My dear Father

I have to acknowledge  
a letter from you this  
week giving an account of  
visit to Scarborough which  
I am much pleased to  
find that you have enjoyed  
so much. Scarborough has many  
attractions, which in the  
public mind give it the  
title of the Queen of  
watering places, but whether  
it deserves that title it is  
not for me to say, I would  
to consider it a very great  
treat to spend a little



time there, when I lived at  
Malden, I recollect making  
a trip to Oak Knep, I also  
went to Whitley by sea and  
perhaps that I will recollect.  
I lost my hat on the trip.  
I was also glad to find that  
you felt yourself benefitted with  
the change. I shall think  
very much of thee the next  
day or two, enjoying the  
company of Mother, it  
will indeed be a mutual  
pleasure to you both.  
Mother will no doubt inform  
thee of my intention to  
take a run down to Lubon  
by a Trip train next Mon-  
day week the 14<sup>th</sup> Inst  
returning on the following  
Friday night. I should  
very much like to see thee  
if considered proper, the  
train no doubt will stop



a short time at York  
I had omitted to look  
what time the train is  
scheduled to arrive at  
York but I believe a notice  
of the trip will be passed  
up in York perhaps  
they could see and in  
emergency perhaps both  
themselves and they might  
meet me at the station  
I should be pleased to  
have an opportunity with  
you I hope to run down  
to Leeds the evening after-  
noon to see Allen  
who further has had an  
agreeable journey the weather  
has been changeable here  
and have had some sun-  
shiny which I hope after  
was the consequence of the  
change in the weather  
I enclose this a  
notice of a trip in  
a Monday week, I am a



member of the Association and  
should much enjoy the accom-  
panying the party but with  
my prospect in view of the  
following week I think  
must defer my visit. I have  
is the editor of a profound  
work on the Roman  
and the paper states he saw  
a party at the Castle yesterday  
evening and explained the  
subject a little exhibiting  
diagrams and sketches of  
places and items of interest.  
He also showed us some Roman  
Altars in the Castle with

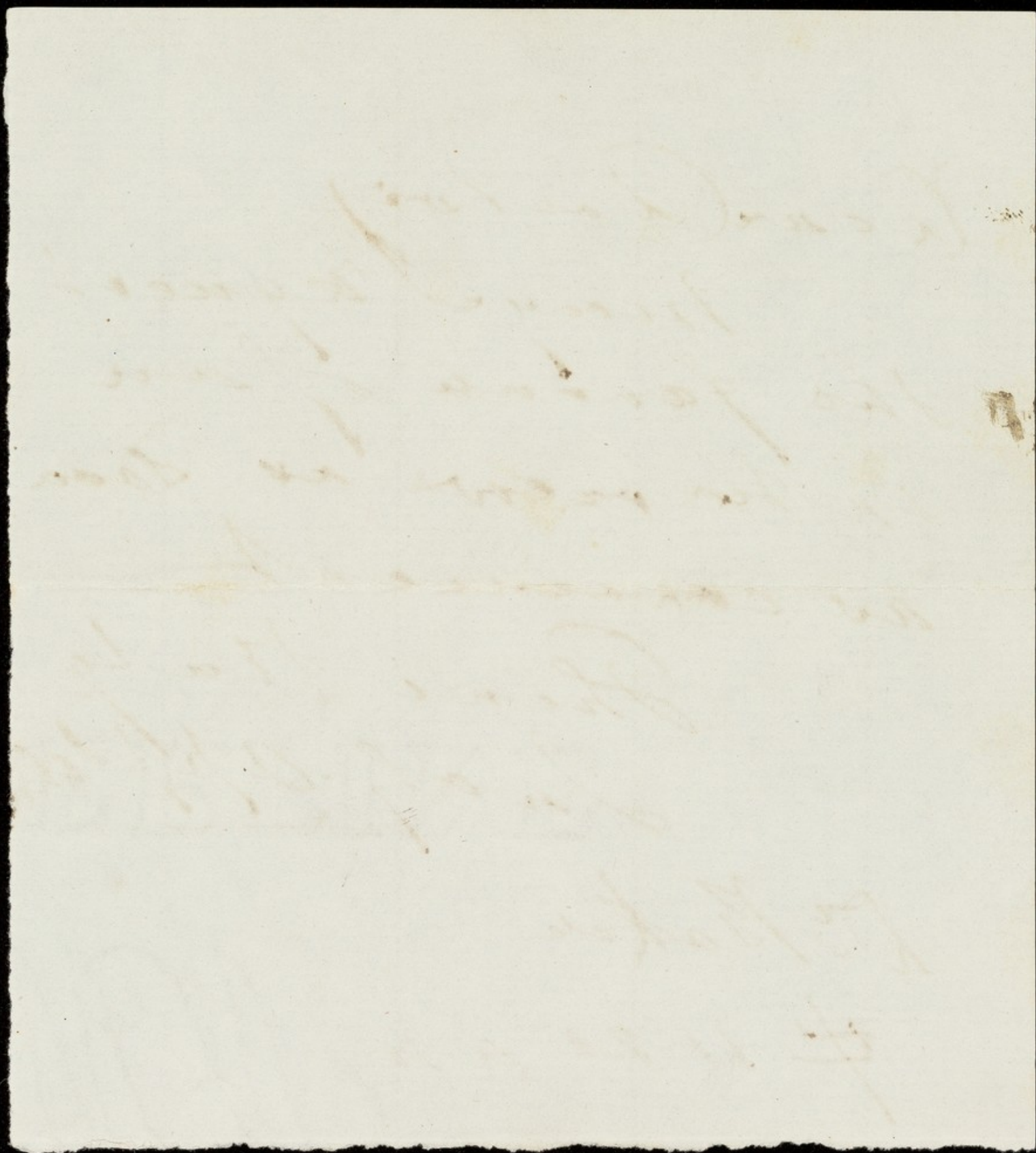

The Retreat

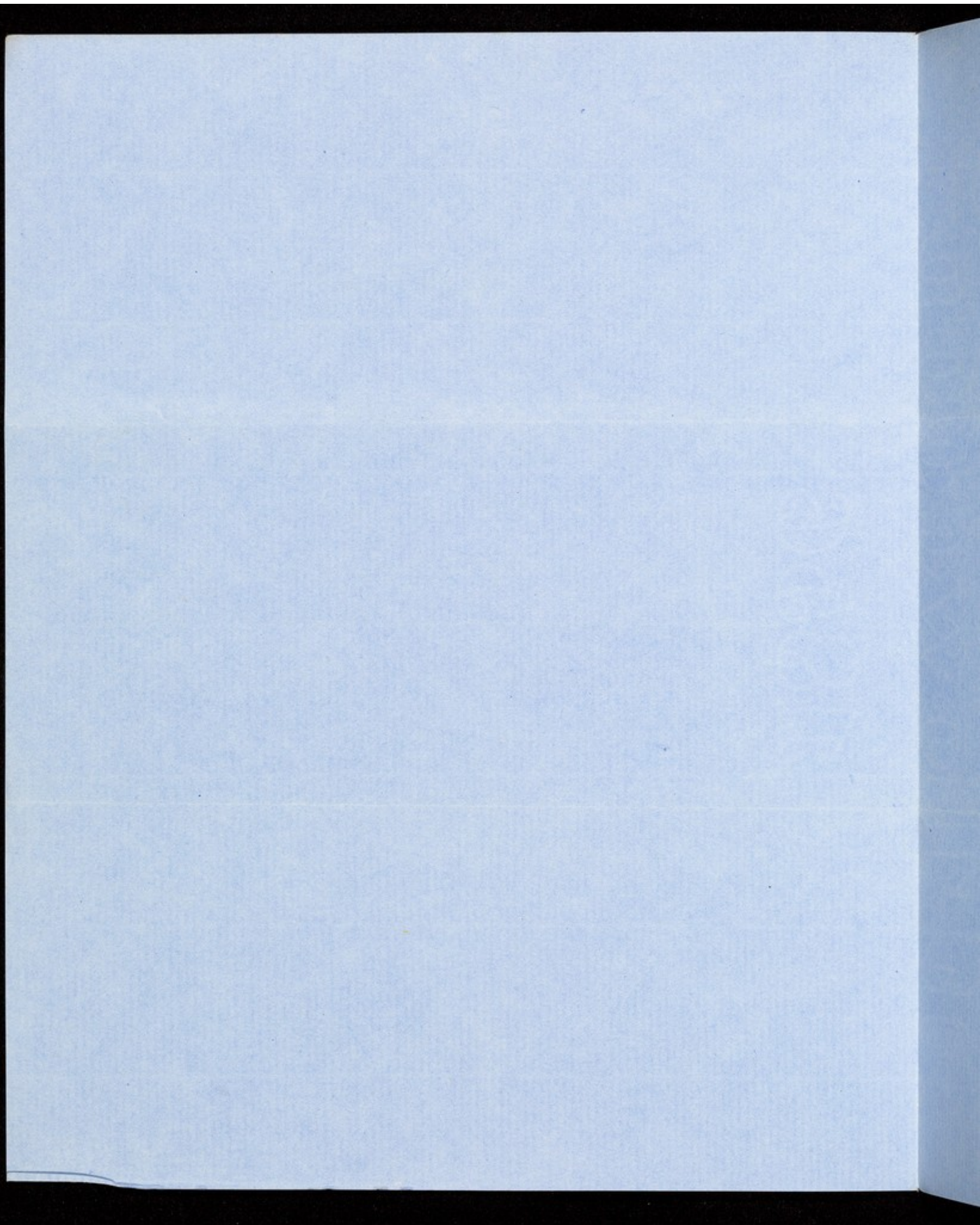
April 1. 1874.

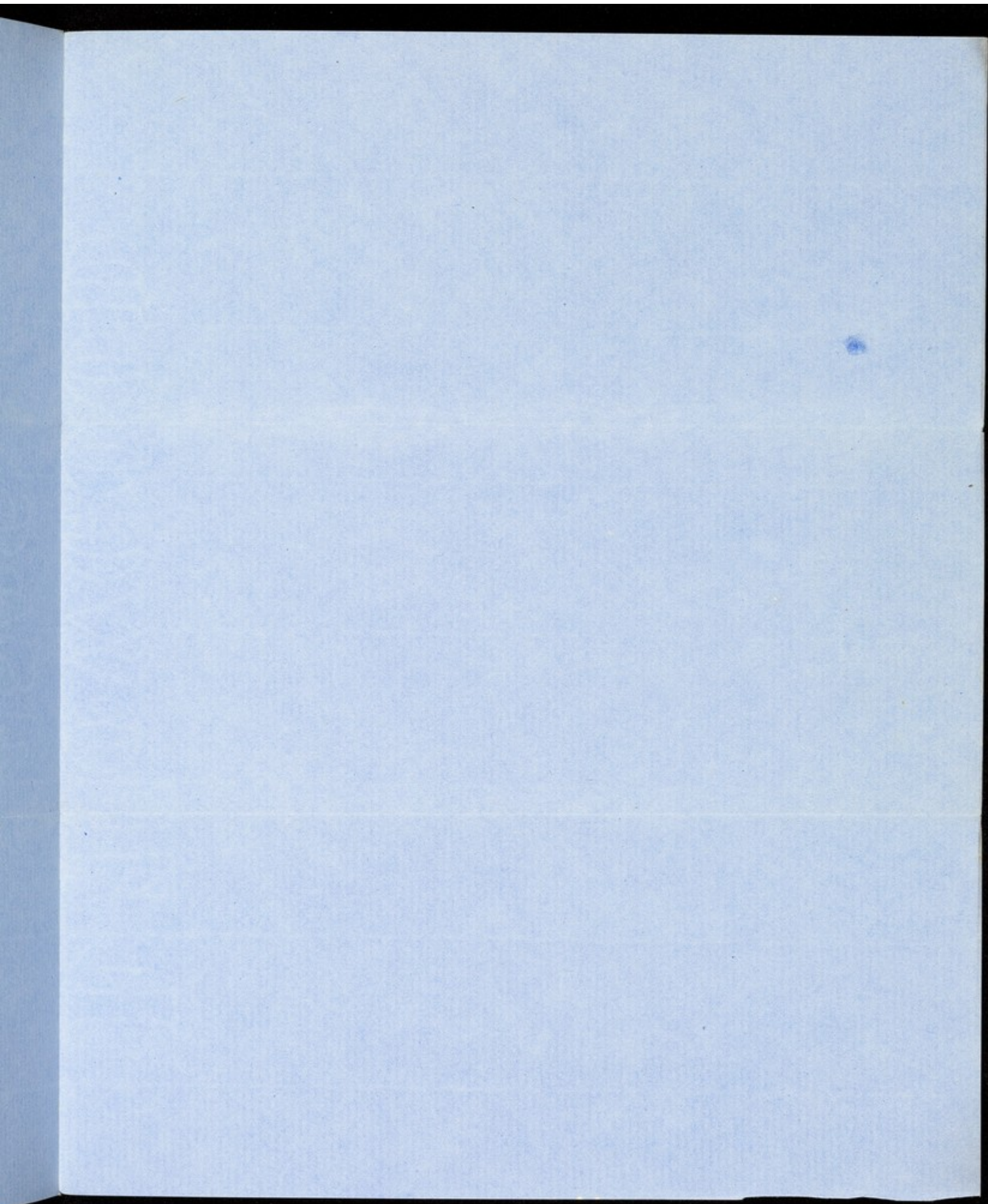
