

GEORGE THE THIRD, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, and so forth. To all unto whom these Presents shall come greeting.

HEREAS we are informed by the humble Petition of Henry Morris, William Ruxton, George Daunt, John Whiteway, Henry Lyster, Robert Bowes, Samuel Croker King, Gustavus Hume, John Neale, Philip Wood-

Petition of feveral Surge. ons of the City of Dubliu, letting forth Reasons for incorporating them and others.

Woodroofe, Francis Foreside, William Deafe, and James Henthorn, on Behalf of themselves and others, principal Surgeons of the City of Dublin, That the Regulation of the Profession of Surgery is of the utmost Importance to the Publick, and highly necessary to the Welfare of Mankind, and that the Publick fustains great Injury from the Defects in the present System of Surgical Education in our Kingdom of Ireland, and that the regularly educated Surgeons of the City of Dublin, in our Kingdom of Ireland, (who are become a numerous and confiderable Body) find themselves incompetent (from the want of a Charter) to establish a liberal and extensive System of Surgical Education in our faid Kingdom. And the Retitioners, by their faid Petition, having prayed that we would be graciously pleased, by Letters Patent under our Great Seal of our faid Kingdom of Ireland, to incorporate the faid Petitioners and others hereinafter particularly mentioned. shall come greeting.

And we being graciously pleased to approve of the said Institution, and to provide that a due and seasonable Regulation may be made, and that an apt, proper and legal Corporation may be constituted and established in our said City of Dublin, of regular able, and

and experienced Practitioners in Surgery, endowed with Powers, Jurisdictions and Privilleges, convenient and requisite for the Purpofe aforefaid. The stockishes miles

OUR Will and Pleasure therefore is, and We edo hereby grant, ordain, constitute and ap- rated. point the faid Henry Morris, George Daunt, John Whiteway, Henry Lyster, Robert Bowes, Samuel Croker King, Gustavus Hume, John Neale, Philip Woodroofe, William Deafe, and James Henthorn, and fuch others as shall from time to time be elected in the Manner Thereinafter directed, to be for ever a Body politic and corporate, which at all times hereafter shall consist of a President and Commonalty, and shall be called by the Name of THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF SURGEONS IN IRE- Title. LAND, and by the aforefaid Name they shall have perpetual Succession, and shall and may for ever hereafter implead and be impleaded before all manner of Justices in all Courts, and in all manner of Actions and Suits. And alfo, that they and their Successors, by the fame Name, shall be at all Times hereafter. for ever, able and capable in Law, to purchase, enjoy and take Lands, Tenements, Rents and Hereditaments, not exceeding the yearly Rent exceeding or Value of One Thousand Pounds Sterling;

And Goods and also Goods and Chattles, and all other Things of what Name, Nature or Quality the fame may be; and also to grant, demise, alien, affign and dispose of the faid Lands, Tenements, Rents, Hereditaments, Goods and Chattles, and to do and execute all other Things, lawful, necessary and convenient, for the common Profit of the faid College; and also that they and their Successors shall and may for ever hereafter have a Common Seal, which shall always be and remain in the Custody of the President of the said College for the Time being; and that it shall and may be lawful to and for the faid College, lawfully convened, or the major Part of the Members thereof, for the Time being, to break, alter, change or make void, the faid Seal from Time to Time, as to them shall feem requisite and fit.

Common Seal.

To have a

Election of Officers and Members.

AND further, our Will and Pleafure is, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Corporation, from Time to Time, to elect, chuse and appoint one President, and six Cenfors, and to elect, chuse and appoint twelve Members of the faid College to be the Court of Affiftants of the faid College; and also to elect fuch Number of Persons qualified as herein mentioned as they shall think fit, to be of

he aforesaid Commonalty. The said Presicent, Cenfors and twelve Perfons, to be coninued in the faid respective Offices for such Time as is hereinafter fet forth.

AND further, That it shall and may be Appointment awful for fuch President for the Time being o appoint, by Deed or Instrument under his Hand and Seal, fome Person who shall have obtained fuch Letters Testimonial as herein mentioned, to be Vice-President of the said College, which Vice-President shall, in the Absence of the President, have all and singudar the fame Powers and Authorities as the faid President would have if personally prefent.

And further, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the President, or in his Absence the Vice-President, and Censors, or any two of them, with fix or more of the faid Commonalty of the faid College, for the Time being, when and as often as the faid President, or in his Absence the Vice-President, shall think fitting to hold Courts and Assemblies, in order to treat and confult about the State and Government of the faid College. And that it shall be lawful for the President, or in his Abfence.

President. Vice - Prefident. Cenfors, or two of them, and fix or more of the Commonalty may hold Affemblies when the Prefident or Vice Prefidentshall think fit.

To make By-laws, &c. fence, the Vice-President, Censors, and Commonalty, so assembled, or the major Part of them so assembled, to make, ordain, constitute, establish, ratify, consirm, alter, annul, revoke or abrogate, from Time to Time, such By-laws, Ordinances, Rules and Constitutions, as to them shall seem requisite for the Regulation, Government and Advantage of the said Body, so as such By-laws, Rules and Constitutions be agreeable to the Laws and Statutes of our Realm, and be communicated to the Members of the said College at large, lawfully convened by Summonses, and be ratified and confirmed by the Majority of the Members so convened.

Appointment of the First President, Censors and Assistants, And our further Will and Pleasure is, That our said well-beloved Subject Samuel Croker King, be First President of the said College of Surgeons; and that the said Henry Morris, George Daunt, John Whiteway, Henry Lyster, Robert Bowes and Gustavus Hume, be the First six Censors of the said College of Surgeons; and that the said John Nease, Philip Woodroofe, William Dease, James Henthorn and Arthur Winter, Michael Keogh, Archibald Richardson, James Mills, Vernon Lloyd, James Boyton, George Stewart and Ralph Smyth Obre, be the First twelve Assist-

of the Date of these our Letters Patent, until the first Monday in January One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-sive, then next censuing, and from and after the said Day until some other meet and sufficient Members of the said Corporation be elected and sworn into the said respective Offices of President, Cenfors and Assistants, if they respectively shall so long live, or be not sooner removed.

AND our further Will and Pleafure is, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Cenfors of the College aforesaid, or any two of them, to give and administer unto the said first President his personal Oath on the Holy Evangelists, well, truly and faithfully to attend and execute the said Office or Place of President of the same College; and also full Power and Authority unto the faid first President, after he shall be so fworn, to give and administer to the faid Cenfors, and to fuch Vice-Presidents as he shall appoint, and to all and every Person and Persons whomsoever to be constituted by these our Letters Patent, Officers or Members of the faid College, his and their like corporal Oath on the Holy Evangelists, well, truly and faithfully to attend and execute his and their several and respective Office or Offices, Place or Places;

Oath of Officers and of Members.

and that the succeeding President and Presidents, before he or they shall enter on the said Office and Offices respectively, shall take the Oaths hereby appointed to be taken by the President before the next preceding President, or before the next preceding Cenfors, or any two of them; and the Cenfors fo to be elected as herein-after directed, shall, from Time to Time, before they shall respectively enter on their respective Offices, take such respective Oaths as aforesaid before the Prefident or Vice-President, for the Time being, or before the next preceding President or Vice-Prefident, or any two of the next preceding Cenfors and the Affiftants, fo to be elected, as herein after directed, from Time to Time, shall likewife, before they or any of them enter on their respective Offices, take the Oath hereby appointed to be taken by them, before the President, Vice-President, or any of the two Cenfors, for the Time being; and fuch Vice-Prefident and Vice-Prefidents shall, from Time to Time, before he and they shall enter on his and their Offices, take the Oath hereby appointed to be taken by them, before the President for the Time being, which Oath the faid President, Vice-Prefident and Cenfors respectively, or any two of fuch Cenfors, are hereby respectively, required and empowered to administer. AND

that the faid feveral Perfons, fo examined and approved of, shall be deemed qualified to practife Surgery and to be elected Members of the Maid College.

AND our further Will and Pleafure is, That all Persons being Members of the said Exemption from Parish College shall, for so long a Time as he and and other Ofthey shall exercise and practise the said Profession of Surgery, and no longer, be freed and exempted from the several Offices of Constable, Church-Warden, and all other Parish, Ward and Leet Offices, and from serving upon any Jury or Inquest in any County, City or Town, in our faid Kingdom of Ireland, upon his or their producing Letters ITestimonial under the Common Seal of the Taid College of fuch his Examination and Approbation.

AND laftly, we do declare and ordain, Ratification, That these our Letters Patent, and every Clause, Sentence and Article herein contained, or the Inrollment thereof in our High Court of Chancery in our faid Kingdom of reland, shall be in all Things firm, valid, infficient and effectual in the Law unto the aid College and their Successors, according to he Purport and Tenor thereof, without any further

further Grant, License or Toleration from us, our Heirs or Successors, to be procured or obtained.

Inrollment.

PROVIDED always, that these our Letters Patent be inrolled in the Rolls Office of the High Court of Chancery in our said Kingdom of Ireland, within six Months next ensuing the Date hereof; otherwise these our Letters Patent to be void and of none Effect, any Thing herein contained to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.

IN WITNESS whereof, we have caused these our Letters to be made Patent.—Witness our Lieutenant-General and General Governor of our said Kingdom of Ireland, at Dublin, the eleventh Day of February, in the twenty-fourth Year of our Reign.

INROLLED in the Office of the Rolls of his Majesty's High Court of Chancery of Ireland, the ninth Day of March, in the twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Third, &c. and examined by

AND our further Will and Pleasure is, That the said College lawfully convened may, from Time to Time, elect a Register or Secretary, and elect such other Officer or Officers, Servant or Servants, as to them shall seem necessary for the better regulation of the said College.

May elect a Register or Secretary, Officers, and Servants.

AND our further Will and Pleasure is, That the President, or any two of the Cenfors, shall, upon the first Monday of January, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-five, and on the first Monday in the Month of January in every flucceeding Year, between the Hours of Nine and Three of the faid Day, or within three Days next enfuing, by regular Summonfes convene the Members of the faid College, at any convenient Place within the City of Dubllin. And the faid College shall and may, by Ballot, elect, chuse and appoint out of the Members at large of the faid College, by the Majority of Votes, one Person to be President, and fix other Persons to be Censors, for the then succeeding Year; and then and there also in like Manner elect, chuse and appoint out of the Members of the faid College twelve Persons, to be of the Court of Assistants for the then fucceeding Year.

Annual Election of Officers on the first Monday in January.

To elect by Ballot.

Election of Officers, in case of Death, &c.

AND our further Will and Pleasure is, That when and fo often as the Prefident or any of the Cenfors or Affiftants shall die, refign, or be removed before the Expiration of the Year or other Time for which he shall be elected to ferve, then and fo often it shall and may be lawful for the faid College, being duly convened by Summonfes, to elect a Prefident, Cenfor or Affiftant, as the Cafe may be, in the Place and Stead of the President, Cenfor or Affiftant fo dying, refigning or being removed; and fuch Person, so elected, shall serve for the Remainder of the Year, or other Time for which the faid President, Cenfor or Affistant fodying, refigning or being removed, was so elected to serve.

Prefident and four Cenfors to examine. AND our further Will and Pleafure is, That the Cenfors of the faid College, or any four of them, together with the Prefident, or in his Absence the Vice-Prefident shall, from Time to Time, upon request made to the President, or in his Absence to the Vice-President, or any one of the said Censors, examine every Person who shall have served an Apprenticeship of five Years to any regularly educated Surgeon, and who shall intend to become a Member of said College; and if such President, or in his Absence the Vice-President.

Prefident, and fuch four Cenfors, or the Macority of fuch Prefident or Vice-Prefident, and rast mentioned Censors, shall be of Opinion that fuch Person so examined is duly qualiied to practife Surgery, then they, or the Majority of them as aforefaid, shall give each Person so examined and qualified as aforesaid, fuch Certificate or Letters Testimonial of his Qualification to practife under the Common Seal of the faid College, as to the faid Prefident and last mentioned Cenfors, or the major Part of them, shall seem reasonable and just .- And that the feveral Perfons, fo examined and approved of, shall be deemed qualified to be elected Members of the faid College, the faid Prefi-Hent, or in his Absence the Vice-President, and Cenfors, having first taken the following Oath, that is to fay :- I, A. B. do solemnly and finverely promise and swear, that I will, to the best f my Knowledge, Skill and Judgment, without Hatred, Evil-will, Partiality, Affection, Favour Fear, justly, equally and faithfully discharge the Trust and execute the Powers vested in me by n certain Charter, whereby the Surgeons of the City of Dublin are incorporated by the Name of "The Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland." the Vice-President, by the said Censors, or any two of them; and the President is to administer the same Oath to the said Censors; and they are hereby respectively authorised and required to administer the same accordingly.

Appeal to the Court of Af-

AND our further Will and Pleasure is, That in Case any Person examined as aforesaid shall think himself agrieved by the Judgment of the faid President, Vice-President, and Censors or Examiners, he may lodge an Appeal from fuch Judgment of the faid President, Vice-President, and Cenfors or Examiners, to the President and Court of Affiftants, who shall be required upon fuch Appeal to re-examine the Party fo complaining, within a reasonable Time; and if, upon fuch Re-examination, he shall appear duly qualified as aforefaid, then to grant him fuch Letters Testimonial as aforesaid, as to the faid President, or in his Absence the Vice-Prefident, and Court of Affiftants, or to the major Part of them, shall appear just and reasonable. The said Court of Assistants first taking the faid Examiners' Oath directed by this Charter, which Oath the President, or in his Absence the Vice-President, is hereby authorised and required to administer; and that
