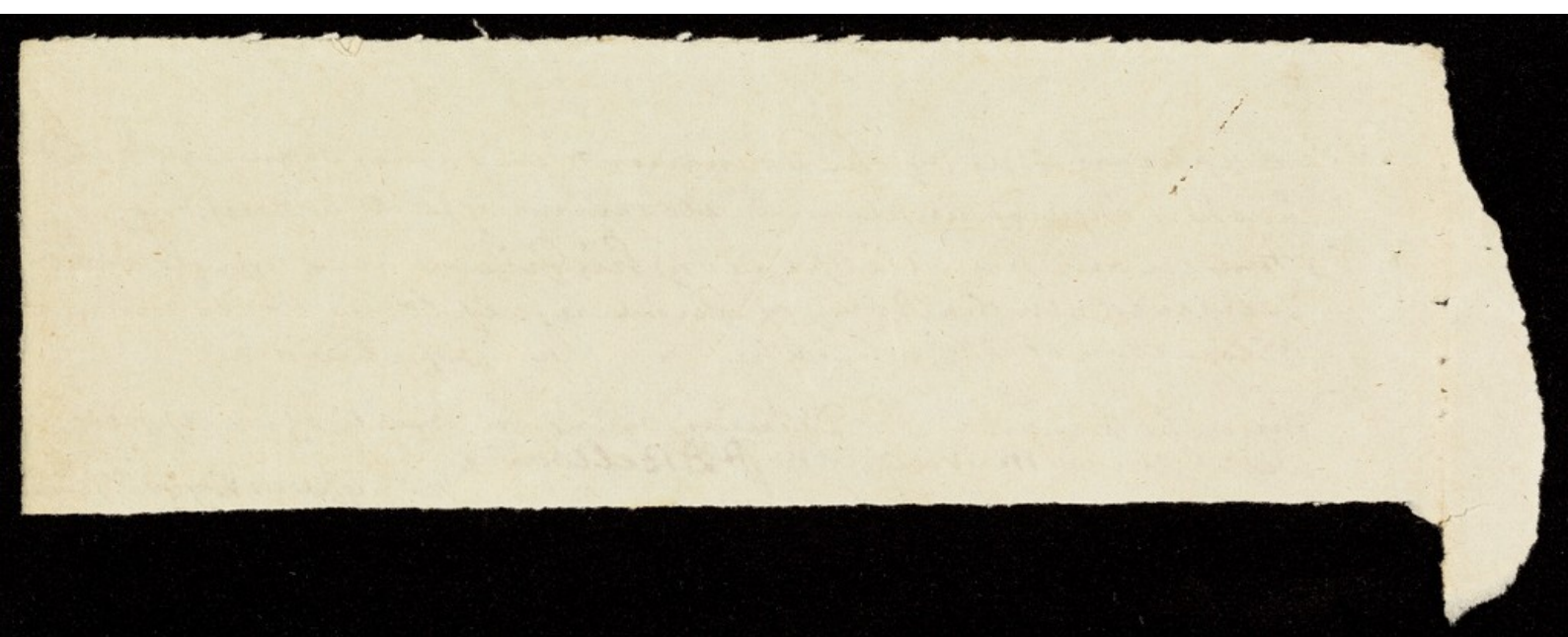
I am in forma Pauperi billeting for life here &

Done by J. Deacon 16th of 5th 1817

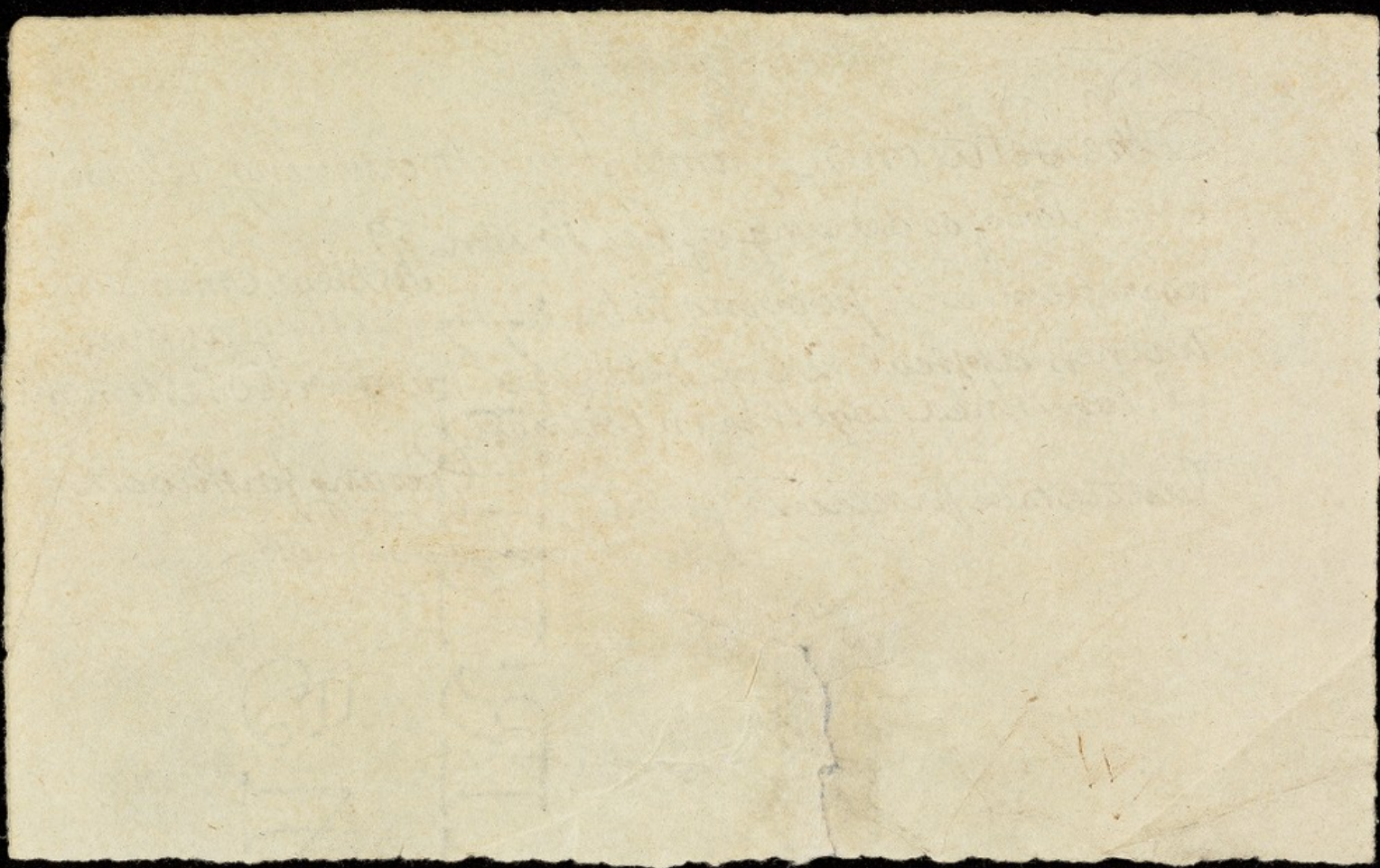
