Visited 22nd November. 1884.

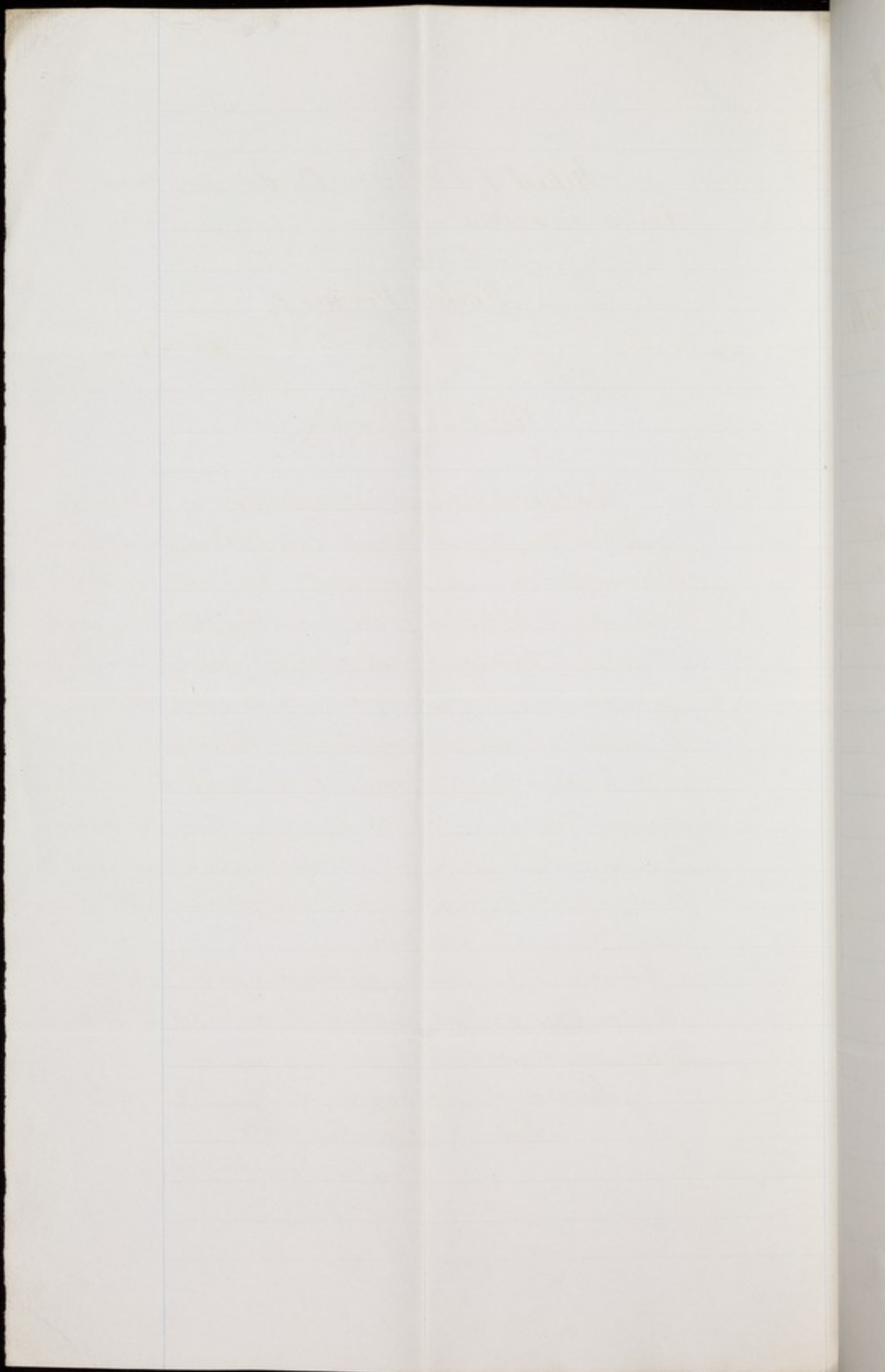
This Patient although only recently found insane by
Inquisition has been an Inmate of the Retreat for 16 years. —
His mind is in a very rapid state. — He stands motionless in
one position with his eyes closed and although able to answer
a question rationally when it is pressed on him seems to have
difficulty in rousing himself to make the effort. He cannot
be induced to read or occupy himself. He is thin — in rather
feeble health and labours under Scouris which must cause
him some irritation. — Should his means allow of it some
specialist in skin diseases might endeavour to relieve the
Scouris and in doing so might perhaps at the same time
improve his general condition

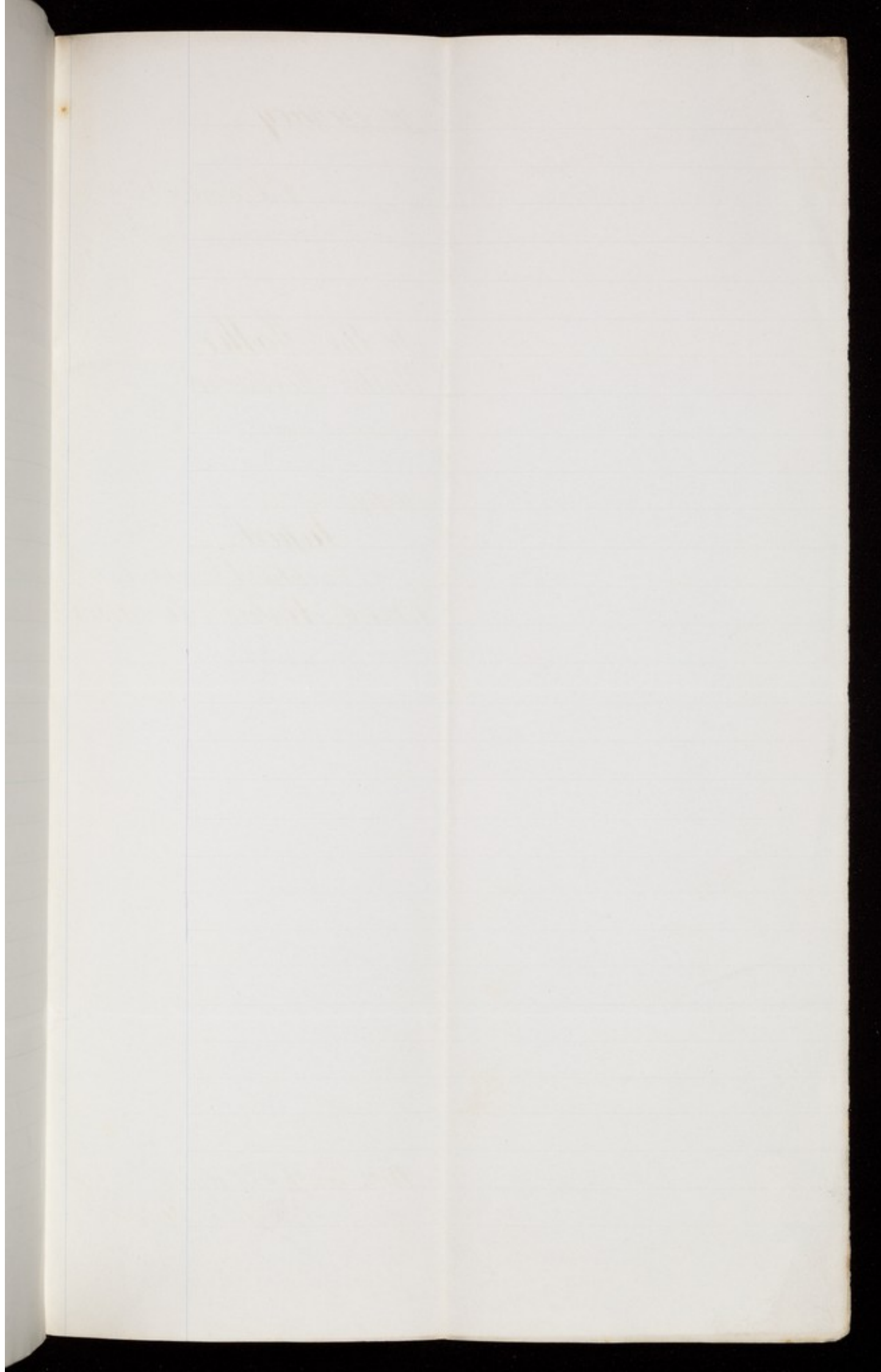
His attendant should be instructed to pay a little more
