## A General Meeting

OF

DIRECTORS AND SUBSCRIBERS

TO

## THE RETREAT,

Held at York, the 27th. of 6th. Month, 1822.

The Committee, in conjunction with the Friends appointed to examine the accounts of the Institution, for the year ending the 31st. of 3rd. mo. 1822, have presented the following statement, from which it is satistactory to find, that the income from the Patients approaches much nearer to the expenditure on their account, than it has done for several past years. There is still however an excess of expenditure above the Income, of £234. 15s. 51d. which, with the claims of annuitants, £215. 5s. 6d. and the interest of money borrowed, £136.5s. 10d. makes a total surplus of expenditure above the Income from the Patients, of £586. 6s. 91. We have however gratefully to acknowledge, that the sums received in the forms of Donations and Annual Subscriptions, amount to £484.12s. 6d. and the sums subscribed for annuities and bequeathed to the Institution during the last year, amount to £395. 7s. leaving, with the rent of the farm, a balance in favor of the Retreat of £343. 12s. 81d.

This statement, and the consideration of the debt with which the Institution is encumbered, will, we hope, induce the continued exertions of the Agents and other friends of the establishment, in obtaining Subscriptions towards its support.

During the past year sixteen Patients have been admitted—thirteen have been discharged, of whom nine were recovered, and most of the rest in an improved state—four have died—two of whom were about 80 years of age.

There are now 67 Patients under care, viz. 28 men and 39 women, of whom 3 men and 7 women are at the Appendage.

The state of the Institution continues to be such as affords satisfaction, and we believe fully authorizes us to recommend it to the confidence and liberal support of the Society.
