

Mr. Brazier has also delivered the instruments which I have approved of, and I have also paid him. I have just had a letter from your wife stating that Mr. Brazier has been in and settled with her satisfactorily, so you may rest assured, I think, that everything is right.

Although the weather is bad, the war news looks brighter, and you must keep up a stiff back down there where there are bound to be discomforts for the next month or two. I trust you will keep well in health, and will have good luck if you go to the Front.

An excellent preventive against the effects of cold if you get on damp ground is to take 2 grain doses of quinine three times a day. It acts as an excellent preventive, and you can get the tablets at any chemist's shop, and keep them in your pocket, and swallow them as you want them.
