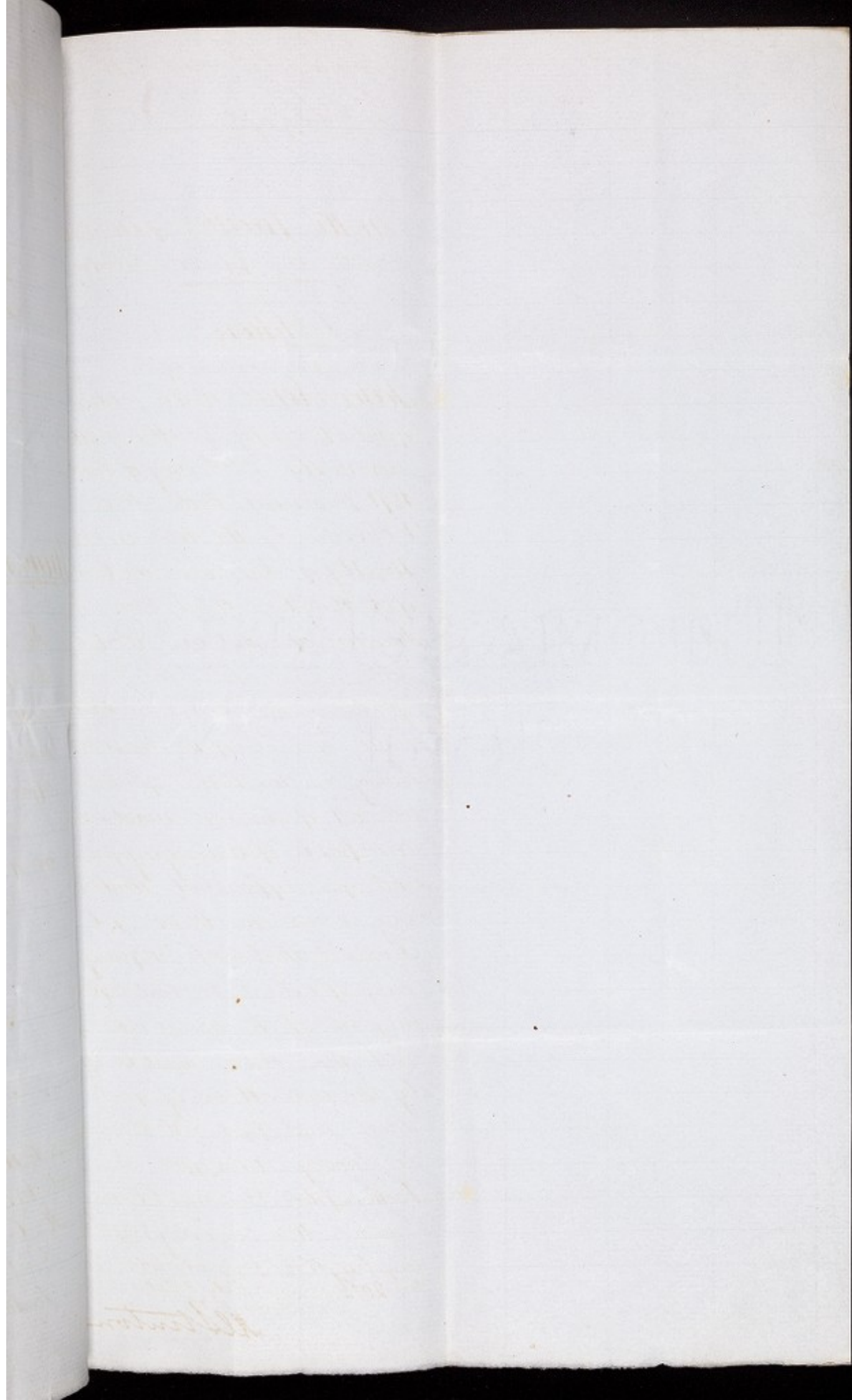

an enquiry may be ordered to take
place before one of the Masters in
Lunacy as to whether you are or
are not of unsound mind and
incapable of managing yourself
and your affairs but that you

Jury in which case a notice of
such your desire must be signed
by you and attested by your
Solicitor and filed with the Registrar
in Lunacy at his office in the
Southampton Buildings Chancery Lane
London within seven days after your

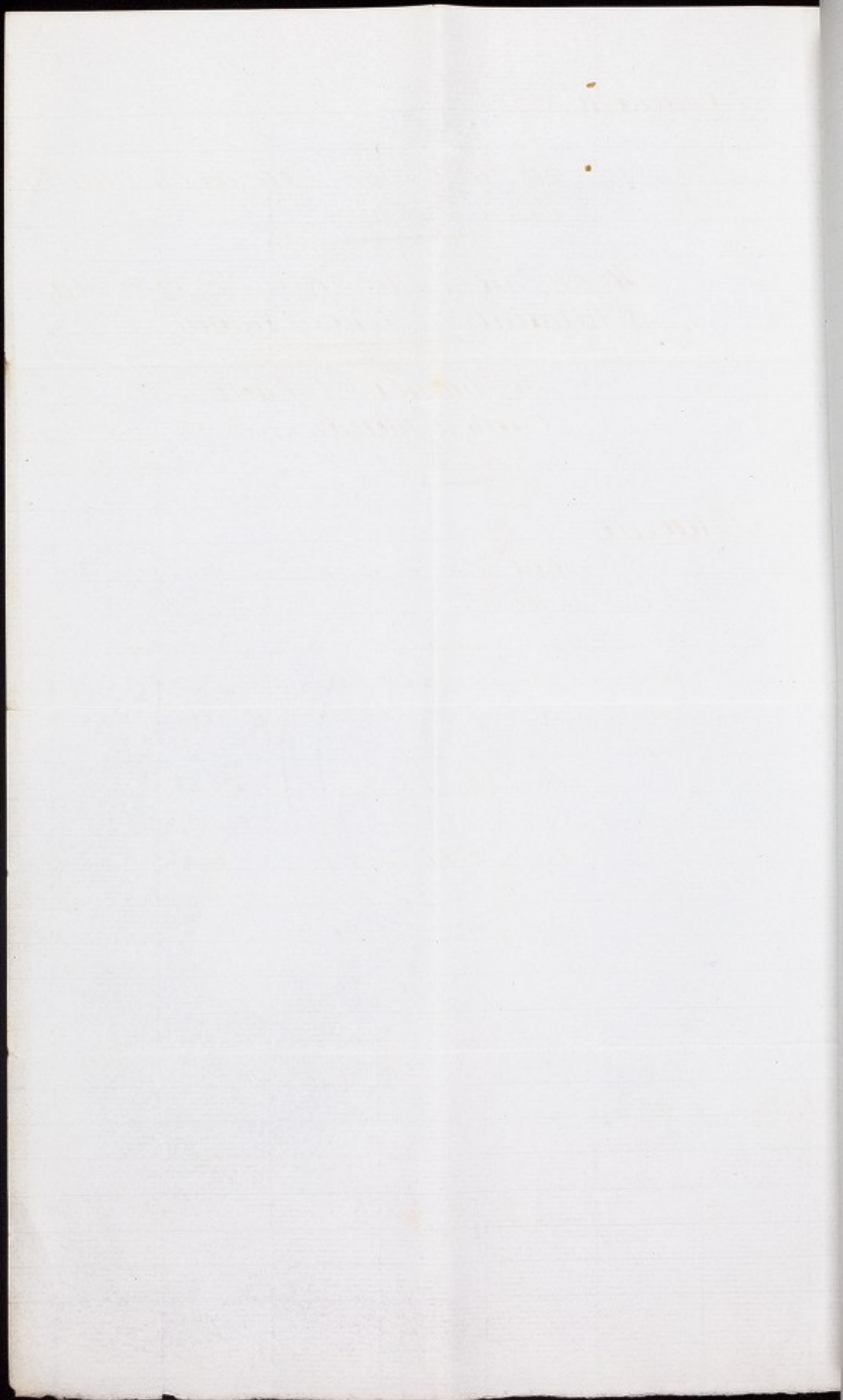

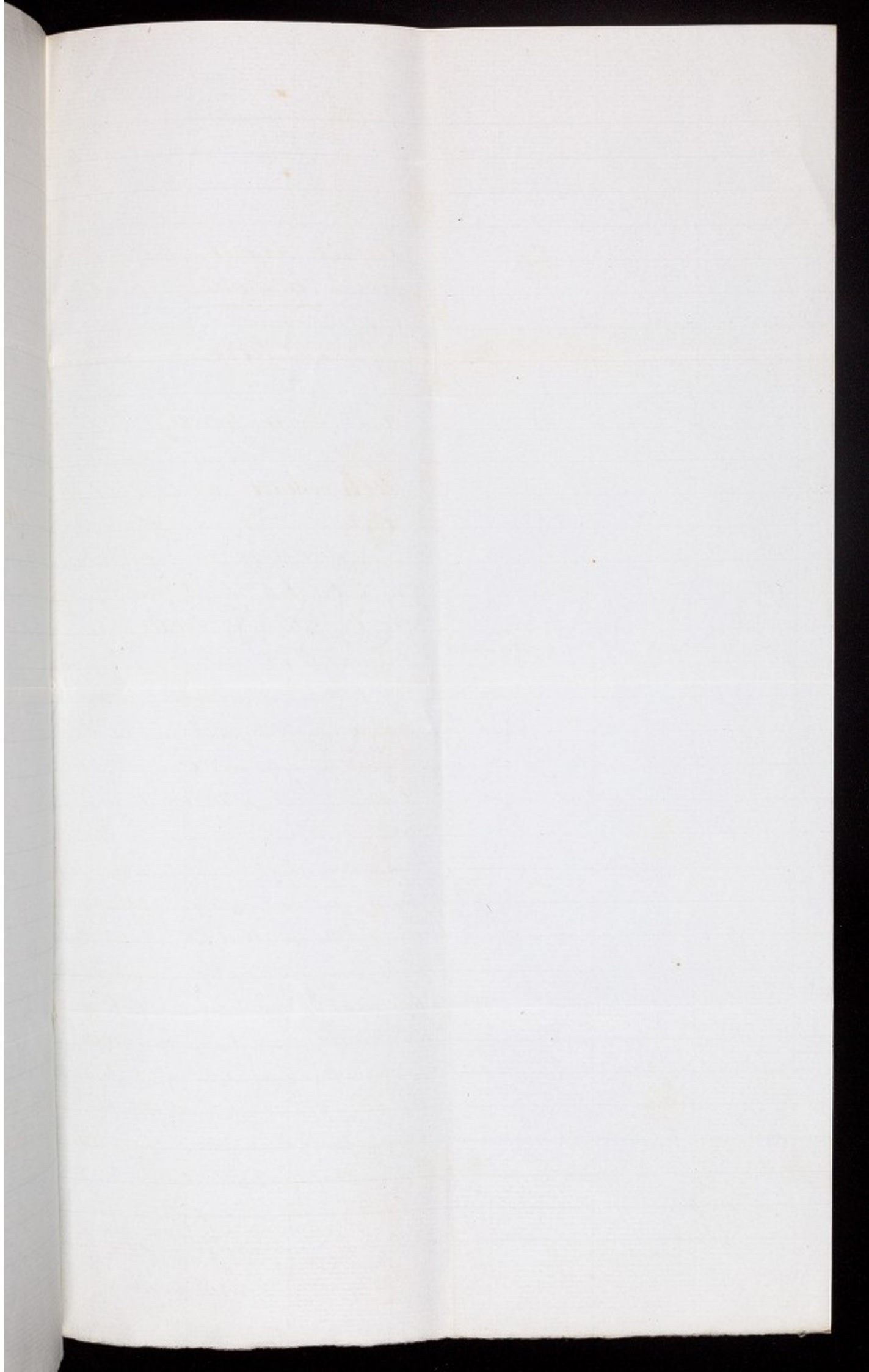
