KNOW all Men by these Presents, That *Richard Mundy*
Auctioneer of *St. James's Park*
County of *York*

in the
Auctioneer, am held and firmly bound to His present Majesty King GEORGE the
Third, in the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain, to be paid
to His said Majesty, His Heirs or Successors: To which Payment, well and truly to
be made, I bind myself, my Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, and every of them,
firmly by these Presents. Sealed with my Seal. Dated the *29th*
Day of *April* in the Year of our Lord One Thousand
Eight Hundred and *five*

Bond.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty:
Every Person using or exercising the Trade or Business of an AUCTIONEER is obliged to take out a
Licence for that Purpose, and to give Security by Bond to His Majesty with two or more sufficient Sureties that he
will, within six Weeks after each and every Sale, by way of Auction, deliver to the Person appointed to
receive the same, an exact and particular Account, in Writing, of the Total Amount of the Money bid at each such Sale,
and of the several Articles, Lots, or Parcels which shall have been there sold, and the Price of each and every such
Article, Lot or Parcel, and shall at the same Time make Payment of all such Sum and Sums of Money as shall be
