Note by the Military Comptroller of "The Sphere" - The Italian troops have more careful control, however to control with us Tripolitania. The scene is one near the beach-head camp, where a group of trading goods were displayed in a narrow aisle. The scene had its actual level black, and one of them is seen climbing up on to the high ground to permit him to take position in a trench at the quarters. The view affords one some idea of the distance between the scene of the present campaign and the terrain usually to be met with in Italy's last line.

and all available "shells" are rolled into use. The small mine employed by the Italians are growing very useful. Their handling is not an easy matter on account of the heavy nature of the ground and they are undergoing the moving of the guns a matter of great difficulty. The valuable quality of these small-caliber guns have been made that proved in a country where their transportation is a matter of no small moment. The job of ground gun sappers showed that they were not to be despised.

"Under our military, who have been taught by their South Africa experience to maintain their own cover and when under fire to immediately "dig themselves in," the Italians are to be pitied dependent on their sappers to provide them with more cover. It will be noted that in order to make this attachment less conspicuous and more splintered the barracks is being covered with various shells, etc.
