Three King's Court, in Fleet Street,

ONE of the greatest Curiosities in Nature, of a BOY and GIRL, with
Two Distinct Heads and Necks, and but one Body, three Arms and three Legs and
Feet, and one Foot with six Toes; and allowed by Sir Hans Sloane and several other
Physicians, and other curious Gentlemen, who have seen them, to be the greatest Curiosity
that ever was *seen*, and but just exposed to Publick View; and is shewn by the Mother,
who was deliver'd of them, June 25, 1736, in the County of Suffolk. There was some
small Account of them in the Publick News, in the beginning of July, 1736.

To be seen by one or more, without Loss of Time.

Gentlemen and Ladies may have it brought to their Houses, giving an Hour's Notice.
