Immediately after our wounded had been attended to, several medical officers with attendants went out among the wounded Tibetans scattered over the battlefield, binding up injured limbs, administering water, and applying field dressings to wounds. Our troops provided dressing splints hastily improvised

from the muskets and scabbards abandoned by the enemy. The Tibetan prisoners were employed in placing the wounded under shelter.
