An annual sum of 15*l.* is paid by the keeper of each of the said licensed houses, which is applied in defraying the expenses attendant on the visitations, and no charge is made on the county rates. The houses are visited once in each quarter of the year.

These are the only houses ever licensed in this county under the Acts of Parliament, and no instance of the refusal of a licence has occurred.

William Symes, Surgeon - No returns of admissions, deaths, or removal of lunatics have been sent to the Clerk of the Peace.	From the reports made by the Visiting Justices of this Asylum in the years 1839 and 1840, there appear to have been two male and two female patients therein. No sum has been paid to the county stock, nor any sum paid out of the county stock, pursuant to the statute 9 Geo. 4, c. 40. No medical visitor appears to have attended, although one has been annually appointed with the Visiting Justices. Two visitations were made by the Visiting Justices in the year 1839, and five in the year 1840. No licences have been regularly obtained by Mr. Symes for this house; there is, in consequence, a considerable arrear due from him, and notice of a motion was given at the last Michaelmas Sessions, for the next Sessions to be held in January 1842, that the Clerk of the Peace be instructed to prosecute Mr. Symes for keeping a Lunatic Asylum without a licence.

I have enclosed a copy of the statement as allowed at the last Michaelmas sessions, and a copy of my bill as charged therein, which specifies the charges for that year, and the bills in the former years contain similar items in each year.

I have made out the return from the entries in our books, taken from the notices of admission, &c. sent me by the keepers of the respective asylums, showing the number confined in each of the last five years in each asylum; but it will appear in some instances that they exceeded the number for which the licences were granted. This, I suppose, arises from some omissions in transmitting the discharges, and by taking the whole number admitted in each year, without reference to some of them being again discharged in the same year, and other admissions in their stead.
