REPORT

OF

THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

YORK LUNATIC ASYLUM,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MAY 30, 1830.

THE COMMITTEE have great pleasure in laying before the Governors a statement of the concerns of the Asylum, which cannot fail to prove highly satisfactory. The balance in favour of the Institution is no less than £.812, which will enable the Committee not only to add to the funded property, but also to make still further reductions of payment in some very indigent and distressing cases.

The farm is going on well, and promising to realize the hope that has been before expressed, that it will be a source of profit to the Institution. The expenditure of the farm during the last year has been £.222. The return in sale of stock, supply of milk, and vegetables has been upwards of £.300, and it may be fairly presumed, that in future the profit will be from £.50 to £.100 per annum.

The number of Patients has been nearly the same as in the preceding year; but a larger proportion have been cured, or improved.—In every respect, the state of the Asylum is such as the friends of the Institution must desire it to be.
