquires ftrength daily. He digefts what food he takes well, and has appetite.

He becomes the patient of another practitioner on the first of April.

On the first of the enfuing June I found this patient still in the hospital, and reduced to the last degree of emaciation. I did not enquire what medicines he had taken fince the end of March, when I perceived he had been allowed eight glasses of wine daily; which were sufficient to destroy him, without the interference of medicines. He now refused to take any; and he lingered till the ninth of June, when he expired.

CASE II.

WINDALL. Age 27. Admitted February, 1787.

March 3d. He has been in the hofpital the greater part of February, and ftands admitted for dyfentery. He has been alfo afflicted

flicted with a fevere pain and inflammation in the right eye. He had, and still has, fome griping and straining, with his mucous stools; but he has not, at any period of the complaint, passed blood. He does not seem to have taken any other medicine for the purging than three dofes of rhubarb daily, of five grains each. High diet has been allowed, and three glaffes of Madeira daily. He has not had any feverish fymptoms that he can recollect. His purging is not in the least abated fince his admission .---- The wine is countermanded, and low diet only allowed. The infusion of fena to be taken to-morrow morning, in the ufual manner, until it shall have operated very freely by ftool.

Full Moon 4th.—5th. His evacuations by ftool have been most copious. His purging, griping, and straining are greatly better. — An anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time.

7th. He gets better of his bowel complaints daily, but not of the affection of his eye.—An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning early.

9th. He gets better daily of his purging.

10th. Last Quarter 12th. New Moon 19th. An ounce of castor-oil to be taken immediately.

First Quarter 26th.—29th. He has not had any fymptoms of his bowel complaints fince the 10th, although he has taken mercury fufficient to affect his mouth, for the inflammation in his eye; which continued obstinate, and was deemed to proceed from a venereal taint.

CASE III.

MILLER. Age 32. Admitted 23d February, 1787.

March 2d. He ftands admitted for dyfentery. On his admiffion he took a folution of manna and emetic tartar, which operated both ways. He has fince taken rhubarb in separate doses daily, and anodyne draughts twice. His calls are very frequent, particularly at night, with confiderable fraining, fome griping, but no blood at prefent; they confift chiefly of a little white mucus, fometimes tinged with yellow. He has feverifh fymptoms, generally in the evening. High diet, and three glaffes of red-wine, have been allowed, which are now countermanded, and low diet only allowed .---- Five grains of rhubarb to be taken every four hours to-day; two purging pills at bed-time, and the folution of falts in the morning, until it shall have

have procured copious and eafy evacuations by ftool.

3d. Fifteen drops of laudanum to be taken in a draught at bed-time.

4th. Full Moon. During the whole day yefterday he was much purged by the medicines; and there is the greateft poffible alteration in his complaints. In lieu of the great frequency of calls, he had only two laft night, and those free from uneafines of any kind.—The pills and solution of falts to be repeated.

5th. The anodyne draught to be repeated at bed-time.

6th. He has had again fome fmall mucous ftools, with a little ftraining.——An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

7th. The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day, fo as to operate principally downwards.

9th. He is quite well.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken as before.

10th. Discharged.

CASE

CASE IV.

JONES. Aged 38. Admitted 12th February, 1787.

March 1ft. He ftands admitted for the dyfentery. He has taken falts occafionally, and anodyne draughts frequently. Two and three glaffes of Madeira wine have been allowed daily. He thinks he is rather better than on his admiflion; yet he ftill feels much griping, ftraining at ftool, and his mucous difcharges, which are frequent, are fometimes tinged with blood,——The wine to be difcontinued. The folution of falts to be taken at feparate dofes in the ufual manner, until evening, when the anodyne draught may be repeated.

2d. The folution of falts operated copioufly, and has procured a great abatement of the ftraining and griping. There was not any appearance of blood in the ftools, which chiefly confifted of glaire and vitiated bile. ——Two purging pills to be taken at bedtime; and the infufion in the morning, two ounces every half hour, until it fhall have procured copious and eafy difcharges by ftool.

3d.

3d. He fays he is quite well; and has not felt any of the fymptoms laft night or this morning. His appetite has returned; he has had none for a long time.—— Middle diet to be allowed.

4th. Full Moon. He requefts his difcharge, as he feels quite well. — Difcharged.

CASE V.

BULL. Admitted 8th March, 1787.

9th. He has had for a confiderable time very frequent calls to ftool, with fevere ftraining, accompanied by a degree of fever every evening, and fometimes a regular paroxyfm of an intermittent. His ftools are fmall, mucous, and rather white. He has not the leaft appetite. The difcharges by ftool have fometimes been tinged flightly with blood. —— The folution of emetic tartar to be taken, in fmall and frequent dofes, until it fhall have operated freely by vomit.

10th. He discharged by vomit much fordes of various colours, and afterwards much yellow bile. He is greatly relieved. ——The solution of falts to be taken in the usual

ufual manner, fo as to procure large and eafy ftools, without delay.

11th. He had fewer calls laft night; and was much purged yefterday. He flept better than fince his admiffion.—— An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken immediately.

Evening. The oil has procured two or three pretty large ftools, without ftraining; which, however, has, in a flight degree, returned this evening, with the feverifh fymptoms; thefe too have fomewhat abated.—— Two grains of emetic tartar, and two fcruples of ipecacuan, to be mixed with four ounces of water, and a table-fpoonful to be taken every five minutes, until it fhall have cleared the ftomach well; after which, let him have a draught with twenty drops of laudanum.

12th. Laft Quarter. He difcharged much bitter matters by vomit; and flept more composedly than usual.——The folution of falts to be taken during the day.

13th. His purging and ftraining appear to have left him; but his fever does not diminish in any proportion to the former. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

15th. The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day; three pills at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

16th,

16th. The mixture to be continued.

17th. His difcharges by ftool are ftill offenfive, fometimes hot, and apparently bilious. He has not had a return of the ftraining; but the fever continues to recur with more or lefs feverity.—— The mixture to be continued, with double the proportion of emetic tartar. Two pills at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

18th. New Moon 19th. First Quarter 26th. The mixture to be continued. The pills and oil to be repeated.

30th. He has not had any return of the purging or ftraining; but his fever continues obftinate, notwithftanding the repeated exhibition of emetics, mercurial and other purgatives. The bark was alfo given in confiderable quantities, as the fever put on a tertian form twice, but in vain; as well as two anodyne draughts to check the violence of the paroxyfms. He has been fince the 23d on a courfe of mercury, from a prefumption that the obftinacy of the fever might be the effect of a difeafed liver.

CASE

CASE VI.

J. JONES. Age 41. Admitted 6th February, 1787 ..

March 2d. He stands admitted for dyfentery. At first he took one or two doses of falts, two or three emetics, fome anodyne draughts, and latterly fifteen grains of rhubarb every day. He is rather better than on his admission, but still complains of frequent and unproductive calls to ftool, with griping and straining; his discharges confist of a little mucus or glaire, fometimes tinged with bile, fometimes with blood; he has often a flight degree of feverifhnefs, particularly towards the evening; his calls are more frequent during the night; his tongue is rather foul, and his skin dry. Two glasses of Madeira have been allowed daily, and low diet .----The wine to be difcontinued; two purging pills to be taken at bed-time, and the infufion of fena in the morning, in the ufual way, until large and free difcharges by ftool shall have been procured.

3d. He has had feveral large ftools this morning early, of very fetid, bilious, glareous, greafy matters, of various colour and confiftence.

fistence.——The medicines to be repeated in the fame manner, and at the fame hours.

4th. Full Moon. He was much better all yefterday, and continues much relieved this morning; he has had feveral eafy ftools early, confiderably improved in quality; the gripes have entirely difappeared.——Let him take fifteen grains of rhubarb, in three dofes, during the day.

5th. He has not had any feverifh fymptoms for feveral days, yet his tongue is ftill foul; his nights are eafy; the rhubarb did not produce any confiderable evacuation by ftool; the ftraining recurs occafionally.——An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken immediately; two purging pills at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of caftor-oil again in the morning: let the oil be made up into a draught with peppermint.

8th. The ftraining has not recurred fince the 5th; his pulse is quick this morning, and his skin rather dry; but his tongue is much cleaner.

9th,

9th. He appears free from all complaint at prefent.——The oil to be repeated in the morning; and after its operation two ounces of decoction of bark to be taken three times a day, until further directions.

12th. Last Quarter. Discharged.—Recommended to be excused from duty for two days.

CASE VII.

S. SPEECHLY. Age 30. Admitted 24th February, 1787.

March 2d. He was admitted for fever and dyfentery; the latter commenced with a violent attack of the former, which had left him, however, either before or immediately after his admission. He has occasionally passed much blood, with fevere griping and straining. His stools are fmall, flimy, mucous, or glareous, fometimes mixed with fmall fatty fubstances. He is in general thirsty; his mouth foul, and his fkin dry and rough. He exhibits an appearance of much debility. High diet, and fix glaffes of Madeira, have been hitherto allowed daily .---- The wine is countermanded; and low diet directed to be ftrictly observed. The infusion of sena to be taken in

in separate doses, in the usual manner, during the day; three purging pills at bed-time; and the folution of falts to-morrow morning.

4th. Full Moon. He has experienced great relief from the copious, flimy, very fetid evacuations by ftool .---- Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion of fena in the morning.

5th. His discharges by stool continue large, very hot, and very offenfive. The gripes have vanished. Scarcely any straining remains .---- The febrifuge mixture to be taken during the day.

No tinge of blood appears in his 6th. It feems he has had a pain in his ftools. ftomach fince the commencement of his diforder, which has nearly left him now. The purging and ftraining have not entirely vanished. His skin is cool and open.----Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

7th. The medicines have purged off much white, flimy, fetid matters. He flept well laft night, and had fewer calls than ufual. His tongue is still a little foul.---- The febrifuge mixture to be continued.

8th. He was three times only at ftool during the night; but he had a little griping, and no ftraining. In every other refpect he thinks S himfelf

himfelf quite well.——The mixture to be continued; and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning.

12th. Laft Quarter. Difcharged.—— Recommended to an exemption from duty for two days.

New Moon 19th.—30th. He returned on the 21ft, with gonorrhæa, cough, and fever; but has not relapfed into the dyfentery.

CASE VIII.

FOSTER. Age 29. Admitted 24th February, 1787.

March 2d. He ftands admitted for dyfentery; nor does it appear that he has taken any other medicine than chalk julep every day, and an anodyne draught every night. High diet, and fix glaffes of wine, have been allowed daily. He has a confiderable degree of feverifh heat on him in general, as well as conftant thirft. His pulfe is quick and intermitting, and he is much troubled with palpitations of the heart. The flux is particularly troublefome

troublefome at night. He fays his calls are innumerable during the twenty-four hours; and often accompanied with fmall difcharges of blood, griping, and ftraining. He is much afflicted with the piles; and feels greatly debilitated.——To be ftrictly confined to a low diet, and the wine difcontinued. The infufion of fena to be taken in the ufual manner, until it fhall have procured large and eafier ftools. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

3d. He complains to-day of a gnawing pain at the pit of the ftomach, or more properly about the navel.——The folution to be continued during the day.

4th. Full Moon. He paffed, yefterday and the day before, an aftonifhing quantity of putrid and bilious matters. The feverifhnefs was more confiderable yefterday; but he is much better in every refpect to-day. He complains of great weaknefs, but flept well laft night; and had very few calls to ftool. At prefent he is free from feverifh fymptoms. —Two ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken four times a day, until countermanded.

5th. His health continues to improve. The decoction runs off by ftool. He has fome S 2 appetite.

appetite. The gripes are ftill troublefome occafionally.——An anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time.

6th. His pulfe continues to intermit. The palpitations have decreafed. The griping is much leffened. He had no call to ftool laft night.——The decoction to be difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

8th. The medicines have purged him violently, which, he fays, has made him worfe. The pain about the navel recurred yefterday, particularly at ftool. The griping, however, is much better. He feems much debilitated——Two ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken three times a day. Two grains of opium to be diffolved in a common clyfter, without the falt, and given at bedtime.

10th. He has complained of heat, particularly at night, which he attributes to the total fupprefiion of his purging. In other refpects he is free from complaint.——An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken immediately.

of decoction which he takes daily. An antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at bedtime.

12th. Laft Quarter. He continues free from all complaint, but that of debility. His appetite is pretty confiderable. He was, however, rather reftlefs laft night; and he fays he could never fleep after an opiate. He is directed to be fent to the barracks for three or four days, for a change of air, exempted from duty, and defired to return on the flighteft fymptoms of a relapfe.

30th. He has not returned to the hofpital.

CASE IX.

LE TELLIER. Age 36. Admitted 5th March, 1787.

5th. He complains of excruciating gripings; and paffes great quantities of blood by ftool. His difcharges are intolerably fetid.——An ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken immediately.

Evening.

Evening. He is not better.—A clyfter to be immediately exhibited.

7th. He has had further difcharges of the fame kind; but is not much relieved.—An anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time.

Evening. His ftools during the day have been much the fame as ufual, from the purgatives.——The anodyne is countermanded. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

8th. He is confiderably better, and paffes much lefs blood. He appears exhaufted with the feverity of the pains in his bowels. —Let him take a little panada or fago frequently. His belly to be fomented whenever he complains much of pain. A clyfter to be given at bed-time; and after its operation thirty-five drops of laudanum in a draught.

9th. He paffed the night better than ufually.—The clyfter and draught to be repeated at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken early the enfuing morning.

10th. He does not feem to be any better to-day, nor did he pafs an eafy night. The gripings are very fevere, and blood accompanies the ftools ftill; fome clots of it have alfo paffed with the urine.——The infufion of mindee to be drank daily, to the amount of

of one pint. The clyfter and anodyne draught to be repeated at bed-time.

11th. All the fymptoms appear to be worfe. He paffed a very bad night.— Three or four clyfters to be exhibited during the day. A table fpoonful of the mixture of ipecacuan and emetic tartar to be taken every five minutes, until it shall have operated plentifully by vomit. The femicupium to be used twice or thrice, as occasion may require. An attendant to be allowed. Three purging pills, with a grain and a half of opium in them, to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of castor-oil in the morning.

12th. Laft Quarter. He has had large putrid, bilious ftools, with glaire and mucus, but with lefs blood. He feels much relieved, though greatly debilitated.—Let him have a little panada, with fugar, lime-juice, and wine, whenever he may choofe to call for it. —The pains in his bowels have abated.— The fomentation to be continued. The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts to be taken in the ufual way, the enfuing morning,

13th. An ounce and a half of powder of bark, with a grain of opium, to be mixed with two pints of water; and three ounces of the mixture to be taken every three hours.

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An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning. Two glaffes of Madeira to be allowed in his rice-water.

14th. The mixture to be continued. Five grains of calomel, with one and a half of opium, to be taken at bed-time; the folution of falts in the morning, and, after the first ftools, the mixture again.

15th. He is much relieved by the copious ftools, and paffes no blood.—Only four ounces of the mixture to be taken four times a day; thirty drops of laudanum at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

16th. He complains of pain and difficulty in paffing his urine: in other refpects he is much better.—A little nitre to be mixed in all his common drink. The mixture to be continued; the anodyne taken at night, after the operation of a clyfter. Wine to be difcontinued.

17th. The mixture to be difcontinued.— He fays it heats him, and prevents the evacuations that give him most ease.—The folution of falts to be taken immediately. To be allowed tamarind-water, at his own request.

Evening. He has paffed much black, fetid, bloody matters by ftool. The gripes have been very fevere.—Four ounces of the decoction

coction of bark, with three drops of laudanum, to be taken every hour during the night, should he be awake.

18th. The folution of falts to be taken immediately, till one copious motion be procured. A grain and a half of calomel, two of ipecacuan, and one of opium, to be taken in form of pill every night. The folution of falts again in the morning,

19th. New Moon. He is greatly better in every refpect. The pill excited much naufea last night.——To be difcontinued. Two grains of opium made into pills, with fix of calomel, to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of castor-oil the ensuing morning, in two doses.

20th. His ftools are large, with very little griping, and no blood. He flept better laft night.——Three ounces of the decoction of bark to be taken three times daily. The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts taken in the morning.

21ft. He is remarkably well to-day. The gripes have not recurred. He flept well, and had not a fingle call to ftool during the whole night.——The pills to be repeated at bedtime; and fix drachms of caftor-oil taken in the morning.

22d. He has passed a very easy night, and

and is free from all complaint, but weaknefs at prefent.

23d. His mouth is rather tender.——An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken immediately; thirty drops of laudanum at bed-time, in a draught, with twenty of antimonial wine; and the folution of falts in the morning. The pills to be difcontinued.

24th. Contrary to the diet prefcribed, he ate yefterday mutton-broth, with leeks, and other greens. He is much griped to-day, and paffes fome blood.——The pills to be taken at bed-time; and the folution of falts in the morning.

25th. His mouth is very fore, and he fpits confiderably; in other refpects he is free from complaint this morning.——An aftringent gargle to be used.

First Quarter 26th.—27th. He continues quite well of his bowel complaints. His appetite encreases daily.——To be allowed a chicken for his dinner daily, and two glasses of Madeira in his rice-water.

30th. He continues perfectly free from all complaint, but requefts to be permitted to remain in the hofpital, until he shall have acquired more strength.

CASE X.

MELCALF. Age 28. Admitted 13th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He ftands admitted for dyfentery and piles. He has had feveral remedies, principally anodyne draughts, fince his admiffion, with very little diminution of the former complaint, but with fome relief to the latter. He has been allowed three glaffes of Madeira, and middle diet. The blood feems chiefly to come from the piles. — Wine to be difcontinued, and low diet prefcribed. His former medicines to be alfo difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d. The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time; and the oil repeated in the morning.

3d. His evacuations yefterday were large, eafy, and extremely fetid; they have afforded him great relief, and he thinks he is quite well, except the piles, which are not troublefome. — The pills to be repeated at bed-time; and eight ounces of the infufion of fena to be taken in the morning, in feparate dofes.

4th. He perfifts in faying he is quite well.——Ten grains of the mafs of laxative mercurial pill, with two grains of opium, to be taken at bed-time, and repeated every night.

5th. He has continued free from his bowel complaints, and his piles have not troubled him these three days; yet from the general appearance there is room to suspect a slight affection of the liver. At his own request, however, he is discharged.

30th. He has not experienced a relapfe.

CASE XI.

STILEY. Age 24. Admitted 22d April, 1787.

June 1ft. He ftands admitted for dyfentery, and has taken many medicines which have given him confiderable relief. His calls are frequent and painful, with a little blood occafionally. He complains of thirft and heat fometimes. He is not much reduced. —Wine and middle diet to be difcontinued, and low diet allowed. His former medicines to be difcontinued. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and fix drachms of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d.

2d. He has had already very extraordinary large, offenfive evacuations; from which, he fays, he feels great relief.——The pills and oil to be repeated.

3d. He is quite eafy in every refpect; and has not had any calls but fuch as were procured by the medicine. —— The pills to be repeated; and the folution of falts to be taken in the morning.

5th. He fays he is quite well, and requefts his difcharge. — Difcharged. Recommended to be exempted from duty for two days.

30th. He has not experienced a relapfe.

CASE XII.

HORNER. Age 28. Admitted 4th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He ftands admitted for dyfentery. Before the flux appeared he had taken large quantities of bark, for the cure of a tertian fever, without any previous evacuations by ftool. He has taken many of the ufual medicines for the flux fince his admiffion, but with very little benefit. He complains of pain in the left fide, and in the right fhoulder, but not in the region of the liver.

liver.—— His former medicines and wine tobe difcontinued.—He is much reduced and debilitated.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

2d. Thirty drops of laudanum, and half a grain of emetic tartar, to be taken in a draught at bed-time.

3d. His evacuations by ftool have afforded him fome relief. — Milk diet to be allowed, at his requeft. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the caftor-oil in the morning.

4th. The pills, he fays, gripe him very much; but the ftraining is greatly better, and he paffes no blood; his calls too are lefs frequent.——Eight grains of the mafs of laxative mercurial pill, and half a grain of opium, to be taken, in two pills, every night.

6th. He continues to get better.——Six drachms of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning.

7th. His calls are ftill very frequent; but the griping and ftraining have entirely vanifhed, except a little griping from the pills. ——Half a grain of opium to be added to the pills.

9th. The medicines have operated well, and without gripes or ftraining. —— The former pills to be continued as ufual.

10th. He paffed a very reftlefs night; and had many ineffectual calls, with griping and ftraining. He voided brown, glareous matter, with a little blood. He ftill feels the pain in the right fhoulder, but none in the left fide. — Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion of fena in the morning, fix ounces in two dofes.

11th. The griping is much diminifhed, and the ftraining entirely gone. He now complains of pain in both his fhoulder-blades. The former pills with opium were difcontinued laft night.——Six grains of the mafs of mercurial laxative pill to be taken every night.

12th. He had frequent calls laft night, with griping, which he attributes to the pills.— In lieu of thefe, three grains of calomel, one of opium, and a fixth of a grain of emetic tartar, to be made into a pill, and taken every night. An ounce of caftor-oil to be taken to-morrow morning.

13th. He is greatly better this morning, and

and paffed an eafy night, with very few calls, and without griping or ftraining.

14th. He is better every day.——Eight ounces of the folution of falts to be taken in the morning in feparate doses.

15th. New Moon. He continues quite free from the straining and griping; and has no purging, except from the purgatives.—— Eight ounces of decoction of bark, with half a drachm of elixir of vitriol, to be taken daily in feparate doses.

17th. He complains of acute pain in the bowels, which he attributes to the medicine; and which deprived him of reft laft night, ——His belly to be fomented feveral times during the day. The antimonial anodyne draught to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning. The pill to be difcontinued.

18th. The draught procured him eafe the whole night.——To be repeated at bed-time; and four ounces of infufion of fena to be taken in the morning. His mouth is fomewhat fore.

19th. The draught to be repeated.

20th. He continues free from his bowel complaints; but feels the pain in his right fhoulder ftill. —— Six ounces of the laxative bitter infufion to be taken daily. — He is troubled

troubled with a fullness about the ftomach occasionally.——The draught to be continued; and one glass of wine to be allowed, diluted with an equal quantity of water.

First Quarter 22d.—23d. He was much purged and griped during the night; he attributes these effects to the bitters.— Let the bitters be made with less of the laxative ingredient. The draught to be difcontinued.—His mouth is free from foreness.—Six grains of the mass of laxative mercurial pill, and one of opium, in pill, to be taken every night.

24th. He had feveral calls laft night, with ftraining, in a flight degree.—A clyfter of rice-water, with three grains of opium, ftrained, to be given at bed-time.

withstanding the evacuations by medicine. ——It is recommended that he be kept in a gentle spitting for some time longer. The bitters to be continued.

CASE XIII.

DAGHERTY. Age 36. Admitted 26th May, 1787.

June 1ft. He ftands admitted for dyfentery, of which he ftill has the general fymptoms. His calls are very frequent. He had the diforder a very confiderable time before his application for admiffion. He does not think he has received much benefit from the medicines which have been preferibed. His nights are particularly reftlefs. He has had anodyne draughts every night, which he fays give him much eafe.——The draught to be repeated, as ufual; and an ounce of caftor-oil to be taken in the morning.

2d. The draught to be repeated.

3d. The oil operated freely, and has afforded him much relief. — Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and the oil repeated in the morning. The draught to be difcontinued, as it appears rather to encrease the feverish heat at night.

4th. The antimonial anodyne draught to be

4th. He had only three or four ftools during the last twenty-four hours.

2d. First Quarter. The Madeira to be reduced from five to two glasses. The mixture of ipecacuan and tartar emetic to be taken, until it shall excite copious vomiting.

Evening. He vomited feveral times, and difcharged "a quantity of red ftuff, very four."

3d. He has only had one ftool fince the vomit. He feems to have been much debilitated.—One grain of ipecacuan to be taken every three hours.

Evening. He has taken three of the powders, which feem to have occasioned a stool

4th. The ipecacuan to be continued. Three grains of calomel to be taken at bedtime; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

JAMES WILLIAMS. Age 44. Admitted 24th May, 1789.

New Moon 24th—25th. He has had a flux for four months. He paffes blood, with griping, and fometimes with ftraining. His calls are from twelve to twenty-four during the day and night. He was in the hofpital the month before laft for flux; which, he fays,

" fwelled and blowed" much, and evacuated much wind.——A pill, of five grains of calomel and one of affafœtida, to be taken at bed-time; and two ounces of caftor-oil in the morning.

30th. He is better.—One grain and a half of affafætida to be taken at bed-time.

31ft. First Quarter. A pill, of four grains of calomel and two of affafætida, to be taken at bed-time; and two ounces of castoroil, with aqua menthæ spirituosa, in the morning.— He continues to get better in every respect, and becomes the patient of another practitioner.

BENJAMIN REBEA. Admitted 13th May, 1789.

14th. He complains of bloody ftools and griping. He fays his complaints generally commence with a difcharge of blood from his lungs, which ftops, and is fucceeded by the bloody ftools. He has had a cough, and occafional difcharge from the lungs, for fix years. His difficulty of breathing is fuch after exercife, as to make him fall down fuddenly fometimes. 12th. He did not reft well laft night, and was thirfty; but is well in every other refpect. ——Three grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time; and the infufion in the morning.

13th. Discharged.

S. SPIRES. Age 46. Admitted 5th December, 1789.

6th. He complains of fevere purging and griping, with much thirft. His fkin is hot and dry; his pulfe quick and finall. — Two ounces of caftor-oil to be taken immediately.

7th. The oil operated well about four times. He has had two ftools this morning without griping, and with very little ftraining.—Five grains of calomel to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce of caftor-oil in the morning.

4th. He has had feven returns of the paroxyfm of an ague every fecond day; latterly the cold ftage has been trifling, but the hot ftage fevere; he has a cough likewife.—— The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken in the ufual manner.

5th.

5th. The cold and hot stages returned at noon yesterday. The medicine has operated much both ways.——Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of castor-oil in the morning.

6th. He had a very flight attack of the paroxyfm yefterday afternoon. —— Let the pills be repeated at bed-time; and the folution of falts, with one grain of tartar emetic, in the morning.

7th. Laft Quarter. The fever returned flightly, without the cold ftage, yefterday. —The febrifuge mixture to be taken.— He has had four ftools this morning.

8th. The paroxyfm ufed to return every fecond day; he has now a very flight attack daily. He had feveral ftools yefterday.—— Let him take the emetic mixture, until he vomits.—His urine is not of high colour.—— Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and two ounces of caftor-oil in the morning.

9th. He fays he had about thirty ftools during the laft twenty-four hours. That his urine becomes rather of high colour fome time after he takes the medicines. He vomited very little. The fever returned for about two hours yesterday afternoon.—— The febrifuge mixture to be taken.

10th. He has had about feven stools fince yesterday.

yefterday. No fymptoms whatever of fever have recurred. —— Continue the mixture. Two purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and an ounce and a half of caftor-oil in the morning.

11th. The fever has not returned.
Continue the mixture.

[CASE CXIX.* FEVER.]

ROBERT ROSS. Age 52. Admitted 12th March, 1790.

13th. He has had, for five days paft, feveral attacks each day of cold fhivering, followed by heat, and occafionally attended with cold fweat on the head; he complains alfo of fevere pain in the head, back, and between the fhoulders. He is very coftive. Pulfe rather flow and fmall; fkin preternaturally warm and dry; tongue white; urine " as yellow as faffron."——The folution of falts, with two grains of emetic tartar, to be taken until it fhall have operated well.

14th. He vomited much all yesterday matter " as green as verjuice." He was much purged all night, and passed much black stuff.——The febrifuge mixture to be taken in half the usual proportions.—Preffure in the region of the liver gave him sudden and great pain. His tongue is rather white; his pulse rather full, and not quick.

15th. New Moon. Three purging pills to be taken at bed-time; and two ounces of

caftor-oil in the morning. Three drachms of mercurial ointment to be rubbed into his right fide to-night.

16th. Pulfe rather quick and fmart, not full; tongue pretty clean; fkin cool and moift. He fays he has fweated much, and has been occafionally a little delirious. Pain in breathing. Pain ftill, on preffure, in the right fide.——Two drachms of mercurial ointment to be rubbed in at different times during the courfe of the day.

17th. He had three or four yellow offenfive ftools yefterday, and feels better. His fide is eafier. — Two drachms of mercurial ointment to be used during the day. The febrifuge mixture to be taken in the usual way, but not fo as to operate by vomit.

18th. An eruption appears on his lips; his pulfe is rather weak, but in other refpects natural; his fkin natural; tongue rather white ftill. He dozes much, and talks incoherently occafionally. — Two or three fpoonsfull of panada, without wine, to be taken every two hours. Two drachms of mercurial ointment to be rubbed in.—He has had two ftools this morning.

19th. Two ounces of caftor-oil to be taken as foon as he awakes.—During fleep his pulfe is equal and full, his fkin warm.

20th.

20th. Two drachins of mercurial ointment to be rubbed in during the day. The febrifuge mixture to be taken, fo as to operate downwards only .- He appears confiderably better.

21ft. The fame medicines to be repeated to-day.

22d. The febrifuge mixture to be taken.

23d. First Quarter. He fays he has not had any fever thefe two days; but that his head is very heavy. His tongue is clean. He takes the febrifuge mixture daily .---- Let it be continued .- His gums are a little fore. ——Omit the mercury.

24th. He was feverifh yesterday, and the heaviness of his head was very great. He fays what he drank paffed through him immediately. His tongue is cleaner; his skin not fo cool; his pulse rather quick. ---- Omit the mixture, &c. to-day. To-morrow morning an ounce and a half of caftor-oil to be taken.

From this date he became the patient of another practitioner.
