Under deep feelings of gratitude to Anne who has been pleased to restore me so far from a state of weakness & Suffering, of late, I now write to thank thee for they truly interesting letter of date 16th 5thmo. - Zec? here on 26th 5thmo. with £5c. for which I do knost gratifully thank thee & the other downs of the Seem. Please Zeturn to them all my warmest and host gratiful thanks, in the love of Him Who graciously Continues to My Sun and Strieb, fulfilling to me His promise "When passing through the waters I will be with thee"

Shortly after withing to thee last, about the time of my Spring Vacation, by Some Sudden change from warmth to exposure to Cot I con tracted fever and was thereby brought very low indeed. I was three weeks Confished to bed under Medical treatment and three weeks longer Confished to the inside of my known. My cough through, was distressing, Causing sof sheepless nights. The Spring here continued intensely coto till very lately, but since the weather became warm I feel much relieved from Cough and letter otherwise, this I still feel sum weathers as yet, as I was teduced to much weathers be before I began to treover.
