## PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (11 and 12 Vict. cap. 63.)

---

*Supplement to the Report to the General Board of Health on a Preliminary Inquiry into the Sewerage, Drainage, and Supply of Water, and the Sanitary Condition of the Inhabitants of the Town of WHITEHAVEN.* By ROBERT RAWLINSON, Esq.,  
Superintending Inspector.

THE following Table has been drawn up to show the present condition of Room Tenements in Whitehaven, which are let off as separate residences. The buildings are in a ruinous condition; the staircases are of wood, frequently dark, confined, and rotten or out of repair. Where the beds are described as "old and dirty," they are upon bedstocks, but very few of them have anything to cover them with but a bundle of old rags. The furniture described as "old and dirty," is more in quantity than good in quality; frequently only a few old broken chairs and tables, and other articles of furniture, which are very dirty. Those beds named "rags and straw," are on the floor, without bedstocks, and without proper bedding to cover them with; the bed-clothing, if any, a bundle of rags. The worst rooms are very confined and ill-ventilated. The water supply, and every other necessary convenience is at a considerable distance from many of those dwellings. Few persons would believe the human wretchedness that exists in Whitehaven, without making an inspection through Mount Pleasant, Rosemary-lane, Harmless-hill, Solomon's Temple, Caledonia, and other parts of the town. Many of those rooms are swarming with vermin; disease and fever prevail throughout.

In front of those rooms there is a row of little low houses 1 story high, intermixed with nail-makers' shops, as dirty as they can be, and in as bad repair. Further up again there is a long row of top rooms ; the bed is chiefly straw, and old rags to cover them ; and those that have bedsteads are almost as bad as the others for filth and dirt ; the houses are almost tumbling down for want of repairing. All the rain-water and house-refuse runs upon the surface of the street on Mount Pleasant ; and from the street down an open gutter which empties into the harbour, there are about 365 dwelling-houses, all more or less crowded with people ; 3 ash-pits are all the conveniences for this mass of people ; there is not a privy in all Mount Pleasant, nor any conveniences of that sort. The water supply is also very bad. There is a population of about 2200, without a single privy or convenience of any kind provided. Fever prevails constantly. There is no lamp here.

is laid on the damp floor in one corner. The confined smell and foetid atmosphere in these places are most offensive, and almost suffocating to any person entering, and who is not used to such a state of things. Filth, fever, vermin, and disease are common and constant amongst the wretched inhabitants. The small rents paid must be extravagantly dear to the occupants, as neither health nor comfort can be obtained. There is nothing to induce industry, sobriety, or care; but all the elements of vice are congregated about the wretched and helpless people.

NOTE.—The single tenements are generally inhabited by women who receive from one to two shillings per from the parish. Those cellars having two rooms, the back one has seldom any window, fire-place, or opening kind, but the intermediate door, and consequently there is little or no ventilation. Some single cellars have two three beds, but the majority have nothing but straw on the damp ground, and these places are frequently the crowded. It is common for a window to have only one square of glass. Many of the inhabitants complain

things, which they say they cannot help. They are generally Irish who live in these places. They take cause of their low rental, and paying no rates. They have no water supply, privies, or convenience for but they get rid of their refuse as they best can, most frequently immediately in front of their door. Many entrances are most difficult to get into, they are so confined, steep, and low. There are no drains.



**NEW HOUSES.**—These cottages were erected by the late Lord Lonsdale for the use of his miners and labourers. They are built on the side of a hill, and form three rows; the roofs at the back being in many instances level with the road-way in the front of the houses behind, and the roofs of the back row fall against the hill side. On the front row there are 77 tenements and 5 ash-pits; on the middle row, 111 tenements and 9 ash-pits; on the back row, 78 tenements and 7 ash-pits: total number of houses, 266; total number of ash-pits, 21. There are no privies; the ashes are taken away every week by the Earl of Lonsdale's carts for agricultural purposes; the water supply is very inadequate. There is a metal pipe laid by the Earl of Lonsdale from Monkway Gill, to supply an engine with water which is situated at the top of the Ginns. The overplus is taken through a pipe to the middle-row new houses; this is the only supply of water for these 266 tenements. The people from the top of the Ginns also go to the middle row for water. It is not uncommon to see at one time 20 women waiting their turns for water. In the summer months the supply fails, and the inhabitants are obliged to fetch their water for domestic use from Whitehaven Castle, which is about a mile distant from their dwellings; or they resort to any other place where they can conveniently get it. Many of the tenants on the front row complain of the ash-pits belonging to the middle row as being level with the roof of their houses behind; the refuse sinks down into their back kitchens, and causes a very bad smell through the whole house. Pigsties and stagnant water prevail in abundance. This place is very seldom clear of fever. The whole surface around the houses and roads is covered with human dirt, and on Sundays 10 or 12 men may be seen exposing themselves at one time; with the children this is the case throughout the week.
