This most interesting variety of mankind was brought from the interior of Africa, to the western coast, by a trader, who shad purchased him from one of the native chiefs. This man affirms that the boy came from the neighbourhood of certain white tribes, which inhabit Central Africa, and has been corroborated by Major Serpa Pinto in his recent work. The boy's age is about twelve years, so that his skin is fully developed and unlikely to change in colour. The base is of the ordinary African negro bronzed black, but all over this extend a multitude of white spots, in size varying from that of a threepenny piece to the palm of one's hand. Not only do these marks exist on the body, but even extend to the hair, which is likewire variegated with white patches and lines as though some of the woolly black hair had become quite grey irregularly.
