Constitution and Rules

OF THE

AYR TRAINED NURSING ASSOCIATION.

1. The Committee consists of 16 Members—which includes President, Vice-President, and Hon. Secretary.
2. One Member of Committee takes a general superintendence of the work of the Association during each month, and the Committee meet at the Nurse's house once a month to transact the ordinary business, examine the accounts, hear the reports from the Lady Visitor and Nurse, &c., &c.
3. All Doctors are asked to let the Nurse know when they have a poor case where her services would be useful, and any one is at liberty to apply, through one of the Members of Committee, on behalf of any case believed to be suitable for the attendance of the Nurse, and it will be given after proper enquiries are made.
4. In the case of applicants not recommended by any one, it is considered best that the Nurse should see the case, and then consult with her Superintendent.
5. Patients suitable for the Convalescent Home to be seen by the Lady Superintendent for the month, so that all particulars regarding the case may be reported to the following meeting of Committee.
6. Care to be taken by the Nurse that relief is given to the sick alone—not to those who are only needy.
7. As several of the Doctors in Ayr have intimated their willingness to be called on to visit any of the patients needing more than ordinary care, the Nurse can of herself, or through the Lady Superintendent for the month, ask any of these gentlemen to give their services when required.
8. The relief given by the Nurse is to be entirely in food, or medicine of a simple kind, not in money, unless that be given to assist special cases, in which event the person so assisted must be informed that that kind of help does not come from the Association, but from a private source.
9. All money and comforts given to the Nurse for special cases to be notified by her to the Committee, who are quite willing that the wishes of the donors should be carried out. These special sums will be mentioned in the Annual Report, but without names or details.
10. All the work of the Nurse to be open to the Committee.
11. The Nurse to meet with the Lady Superintendent of the month, once or twice a week, and consider all the new cases.
12. It is not considered desirable that the Lady Superintendent should give any money while visiting along with the Nurse. It is enough for her to sanction relief from the funds.
13. Any one asking the services of the Nurse for a poor patient, must do so in writing, or by filling up a printed form of application. Any one interested in the poor can have a few of these forms from the Secretary, or any Member of Committee.
14. The Nurse, on receiving an application, will either attend to it as soon as possible, or bring it before her monthly Superintendent. All the month's applications will be on the table at the monthly meeting.
15. The Nurse is to give no wine or spirits of any kind.
16. The Nurse is to receive three months' notice from the Committee, or to give the same if she should wish to resign her situation.

REPORT OF THE WORKING COMMITTEE.

TWENTY-ONE years have now elapsed since the work of trained nursing of the sick poor was begun in Ayr, and every year proves more conclusively how necessary this work is. The expenses have risen from £145 to £242, but so ready has been the response to appeals that the Committee have always been able to provide not only all necessary expenditure, but to supply help and comfort of every kind, without which nursing is of little use. The services of the nurse have been so much appreciated and so eagerly sought after, that the Committee are considering the propriety of adding another nurse instead of the young assistant, whose services have, however, been found most useful. This would mean additional expense, including a larger house; and although there is a considerable balance in hand, the financial statement for last year shows that the expenditure exceeded the ordinary income by nearly £11. Several friends, however, interested in the work, and realizing the necessity for extending it, have kindly offered to increase their subscriptions in the event of the addition being made; and the Committee will gladly undertake the increased work if encouraged by an assurance that sufficient funds will be supplied.

The Committee would beg to thank the many kind friends who have been so generous during the past year in supplying them with so many necessaries—money for special cases, old and new clothing and old linen, food and medicine, and nursing appliances; and to the doctors in town, to Ayr and Glasgow hospitals and infirmaries, and Ochiltree and Dundonald Convalescent Homes. They would specially express their thankfulness to Ayr Hospital, which readily receives all their patients.

Also to the Ayr papers, which publish their monthly notice of gifts and work; to the collectors in the different churches, and to Mr. Kilpatrick, auditor.

The Committee regret to have lost two of their most useful and interested members, Miss L. MacInnes and Miss Rowand—now Mrs. Murray of Troon—both of whom have left Ayr. Their places have been taken by Miss Leck, Hollybush, and Mrs. Ker, 21 Park Circus. There are no other changes in the Committees.

The patients in book at November, 1894, numbered 53. New cases during the year, 426—viz., 106 men, 241 women, and 79 children.

The visits paid by Nurse M'Callum were 4219.

99 cases were treated by her at her own house—viz., 20 men, 59 women, and 20 children.

40 patients were sent to Ayr Hospital, and 73 applicants were supplied with hospital lines.

73 cases were sent to Ochiltree Convalescent Home, many of these not being patients, but merely clothed, if necessary, and arranged for by Nurse M'Callum.

2 children were sent to Dundonald Convalescent Home, by permission of the Hon. Mrs. Vernon.

4 children were sent to Quarrier's Homes, and 1 patient to Saltcoats Convalescent Home.

3 patients were sent to Glasgow for surgical appliances; 4 to Western Infirmary.

12 were attended by Dr. Beatson, Glasgow, and 2 were boarded in a Nursing Home for treatment.

There were 57 deaths.

The average number of new patients each month was 40.

The visits paid by the monthly Lady Superintendents numbered 615.

The patients in book at November, 1895, were 56.

The financial statement submitted by Miss Davidson, Treasurer, is again satisfactory.

The income, including balance from last year of £317 7s. 9d., is £577 13s. 4d., and the expenditure £248 14s. 11½d., leaving a credit balance of £328 18s. 4½d. This includes a legacy of £25, less legacy duty of £2 10s., from the late Miss Bone, Academy Street, Ayr.

£48 7s. 7d. was received from friends interested in special cases. This item is not included in the Treasurer's financial statement.

It may be desirable to know who are entitled to the free services of the Nurse. Her work is to nurse the sick poor in

their own houses, entirely free of charge.
