His height is 5 feet $9\frac{1}{2}$ inches; circumference of neck, $23\frac{1}{2}$ inches; arm, 27 inches; breast, 70 inches; stomach, 80 inches; thigh, $50\frac{1}{2}$ inches; calf of leg, 25 inches. His weight exceeds 40 stone. He is healthy and very active, and worked forty years puddler and shingler for the Colebrook-dale company of ironmasters.
