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I am requested by the Committee of the Retreat to communicate to the friends of that institution, the annexed Minute of an adjourned Meeting of the Directors, held on the 15th instant, for the purpose of appointing suitable persons to fill the offices of Superintendent and Matron, which are likely soon to be vacant by the resignation of our Friends, Thomas Allis and Hannah Bonsonby.

The Committee believe that the appointment which has taken place, will be entirely satisfactory to all who are interested in the welfare of the Institution. They think it right to state, that no change is likely to occur in the medical department of the Establishment. The Physician and Visiting Surgeon, who have for so many years attended the Retreat, and the Resident Surgeon, who has now been for upwards of three years in daily intercourse with the patients, will continue their valuable services; and the friends of the patients may be assured, that the attention hitherto paid to their recovery and comfort, will not be diminished. It is the anxious desire of the Committee to promote these objects by every means within their reach; to improve the methods of treatment wherever it is practicable to do so; and thus, to sustain the character which the Retreat has heretofore held among Establishments of a similar kind.

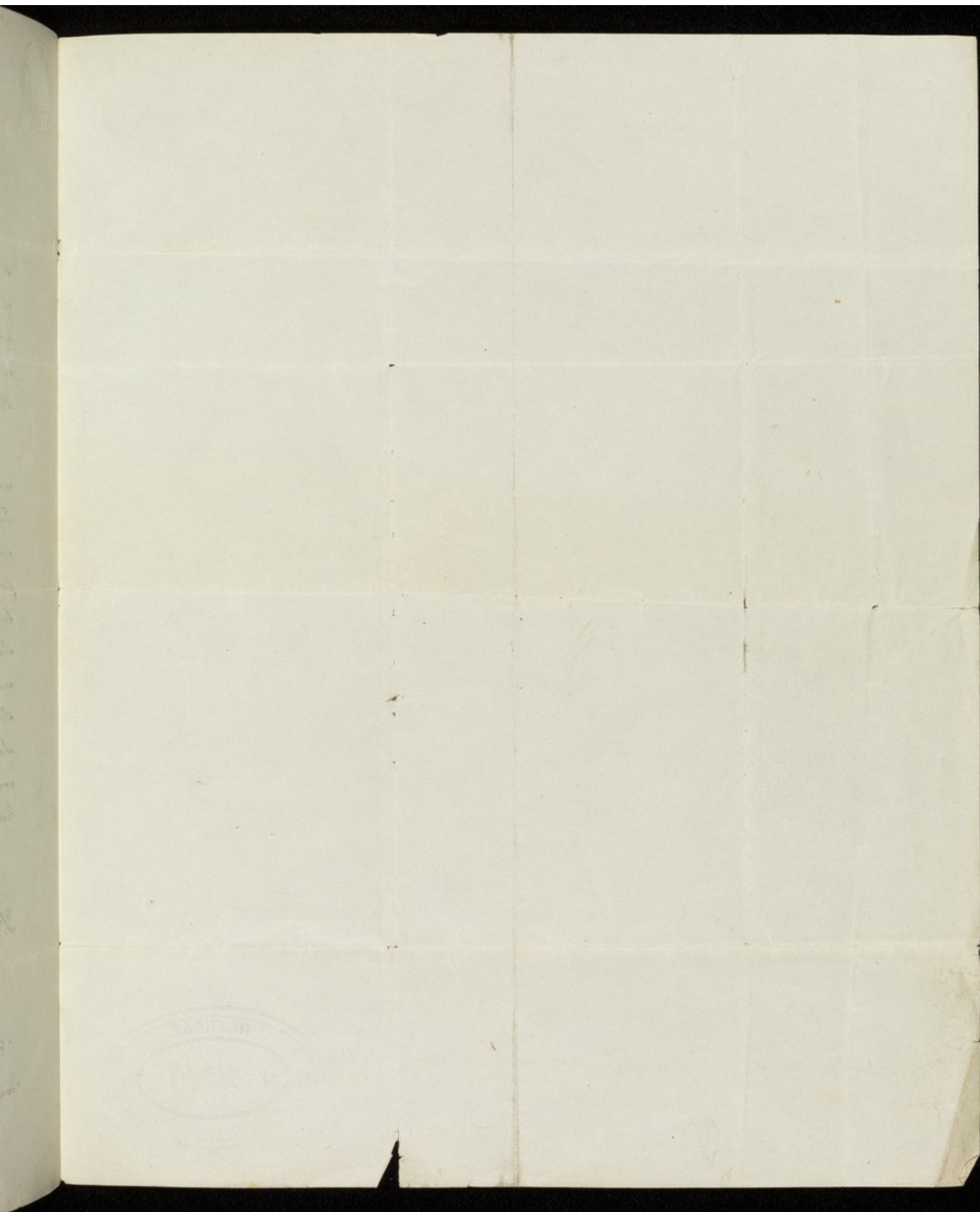
