I am directed by Sir Matthew Ridley to inform you that the Secretary of State for War has requested to be furnished with the names of all criminal lunatics confined in Asylums other than Broadmoor who are known to be in receipt of Army Pensions, and with details of the cost of their maintenance, the value of the work which they have respectively performed during the year ended the 31st March, 1896, and the addresses of their wives or other dependent relatives. Sir Matthew Ridley understands that the object of this enquiry is to determine with reference to section 7 (2) of the Superannuation Act, 1887, whether any portion of the lunatics' pensions will be available for issue to their relatives. The records in the possession of this Department are insufficient to furnish the desired information, and I am to request that you will be so good as to state whether you have any Criminal Lunatic confined in your Asylum who is an Army Pensioner, and if you have any such patient, to furnish the Secretary of State for War with the desired information concerning him. The reply should be addressed directly to the War Office, and should you have no such patient confined in your Asylum, it is requested that the War Office may be so informed.

I am also to request that in the event of any criminal lunatic who is an Army Pensioner being sent to your Asylum hereafter, the fact may be reported to the War Office.
