An Appeal

HE Voluntary Aid Detachments of Hackney and Stoke Newington, since the outbreak of War, have been seeking for a suitable Building to open as a Red Cross Hospital. Stormont House being unoccupied by the L.C.C., an

application for this House was made to them, and was very generously granted, at a purely nominal rental, as an Auxiliary Military Hospital.

C, The Hospital will accommodate from thirty to forty Beds, and the War Office has been notified that thirty Beds will be ready to receive Wounded by 1st February, 1916.

C. The Hospital will be run practically by Voluntary Work and Subscriptions, with the exception of a small War Office grant. There will be a Qualified Matron and Sister; the rest of the Staff will be provided by the V.A. Detachments, who, through the kindness of the Guardians, have had practical training at the Hackney Infirmary, and are fit and capable of undertaking such work as they will be called upon to perform in this Hospital.

C. The equipment of the Building has been, of course, a great expense, but the Appeals made to the public have been well responded to, and gone far towards enabling the Committee to fit it up with every comfort for our Wounded Soldiers.

C, All the work of Redecorating and Cleaning of the Building has been done by Local Firms and Members of the V.A.D. free of cost.

(I) Many Articles of Equipment and Money are still required, and, in order that the future success of the Hospital may be ensured, we ask you to kindly fill up and return the enclosed Donation Form. Any sum, however small, will be most acceptable, and will give encouragement to those engaged in the National duty of adequately administering to the men wounded in our Country's cause. No greater encouragement could be given than the knowledge that the general public are sharing the work.
