MR. JUSTICE

In the Matter of George Hall Palmer  
a person alleged to be of unsound mind

---

Let all parties concerned attend <sup>the Master in Chambers at the</sup> at the Chambers of Mr. Justice  
Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, on Friday, the 12<sup>th</sup> day  
of January 1900, at 11 — of the clock in the fore noon, on  
the hearing of an application on the part of ~~the~~ Alice Palmer of  
Hayton near East Retford in the County of  
Notts the Wife of the <sup>late</sup> George Hall Palmer.

1. That James William Hainsworth of Doncaster in the County of York Manager of the Yorkshire Banking Company at Doncaster aforesaid may upon giving security be appointed to act as Receiver of the Estate of the said George Hall Palmer and that he may be allowed such reasonable sum as the Master may fix for his remuneration in carrying out the duties of such Receiver & in the receipt & application of the income of the said George Hall Palmer.
2. That until further order the sum of £120- per annum may be allowed for the maintenance care clothing & other necessities of the said George Hall Palmer at the Retreat at York in the County of York (where he has remained since the year 1893

and now is) and that such allowance may commence from the 3<sup>d</sup> day of March & be payable to such Receiver out of the income of the Trust funds to which the said George Hall Palmer is entitled under the respective Wills of Sarah Hall & of George Hall & of W<sup>m</sup> Henry Palmer the Father of the said George Hall Palmer

3. That the said Receiver may be directed to receive the amount of the said Trust funds under the Wills of the said Sarah<sup>Hall</sup> and George Hall from Daniel May the present Trustee of the Will of the said Sarah Hall and from John Barnard Lee and the said Daniel May the present Trustees of the Will of the said William Henry Palmer who was the surviving Trustee of the Will of the said George Hall and upon receipt thereof to invest so much of the same as may be found convenient in Consols or in some other suitable Trustees investment as the Master may direct.
4. That the proper costs charges & expenses of the Applicant of incidental to and consequent upon the application may be provided for.
5. And for such further directions and



enquiries as the Master may consider necessary
