And your petitioner will ever pray t.





virtue of and under the same
an enquiry may be ordered to take
place before one of the masters in
Lunacy as to whether you are or
are not of unsound mind and
incapable of managing yourself
and your affairs but that you
may in case you think fit
demand that such enquiry
may if ordered be had before a
jury in which case a notice of
such your desire must be signed
by you and attested by your
Doctor and filed with the Registrar
in Lunacy at his office in the
Southampton Buildings Chancery Lane
London within seven days after your
receipt of this present notice Dated
the 20th day of July 1871





by your solicitor and filed with the Registrar
in Lunacy at his office in Southampton Buildings
Chancery Lane London within seven days after
your receipt of this present notice
