Ferrand.

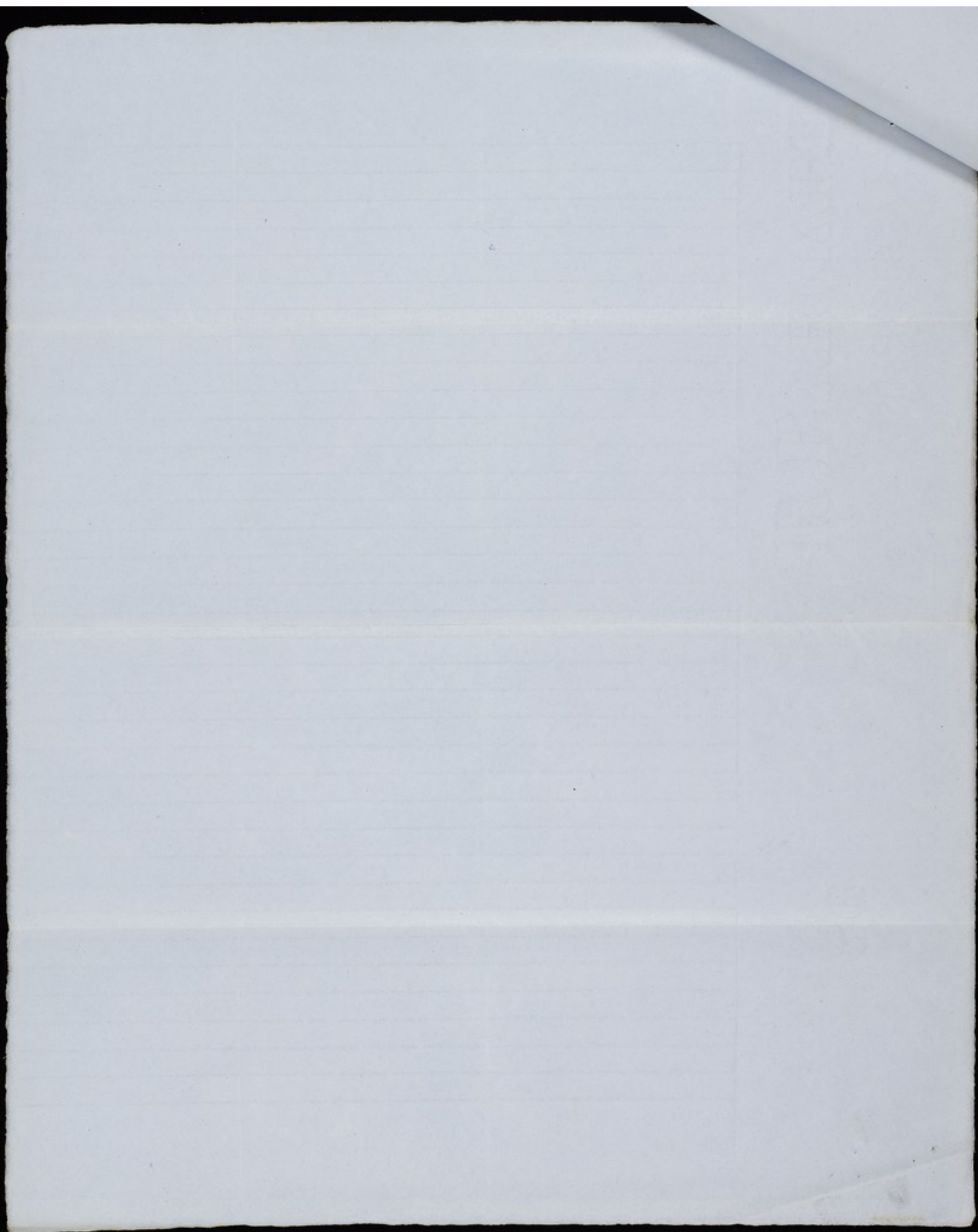

of London, within seven days  
of the date receipt of this present notice  
dated this 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1884

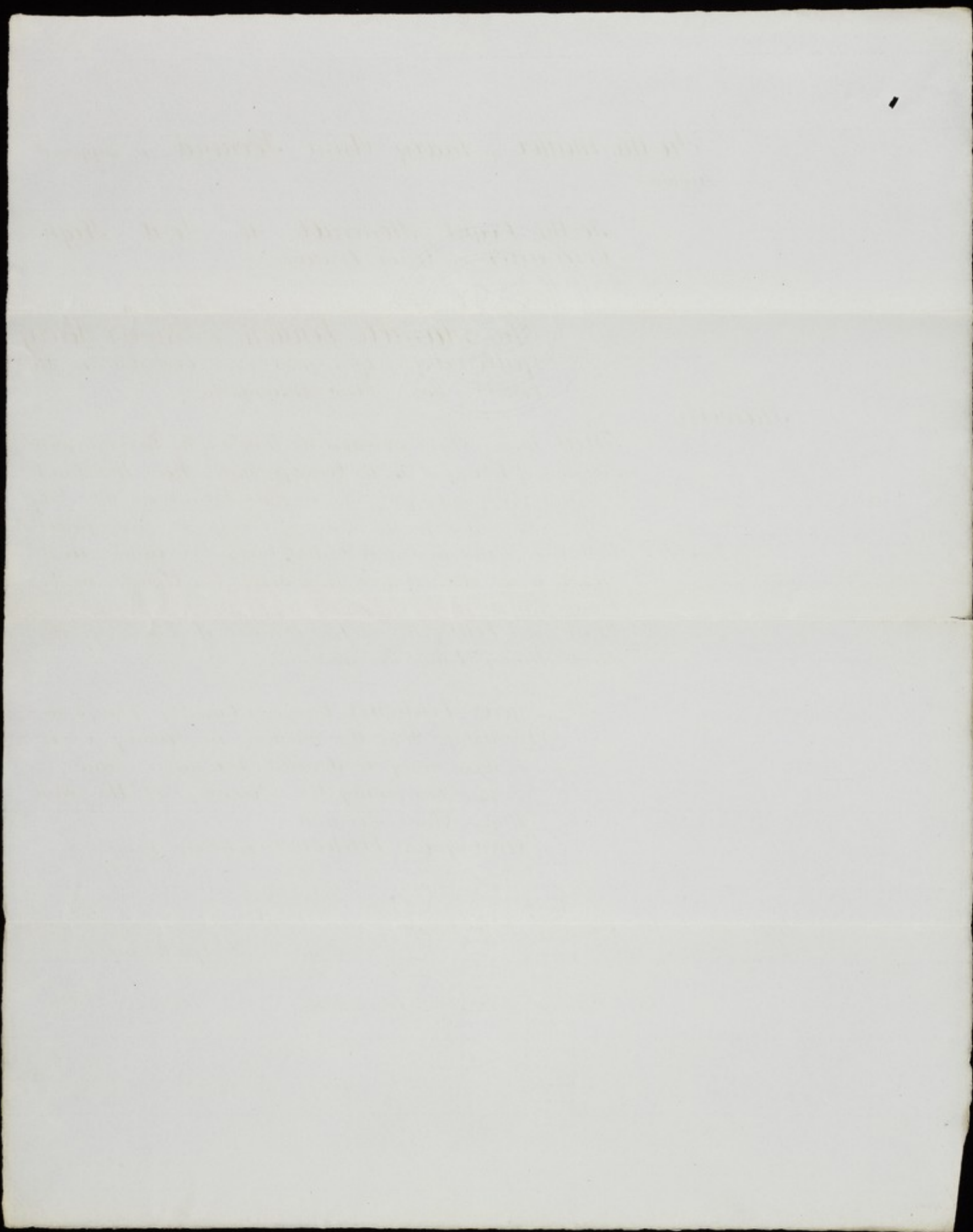

And your Petitioner will ever pray &c.

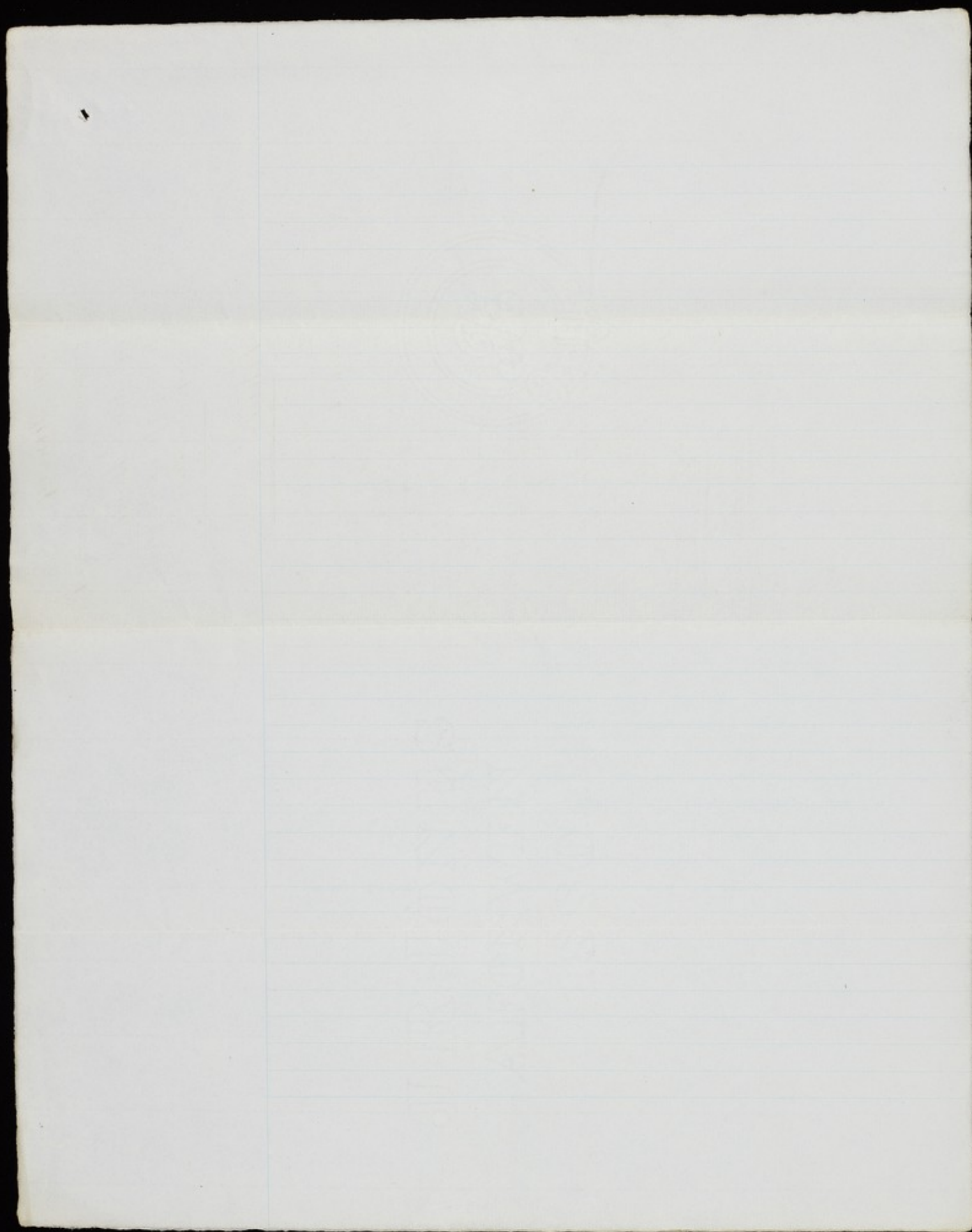

To Mrs Mary Anne Bernard  
State Notice That a Petition  
of which a copy is within under  
leave the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December  
1853 presented to the Lord Chancellor  
and that in pursuance thereof a  
order may be made on the a  
ground of your being of unsound  
mind and incapable of managing  
your effects for the purpose of  
redeeming your property or the  
income thereof available for the  
maintenance or support of yourself  
and your family and that if  
you intend to object to such a  
order being made notice of such  
objection must be signed by you  
and attested by your solicitor and  
filed at the office of the Masters  
in January the next before of  
justice within certain days  
except from your receipt of the  
present notice.
